The necessity for settling the Italian military forces in Rome have been represented to the R.A.C.

The particular urgency of obtaining certain concessions has been stated (see enclosed list) in view of the transferment of the various offices to Rome.

The possibility has been also suggested of agreeing ^{to the concessions by transferring} certain Allied military elements to the barracks at (Acquafredda).

R.A.C. was favorable to this solution but has put off any definite decision until the problem of the local water supply will be able to be solved.

Following this, permission was requested, to use temporarily at least a part of the unoccupied premises in barracks where Allied troops were already installed, but it was not found advisable to place Allied and Italian troops at close contact in this way the Italian units arriving from the South

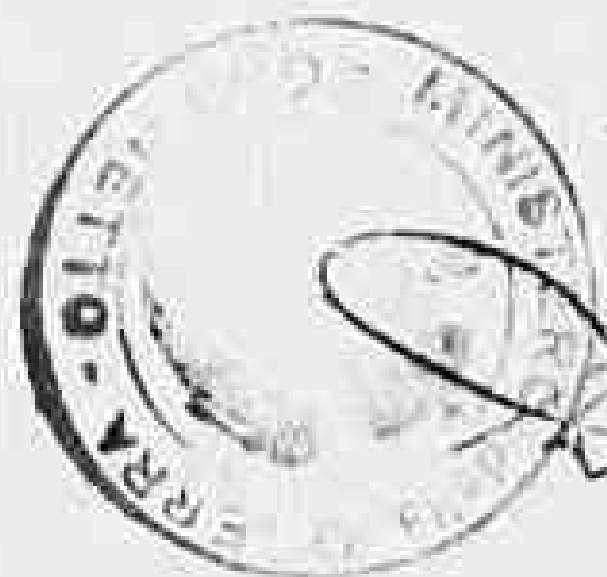

2. It is regretted that the Giulio CESARI Institute NARI is NOT available for the purposes of an Italian hospital. It contains the HQ, Mess and Billet of the PRG branch of this Sub-area, the torn guard room, a complete Provost Coy, a JIB Section and a Works Sec RM. It would NOT be possible to relocate these units conveniently elsewhere.
3. It is suggested that the Italian Army should house their Camp Reception Station in one of the two big, modern barracks situated between the Carbonara rd and the Via De David, close to the San Ponzale Barracks. These barracks are among the best equipped and most modern premises in NARI and are at present occupied entirely by Italian troops. The Italian troops displaced by the Camp Reception Station could be housed elsewhere or under canvas during the summer.

1. The Italian Army is experiencing great difficulty in finding alternative accommodation for stores and beds from the BARI Military Hospital.

2. The GIULIO Cesare Institute, via Corso GARIBOLDI, BARI, which is capable of holding 400 beds, was up to the Armistice, a Italian Military Hospital.

3. This building would well serve the purpose for which it is required, if it could be made available. It is understood that only a small detachment of C.M.F. are at present billeted there.

4. The alternative accommodation, which has been offered at TURK, is unfortunately unsuitable for the following reasons:-

- a) No train service
- b) 29 km from BARI.

5. It is essential for the Italians to have accommodation in BARI because:-

- a) A large number of troops and dock workers are based on BARI
- b) The Italian Army is short of Ammunition.

6. It is, therefore, requested that the GIULIO Cesare Institute be made available, or any other suitable alternative accommodation found in BARI.

The hosp had some equipment but a great deal was destroyed by bombing. The U.S. hospitals are using their own equipment which of course they will take with them upon departure. The 104 Stc Hosp will depart about 10 July and the 495th Hosp will remain dependent upon the reception of U.S. troops in the Palermo area. Hospitalization for civilians here at Palermo is critical and M.O. has recommended that the University Polytechnic Hosp revert to the civilian when U.S. no longer needs same. Because when hospitals mentioned in Sub-Pars 1 and 1 c (1) above revert to the Italian Army they will have sufficient hosp space even if one or two additional Italian PWs are brought to Sicily (based upon hospital beds now in use).

3. Will keep you informed regarding hosp situation in Sicily.

4. Medical personnel to operate the hospitals seems to be quite critical here in Sicily.

MEMORANDUM

Reasons against moving present location of IX Corps

Italian point of view

1) IX Corps has been stationed in BARI for past 50 years. and its existing communications with units under its command are perfect. It has a very difficult comm. system which would be ruined by a move.

