SUBJECT: Boundaries.

TO : Distribution below.

1. Consequent on the Eighth Army's advance an adjustment of its Rear Boundary has been made leaving only a small part of Campobasso Province within the Army area.
2. The only part remaining in forward of a line along the road CASTELLONE - CARPINONE - IBERNIA thence South to the Provincial Boundary at VALLE SCHICOLA.
3. For the purpose of administration the whole of the Province of Campobasso will be turned over to Region V forthwith.
4. The following conditions will apply until further notice:-
 - (i) There will be no change in the security measures already existing in that portion of the Province still in the Army Area.
 - (ii) Stockpiles in IBERNIA and VENEZIA will remain under control Eighth Army and will be operated in conjunction with Region V Provinces as at present.
 - (iii) All refugee camps and mobile hospitals will remain under control Eighth Army.

1. Passive Air Defense (P.A.D.) Manual issued by AFM on 1st Feb. 44, with particular reference to Chapter VI Section 11 part 32 b states that "The relative importance of Civil Defense to Military Requirements will be defined by classifying areas of occupied territory as follows:-

- (a) Class "A" Areas in which Civil Defense is regarded as a Military Necessity.
- (b) Class "B" Areas in which Civil Defense is regarded as of military importance only in so far as there may be repercussions on the Military in the event of failure of the Civil Defense Organization.
- (c) Class "C" Areas in which Civil Defense is regarded as of no military importance.

The classification of areas as above, and their re-classification according to changing circumstances, will be the responsibility of Army Commanders in the Combat Zone, and of the District or Base Section Commanders in the Communications Zone (C.Z.)."

2. In order to facilitate the work of the Allied Control Commission in its contacts with elements of the armed Forces, Executive Memorandum number 26 dated 24th Feb. designated Liaison officers for this purpose.

3. In order that proper instructions may be issued to officers of this Sub-Commission, and suitable arrangements regarding personnel and equipment made, it would be appreciated if at an early date it could be ascertained from each Military Commander concerned, under which classification the area under his command falls for the purpose of P.A.D. and C.D. and this Headquarters informed accordingly.

4. If the Passive Air Defense (P.A.D.) Manual referred to in para 1 is not in your possession, it will probably be available at the HQ of the various Military Commands. In the meantime this HQ will endeavor to obtain sufficient copies of the manual for distribution to Regions.

"The original HQ Allied Commission, HQ AMG, and AMG 15 Army Gp are now combined in HQ Allied Control Commission at NAPLES which controls all Allied Control Commission and AMG activities under the Chief Commission-er (appointed also Deputy President Allied Control Commission), Lieut General Sir Noel Mason Macfarlane".

3. Delete para 10 and substitute

"3 District is only concerned with Region III, although Region IV will probably come into the District at a later date. Details are given in Appx 'D'".

4. Delete para 11 and substitute

- (a) As from 1 March 1944 the Province of SALERNO is transferred from Region II to Region III.
- (b) The Western group of the POMPEI Islands of which POMZA is the largest, (Province of NAPLES), will be transferred from Region IV (Province of Littoria) to Region III (Province of NAPLES). The island is already being administered by Region III and the change is, therefore, merely for the purpose of record."

