SUBJECT: Replacement Personnel.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394, U.S. Army.
(Attn: Lt. Col. Scudder).

1. In the absence of General Back, I am taking this opportunity to answer your letter of 22 September, relative to replacements for the Signal Center.
2. While I am fully aware of your personnel problem, there is little which can be done at the moment. Every headquarters in the Theater is faced with the same situation.
3. It is informally stated by our G-1 that a shipment of low score replacements is due from the States about 15 October 1945. This will include some Signal specialists. The only present source of replacements has been from inactivated units within the Theater, and this source has been entirely inadequate.
4. We are very desirous of giving all the attention possible under the present circumstances. It is strongly advised, however, a requisition be submitted for required low-score specialists. It is our belief these enlisted men will have to be shipped from the United States. In the meantime we will canvass all possible sources of replacements and if any are found, will send them to you.

SUBJECT: Signal Staff for AC Hqs.

Dear General Back,

I am enclosing copy of a memorandum from our Hqs Communication Officer on the need for enlisted personnel which release of high point men in the Signal Section will create.

Requisition for the needed replacements has been made by the ²⁶⁷⁵2657th Regiment (which is the US AC Hqs Military Unit) but with the crying need for all units remaining in the theatre for specialists I am afraid the requisition will be a long time in being filled.

There is no indication that the Signal center load of this Hqs will be reduced for several months as the AC is probably busier at the present moment than for some time past and the matters being treated are of the highest urgency. It would, therefore, create a very serious situation if sufficient Signal personnel is not available to man the Signal centre.

As you have always shown a sympathetic understanding of the needs of this Commission, I am taking the liberty of writing to ask if you would lend your personal assistance to insuring that the requisition for:

- 4 Teletype operators (MES No. 237)
- 4 Signal center clerks (MES No. 542)

is assigned a high priority.

SUBJECT: Assignment of Regular Army Enlistees.

TO: All Concerned.

1. As a general rule, enlisted personnel who enlist or re-enlist in the Regular Army, will be assigned to the organization with which they are serving at time of discharge and enlistment or re-enlistment.

2. When an enlisted man has requested assignment to an arm or service or racial unit other than the one in which serving, recruiting officer will take appropriate action as follows:

a. If an organization of the arm or service selected by the enlistee is assigned to the same command as the organization with which the enlistee has been serving, appropriate reassignment to a unit in the command will be made as directed by the commander thereof.

b. If no organization of the arm or service selected by the enlistee is assigned to the same command as the organization with which the enlistee has been serving, appropriate arrangements will be made between the major commands concerned to effect the reassignment.

3. Enlistees selecting another overseas theater will be reassigned to the organization with which they have been serving, and will be dropped by that organization when the individual departs on orders for the United States, on re-enlistment furlough, or direct to the other theater concerned.

4. Orders issued for enlistees proceeding to the US on re-enlistment furlough will include a paragraph substantially as follows:

"The above named enlisted man, having enlisted in the Regular Army, will proceed without delay to the 7th Replacement Depot and report to the Commanding Officer for trans-shipment to the United States for (number) days re-enlistment furlough (which will not exceed 90 days). Upon expiration of furlough he will be (returned to this theater) (assigned to the _____ theater)."

5. Those organizations with which enlistees are serving, or from which enlistees have departed for re-enlistment furloughs, are to be inactivated, disbanded or are scheduled to depart from this theater, the enlistees will be reported for reassignment to Peninsular Base Section by

the appropriate commander prior to the organization's inactivation, disbandment or departure. Adjutant General Section will issue the necessary instructions for assignment in accordance with arm or service and MOS.

6. At the time of enlistment or re-enlistment, the assignment or reassignment of the enlisted as outlined above is affected by the entry on Page 5 of 'D AGO Form 24 under "Original Assignment and Organizations to which Subsequently Assigned During this Enlistment Period," accomplished by the recruiting officer. Issuance of orders is required only where travel is involved.

1. At present the Signal Section, Headquarters Allied Commission has on duty the enlisted personnel listed below. By each man's name is shown his present Adjusted Service Rating Score and his position in the Signal Section.

2. This office has been informed verbally by the Adjutant, 2675th Regiment, that all men with Adjusted Service Rating Scores of 70 or more will be redeployed within approximately two-three weeks and that all men with Adjusted Service Rating Scores of 60 or more will be redeployed within four-six weeks from this date if redeployment is carried out according to the present schedule.

3. This section is at present functioning on a twenty-four hour basis. Three of the above listed men can be replaced by Italian Civilian personnel. However, under present Signal Instructions, Chief Signal Officer, AFHQ, and Army Regulations 380-5, teletype operators and Signal Center clerks cannot be replaced by civilians other than Allied Nationals because of classified signal traffic that passes through the Signal Center. There is an average volume of more than 20,000 groups of traffic passing through this Signal Center daily, and such a volume of traffic requires expert and efficient handling if it is expected to be delivered promptly to addressees.

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4. G-1 American has verbally informed the undersigned that it cannot replace the nine (9) enlisted men that this section expects to lose under redeployment. In order that this section may continue to function at all, it is urgently requested that the following listed experienced personnel, with low point Adjusted Service Rating Scores and any grade including Staff Sergeant or less, be requisitioned immediately:

Four (4) Teletype Operators (MOS # 237)
Four (4) Signal Center Clerks (MOS # 542)

5. While it is realized that replacement of personnel is extremely difficult at this time, unless the above personnel may be acquired immediately for training in the multiple problems of signals handled by Signal center, Allied Commission, and so that they may take over the operation, it will be absolutely necessary for this Signal Center to cease operation at the time of redeployment of its present enlisted strength.

TO : Colonel C. E. PARKIN.

1. Furloughs to enlisted men have been and are available under current theater directives, up to 10 days. Personnel in regions have been regularly submitting furlough applications, and policy has been to approve them after they have been forwarded approved by the Commanding Officer of the company involved. This applies to furloughs on the Italian mainland and Sicily.

2. Occasional applications to Africa, the Balkans, Cairo, etc., were processed through MTOUSA as temporary duty. Recent application to Czechoslovakia was returned from MTOUSA "Not favorably considered at this time." (These applications were to visit relatives.)

3. Headquarters Command has made available, for officers and enlisted men, rest facilities at Mondragone Beach and Acquila. No applications have been received for these since the northern regions have access to more attractive locations, and personnel in Rome desire to see northern Italy rather than remain at a nearby beach area.

4. Officers and enlisted men also have access to temporary duty at the U.S. Riviera Recreation Area in France (5 days, but necessitates 11 days absence) and in Cairo (7 days, necessitates 11 days absence, available only to those with more than 12 months overseas service). However, in both cases, the quota is so limited that Hq Comd could not assign a quota to this organization.

5. Trips to Capri are available to all officers and enlisted men/OR's of the Allied Commission, but it is not believed that many will avail themselves of this, since two and one half days are occupied in giving a six hour period at Capri; Certainly the northern companies have no desire to participate.

6. Lt Col Seith, Capt Reed, Capt Arens and Capt Lee have evolved a plan by which each northern company will be prepared to accomodate personnel from each other and from Rome, so that Hq personnel may be able to see a portion of the north and northern companies may exchange personnel. This will apply to officers and enlisted men. (Capt Reed is preparing a letter to all companies on this subject).