2) Bari is situated in the center. Situated all around BARI are Italian troops, many of whom are working for the Allies. IX Corp's position simplifies the control of all these.

3) The moving of IX Corps to MATERA as suggested would immediately remove all direct contact with its troops. It would be away from the centre of major activity and distance would severely impede communications. It would in addition lose all contact with Allied formations.

MMHA point of view.

1) Present position enables direct contact with District H A and Admin. H A in BARI. In view of extensive employment of Italian troops this is essential.

2) Italians are responsible for Administration of all Italian

troops. In view of existing communications, present position is a very sound pivot and only sensible location.

3). Moving of IX Corps would mean separation of Italians from main interested Allied H.Q's. Communications would be very difficult to set up and in view of distances NO direct contact would be possible.

4). MMIA's main object is to obtain set up whereby direct liaison can be had between Allied formations and Italians.

\* 8). Bari is a very large town with many available and suitable buildings capable of holding any new H.Q. of any size wishing to establish itself in the town.

\* 7). Present system is working admirably and no change is therefore desired.

5). CIL now depends on IX Corps for its administration. IX Corps controls all depots & dumps, ~~for~~ situated principally around Bari, which supply the CIL with its requirements.

Subject: Accommodation for HQ 2 Region ACC @ BARI

Comd MMIA

1. I went to BARI on 6 Apr to find a HQ for Region II ACC (12 officers and 48 CRs). I saw the District and Area Commanders who gave me all the help possible but told me they had a big waiting list and were already overcrowded.

2. Being Saturday I could not get into some of the government and other offices (their occupants having retired for the weekend) but from such visits and contacts as I made I can offer the following suggestions in order of merit:

a) The HQ's Italian IX Corps Territorial District and local garrison occupy three adjoining buildings opposite the Governor's Palace. They can and are willing to close up and release one block. This would be suitable for Region II Offices, mess accommodation and a mess and bedrooms for some officers. It would remain to select a house for the regional commissioner and his senior officers; the Town Major thinks this could be done.

b) The Provincia building has enough spare room as offices and HQ. Living accommodation could be found (with some ruthlessness) in near by flats etc.

c) The Carabinieri barracks are not fully occupied but it would be a mistake to force an issue here unnecessarily.

d) The Aqueduct Company's offices might be closed up considerably but as this building also houses District Comd's A Mess and billets it would be better not to press this.

3. The problem is therefore not insuperable but I don't think I can do more than offer these suggestions for Col ZELLERS to explore and make his own decision in consultation with Brig PALMER on the spot.

1. The following is quoted from a memorandum dated 14 May 1944 from the Regional Commissioner, Region II, to the Executive Commissioner:

"4. In the opinion of HQ. District and Sub-Area, alone of all the units in Bari, the presence of the 9th Italian Army Corps Headquarters is quite redundant. From inquiries it would seem that this unit's furnished Barracks, supported by sundry flats in which their officers live, would provide full accommodation for HQ., Region II. The only possible solution at present is to make an exchange for accommodations with the 9th Italian Army Corps. This proposal is very strongly opposed by the Army Sub-Commission, A.C.C., and the Italian War Ministry.

\* \* \* \* \*

"8. In view of the above, I am compelled to report that I am unable to move this Headquarters to Bari at the present or in the near future, unless it can be arranged by higher authority to exchange accommodations with the 9th Italian Army Corps and some Italian personnel. ...."

2. In view of the greater convenience and efficiency which would result from the removal of Headquarters Region II, to Bari, and the frequently-expressed desire of the Chief Commissioner that this move take place as soon as possible, will you please comment on the above quoted material, setting forth specific reasons why the proposed occupation of quarters and barracks occupied by 9th Italian Army Corps Headquarters is "very strongly opposed"?

3. It is appreciated that there may be and probably are, cogent reasons for your position, and the purpose of this memorandum is solely to obtain full information. No criticism is implied.

The military school in Naples has been open since the 1st February last, as a normal, civil, intermediate or high-school.

Second and third year high-school courses are conducted, with about forty pupils; the soldiers frequent the school in civilian clothes and as day students.

The Allied authorities have left a few rooms at the disposal of the schools as well as the library and the physics and science laboratories.

