1. The attached letter is a complaint by a Signor CORNI of BOLOGNA that his car ALFA ROMEO, ED-25385, was taken by an American Officer without proper requisition and that the officer has now taken the car to REGGIO DI CALABRIA.
2. The facts of the case appear to be as follows:-
  - (a). A few days after the liberation of BOLOGNA, Lt. BASS of AMG ordered that the vehicle should be handed over to him, but did not give the owner any requisition papers.
  - (b). Signor CORNI's driver went with the car.
  - (c). Lt. BASS has now left BOLOGNA and it is understood that he, the car and driver are now in REGGIO DI CALABRIA.
3. The report is forwarded for any action that you consider necessary.

Bologna, 11 September 1943.

Sir,

As I had taken an interest in doing my best to put at your disposal the vehicle of the officina Minganti, of which I am one of the three owners, I feel bound to explain to you the following:

A few days after the liberation of Bologna, Mr. Haas, an American lieutenant, came at the over mentioned workshop, situated at Via Ferrarese No. 32, and, producing the numbers of the vehicle Alfa-Romeo BO 25385, furnished to him by the R.A.C.I. (Automobil Club - Public Register) he ordered that the said vehicle be handed over to him, without leaving any document of requisitioning. Besides he asked to our employee concerned with, for our driver: Gustavo TAGLIAVINI, who, although working for the A.M.G., is still paid by us.

The car under subject has been used at Bologna by Lt. Haas until the tasks of Bologna A.M.G. were over; later from some private letters of the driver, we heard Lt. Haas has gone to Reggio-Calabria with the car which is still there, as from a letter of the driver to his family.

I beg your pardon for having troubled you, but I thought it was my duty to inform you of the whole matter so as to allow you to intervene and support the rights we have as owners of the vehicle in question.

Lt. Haas is, at present, at the Truck Pool of Reggio Calabria with the car.

APPENDIX 'B' TO OPERATIONS MEMORANDUM NO 15

USE OF TEAR GAS - CIVIL DISORDERS

OBJECT

1. The employment of Tear Gas is authorized for the purpose of dealing with civil disorders subject to the conditions laid down in the following paragraphs.
2. The use of Tear Gas may be justified in circumstances which would hardly warrant opening fire. Officers i/c Troops employed in circumstances of civil disorder must therefore always keep watch on the changing temper of a mob, bearing in mind that this temper is liable suddenly to deteriorate, and must judge of the moment when the use of Tear Gas is calculated to stop it from getting out of control, and to obviate the necessity for opening fire.

POLICY

3. The employment of Tear Gas, having been authorized in principle by higher authority, powers to order its employment are vested in the Commanding General, Rome Area Allied Command.
4. The Commanding General, Rome Area Allied Command will therefore:
  - a. designate units or parts thereof to draw, hold and employ Tear Gas,
  - b. issue orders to commanders of specific units detailed as protective units when alerted, either wholly or in part, to carry Tear Gas,
  - c. issue general orders to the commanders of these protective troops authorizing the employment of Tear Gas.

METHOD

5. Tear Gas will never be used by any troops other than those detailed in accordance with para 4 above, and as given in para 6 below. It will never be used until after the issue of a general order by HQ Rome Area Allied Command in accordance with para 4 (2) above. A protective order for the use of Tear Gas will only be given by:
  - a. US and British Military Police.
  - b. Personnel of Emergency Column.
  - c. Mobile Reserves.
6. Tear Gas will be drawn and held only for use by:

7. Personnel of static guards will not be authorized to use Tear Gas.
8. On receipt of code word "Threaten"

3. The employment of Tear Gas, having been authorized in principle by higher authority, powers to order its employment are vested in the Commanding General, Rome Area Allied Command.

4. The Commanding General, Rome Area Allied Command will therefore,
- a. designate units or parts thereof to draw, hold and employ Tear Gas,
  - b. issue orders to commanders of specific units detailed as protective units when alerted, either wholly or in part, to carry Tear Gas,
  - c. issue general orders to the commanders of these protective troops authorizing the employment of Tear Gas.

METHOD

5. Tear Gas will never be used by any troops other than those detailed in accordance with para 4 above, and as given by para 5 below. It will never be used until after the issue of a general order by HQ Rome Area Allied Command in accordance with para 4 (c) above. The executive order for the use of Tear Gas will only be given by an authorized officer.

6. Tear Gas will be drawn and held only for use by:

- a. US and British Military Police.
- b. Personnel of Emergency Column.
- c. Mobile Reserves.

