SUBJECT: Requisitioned Car - Property of Marchesa di  
Monte Viro.

FROM : Major C. P. Murchie.

1. The car in question is used by a senior officer on the staff of the Commander in Chief, Mediterranean.
2. The officer concerned is at present in North Africa, and de-requisitioning cannot take place until he returns. It is anticipated that this will take place within a very few days.
3. The Maintenance Captain, R.N. is handling the affair, and appreciates the importance attached to it at your end. Every endeavour will be made to effect a return of the car. It will be returned less tyres - as it was without tyres when taken over. It is extremely unlikely that the Navy can be persuaded to relax on this point.

4. The original arrangement, made by me personally, for the return of the car, was based on an undertaking given by the Requisitioning Officer, R.N. It appears that in giving such an undertaking he exceeded his powers. Nevertheless a sympathetic view was being taken by the Assistant Maintenance Captain, R.N. and it was the intention to effect the return of the car without undue delay and by obviating most of the usual routine. It appears however that the Marchesa, in her desire to make doubly sure of results, approached the agricultural officer at your headquarters, with the result that a letter went direct to the Royal Navy from the agricultural officer to Region III. This had the direct result of starting the official machinery, and thus bringing about the present situation.
