- 1. Fr Goshie said that he was surprised that the plan in this letter had come up for discussion as he understood this was Flow 2, and Flow 1 has not yet definitely been abundance.
- 2. He stated that the Secretaries Committee of the Advisory Commoll had ununimously advised the Mombers that it was most undesirable at the moment to discontinue the L & A Section, even if it was only possible to maintain it on a kimited scale.
- 5. He state that further discussion on Plan 1 was necessary, before he was prepared to discuss the attached letter which presented many diffloulties.


CONNECTS ON THE ATTACHED LETTER FROM THE BRITISH DEBADEY:

- Para 1 (d) British Zebassy do not understand this paragraph. Could it be clarified.
- Para 1 (e) British Embassy have their own private arrangements with Command Paymenter in regard to funds and expenses, and are writing a lettor to this office explaining the position.

Subject: Plan for Discontinuing the L & A Section, Advisory Council for Italy.

To : Commanding Officer, Allied Comtrol Commission.

1. Herewith for your approval is recommended procedure to discontinue the Liaison & Administrative Section of the A C I, as a unit, showing the necessary steps to be taken in each phase:

A. RATIONS,

- (1) The AMERICAN Delegation drawing a total of 44 rations (18 Mr. Kirk (private home) and 26 members of the Staff), can be drawn by them from the PBS Ration Point and billed accordingly. At a later date a Sales Commissary will be put in operation and they (AMERICANS) them can purchase at will from those sources. As an alternative, the American Delegation could drawn from Hq. 2675th Supply.
- (2) The BRITISH Delegation has established itself with the British 92 DID therefore mothing need be done about them in regards to rations.
 - (3) The remaining Delegations:
 RUSSIAN Strength for rations: 30
 YUGOSIAV 33
 FRENCH 20
 GREEK 16

NOTE: To be furnished on a 50/50 basis American and British in compliance with Cable CINC to FLAMBO, 5 Mar. 1944, reference 60560.

HECOMMOND:

HQ. 2675th SUPPLY - RUSSIAN AND FRENCH. HQ. COMDT, ACC - YUGOSLAV AND GREEK.

This can be accomplished immediately after receiving orders to disherd unit.

b. POST EXCHANGE AND NAAFI RATIONS:

(1) In accordance with cable instructions the American Civilians will be furnished PX Rations from American Sources. This rationing is now being handled by the Post Exchange Officer, Hq. 2675th.

(2) In accordance with cable instructions the British civilians will be furnished NAAFI from British Sources. The British Delegation has established a channel of supply through the 37 BIS in this area.

(3) For the remaining Delegations, cable instructions suthorize issue on a 50/50 basis for a total of forty (40) persons:

RECOMMEND: PX 2675th furnish: 10 Russians) Each can furnish list of 10 French)

names for whom PX should be drawn.

HQ. COMDT. ACC, Supply NAAFI to:

12 Yugoslav) Each delegation can pick-

8 Greek

up its quota from ACC.

The above can be put in operation at your earliest order.

. TRANSPORTATION:

(1) Vehicles assigned this unit:

Five (5) U S Army Chevrolet Sedans (one of which was wrecked 23 Sept)

Six (6) British Humber Pullmans

Two (2) British Utility Cars, 2 seater.

Ome (1) British Dodge 15 cwt.

As these vehicles were issued by the PBS and 57th ARKA in Naples, it will require necessary authority from AFH, to either return them to the issueing units or turn them over to the ACC. American and British each receiving their own lot.


Except for one vehicle required to complete the turnover of all matters pertaining to this section, the above listed can be released immediately upon receipt of authority.

4. SUPPLIES & EQUIPMENT,

(1) All supplies and equipment were drawn from PRS and 57th ARKA, this will require authority from AFHQ to turn over records to the American and British Units of the ACC. Supplies and Equipment now on hand with this Section could be turned over to the proper unit together with records involved.

2. FUNIS:

(1) The matter of funds for Administrative expenses will be closed as of the last day of existence of this Section and will be taken up by the undersigned direct with the Allied Financial Agency. Upon receipt of orders to slose shop, all delegations will be notified to begin dealing (!) direct with AFA for funds needed by them.



f. AIMINISTRATIVE RECORDS.

(1) All Administrative records which have been kept by this Section should be turned over to the Chief Secretary of the Advisory Council. Other than supply and financial records, all papers could actually be destroyed as they are of little or no value.

g. PERSONNEL:

(1) Military personnel can be released to rejoin their unit as the mecessity for their presence seases. Italian drivers and administrative personnel can be released accordingly.

h. QUARTERS:

- (1) Quarters now occupied by this Section will be released to Rome Area Command at last date of existence.
- 2. The above recommended action could be taken and be completed within ten (10) days from the time the all-clear signal is given to disband.

Subject: Report and Requirements, L & A Section, Advisory Council for Italy.

To : Executive Officers, Establishments Branch, (American and British)
Allied Control Commission.