7. Personnel of static guards will not be authorized to use Tear Gas. 5035

8. On receipt of code word "TEAR GAS" all personnel detailed for protective duties in this Operations Memorandum (incl static protective detachments) will wear respirators/masks, service, gas in the alert position.

9. a. Tear Gas will be stored separately and well away from dumps of ammunition and explosives and away from quarters and premises in use by personnel.

b. Tear Gas may be stored in water-tight boxes and buried, should it not be possible to segregate it by other means.

c. Storage will be checked at regular intervals to ensure that leakage does not occur.

10. Requisition and subsequent issue of Tear Gas will be dealt with by Rome Area Allied Command, and independent demands will not be submitted by unit commanders.

1. A study of the heating systems has been completed by this Sub-Commission and herewith are its recommendations.
2. The repairs now under way to the three large boilers and pumps in the main building should be completed not later than Nov. 15.
  - a. As these boilers have oil burners an assured supply of Navy Special should be arranged for immediately as shortages are developing in this fuel in the theatre.
  - b. In the event that fuel oil can not be obtained it will be necessary to re-install the coal stokers previously in service on the large boilers. Should this be necessary it is recommended that only a good grade of coal such as East Virginia or Welsh be used. Local coals such as Berco and Highite have not sufficient heat value with the limited grate area available to be effective.
3. In the Annex after several schemes have been studied, it is suggested that the small boiler (coal fired) EGA II now installed in the main building be dismantled and re-installed in the place of the two existing smaller boilers now in the Annex. This installation should be adequate if a good grade of coal is used as previously suggested. This cost of this work should be approximately \$1,000.00 The Headquarter Commandant's Office has been requested to obtain an estimate from the heating contractor who performed the work last season and should be completed in 15 days.
4. The repairs to the small old boilers are not practical due to excessive cost and their unreliability in performance last season and therefore is not recommended.

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5. The tying in of the two building systems to carry the load on the main building equipment is not recommended, due to excessive cost and scarcity of materials.

1. Future of ITALY and Cessation of A.R.G.

The Chief Commissioner read to the meeting a paper on future policy towards ITALY. He invited comment from Regional Commissioners.

All Regional Commissioners agreed with general policy outlined in the Paper.

SCAO IV Corps pressed for an increase in the provision of suitable literature and books. He said that the Italians were anxious to know how democracy worked and how it solved its problems.

Regional Commissioner, LOBARDIA Region, said that in his opinion too little emphasis was given in the paper to the importance of the early return of ITALY to normal relations with other countries which was so desirable for the rehabilitation of ITALY. He was also opposed to leaving skeleton A.C. teams in territory that had been handed back to the Italian Government. He thought that the retention of Allied officers in the field, once their authority had been taken away from them, was a mistake. Considerable discussion took place on this point, Regional Commissioners LIGURIA and VENETIE Regions being opposed to Colonel ROBERTI's views. Both the Chief Commissioner and the Executive Commissioner were of the opinion that the A.C. Liaison Officers had proved useful in the past and that their presence in ITALY during the election period would be beneficial.

The Chief Commissioner stated that 1 September 1945 had been fixed as the probable date for the withdrawal of A.M.C. in ITALY except for VENEZIA, GIULIA, and possibly the BOLZANO area. Regional Commissioners agreed that it was a satisfactory date.

2. Italian Elections.

Vice President, Civil Affairs Section and Director, Local Government Sub-Commission outlined the preparations necessary for the holding of local government elections, following which Chief Commissioner took the views of the Regional Commissioners on the date on which the preparation of electoral lists could be started. Chief Commissioner announced later in the meeting that he had decided that the work should be started on 15 July.

It was calculated that preparations for elections could not be completed until December. Owing to the winter (snow), this meant that the actual election might not take place until the Spring of 1946. This applied to both local and national elections.

Vice President, Civil Affairs Section told the meeting the Allied Commission had been trying to persuade the Italian Government to alter the present electoral law which had been passed in 1915 and which was considered by both the British and American Governments to be undemocratic. So far no success had been achieved. A further approach would be made.

