SUBJECT: Yugoslav Mission in Italy

TO : G-5, AFHQ

3. It is recommended that all these be properly accredited, with the exception of the following who have not proved sufficiently cooperative in their work with the Advisory Council.

4. In addition to the above exceptions it is recommended that 13 of the auxiliary staff should be also dispensed with. The choice of the 13 not required could, it is suggested, be left to the Yugoslav Delegation.

5. It will be seen that the total number of those whom it is recommended be properly accredited is 40, which number is considered quite adequate. As regards the removal of those people who are not recommended, you will no doubt wish to take up the question of their departure from Italy with RAAG.

Subject: Reply from Marshal Alexander.

To : Yugoslav Delegation, Advisory Council for Italy.

1. In reply to your cable of 20 September 1945 to Marshal Alexander, herewith quoted please find reply thereto:

1. IT IS CONTRARY TO AFHQ POLICY TO AUTHORIZE ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICES SUCH AS PRESENT CASE OUTSIDE OF ROME WITHOUT SPECIAL APPROVAL OF AFHQ AND THEN ONLY WHEN NECESSITY IS PROVED. NO SUCH NECESSITY HAS BEEN SHOWN FOR JUGOSLAV OFFICERS IN MILAN.

2. CAPTAIN PERWANJA WAS AUTHORIZED TO VISIT REPEAT VISIT MILAN. WHEN THE VISIT BECAME IN FACT A RESIDENCE HE WAS ORDERED TO RETURN BUT FAILED TO COMPLY. WHETHER THE FAILURE WAS HIS OR DUE TO ACTION OF HIS SUPERIORS IS NOT KNOWN BUT THE FACT REMAINS THAT THE ORDERS OF THIS HEADQUARTERS WERE NOT CARRIED OUT. IT CANNOT BE ACCEPTED THAT SUCH CONDITIONS CAN BE PERMITTED TO CONTINUE.

3. AFHQ/DESIROUS OF ASSISTING ALL ACTIVITIES OF REPRESENTATIVES OF ALLIED GOVERNMENTS WHERE THOSE ACTIVITIES ARE PRODUCTIVE AND NECESSARY AND STAND READY TO TAKE CORRECTIVE ACTION WHERE IMPROPER OR INEFFECTIVE ACTION IS BROUGHT TO ATTENTION OF THE THEATRE COMMANDER. RESTRICTIONS ON MOVEMENT ARE KEPT TO THE MINIMUM CONSISTENT WITH THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF COMMAND."

Capt. Edvin Pervanje has been appointed Head of the Yugoslav Repatriation Office Milan and accredited by A.F.H.Q. to D.P. & R.S.C. following the proposal of the Yugoslav Delegation to the Advisory Council for Italy. This Delegation entrusted Capt. Pervanje, with agreement of the Yugoslav Government to protect Yugoslav interests in Northern Italy having this Delegation taken over the protection of Yugoslav interests from the Swiss Legation, according to protocol signed on 13 August 1945.

D.P. & R.S.C. informed me in a letter dated 6 September 1945 DPR/26/G-II/DP that instructions have been issued by A.F.H.Q. to recall Captain Pervanje to Rome forthwith. The reason alleged was that his work on repatriation proceeded too slow.

On September 11, '45 Col. Findlay told me he was convinced that repatriation had not been the reason to recall Capt. Pervanje. Same is ascertained also in Col. Findlay's letter dated 12 Sept. DPR/26/G-II, where he issued orders to A, B, C, D, DP & RSC Groups to supply the Yugoslav Representative in Milan with trucks for continuing the repatriation of Yugoslav nationals.

As Col. Findlay refused to tell me the real reason for Pervanje's recall, I informed Col. Findlay with a letter dated September 12, Pov. br.1368/45 that I will go personally to Milan for investigations on the spot and to interrogate Capt. Pervanje; to take immediate measures in Milan if necessary and to inform Col. Findlay about straight away.

I arrived in Milan on 14th September. I made an inspection in the Yugoslav Repatriation Office and found that Capt. Pervanje's work was quite correct, and that there was no reason to recall him. Notwithstanding that, in order to exclude even the minimal possibility of incorrect

Pervanje; to take immediate measures in Milan if necessary and to inform Col. Findlay about straight away.

