1. A request has been received from the Chief Commissioner, Allied Commission for the provision of accommodation for the Soviet Delegations on the Allied Commission and on the Advisory Council for Italy.
 2. Particulars of these delegations were provided by you in your 103/58/EC(L) dated 27 Feb 45.
 3. Will you be good enough to approach the delegations with a view to having deputed a representative or representatives to deal with our Real Estate Section in the matter ?.
 4. The exact status of the Soviet Delegation to the Advisory Council is not quite clear. It is understood that it is on the same footing as the Diplomatic Missions of the other Allied Powers, Diplomats of the United States and of Great Britain and of most other Missions do not as a rule occupy requisitioned quarters but make their own hiring arrangements,
- It is desired to know whether the members of the Soviet Delegation are empowered and willing to act similarly.
5. In any event the fullest co-operation may be relied upon from this HQ in obtaining the necessary accommodation, but it is pointed out that obtaining premises by hiring is usually quicker than by requisition.

1. 1750 hrs 6 February Telephone call from AM Bowen Buscarlet who says that AM Slessor has phoned to say that the plane will be held until an official application is received from Gen. Susloparov.
2. 0915 hrs 7 February MA to Slessor phones to say that an apology has been received from Moscow and the plane will now be allowed to proceed.
3. 0930 hrs Deliver above information to Soviet Representative.

SUBJECT: Soviet Military Mission to France.

1. 0840 hrs Maj. Snagge P.A. to C.O.S. AFHQ, telephones to say that the Soviet Representative on Alcoa has been attempting to phone COS direct in re Soviet Military Mission and their plane who are detained in Bari. Soviet Representative was instructed by COS to deal direct through this office.
2. 0930hrs visit from Uraevsky, who explains what has happened; ~~the~~ plane and passengers all detained at Bari for unauthorized arrival. He asks that the plane and passengers be allowed to proceed immediately to Rome, pick up Gen. Susloparov, and continue to Paris.
3. 1030 hrs Phone Chief of Air Staff AFHQ (AVM Baker) and explain the situation, and ask what his instructions are.
4. 1040 hrs Phone AG AFHQ (Sgt Burley) who confirm that they will send a Priority Signal to SHAEP and obtain clearance for Gen. Susloparov and 8 officers of his staff to proceed into France.
5. 1050 hrs Phone call from Director of Operations and Intelligence MAAP (Lt.Col Stapleton) who states that the plane will be detained in Bari. A signal has already been sent to Moscow which has been acknowledged but not replied to. Directs me to tell the Soviet Rep. that the plane's arrival was not authorized. That we are applying the same restrictions here as are applied to our own planes when flying to Bulgaria, Rumania, or Russia. The plane will be allowed to proceed to Rome whenever proper clearance has been obtained by Moscow.
6. 1200 hrs Telephone Wing Commander Orme, MA to Slessor, who confirms 5 above, and states that British Military Mission Moscow knew nothing of the Departure of the Soviet Mission to France until receiving the signal from MAAP (5)
7. 1210 hrs Maj Leonidov delivers message from Gen. Susloparov for COS AG "Gen. Susloparov wishes to thank AG for the efforts on his behalf, and at the same time wishes to say that he is astounded at his plane, a Soviet plane, being detained at Bari".
8. 1215 hrs Deliver message as in 7 above to Maj Talbot.

1. Reference telephone conversation of today, Col Henn-Lt Col Shipp.
2. It is confirmed that Maj Gen SUSLOPAROV, Soviet Representative on A.C. and Acting Soviet Representative on the Advisory Council for Italy, will visit AHCQ on Wednesday 10 January 1945, arriving at about 1230 hours.
3. The purpose of the visit is to meet Major General ROCKS.
4. Maj Gen SUSLOPAROV has notified this office that he wishes to discuss the question of the repatriation of Soviet Prisoners of War, and in particular the delays of which they are subjected at two camps in the Florence area before they are sent back to the camps at SALERNO, TARANTO, etc. Gen Clark has advised Gen Susloparov that these camps in the Florence area are under the supervision of A.P.H.Q.
5. It is felt that this is a matter that does not concern the Allied Commission except insofar as the Russian Military Mission is attached to the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Committee, and that G II will be able to advise Major General Rocks.
6. Two recent letters that are relative to this question are attached.
7. Major General Susloparov will be accompanied by Colonel Rabin, Head of the Russian Military Mission to the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission, and Lt Uraevsky (Interpreter).

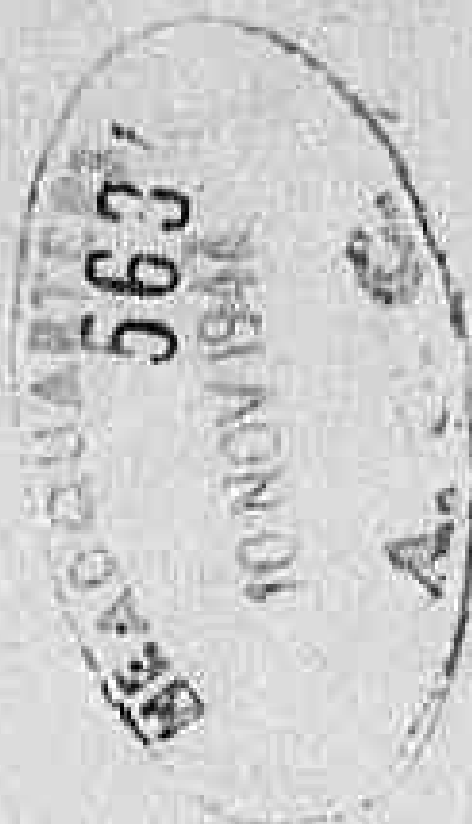

Thanks for moving so quickly about the newsprint for
Sardegna.

I understand from Mr. Minifie that the Russians have replied to the letter from the Acting Commissioner of the Allied Commission, which suggested they make formal application for transport, to enable them to distribute Russian propaganda films in Liberated Italy. As I understand it, their reply stated they would not make any further request for transport for this purpose, and that they indicated they would let this area alone and would expect us to do the same in areas in which they were the chief controlling power.

However, we are informed that PWD are handling Russian films in the SHAEF area on an equal basis with British and United States films, by full agreement with the Russians. I am wondering if this wouldn't provide a precedent for us to re-open the question. My feeling is that it would and it might be an extremely useful move.

I should welcome your reaction to this suggestion.
