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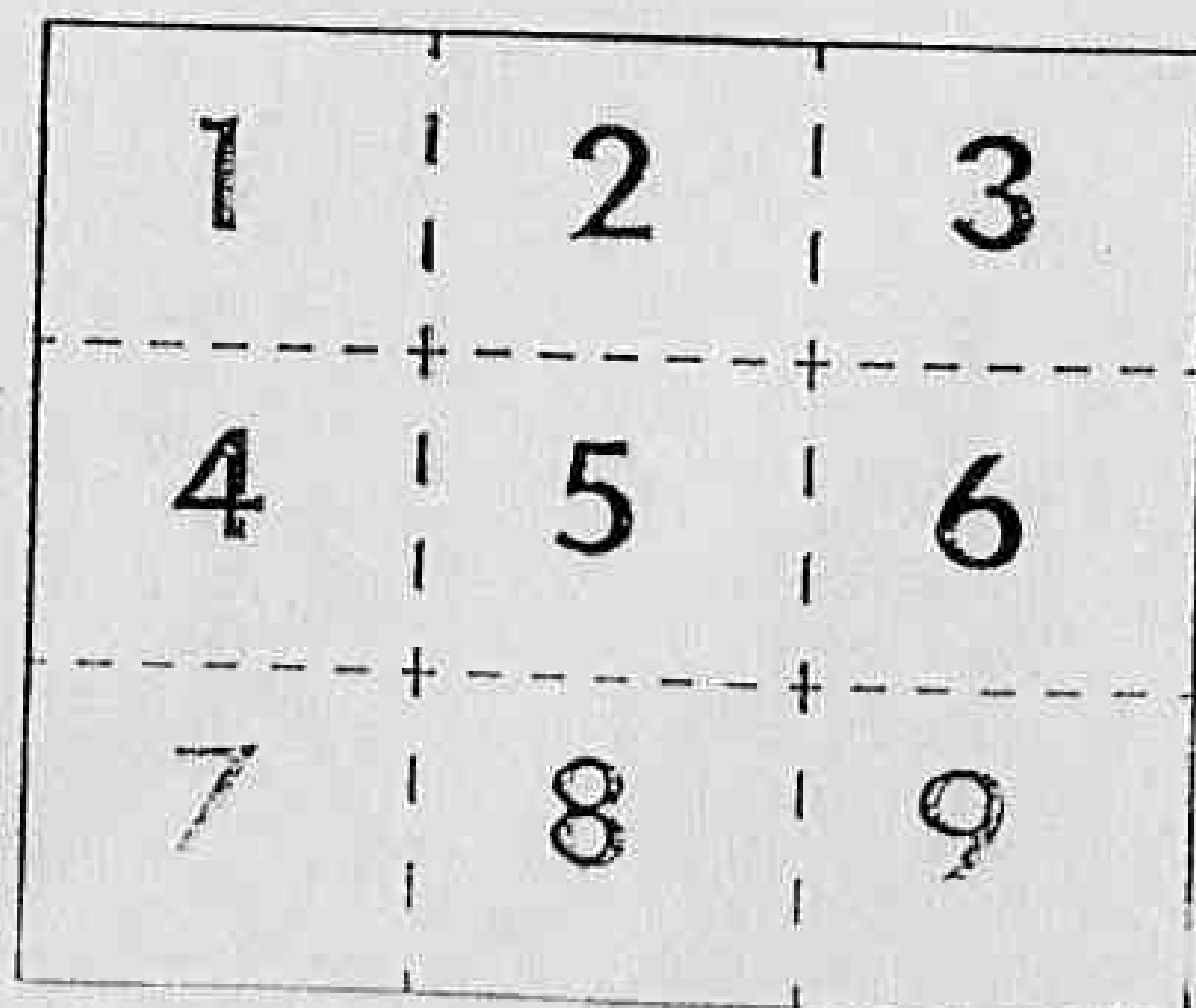
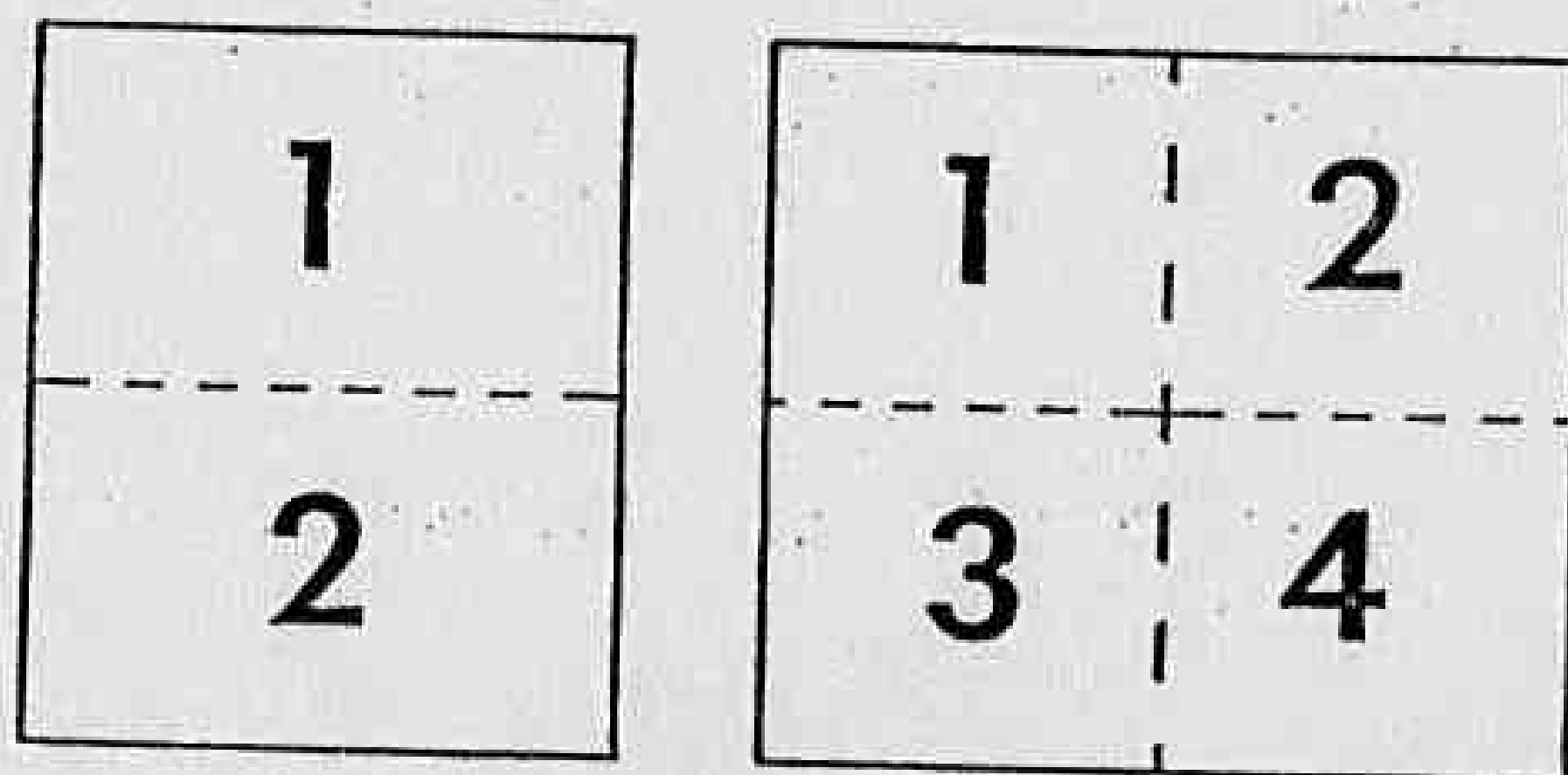