I arrived in Milan on 14th September. I made an inspection in the Yugoslav Repatriation Office and found that Capt. Pervanje's work was quite correct, and that there was no reason to recall him. Notwithstanding that, in order to exclude even the minimal possibility of incorrectness in Capt. Pervanje's work I left on duty in Milan Mr. Radisav Raspopovic, Secretary of Embassy and Member of the Yugoslav Delegation to A.C.I. and charged him to supervise the work in the Yugoslav Repatriation Office in Milan. I have seen and informed officially about it Col. Hancock, in charge of the Regional Commissioner A.M.G. for Lombardy, getting his acknowledgement. Col. Hancock had no reason to complain against Capt. Pervanje's activity.

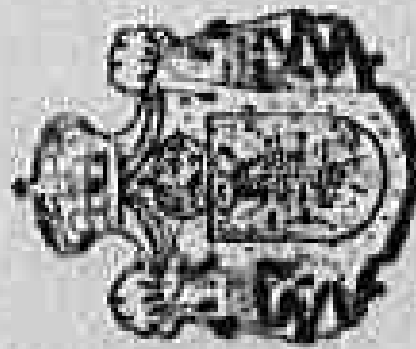

I am in Rome since three weeks and during this time I tried to settle the question of our accommodation.

The result is a negative one until to-day.

It happened as follows :

I was informed by Lt.Col. Regis that no requisition will be made in Rome for the Advisory Council, and that every Delegation has to settle this question by private ways.

I found in Rome the villa of the former Croatian Legation at Via Monti Parioli no. 24 and when I inspected it I saw that it was suitable for our Mission.

I established at the same time that there was a car " Oldsmobile " in the garage of the Villa and that the furniture of the building was in the warehouse, Piazza di Spagna no. 49.

The owner of the warehouse, Mr. Arthur Bolliger, stated that the furniture was property of the former Croatian Legation.

Concerning the Villa, I informed the Real Estate Section of the Rome Area Command that we would like to have it and Real Estate directed us to the Political Section of ACC.

Mr. Reber promised to settle the question of the Villa with the authorities in Rome and informed us the following day that

I found in Rome the villa of the former Croatian Legation at Via Monti Parioli no. 24 and when I inspected it I saw that it was suitable for our Mission.

I established at the same time that there was a car "Oldsmobile" in the garage of the Villa and that the furniture of the building was in the warehouse, Piazza di Spagna no. 49.

The owner of the warehouse, Mr. Arthur Bolliger, stated that the furniture was property of the former Croatian Legation.

Concerning the Villa, I informed the Real Estate Section of the Rome Area Command that we would like to have it and Real Estate directed us to the Political Section of ACC.

Mr. Reber promised to settle the question of the Villa with the authorities in Rome and informed us the following day that we could take possession of the building as soon as we receive an agreement from the owner, in this case the Italian Government.

With a letter of *July 6th 1944* the Italian Government had agreed to the building occupied by the former Croatian Legation being transferred to the Yugoslav Government.

We delivered this letter to the Real Estate Section of the Rome Area Command.

In the meantime however the Villa was occupied by an American Military Unit (O.S.S.) in spite of the fact that *we have* done all that was possible to avoid the building being occupied by military forces.

We went on searching, but whatever we found was

- a) reserved for a high rank officer,
- b) reserved for a military unit or
- c) under special protection.

At last, the 13 July 1944 the Chief of the Real Estate Section declared to Commander M l t r o v i c h that nothing more was available in Rome.

So far for the premises.

II.

Concerning the furniture and the car found at Via Monti Parloli no. 24, I have to make the following statement :

- a) The military authorities in Rome considered the building of the former Croatian Legation as enemy property.

A part of the furniture of the Villa was requisitioned by the O.S.S. under the command of Lt.Col. Torrielli, occupying the building and no report about this requisition has been given.

- b) The car " Oldsmobile " which was registered in Rome under the number 0639 as a " CD " car was requisitioned too and is now in the possession of Mr. Edward Kennedy of the Associated Press.

I wrote a letter to Mr. Kennedy and received the following answer :

Parliotti no. 24, I have to make the following statement:

a) The military authorities in Rome considered the building of the former Croatian Legation as enemy property.

b) The car "Oldsmobile" which was registered in Rome under the number 0639 as a "CD" car was requisitioned too and is now in the possession of Mr. Edward Kennedy of the Associated Press.

