1. Some confusion appears to exist over your reading of the two letters AAI 2049/12/Q2 dated 5 Oct 44, and AFHQ 2554/Q Maint dated 27 Sept 44. They should be read in conjunction.

2. The AAI letter referred to does not state that para 4 of AFHQ 2554/Q Maint does not apply until the Gruppi enter the operational zone. It merely states that para 4 will apply when the Gruppi enter such zone.

3. Para 2 of AFHQ letter 2554/Q Maint states that "It is intended to provide these Italian Gruppi, as they are formed, with toilet articles from E.F.I. as follows. This authority must not be quoted as a precedent for the issue of E.F.I. supplies to other Italian forces."

2. It is suggested that the BLU should not be given this added responsibility which would fall on the DAA & QMG who is already fully occupied. It is agreed, however, that the Combat Gp must be made entirely responsible for accounting and the settlement of their accounts.

If EFTI have any difficulty in their transactions with the Gp, the MMIA LO would carry out the necessary liaison.

3. It is considered that no British officer should be made responsible for the settlement of accounts, which is entirely a matter between the EFTI and the Gp.

1. It is not considered practicable for an officer of the BLU to undertake the suggested responsibility for settlement of the Gruppo's EFI accounts. 1. It is suggested that a cash transaction between each Combat Group and EFI would be a better means of distributing EFI goods to Combat Groups than the present system whereby the account is presented afterwards to the Ministry of War. Each Group would then be entirely responsible for accounting for such goods and the Ministry of War would not be involved in something over which it has no direct control.
2. The Ministry of War states that the Groups' Canteen organisation (Spaccio) has the necessary cash resources to do this.
3. It would, however, be necessary for the money to be paid to EFI through a British Officer who would be responsible for each account being settled. Provided the transaction were left on a strictly cash for goods basis there would seem to be no difficulty about this.
4. You are requested to inform MHA if you agree with the above proposal, and if the BLU can undertake the task of being the necessary link between the Combat Group and EFI on the question of handing over the cash.

MINISTRY OF WAR

1. The maintenance of the Gruppi di Combattimento while they are being reorganised and trained in the use of British Equipment remains an ITALIAN responsibility.

2. As each Group reaches a satisfactory state of training it is proposed to transfer it to British administration and make a complete issue of British clothing and personal equipment.

3. For the present therefore you are to ensure that every effort is made to clothe and equip these units as necessary with items of ITALIAN origin from the stocks under your control. No issue of Allied clothing and equipment will be made from MMIA controlled stocks. Certain assistance in the supply of boots may be given should you so request.

4. You will be notified in advance of the date on which the transfer is to take place, so that arrangements for withdrawal and transfer of Italian items can be made. It is not expected that this will take place, in the case of the first group, before mid October.

5. In view of the above, you will appreciate the vital necessity of developing your repair programme with the greatest energy and speed.



1. Following on instructions received from ADST, MMIA HQ in Rome on 8 August 1944 visits were made to Benevento by Major Papineau and Capt. Nelson on 9 August 1944 and 11 August 1944.

2. Resulting from these journeys the following is the latest position.

3. The pre-existing Italian Commissariato Magazzino Viveri at Benevento is a very small depot holding approximately 10 tons in constricted premises for the maintenance of approximately 1000 ITI troops based on Benevento. These premises would not allow an increase in the holding of this depot.

4. Prior for check up by this arrangements had been worked out in Naples on 9 August 1944 between Lt. Col. Riso Commissariato Naples and Lt. Col. Petrucci Chief of Staff Friuli Division for food supplies to be consigned from Naples to Benevento for acceptance by the Friuli Division into their own special depot at San Giorgio.

5. On visit by MMIA Naples officers to Benevento on 9 August 1944 no trace could be found either of the Italian divisional staff or of the food depot referred to in para 4.

6. On 10/11 August 1944 food supplies were despatched from Naples to Benevento as per attached list (which is set out for comparative purposes against a target of 6000 feeding Strengths for 15 days). Despatches will continue daily.

7. On 11 August 1944 the depot created by Friuli Division for acceptance of these supplies was inspected. It consisted of a small but satisfactory barn-type storeroom capable of holding and operating distribution of some 25 tons all supplies.

8. Additional storage space is available in the vicinity and it was therefore agreed with Lt. Col. Petrucci in San Giorgio on 11 August 1944, that despatches from Naples would continue until the target of 6000 men x 15 days is attained,

9. Baking facilities will constitute a difficulty. The Friuli Division is actively investigating all possibilities for meeting their own divisional requirements and will probably succeed in arranging sufficient daily bread production. The situation for subsequent personnel will however be correspondingly more difficult. It is considered that War Ministry should be invited to examine urgently the problem of arranging Italian field bakeries to cope with later arrivals. In addition a small reserve stock of Biscuits is being transported from Naples to the Benevento Commissariato depot as an emergency reserve.

10. The situation is at present therefore under control and will continue to be closely watched.