The Army Sub-Commission of the ACC was asked as long ago as February last by the Ministry of War to put at the school's disposal the other rooms necessary to completely resume the school's activities.

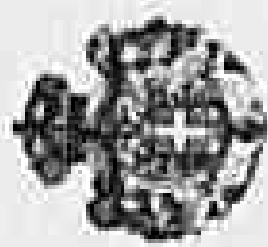

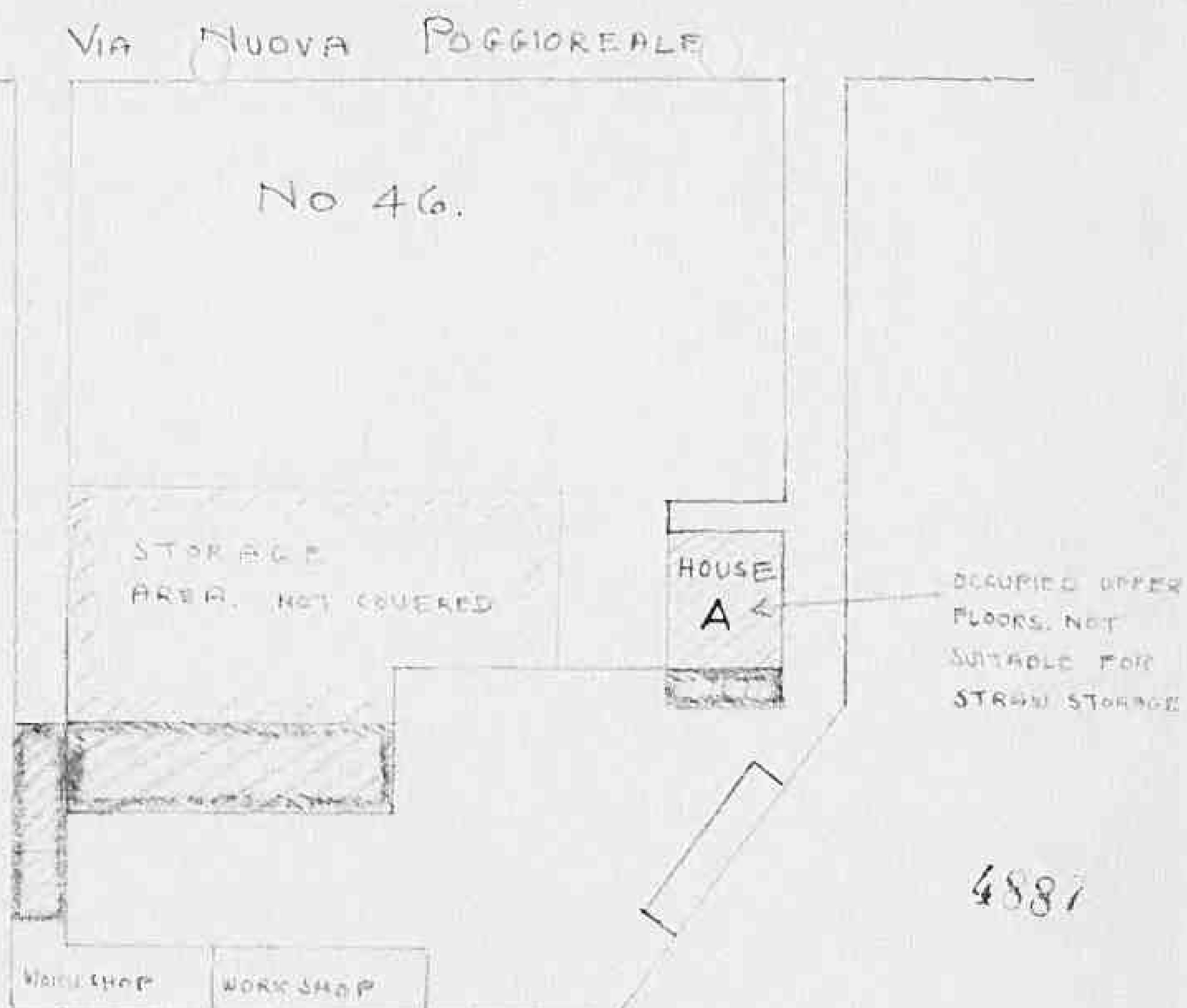

TO : Army Sub-Commission.

