

- On the morning of 6 Jan 524 muleteers were scheduled to leave TRANI for ORVILLO. The number of muleteers physically present in barracks on the evening of 5 Jan was 543.
- In endeavour to avoid sending off less than the agreed total of 524, the men were confined to barracks and a guard put on the only door. Taking advantage, however, of a failure of the electric current, some 300 men who had already been warned for the draft escaped from barracks during the evening and night. The number of men actually sent to ORVILLO was only 231.
- I am of the opinion that among the muleteers in this camp there is a hard core of approx 300 from APULIA who came here from LEGGE or the disbandment of 47 Inf Regt Depot. These men, although present in camp, make off when a draft is due to leave, returning to camp when the draft has gone.
- Part, if not all of the trouble is due to the fact that the average Italian soldier is convinced that there has been such a breakdown of normal Italian military justice that he can do exactly as he pleases without receiving a punishment that meets the offence. He is aware that the prisons are full, and that prisoners who have been convicted by court-martial and sentenced to several years' prison have been released on conditional liberty after serving only a few weeks of the sentence. Hence there is no real deterrent to the wrongdoer, and the only discipline that exists

4. Part, if not all of the trouble is due to the fact that the average Italian soldier is convinced that there has been such a breakdown of normal Italian military justice that he can do exactly as he pleases without receiving a punishment that meets the offence. He is aware that the prisons are full, and that prisoners who have been convicted by court-martial and sentenced to several years in prison have been released or conditional liberty after serving only a few weeks of the sentence. Hence there is no real deterrent to the wrongdoer, and the only discipline that exists springs from the individual soldier's sense of duty. With certain types - particularly those from the provinces of APULIA, who are here stationed relatively near their own homes - this means a total lack of discipline.

5. Since the Italian authorities seem unable to cope with this grave situation, it is respectfully requested that the allied authorities take the matter up. If some of these habitual escapees could be considered P.O.W and transferred to N. AFRICA, or sent to punishment coys, the effect on other home-lovers would be very great.

6. Pending orders from you as to their disposition, these absentees of 6 Jan will be held here as they return.

Proceedings against Deserters.

In Answer to letter AQ/6 dated 31 Dec/44.

A) The following military tribunals are now in existence.  
BARI - CATANZARO - NAPLES - ORISTANO - PALERMO - ROMA - TARANTO - MAGRATA - CATANIA.

There is on other hand a tribunal section at LECCE and another at SASSARI.

The special Military tribunals have no fixed H.Q. but in base of proclamation N°26 dated 26 of May 1944 from Head office S.M.G. Those are called upon in cases of immediate trial requirements as for example: by any unit Commanding officer who holds the rank of General.

B) The N° of Deserters actually detained awaiting trials will be communicated later and in full.

For the moment we inform you that from the 1st of October 1943 to the 31 of October 44 about 60.000 troops have deserted and of these only 10% are at the time under arrest, the remainder are all still absent without leave.

C) The Deserters awaiting trial together with those already sentenced are being detained in the following prisons:

MILITARY: Roma, Naples, Palermo, Vibo Valentia, Taranto, Lecce, Gueta.

CIVILIAN: Lanusei, Oristano, Alghero, Tempio, Castiadas, Bari, Nicaro, Catanzaro, Cosenza, Reggio Calabria, Sassari, Martina Franca, Ianna, Castrovillari, Rossano, Locri, Asinara.

We point out that the detained personnel awaiting trial are kept in their own unit for a period not exceeding 30 days.

The average period of detention before trial cannot be estimated with sufficient precision as it varies following

1. It has been reported to M.M.I.A. that upon various occasions, Italian soldiers have seen and even talked to individuals who were known by them to be deserters of the Italian Army.

2. If an Italian soldier sees known deserters living as civilians and also if he knows that the probability of the deserter being apprehended and returned to Military service is small, the Italian soldier is liable to think that he also could desert and suffer no ill consequences.

3. It is desired that you issue the appropriate orders making it mandatory for all Italian military personnel to turn over to the nearest C.C.F.R., or Military HQ, any person whom they know or believe to be a deserter of the Italian Army.