There was discussion on the measures that might be taken by Allied forces to ensure a free election. Regional Commissioner, Lombardy Region, thought that a statement should be issued by the U.S. and U.K. Governments which would state definitely that the Governments were prepared to do all in their power to see that the elections were free. This statement should be made public. He believed that with the backing of this statement, even a relatively small number of mobile troops would go a long way to raise the morale of the Italian police agencies and would help the Italians to follow true democratic procedure at the polling booths. If two Governments were not willing to take such a statement the Regional Commissioner was of the opinion that the Italian people should be told that it was entirely their responsibility and the Allies would make no attempt to supervise the election in any way.

Chief Commissioner said that this opinion of Regional Commissioner Lombardy Region would be given careful consideration.

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Vice President, Civil Affairs Section told the meeting the Allied Commission had been trying to persuade the Italian Government to alter the present electoral law which had been passed in 1915 and which was considered by both the British and American Governments to be undemocratic. He saw no success had been achieved. A further approach would be made.

4. Italian Decrees.

Regional Commissioner, EMILIA Region, drew the attention of the meeting to the publication of a decree authorizing the establishment of the National Association of Patriots, to be supported by voluntary contributions.

He maintained that contributions would probably be made at the point of a gun. The Chief Commissioner directed that a memorandum be submitted to him on the subject.

A discussion took place on the implementation of decrees which had affected Northern Regions and it was agreed to give Regional Commissioners notice of intention to implement them so that they would have an opportunity of objecting.

5. Visits by Northern Prefects to Rome.

6. Re-opening of the Swiss Italian Border.

Regional Commissioner, LOMBARDIA Region asked when the Swiss border would be opened. He said there were 40,000 Italians in SWITZERLAND. Director, Displaced Persons & Repatriation Sub-Commission, replied that 29 June had been fixed for the commencement of the repatriation of these Italians on the HENNER route and 14 July on the DOMODOSSOLA route.

Regional Commissioner, LOMBARDIA Region, said that there were many Italians with business connections in SWITZERLAND who wanted to go there as soon as possible. Colonel SIKKY (Transportation Sub-Commission) said that a conference was being held at BASEL on 30 June when it was hoped that a decision would be reached. The Chief Commissioner directed that representations on behalf of Allied Commission should be made at the conference for the early re-opening of the frontier.

7. Public Safety in the North.

Executive Commissioner asked Regional Commissioners for their views on public safety in the Northern Regions. The replies of the Regional Commissioners indicated that in general the public safety situation was satisfactory, but doubts were expressed for the future.

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8. Policy for Italian Industry in the North.

Economic Section briefly outlined the industrial situation in the North. It was dependent on the availability of raw materials, the most important being coal of which there was a world shortage. The Allied Commission had submitted to the Combined Chiefs of Staff a proposal that the Italian Government should set up an Industrial Coordination Board which would have subsidiary boards to deal with each industry or group of industries. It would advise the main Board of the materials available, the Board would allocate the fuel and raw materials to the subsidiary boards who would decide which industries could be supplied. In the meantime a coal allocation organisation was being set up and instructions would be issued shortly. It was reported that coal imports for industries in the North for July would be 66,000 tons and for August 146,000 tons. These figures excluded military and railway requirements. After August the loadings by the U.S. were uncertain.

Discussion followed on the Coal Allocation Board set up in KILBY as a temporary measure. Executive Commissioner said that there seemed to be some divergence of opinion as to recent decisions of the Board and he instructed Colonel EVANS to see that a thorough overhaul was made of its composition.

Regional Commissioner, IOMRDL Region, outlined a scheme which he thought should be adopted as an interim measure until the Industrial Coordination Board was set up. He said that in the North there were twenty-three committees which represented each of the main industries in the five Northern Regions. The Commissioner should be appointed as head of each of these committees and one official nominated to coordinate the work of the committees. The committees were composed of the best men available in the Northern industries and their functions were much the same as those of the proposed sub-boards of the Industrial Coordination Board. Regional Commissioner emphasized that they would work under the direction of AG/LC.

It was decided that the matter be further discussed in committee on the following day in the presence of Minister GROMMI.

It was reported that 15,000 tons of coal had been allotted for July to the military railway administration. Executive Commissioner directed that this should be watched in order to retrieve some for industry if possible.

9. Socialization of Industry and Works Management Committees.

Vice President, Civil Affairs Section explained that the Italian Government had passed a decree which dealt with expropriation of employees in industry but that they had so far failed to pass a similar decree to deal with expropriation of managers. Chief Commissioner had decided that while LM was in existence a permanent expropriation order was necessary and he had directed that the Italian draft decrees on this subject (which they had so far failed to implement) should be issued as a Regional Order.