- 1. 2. The L & A Section, ACI, at present consists of the following personnel:
 - 1 Captain (AM)
 - 2 EM (AM)
 - 11 EM (FR)
 - 4 Civilian Drivers (Italian).
- b. In order that this Organization can properly function in its expedted duties, the following additional personnel is required:
 - 1 Junior Officer (AM or BR)
 - 1 M T Corporal (BR)
 - 9 Drivers (BR)
 - 1 Driver Mechanic (BR)
 - 5 Drivers (AM)
 - 2 Clerks (AM)
- 2. In this connection reference is made to inclosures 1 & 2, Letter OIC. 45th Workshops Coy. RASC and Report of Lt Col James E. Regis, CAC, dated 28 July 1944, respectively. Also attached is copy of Ltr., Hq. NATCUSA, 9 June 1944, as a reply to a request for additional personnel. (Incl. 3).
- 3. Should it be impossible to obtain the required additional personnel, and also, in view of the evident duplication of effort in many instances, RECOMMEND:
- the 92 DID. THAT the American Delegation draw direct from the 92 DID. THAT the American Delegation draw direct from the PBS Ration Point and the other 4 Delegations (YUGISDAV: HUSSIAN: GREEK & FRENCH) draw from the Hq. Comdt., ACC.
- b. FOR TRANSPORTATION: Since each Delegation has a number of vehicles owned and operated by them, THAT the present vehicles now assigned this Section be returned to AFEQ. The undersigned is certain that these vehicles are used only because their presence is known. (Out of sight, out of mind).

c. <u>FUNDS</u>: Since the undersigned is only a go-between, between the individual Delegations and the Allied Financial Agency, <u>THAT</u> each Delegation make private arrangements for drawing funds. The present connection is the Administrative expenses, (approx. 60,000 Lire monthly) which would no longer exist should this unit be disbanded.

d. SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT: Each Delegation is well equipped and complete since most of them have taken over thier pre-war embassies or have leased comfortable estates. THAT records of supplies and equipment be turned over to the Hq. Comdt., ACC, together with balance of equipment now on hand and being used by the personnel of the Section. Further needs can be easily met by the Hq. Comdt., ACC.

4. In conclusion, I feel certain that if the recommendations in par-3 above, be approved it will be advantageous to both the Allied Governments and the Advisory Council. The personnel now attached to this Section could be utilized for more important assignments.

1. The Advisory Council for Italy consists of the following nations:

- 2. The L & A Section is and has been responsible for the following:
 - a. Transportation.
 - b. Rations.
 - c. Quarters.
 - d. Supplies & Equipment.
 - e. Hiring and Payment of Domestic Labor.
 - f . Furnishing of funds for current expenses of individual Delegations.
- 3. The L& A Section is composed of the following personnel:
 - a. Two (2) American Officers.
 - b. Two (2) American Enlisted Men.
 - c. Two (2) British Other ranks.
 - d. Thirteen (13) French Drivers.

II

SUMMARY:

INCL. 2

- l. <u>Personnel</u>: The personnel required for the proper function of this unit is not available owing to several requests for sufficient personnel submitted to G-1 have been denied. The emlisted personnel now attached, except one (1) American emlisted man, is both insufficient and unsatisfactory.
- 2. Transportation: Each delegation now have numbers of privately owned vehicles for which arrangments have been made by the L & A Section for upkeep and maintenance. The vehicles (military) originally assigned on a loss basis are as follows:

5 British Humber Pullman

2 British Utility Cars

1 British 15 Cwt

5 American Chev Sedans (just arrived from US)

3. Quartera: At the direction of the CG, AAI, all delegations have taken over their respective embassies or have by private arrangements with local civilians leased additional buildings.

4. Supplies & Equipment: The bulk of supplies and equipment furnished the delegations while in Naples has now become surphus due to their move to their embassies which are well equipped.

5. Domestic Labor: Practically all domestic labor hired in Naples has been released and each delegation has by private arrangements either re-hired their prewer staffs or are employing their own national refugees.

6. Funds. Only 3 of the 6 Delegations are drawing funds for current expenses.

7. Rations. The British Delegation is drawing mations from the Hq. Comdt., (Br) ACC. All other delegations are being furnished rations by the L & A Section.

III

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. PERSONNEL: THAT is agreement with the wishes expressed by G-1 to the CG, NATCUSA, military personnel be returned to their proper unit and civilian personnel if needed by hired by the individual delegations.
- 2. TRANSPORTATION: THAT in view of the fact that all delegations have been able to make private arrangements for transportation, all military vehicles be returned to AFRQ. Should additional transport be needed, it can be furnished by Hq. Comdt., ACC.
- 3. FUNDS: AS IT is required by the Allied Financial Agency that each delegation keep a record and account for funds expended, the 3 delegations requiring funds draw direct from the A F A.
- 4. RATIONS: THAT rations be drawn from the Hq. Comdt on a 50/50 basis (British and American as per exisiting instructions) by each of the delegations.

Subject: Vehicle Maintenance

0. 0. ALLIED ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR ITALY.

- During recent inspection of your vehicles it has been observed that the standard of maintenance is very low, this causes the vehicles to be off the road in Workshops more often than is necessary. In fact if the standard of maintenance is not improved the vehicles will become unserviceable after a further 5,000 miles, the difficulty of replacement will, no doubt, be appreciated by you.
- 2. The cause of this state of affairs is the complete inefficiency and lack of maintenance knowledge of the Drivers in charge, and the absence of any supervision of them by a responsibe NGO. No organized maintenance exists, AFG 810s and AB 412s are not kept, Section Daspection and the 16 daily tasks are not performed, there are no drivers i/c vehicles as a result tools and equipment are being continuously lost.
- 3. With a view to remedying this situation it is suggested that you apply to Higher Formation for the following British RASC Personnel to be posted to your unit.

1. MT Corporal.

1. Driver Mechanic.

9. Drivers (1 per vehicle)

With these Personnel your vehicles can be operated and maintained as a normal RASC Section.
