AFHQ ADV ADM ECHOLON ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO. 24

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT AND WAGE SCALE FOR CIVILIANS
EMPLOYED BY THE ALLIED ARMED FORCES IN ITALY

1. These instructions apply to the employment of civilian labour and will be observed by all branches of the Allied Forces and by all contractors employed by them.
2. Labour will be engaged by the machinery normal to both the American and British Armies but working in consultation with the AMG/ACC, wherever the latter is operating.
3. All labour will be engaged at or below the minimum rate of pay laid down in Appendix "A" and will be paid at this rate for at least seven days. During this period they will be trade tested and thereafter receive a rate of pay commensurate with their skill and ability, within the limits set out in appendix "A".
4. Provisional rates for trades not listed will be established by Labour officers in conjunction with AMG/ACC. The Labour officer will confirm in writing to the AMG/ACC the classification and rate of pay fixed. AMG/ACC will then submit such confirmation with comment to the Control of Wages Committee of the AFHQ Adv Adm Echelon, Local Resources (Italian) Board.
5. The rates of pay herein established will be basic for Naples area. Rates of pay for other areas will be the basic Naples rate altered by a percentage allowing for increase or decrease in the cost of living. This percentage will be promulgated by AFHQ Adv Adm Echelon based on recommendation submitted to it by the District or Command concerned.
6. The rates of pay herein established will apply to a day of 8 working hours exclusive of meal times or time required to travel to and from the job. Overtime will be paid for all time over 8 hours worked in one day, at the rate of one and a half times the regular rates.

3. All labour will be engaged at or below the minimum rate of pay laid down in Appendix "A" and will be paid at this rate for at least seven days. During this period they will be trade tested and thereafter receive a rate of pay commensurate with their skill and ability, within the limits set out in appendix "A".
4. Provisional rates for trades not listed will be established by Labour officers in conjunction with AMG/ACC. The Labour officer will confirm in writing to the AMG/ACC the classification and rate of pay fixed. AMG/ACC will then submit such confirmation with comment to the Control of Wages Committee of the AFHQ Adv Adv Echelon, Local Resources (Italian) Board.
5. The rates of pay herein established will be basic for Naples area. Rates of pay for other areas will be the basic Naples rate altered by a percentage allowing for increase or decrease in the cost of living. This percentage will be promulgated by AFHQ Adv Adv Echelon based on recommendation submitted to it by the District or Command concerned.
6. The rates of pay herein established will apply to a day of 8 working hours exclusive of meal times or time required to travel to and from the job. Overtime will be paid for all time over 8 hours worked in one day, at the rate of one and a half times the regular rates.

Overtime rates may be paid in any locality for Sunday work where authorised by the Commander of an Army, District (British) or Base Section (US), and then only when the employee has worked seven consecutive days. Where there is conflict regarding overtime payment for Sunday work between two Allied authorities in the same locality, it will be decided by the Controlling Authority. (For definition of Controlling Authority see AFHQ Adv Adv Memo No. 11 (Revised) 1943 series).
- There will be no extra pay for work performed on feast days or **3058**.

Overtime will not be paid to hotel, mess or restaurant employees.
7. No employee will be permitted to change from one Allied unit to another without the agreement of the respective employing officers.
8. When civilian organisation such as railroad, public utilities, etc., are taken over by the military, wage rates shall remain unchanged until further notice.
9. Civilian contractors engaged to work for the Armed Forces will be responsible for making such ~~employee~~ payroll deductions and benefit payments as may

be directed or authorized by law. The Armed Forces will make no such deductions.

10. It is not desirable to issue food or clothing to civil labour. Whenever such issues are essential they will not be made free, but on payment. Such issues and the rate of payment ~~stated~~ for them will, in each case, be first approved by District or Base Section Commander concerned. The latter before approving, will satisfy himself that ASG/ACC have been consulted and that no undue disturbances to the labour market will result.

11. The above instructions are effective 1 Feb 44.

12. The following procedure will be observed in obtaining labour and paying wages:-

British Installations and Units

(a) Applications for civil labour will normally be made to the nearest DADL (Civil), or, in Eighth Army area, to the PLCO. Should this not be possible, applications will be made to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer, AMG.

(b) Payroll forms and instructions on their use will be obtained from the DADL (Civil) or PLCO.

US Organisations and Units

(c) Applications for civil labour will be cleared through the nearest Base Section Headquarters or such other labour office as may be set up in any particular locality from time to time. When no such office exists applications will be made to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer, AMG.

(d) Payroll forms and instructions on their use, will be obtained from the Labour Office, through which labour has been employed.

- (c) US Organizations and Units
Applications for civil labour will be cleared through the nearest Base Section Headquarters or such other labour office as may be set up in any particular locality from time to time. When no such office exists applications will be made to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer, AMG.
- (d) Payroll forms and instructions on their use, will be obtained from the Labour Office, through which labour has been employed.

Minutes of Meeting Held by the Wages Sub
Committee of the Control of Wages Committee
on 7 January 1944.

The Wages Sub Committee of the Control of Wages Committee adjusted the previously submitted rates of pay and took into account that a deduction would be made for any food supplied by the Military Authorities. It, also, took into account the fact that A.M.G. had recently issued a Temporary Wage Adjustment Order dated 11 December 1943, which increased wages of Government employees and, also, authorised an increase in wages for private employees. The result of this was, in the case of Common Labor, the Civilian rate of pay could exceed the Army rate of pay, originally proposed. The recommended rates of pay is shown in Annex "A" hereto attached.

The cost of food items considered were :-

- (a) One lire per meal for dehydrated soup.
- (b) Ten lire per meal or thirty lire per day for rations.