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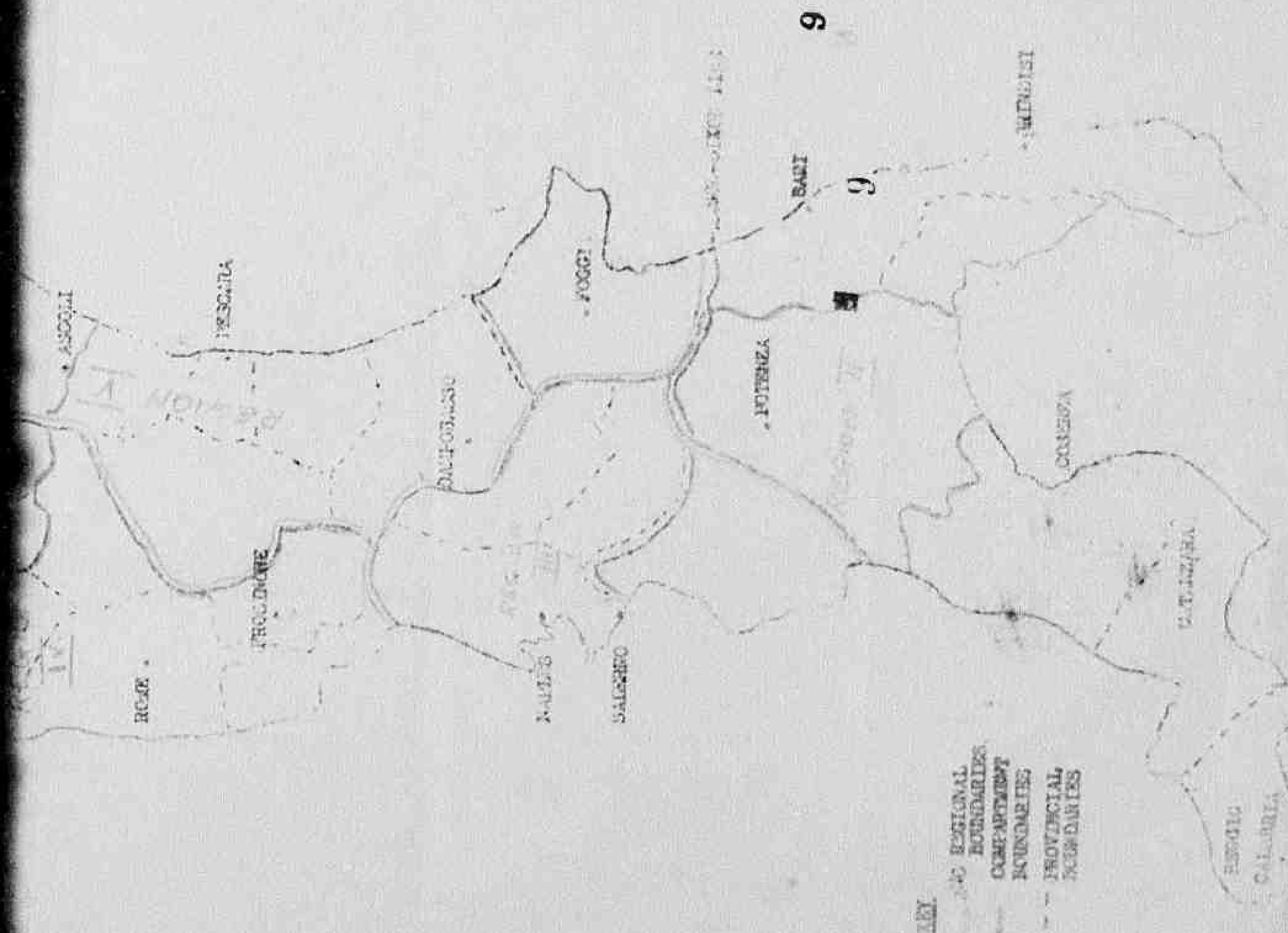

MEMORANDUM

TO : All Concerned

1. By Proclamation No. 16, that part of the Italian Peninsula which lies south of the northern boundaries of the provinces of Salerno, Potenza and Bari, together with the island of Sicily (but exclusive of the islands of Pantelleria, Lampedusa and Linosa) was restored to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government with effect from 0001 hrs. on 11 February 1944.

2. Without prejudice to the rights which the United Nations have under the Armistice and which are exercised in their behalf by the Commander-in-Chief of the Allied Forces and his representatives, including the Allied Control Commission, all powers of government in the above mentioned areas will henceforth belong to the Government of Italy.

3. According to the terms of the Armistice, the Allied Control Commission will continue to insure the effective use of Italian resources in the common war and to represent Allied interests to the Italian National and Local governments.

U.S. UNITS IN BRITISH AREAS AND BRITISH UNITS IN U.S. AREAS

1. Administrative Memoranda numbers 11 and 5, this Headquarters, do, are hereby rescinded.

2. Definitions

When used in this Memorandum, the following definitions will govern:

a. General Administration

- (1) Control of movement of men, animals, and material from ports or from general depots to the front (usually railheads) and vice versa.
- (2) Control of local sea transport, docks, railways, and inland waterways.
- (3) Control of general reserves of all kinds, including the general reserves of transport, i.e. such transport as is not allotted to subordinate commanders.
- (4) Selection of sites for, and control of, all general administrative installations, including their construction, operation and stockpiling.

b. Local Administration

- (1) Interior Economy, such as:

- (a) Quartering and accommodation.
- (b) Provision of water, light, power, etc.
- (c) Care and well-being of personnel and animals
- (d) Sanitation and hygiene
- (e) Fire protection
- (f) Maintenance of standing camps

- (2) Local railway or inland waterway movement of personnel, animals and material, subject to instructions from higher headquarters.