I wrote a letter to Mr. Kennedy and received the following answer:

"The car bears the requisition number R 6140, dated June 24, 1944.

This number should be sufficient reference in any inquiry about the automobile at the Office of the Rome Area Command, where the requisition is on file."

To summarize:

1° The Italian Government with a letter of *July 6th 1944* agreed to rent the Villa, Via Monti Parioli no. 24 to us, but we can't move into this Villa because it is occupied by a Military Unit.

2° This unit requisitioned a part of the furniture of the Villa without giving any notice to us.

3° The car of the former Croatian Legation, considered as enemy property too, was requisitioned for the Associated Press.

View that further property belonging to Croatia will

be found in Florence and Venice, I wish to make the following formal proposition :

III.

The Advisory Council for Italy should notify to the Allied Military Authorities that premises and goods of Croatia have to be considered as property of the Kingdom of Yugoslavia and that these premises and goods have to be treated in accordance with this principle in agreement with the Representative of Yugoslavia on the Advisory Council for Italy.

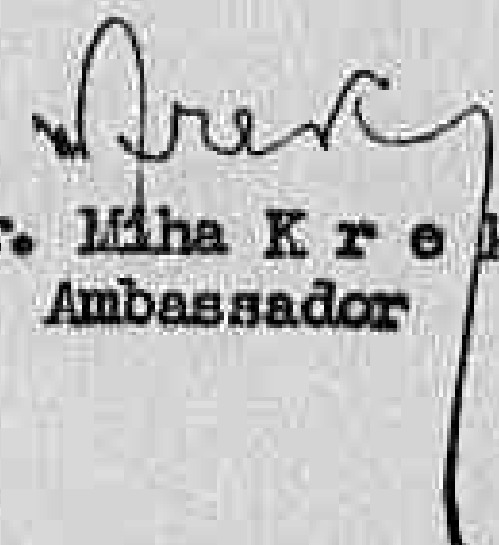

I have been informed that in Rome over a thousand people are waiting for me. They are all destitute. Among them is an archbishop, two generals, about 40 officers of high rank, high officials etc. They have all been interned, imprisoned and they expect the Representative of their State with the hope that he may be able to help them in their poor situation.

My government is in full crisis and I am without news about its formation. Therefore I would like to borrow from you the amount of 5 million lire in order to be able to give to each of my people an average help of 5,000 lire.

I asked money from my government but I did not receive it yet. On the other hand the expenses for the former internees and prisoners have in any way to be payed by the Italian government.

I am leaving for Rome to-morrow and hope that you will be able to settle in time the question of this advance of money.

WHETHER THE FAILURE WAS HIS OR DUE TO ACTION OF HIS SUPERIORS IS NOT KNOWN BUT THE FACT REMAINS THAT THE ORDERS OF THIS HEADQUARTERS WERE NOT CARRIED OUT. IT CANNOT BE ACCEPTED THAT SUCH CONDITIONS CAN BE PERMITTED TO CONTINUE.
3. ^{IS} AFHQ/DESIROUS OF ASSISTING ALL ACTIVITIES OF REPRESENTATIVES OF ALLIED GOVERNMENTS WHERE THOSE ACTIVITIES ARE PRODUCTIVE AND NECESSARY AND STAND READY TO TAKE CORRECTIVE ACTION WHERE IMPROPER OR INEFFECTIVE ACTION IS BROUGHT TO ATTENTION OF THE THEATRE COMMANDER. RESTRICTIONS ON MOVEMENT ARE KEPT TO THE MINIMUM CONSISTENT WITH THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF COMMAND."

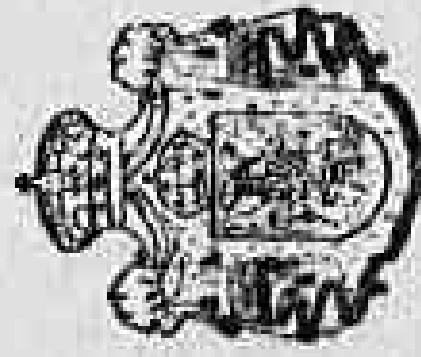

I am in Rome since three weeks and during this time I tried to settle the question of our accommodation.

The result is a negative one until to-day. It happened as follows :

I was informed by Lt.Col. Regis that no requisition will be made in Rome for the Advisory Council, and that every Delegation has to settle this question by private ways.