4. Please furnish M.M.I.A. a copy of your order.

1. Your n.106978/AV prot of 17 Dec has been passed to me for reply.
2. This matter is well known to both the Minister of War and M.I.A. In fact we have been taking action for months past in removing soldiers so employed.
3. Instructions were issued by AMI last summer that the Allies are not to employ deserters from the Italian Army. Considering that soldiers have a civil identification card, it is obviously very difficult, if not impossible, for the Allies to know whether a man is a deserter or not, if in civilian clothes.
4. The matter of a soldier on leave working for the Allies was dealt with in my AQ/3 of Nov 20.
5. All Italian soldiers in uniform employed by the Allies should form part of an established Italian Division and be reported in the strength returns as such. Failure to do this is the fault of the Italian Commanders.
6. I will however represent the matter again to AMI.

Dear Admiral,

The General Staff has been informed that pretty often, Italian soldiers who have left arbitrarily their units have been taken for service by Allied military authorities without the previous authorisation of the Italian commands from which these soldiers depend.

The Italian commands are therefore unable to take proceedings against the said soldiers for their desertion.

The Italian Ministries have informed the competent Allied Sub-Commission which showed comprehension and interest about this problem.

I enclose a copy of letter n. 1086 and of letter 1087 of November 7th of the Ministry of Marine and a copy of letter A.Q. 8, of November 20, of M.M.I.A.

In spite of these communications and of the action taken by the Allied authorities, there are still cases of Italian soldiers, in regular service, being detained by the Allied commands, in contrast to the present regulations.

Considering this and the need to regularise the matter uniformly, in the interest of the discipline and efficiency of the Italian Army Force, I shall be most grateful to you, my dear Admiral, if you could intervene by the Allied Commands and see that they don't take Italian soldiers who have service duties to fulfill.

SUBJECT: Deserters of the R. Navy working on civilians for the Allied  
Military Authorities.

1. The cases mentioned in the letters n. 36/2a of October 2nd  
(ZERZO-CAPITI) and n. 39<sup>a</sup> of the 13th of the same month (STRUMA)  
have been examined and orders have been given to avoid arresting  
preventively the military deserters employed by the organizations  
depending from the Allied Army Forces.
2. Nevertheless, we must again draw the attention of the F.O.L.I. on the  
very serious consequences of these admittances for our Army Force, for  
the soldiers are getting convinced that the Allies grant immunity to those  
who are guilty of this very serious offence.
3. Assurances have been given by various Allied Authorities; the F.O.T.A.  
of Taranto sent the Admiral Commander in Chief of the Jonio Department and  
South Adriatic the enclosed letter (copy); but as a matter of fact, the  
incidents we complain of go on and become more frequent.
4. In another note, that we enclose too, are mentioned the latest cases  
concerning the failure to fulfil the engagements taken about these urgent  
decisions, in relation to letter 36/1 of September 25<sup>th</sup>, sent by this F.O.L.I.  
to the General Staff of the R. Navy.

1. Reference today's letter 1066/F0 of this U.G.
2. Gunner LO RISO Pasquale, n. 95543, born in Manfredonia (Foggia)  
in 1919, living there, Corso Umberto I, unlawfully left the Depot  
C.R.M.M. of Taranto on June 1st; has been denounced to the Military  
Tribunal of this town on September 30th.
3. The Arm of the C.R.R. of Manfredonia that had been entrusted with  
the researches communicated that LO RISO is working for the Allied  
Military Command of this city that declared he was indispensable,

1. Your n.106978/AV prot of 17 Dec has been passed to me for reply.

2. This matter is well known to both the Minister of War and AAI. In fact we have been taking action for months past in removing soldiers so employed.

3. Instructions were issued by AAI last summer that the Allies are not to employ deserters from the Italian Army. Considering that soldiers have a civil identification card, it is obviously very difficult, if not impossible, for the Allies to know whether a man is a deserter or not, if in civilian clothes.

4. The matter of a soldier on leave working for the Allies was dealt with in my AQ/8 of Nov 20.

5. All Italian soldiers in uniform employed by the Allies should form part of an established Italian Division and be reported in the strength returns as such. Failure to do this is the fault of the Italian Commanders.