Vice President, Civil Affairs Section, circulated the draft Regional Order and Executive Commissioner asked that Regional Commissioners should read it and that it should be discussed at a meeting on the following day. If there were no objections by Regional Commissioners the Regional Order would be issued without alteration.

10. Unemployment and Surplus Labour.

Director, Labour Sub-Commission, said that unless surplus labour in industry was very carefully handled there would be great distress and unrest. General Order No. 14 continued the

General Order No. 48 continued the ban on discharges and provided for a system of payment of workers who were on short time, under-employed or unemployed. This was a temporary measure.

Economic Section was ascertaining what other forms of employment were available in commerce, agriculture and relief schemes.

The present unemployment insurance scheme was insufficient and the Italian Government had been pressed to make some improvement. Director, Labour Sub-Commission, gave in detail the improved rates of unemployment pay and family allowances. Unemployment pay would be 50 lire per day instead of 2 lire. Once surplus labour had been drained off industry it just not be allowed to return.

Regional Commissioner, LOMBARDIA Region, said that it had been strongly reported in the I.N. press that wage increases had been excessive, 150 lire per day or more on a basis wage of 95 lire and some were retrospective to 1 January 1945.

Chief Financial Adviser asked how it was proposed to dispose of surplus workers with firms which had swollen pay rolls. Director, Labour Sub-Commission, said that the specialist officers concerned with alternative sources of employment should endeavour to get workers transferred.

Vice President, Civil Affairs Section and Director, Public Safety Sub-Commission, stressed the need for increasing the present strength of Police Officers in VENETIA GIULIA. This brought up the question of unequal distribution generally among Regions and ALG, Fifth Army and IV Corps.

Executive Commissioner ruled that adjustments must be made to produce an equitable result and he hoped that SCAGs would cooperate. Some trained officers would be assigned to VENETIA GIULIA from other Regions, but an endeavour would be made to replace them with others who would however of necessity be untrained or semi-trained.

12. Release of British Officers.

The Executive Commissioner said that Regional Commissioners should not commit themselves to releasing British officers under the Release Scheme without consulting the appropriate Sub-Commissions.

13. Requisitioned Cars.

Executive Officer (A) warned Regional Commissioners that ceilings for requisitioned cars had evidently been exceeded and, following a tour of the North, G-4 AFM, was demanding an explanation. He directed Regional Commissioners to investigate this.

Introduction of UNCLASSIFIED Signal Messages

1. In accordance with APO letter AG 311.5/215 (31-0, dated 20 July 1945, the following information concerning the classification of Signal Traffic is published for compliance by all originators of traffic within this Headquarters.

a. Effective immediately, outside the zone of operations in Pacific Far East area certain subjects may now be treated as UNCLASSIFIED, and signal messages concerning them may be sent in clear by any means, including radio. The operational zone is defined as the area bounded on the west by longitude 60 degrees east and on the east by the Pacific coast of North and South America. Appendix "A" is issued as a guide to originators in subject matter that may be sent as UNCLASSIFIED, and will be considered as a supplement to US Army Regulations 380-5 and War Office Pamphlet "Classification and Handling of Protected Documents, 1944."

b. No relaxation of the now existing security rules is permitted in messages to any address within the operational zone, or the subject matter concerning the war with Japan. This includes multiple address traffic which may be addressed both to the operational zone and the non-operational zone.

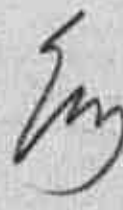

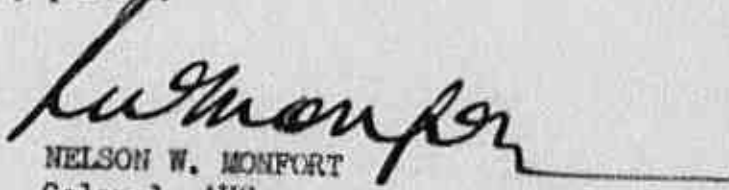

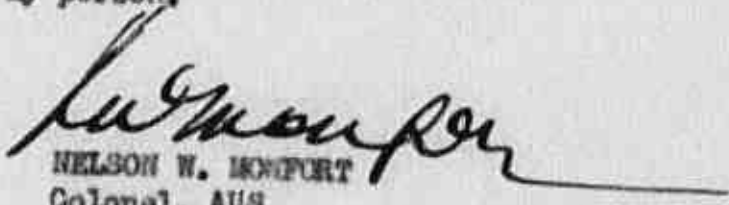