I found in Rome the villa of the former Croatian Legation at Via Monti Parioli no. 24 and when I inspected it I saw that it was suitable for our Mission.

I established at the same time that there was a car " Oldmobile " in the garage of the Villa and that the furniture of the building was in the warehouse, Piazza di Spagna no. 49.

The owner of the warehouse, Mr. Arthur Bolliger, stated that the furniture was property of the former Croatian Legation.

Concerning the Villa, I informed the Real Estate Section of the Rome Area Command that we would like to have it and Real Estate directed us to the Political Section of ACC.

Mr. Reber promised to settle the question of the Villa with the authorities in Rome and informed us the following day that

Delegation has to settle this question by private ways.

I found in Rome the villa of the former Croatian Legation at Via Monti Parioli no. 24 and when I inspected it I saw that it was suitable for our Mission.

I established at the same time that there was a car "Oldsmobile" in the garage of the Villa and that the furniture of the building was in the warehouse, Piazza di Spagna no. 49.

The owner of the warehouse, Mr. Arthur Bolliger, stated that the furniture was property of the former Croatian Legation.

Concerning the Villa, I informed the Real Estate Section of the Rome Area Command that we would like to have it and Real Estate directed us to the Political Section of ACC.

Mr. Reber promised to settle the question of the Villa with the authorities in Rome and informed us the following day that we could take possession of the building as soon as we receive an agreement from the owner, in this case the Italian Government.

With a letter of *July 6th 1944* the Italian Government had agreed to the building occupied by the former Croatian Legation being transferred to the Yugoslav Government.

We delivered this letter to the Real Estate Section of the Rome Area Command.

In the meantime however the Villa was occupied by an American Military Unit (O.S.S.) in spite of the fact that *we have* done all that was possible to avoid the building being occupied by military forces.

We went on searching, but whatever we found was

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- a) reserved for a high rank officer,
- b) reserved for a military unit or
- c) under special protection.

At last, the 13 July 1944 the Chief of the Real Estate Section declared to Commander M i t r o v i c h that nothing more was available in Rome.

So far for the premises.

II.

Concerning the furniture and the car found at Via Monti Perlotti no. 24, I have to make the following statement :

- a) The military authorities in Rome considered the building of the former Croatian Legation as enemy property.

A part of the furniture of the Villa was requisitioned by the O.S.S. under the command of Lt.Col. Torrielli, occupying the building and no report about this requisition has been given.

- b) The car " Oldsmobile " which was registered in Rome under the number 0639 as a " CD " car was requisitioned too and is now in the possession of Mr. Edward Kennedy of the Associated Press.

I wrote a letter to Mr. Kennedy and received the following answer :

This number should be sufficient reference in any inquiry about the automobile at the Office of the Rome Area Command, where the requisition is on file."

To summarize :

1° The Italian Government with a letter of *July 6th 1944* agreed to rent the Villa, Via Monti Parlotti no. 24 to us, but we can't move into this Villa because it is occupied by a Military Unit.

2° This unit requisitioned a part of the furniture of the Villa without giving any notice to us.

3° The car of the former Croatian Legation, considered as enemy property too, was requisitioned for the Associated Press.

View that further property belonging to Croatia will

be found in Florence and Venice, I wish to make the following formal proposition :

III.

The Advisory Council for Italy should notify to the Allied Military Authorities that premises and goods of Croatia have to be considered as property of the Kingdom of Yugoslavia and that these premises and goods have to be treated in accordance with this principle in agreement with the Representative of Yugoslavia on the Advisory Council for Italy.

My dear Colonel,

I have been informed that in Rome over a thousand people are waiting for me. They are all destitute. Among them is an archbishop, two generals, about 40 officers of high rank, high officials etc. They have all been interned, imprisoned and they expect the Representative of their State with the hope that he may be able to help them in their poor situation.

My government is in full crisis and I am without news about its formation. Therefore I would like to borrow from you the amount of 5 million lira in order to be able to give to each of my people an average help of 5,000 lira.

I asked money from my government but I did not receive it yet. On the other hand the expenses for the former internees and prisoners have in any way to be payed by the Italian government.

I am leaving for Rome to-morrow and hope that you will be able to settle in time the question of this advance of money.
