Liaison Report for week ending 17 Nov 45.

1. General.

I took over this office from Capt. Taropp in Milan on 10 Nov. and opened here on 13 Nov. During the week I have contacted most of the 217 Area Staff, Gen. Cerica and some of his staff and Col. Berioni, Cmdr of 717 Adm Regt. With Gen. Cerica I made a short tour of ex-PCR from Russia (I could not altogether share the Italians' horror at their condition. Those I saw were certainly badly dressed, but I did not notice any marks of starvation); the new and rearmy Casa del Soldato; the Officers Club; the troops reception room in the station, on which work is still in progress. Gen. Cerica is an officer who looks at laboratories.

2. 'G' Points.

I find some confusion, which I am engaged in sorting out, over the role and responsibilities of 717 Adm Regt. Up to now it has been in Bologna, w/c 231 Div in Milan, and with some, but not all, Br-It troops in the Bologna Territorial Command under its command. 217 Area was not even aware of its existence. Discussions on the New Army have aroused considerable interest here. Gen CERICA's views are largely in agreement with those of the GOC, but he feels quite strongly on two points: the importance of keeping the Military Districts and cutting down the services by greater reliance on civil services eg. hospitals, transport services etc.

I have heard the view expressed here that the sooner the different categories of the Italian Army are abolished the better. The continued existence of BR-1th Service Tps ("Verdoni") with their divided loyalties and separate adms, causes confusion and lack of cohesion.

- (a) Too little interest on part of the Inspectorate in ⁸¹⁴¹ ROME.
- (b) Too many HQs. With only three bns left, one of the 9p HQs should be scrapped. 1 Gp ("Perotti") in BCL-CCNA could effectively look after the three bns.
- (c) 2 Bn (VERONA) had all its American ^{Army} tpts and now has only a lot of old crooks, mainly German, salvaged last Spring from the banks of the Po. This bn should be completely re-equipped with Italian vehs.

I am told that 3 and 8 Bns are now non-existent. Brit stores (incl vehs in case of 6 Bn) have been transferred to the remaining units.

The Genie have made an inspection of the barracks in FAMO, provisionally earmarked for a PFC, and have confirmed that 300 men can be comfortably accommodated between the two and that damage is repairable at a cost of a few million Lira.

RAILWAY ENGINEERS

The dismantling of the Aly Engre is likely to cause a bit of trouble. For a long time now these units have been in the nature of a "private army" owing allegiance to a Reggimento in COM. 202 Div have hitherto considered them a clothing responsibility only, and now they have been abandoned by the 37 or 38 units which previously looked after them. Two barracks (the "Duca d'Aosta" in MODENA and the "Pensuolo del Friuli" in FERRARA) have finally been released by 217 Area and the gd bn problem is now solved; please disregard therefore my letter Bol/7 of 8 Oct. TRANSPORT

6 Repair Unit is steadily increasing its output. It now turns out an average of 43 vehicles a week of which 6 are newly recovered machines. Potentially the output is much higher, and when work on the sheds is complete, a sharp rise should take place in spite of winter. They have managed to bring back some heavy machinery which had been removed by the Germans to BRUNICO. When this is properly installed, it is said that they will have the best equipped shop in Italy. The great problem is lack of spares. They have reached the point when it becomes uneconomical to cannibalise. A visit from one of the REME staff would be appreciated.

At present a disguised factory in BOLOGNA is being used as a temporary EVR. I discovered that work on the BUDRIO site had not even begun and I have taken the matter up with the Territ. HQ. At BUDRIO there is parking space for a vast number of vehs but they would be very difficult to guard as it is all open. The repairable sheds can house about a hundred vehicles.

ACCOMMODATION

The position has not been improved by the sudden influx of Poles. The barracks for 522 Gd Bn at RAVENNA WK1 which had apparently not been derequisitioned since the days when it was used by Cremona Gp, are now required for Polish troops. Territorial HQ are finding out about a building in PARMA which might be suitable for 522 Bn. Other alternatives are MODENA and REGGIO both of which have reasonable barracks controlled by DP Sub Commission, who however state that they cannot release them. I will send details separately by letter; perhaps you could approach AC about relinquishing one of them.

War Min instructed Territ HQ to issue to transient Gruppi vehs from own stocks until 7 Oct. Is any provision made for transient vehs in the monthly allocation? Several thousands of litres are issued in this way every month.

BR-ITIA

Difficulties have arisen over the disbandment of 2 Gt Coy, which will probably mean that the MT personnel due to go to Mantova and Folgore next week will not be available. The unit (without a Brit Cadre) has, it seems not been under command of anyone. S&F here were not prepared to assist in the disposal of British stores and vehs and actually had the effrontery to suggest that the responsibility should be that of the MBIA LO! In fact almost precisely the same difficulties are being encountered over the disbandment of this unit as arose nearly a year ago when it was formed at AFRAGOLA!

6 Territorial HQ is on the whole a well established and smooth-running HQ with a realistic grasp of local problems. I have met all the heads of services and visited all the principal sub units in the neighbourhood. I have found efficiency and some enthusiasm.

COMMISSARIATO

This is not a very active body but the depots appear to be managed adequately. 6 Pool Depot is about to be moved out of town to CASARALTA, a large supply establishment once of great importance but now mostly in ruins. It is planned to transfer all the Commissariato depots to CASARALTA eventually, including the clothing and equipment depots now occupying very congested premises in the Cavalry Bks.

MT AND REPAIR UNITS

The Repairs Unit (old "O.A.H.E.") is a scene of great activity largely directed towards repairing the sheds to enable the trucks to function in winter, and on salvage work. For this reason the output is not yet large. No vehicles are yet being turned over to the RVF. There are approximately 500 vehs in the repair sheds and the "inefficient park", all potential efficiencies.

Large quantities of spares are being salvaged from the rubble, cleaned and catalogued by an expert civilian staff. It is hard to see what the military personnel will do when they arrive to form a separate spare unit.

BATTLEFIELD CLEARANCE

This work is proceeding very slowly. One of the reasons for the slowness is lack of petrol; Ferrit. HQ can only allocate a small quota which severely restricts the mileage. There is also some confusion of thought over regulations and responsibilities. May I please be sent some paper on this subject, clearly showing what the responsibilities of the Italian Army are?

I.S. BRIGADE

The Brigade HQ is in REGINA and it is planned to leave it there, if possible housed in an annexe of the academy. 523 Bn, being the only mixed sizeable body of troops under command of the Territorial HQ, is having to provide numerous guards and services (one coy is providing depot and rly guards in ALCOA and FORLI). Doubtless when all three bns are available, training will not suffer. ACOA is waiting for 523 Bn in the Uffizio BzS REGINA but so far it has not shown up.

RR-ITALY

The main problem here is the disposal of the personnel of disbanding units. There was a danger that the Brit cadres of the Pioneer coys, also disbanding, would have to go before the troops could be cleared, leaving them without tpt. However an arrangement has been made with the Pioneer Gp HQs whereby insufficient tpt is retained until all the men are away.