6. I will however represent the matter again to AFHQ.

1. GENERAL.

The discipline of the Italian Army is a matter of grave importance to the Allies and to the Italian Government not only now but also for post-war. The prestige and authority of the Italian Army must, therefore, be re-established by every means possible and as soon as possible in order that it may function properly. Major factors in this are that -

- (a) Desertion and absenteeism from the Italian Army be reduced to the minimum.
- (b) Unauthorised retention of Italian individuals by Allied formations and establishments be stopped.

2.

TYPE OF CASE REPORTED.

Typical cases reported by the Italian General Staff allege that 4460

(a) Italian soldiers on leave are employed by Allied units or individuals and the employment is continued after the leave expires. In some cases the Italian soldier has stated that his Allied employer has refused to surrender the Italian soldier to the Italian officers who advised the Allied employer that the soldier was absent without leave.

(b) Italian Medical Officers who returned to their homes on leave were retained there by A.L.G. officers to take care of the civilian population.

(c) Italian deserters employed by Allied formations were recognised

- (a) Desertion and desertion from the Italian Army be reduced to the minimum
- (b) Unauthorised retention of Italian individuals by Allied formations and establishments be stopped.

2. TYPE OF CASE REPORTED.

Typical cases reported by the Italian General Staff allege that 440

(a) Italian soldiers on leave are employed by Allied units or individuals and the employment is continued after the leave expires. In some cases the Italian soldier has stated that his Allied employer has refused to surrender the Italian soldier to the Italian officers who advised the Allied employer that the soldier was absent without leave.

(b) Italian Medical Officers who returned to their homes on leave were retained there by A.M.G. officers to take care of the civilian population.

(c) Italian deserters employed by Allied formations were recognised by Italian officers and placed in jail awaiting return to their units; these deserters were removed from jail by Allied intelligence personnel at once, have not been returned to their units, and have disappeared.

3. ASPECTS.

(a) It is well understood that many Italian soldiers will go to great lengths to remain attached to Allied formations on account of the better living conditions, rations etc. No doubt the interest of the Allied officers in these individuals is to some extent inspired by these Italian soldiers themselves.

(b) Certain classes of Italian civilians are now being called or recalled to the Colours, either to fulfil Allied demands or to permit older men now in the Italian Army to be released from military duty.

(c) In a country where the Army is founded on universal conscription there is always the danger that only those men without influence, power or money, will be required to serve in the Army.

(d) The fact that many civilian now employed by the Allies will be exempted from the call-up on the certificate of the Allied employer increases the opportunity for certain Italians to evade the law, under the cloak of performing essential service for the Allies.

(e) The retention by Allied officers of such individuals, or attempts to retain such individuals, is really tantamount to conspiring with the Italian deserters in their evasion of military duty.

- 2 -

4. VERIFICATION ON REPORT.

The allegations cannot be verified largely owing to difficulties of Italian communications and lack of control, as mentioned above, but I am satisfied that there is some substance in these reports. I am informed, for instance, that there are some 5000 Italians being used as labour over the Combat Zone, of whom we have no details and who presumably should be organised and counted against the strength of 180,000 "units employed or to be employed by the Allies". (Your SHEET 1605/50/3/1 G (S.B.1) dated 3 Apr ).

5. CONCLUSION

(a) I fully realise that under the conditions existing to date the situation as outlined above was bound to have occurred. But I am strongly of opinion that the whole business should be "tidied up" forthwith.  
(b) I therefore request that you will issue orders at an early date that :-

(i) All Allied officers at once examine all Italian personnel employed by them as "civilians" (i.e. not in authorised units) to ensure that all Italian officers and soldiers who are in fact absent without leave or in desertion are turned over at once to the Italian Army for return to their units.

(ii) Allied officers do not in future employ any Italian on any work until it is definitely established that such Italian is not a member of the Italian Army absent either with or without leave, or liable to recall.

(iii) Allied officers do not intervene with Italian authorities on behalf of Italian soldiers who have deserted or are absent from the Italian Army, in order to employ such soldiers or continue such absence.

(iv) A return be furnished forthwith (and thereafter monthly) to the Italian Government, through M.I.A. showing :-

(b) I therefore request that you will issue orders at an early date that :-

(i) All Allied officers at once examine all Italian personnel employed by them as "civilians" (i.e. not in authorised units) to ensure that all Italian officers and soldiers who are in fact absent without leave or in desertion are turned over at once to the Italian Army for return to their units.