1 The following facts have been ascertained from Col. Grigh. in Region III in this matter.

a. The building in which this hospital is located is occupied by British, American, and Italian military hospitals. That part occupied by the Italian Military hospital has in it a school for nurses which has attached to it one ward for Medical cases, one ward for surgical cases.

b. The Italian part of the building has not recently been fully occupied with cases. The American and British parts have been over crowded, particularly the latter.

c. The British Hospital is urgently in need of an operating theatre and therefore proposes to take over one of the floors occupied by the Italian Military authorities.

d. When Naples was first occupied, the Italian Military Hospital catered for a certain number of civilian casualties, this is now the case. Brig Gen. Howe at that time considered it unwise to dispossess Italian military of accommodation, as the unit concerned is the "Cross of Malta", and particularly as civilians were being attended so pressed for its retention. This is the only reason A.M.G. became involved.

e. As the question of civilian casualties does not now arise and the only cases handled are those of military personnel the matter seems to be one in which the military authorities must decide.

This is going to raise a very important issue for A.S.C. as this hospital is under the Cross of Malta and the Royal family and other notables are interested in it.

There are two other hospitals in the same block, one British and the other American and the former wants to take over one floor. The number of beds on which is not specified but is possibly less than 200. Region 3 says 100-150. The capacity of the Italian hospital is 300 beds but it has always been very empty while the British and American hospitals have been full. They now require an operating theatre which is on the floor they propose to take over. Two floors are still retained by the Italians for an Italian Nursing School with say 100 - 150 beds. The Italians have two other military hospitals in NAPLES plus a Red Cross hospital. As the present action is being taken by the military authorities and is a military necessity, I fear we can take no action.

(Ref. MMIA Signal AQ 1033 of 2 May 44)

Early in April this office was approached by the Commissariato (FF.AA. Campania), who stated that British Officers were inspecting the depot and saying that it would shortly be taken over.

The matter was referred to "Q"57 Area, who confirmed this. I was told that the large warehouse which contained only coal was urgently required for storage of HFI stores; arrangement would be made for having the coal removed to the yards.

On my advice 57 Area addressed a letter to Italian HQ stating that the space was required most urgently and that no other suitable accommodation could be found.

I was given to understand at this stage that occupation of the whole premises, which include the yards and certain small rooms adjacent to the large warehouse, was not contemplated, and I informed the Italians accordingly.

On or about 10 April I made an inspection of the depot in company with an Officer of the Commissariato. The warehouse was being cleared by female labour and was almost empty. I spoke to the HFI officer supervising the work, who told me that all that remained to be done was to shift the coal in the yards so as to give turning space for vehicles. When asked about the small rooms, three which were full of sacks of forage and the fourth, an office/billet, he said he was quite sure they had no use for them.

Having ascertained the Italians minimum requirements I put them in writing with plan attached to 57 Area on 11 April. They were:

- a) Retention of the 4 small rooms.
- b) Use of the yards for storage of wood and coal (which would include entry of vehicles to load and unload).
- c) Permission to occupy an empty shed on the opposite side of the road for storage of 100 tons of straw expected shortly from Apulia (in normal circumstances this would have been stored in the ware-

No reply to this letter has yet reached this office; however it has lately been ascertained verbally that the Italians are to be permitted to withdraw their stocks of wood and coal but not to replenish them, that the four small rooms are in fact required by EFL: in other words that the whole depot is to be taken over. Request (c) above, was granted, but this does not ease the situation as the shed in question is full to the ceiling with straw.

The present position is that the Italians are being faced with fresh supplies of wood and nowhere to store them, and they have to find themselves completely new premises for their forage. The Italians have suggested some premises near the new straw shed and 57 Area are being asked about them.

I feel that this matter could have been settled some time ago if "Q" 57 Area had adopted a less procrastinating policy. It was clear that they were averse all along to taking any action on behalf of the Italians or making any decision. So far as I know no attempt has been made by Area to find or suggest alternative accommodation.

Nor was any tangible information vouchsafed verbally when I visited HQ 57 Area to press for some decision; I was merely informed that my attitude was found most irritating.

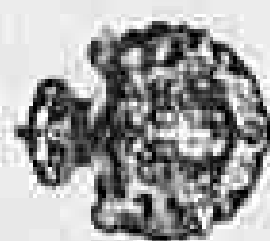