- (3) Local road traffic control and movement
- (4) Preventative measures against theft, and custody of unoccupied standing camps.
- (5) Relations with the local civilian population, subject to instructions from higher headquarters.
- (6) Allocation of the local pool of labor and transport.

c. Controlling Agency

A Controlling Agency is the British or US agency designated by this Headquarters to control an area in rear of the Combat Zone (Army Area). see Paragraph 3.

d. Co-operating Allied Unit

A co-operating Allied unit is any British or US unit, formation, agency or group that may be ordered into an area controlled by the other nation (US or British) (see paragraph 3), for the purpose of carrying out military or related activities therein, either for a fixed limited time or indefinitely.

3. Organization of Areas Controlled by Allied Forces

The areas of this theatre in the rear of the Combat Zone (Army Area) which require the presence or activities of US or British forces will be proscribed from time to time by this Headquarters. Each such area will be defined as primarily British responsibility (British Area), or primarily US responsibility (US Area).

4. General Principles

The general principle is that, when a co-operating Allied unit is moved into an area controlled by the other nation (US or British), it will adjust its activities to conform to the policies of the Controlling Agency, subject to the provision of this Memorandum. In each case, local administration is primarily the responsibility of the Commanding Officer of the Controlling Agency who may delegate to the Commanding Officer of the Co-operating Allied Unit such matters of local administration as may be appropriate in the circumstances. The provision of supplies and equipment required by the Co-operating Allied Unit will be arranged to meet the specific situation (see paragraph 5). General Administration remains the responsibility of higher Headquarters of the nationality concerned. Co-ordination between the Co-operating Allied Unit, and the Controlling Agency is the responsibility of the Commanding Officer of the Controlling Agency. Co-ordination between US Areas or Districts and British Areas or Districts (see paragraph 3) is the responsibility of this Headquarters or its designated agency.

5. Supplies and Equipment for Co-operating Allied Units

Where the size of the unit, or the degree of permanence of its mission warrants such, supply channels will be established to cover the needs of the unit from sources of the same nationality. When a unit is small or has only a temporary mission in the area of the Controlling Agency, the unit may be supplied from sources of the Controlling Agency under arrangements made to meet each specific situation by the commanders concerned. In all cases, POL products (Class III) will be supplied by the Controlling Agency. In an emergency, it is the duty of the senior officer present, regardless of nationality, to make the best possible arrangements for both nationalities by the pooling of resources.

6. Discipline

The discipline of troops in all cases the responsibility of the commander of the nationality concerned.

7. Through movement of traffic

Nothing in this Memorandum shall affect the authority and responsibility of this headquarters for through movement of traffic (rail, road and water).

8. Accommodations for Allied Force Headquarters

In the area in which this Headquarters is situated, the Headquarters Commandant, Allied Force Headquarters, will conduct the commander responsible for local administration on all matters of allocations of accommodation for this headquarters. When a decision as to allocation is required, the Headquarters Commandant will refer the matter, together with the comments of the local commander, to the Chief Administrative Officer, this Headquarters.

ORGANIZATION AND MILITARY ADMINISTRATION OF ITALY

1. Administrative Memorandum No. 63, this headquarters, as, with all appendices thereto is revised as follows:

ORGANIZATION OF THE AREA OF ITALY

2. a. The area occupied by the Allied Forces in Italy will be divided into:

- (1) Army Area (Br.).
- (2) Combat Zone (U.S.).
- (3) Line of Communication (Rear of Eighth Army, Br.).
- (4) Communication Zone (Rear of Fifth Army, U.S.).

b. The boundary between the Combat Zone (Fifth Army) and the Army Area (Eighth Army) will be fixed from time to time by the 15th Army Group. The rear boundaries of the armies will be fixed from time to time by this headquarters, based on recommendations of the 15th Army Group. The boundary between the Communication Zone (U.S.) and the Line of Communication (Br) will be prescribed by this headquarters. (See paragraph 3 of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 11, Revised).

c. The line of Communication (Br) and the Communication Zone (U.S.) will be organized as provided in Field Service Regulations (British and U.S.). In due course this will result into contiguous and distinct geographical areas, the Line of Communication (Br) and the Communication Zone (U.S.).

LINE OF COMMUNICATION AND COMMUNICATION ZONE.

3. a. The coordination of the control of the area in rear of the Army Area (Br) and Combat Zone (U.S.) will be exercised by AFHQ.

b. The Area in the vicinity of Naples will be organized as shown in Appendix 'A', attached.

ARRANGEMENTS AT ITALIAN PORTS.

4. a. The Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean will be responsible for the Naval arrangements at Italian ports.

b. Port organization of Naples and subsidiary ports will be arranged in accordance with Appendix 'B'.