(ii) Allied officers do not in future employ any Italian on any work until it is definitely established that such Italian is not a member of the Italian Army, absent either with or without leave, or liable to recall.

(iii) Allied officers do not interfere with Italian authorities on behalf of Italian soldiers who have deserted or are absent from the Italian Army, in order to employ such soldiers or continue such absence.

(iv) A return be furnished Corbinian (and thereonfor monthly) to the Italian Government, through M.T.A. showing :-

Numbers of Italians, not in authorised units, employed by the allies.

Details in regard to each individual who has been given a certificate of exemption from Military service by any Allied Formation.

I could then take action to organise all such personnel into units and ensure that the issue of rations etc does not exceed the ceiling proposed by you to A.Y.H.Q. for approval of the C.O.S. This at present I cannot do.

Dear Admiral,

the General Staff has been informed that pretty often, Italian soldiers who have left arbitrarily their units have been taken for service by Allied military authorities without the previous authorization of the Italian commands from which these soldiers depend.

The Italian commands are therefore unable to take proceedings against the said soldiers for their desertion.

The Italian Ministries have informed the competent Allied Sub-Commissions which showed comprehension and interest about this problem.

I enclose a copy of letter n. 1086 and of letter 1087 of November 7th of the Ministry of Marine and a copy of letter A.Q. 8, of November 20, of M.M.I.A.

In spite of these communications and of the action taken by the Allied authorities, there are still cases of Italian soldiers, in regular service, being detained by the allied commands, in contrast to the present regulations

Considering this and the need to regularise the matter uniformly, in the interest of the discipline and efficiency of the Italian Army Force, I shall be most grateful to you, my dear Admiral, if you could intervene by the Allied Commands and see that they don't take Italian soldiers who have service duties to fulfill.

1. - The cases mentioned in the letters n. 36/2a of October 2nd (ZERLO-CAPOLATTI) and n. 394 of the 13th of the same month (STRULA) have been examined and orders have been given to avoid arresting preventively the military deserters employed by the organizations depending from the Allied Army Force.
2. - Nevertheless, we must again draw the attention of the F.O.L.I. on the very serious consequences of these admittances for our Army Force, for the soldiers are getting convinced that the Allies grant immunity to those who are guilty of this very serious offence.
3. - Assurances have been given by various Allied Authorities; the F.O.T.A. of Taranto sent the Admiral Commander in Chief of the Jonio Department and South Adriatic the enclosed letter (copy); but as a matter of fact, the incidents we complain of go on and become more frequent.
4. - In another note, that we enclose too, are mentioned the latest cases concerning the failure to fulfil the engagements taken about these urgent decisions, in relation to letter 36/1 of September 23rd, sent by this F.O.L.I. to the General Staff of the R. Navy.







2. It is understood that the tracing of these deserters to their homes by the Carabinieri is practicable, but the machinery for returning the men either to their Units or to a Reinforcements Depot breaks down here owing to lack of feeding and tpt difficulties.

3. It is suggested that a policy granting the Carabinieri the right to request Allied facilities to transport any deserters they may trace to the nearest Ital. Headquarters would greatly ease the present drain on labour resources in all areas,




In Tuscany there are still in hiding, notwithstanding warrants issued, a good number of soldiers, belonging to units of the "Friuli", who have not returned after their leave has expired or that are absent without leave. This covers the period September 1st to November 30th.

This fact has been particularly emphasised by my own soldiers, whom during the present time I have been sending regularly on leave, to enable them to see or at least have news of their families and their homes. 4403

These soldiers, when pointing out the above, have underlined with certain irony the fact that their ex - comrades, absent without leave from their units, are at present happy and unpunished, in their homes.

This type of talk, although generally it is given out in good faith, cannot fail to have harmful effects on the morale of the combat Group at my orders.

It is therefore necessary and also urgent, an immediate action on the part of the Allied and Italian Authorities to apprehend all, or a good part of the men at large, who should be given without any delay the deserved punishment.

Such an action would give my soldiers the impression that in Italy there is still Justice, and above all, it would act as a deterrent to those who may be at present inclined to run away from their ~~soldier~~ units.

I will furnish you with a detailed report of the absent men and their addresses.
