In connection with the American enlisted men who are being withdrawn, as you indicated, some of the men have been alerted - one T/4 Robert J. Acavado, who is in charge as chief clerk with respect to all work done on requisitioning for civilian and disease and unrest supplies from Allied sources through AFHQ. The other is Pfc. David Wintersky of the Agriculture Sub-Commission. I understand that the chap in the Agriculture S/C is of officer material and a highly qualified technician, who the agriculture people do not want to lose.

The Directors involved have come to me and asked that we intercede, but I have told all of them that we had agreed with you in the Vice Presidents' meeting that no efforts would be made and that the orders must take their course, and have insisted that no one make any representation to your section with respect to having the names of enlisted men from the Economic side withdrawn, as I understood this was your wish.

A story is now being circulated to the effect that names of enlisted men have been withdrawn and that the entire Headquarters is not following the same rules. This may of course be just a rumor. If it isn't and officers are interceding for the men with success it places us in a very difficult position. I was hoping that the matter would be handled as outlined by you and no exceptions made. May I tell the Directors of the Economic Sub-Commissions that no exceptions are being made?