owing to long wear.

Other articles stored in the depots are not available
because already assigned to the various legions to be issued
but that were not out of the Depot on the 10th of March

owing to lack of transport.

c) The quantities of C and E material placed at the disposal of the Commissariat Directorate of BDAI and NADRES were with drawn during the second half of the month of feb. therefore such quantities are shown almost complete in this inventory as they had not been issued by the 10th of march.

D) Parts of the Great coats, jackets, and hats are of sizes so small that they cannot be issued to C and E. The trousers are all of very small sizes.

It has been impossible to ~~exchange~~^{exchange} these articles for larger ones owing to unavailability in the Com. Dist. Depots or other Commands of the Army.

E) Other articles are now being repaired by the tailoring W/shops of the legions and will be issued as soon as repaired.

F) nearly all the GJ uniforms are from recovery and all partly worn, these have a very short life especially the trousers, and have to be repaired often as the cloth wears easily.

G) The Dress uniforms for C and E (8680) are only dress tailed coats and are not being used either because to day little use is made of dress uniform or because there is no available blue trousers with stripes (the 1975 in store are of very small sizes)

because of their special double breasted built up,

E' pure di questi giorni il rifiuto, da parte del magazzino vestiario della Direzione di Comm/TO Mil. di Roma, di effettuare il cambio, autorizzato da codesto Ministero, di 71 giubbe di panno g.v. di classe e piccolissime, per il motivo che il magazzino predetto aveva soltanto giubbe nuove e non di recupero.-

Va inoltre notato che pure in precedenza si sono verificati inconvenienti del genere, talché nei magazzini legionali sussiste attualmente una piccola consistenza di materiali, specialmente scarpe spaiate, della

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quale questo Comando Generale non può disporre utilmente in modo alcuno.

Subject:- Clothing CC.RR

With reference to the conversation which transpired on the 14 Aug 45 at the Sub Commission for Public Security, regarding the request for clothing for the CC.RR (this H.Q.'s letter No. 3/1350/8-1 dated 30 Jul 45), on the verbal invitation of Lieut. Col. Wilson, we beg to state:

1. The request for 65,000 series covers the complete requirements for articles of clothing necessary completely and with uniformity, to furnish all the military personnel of the Arm of the CC.RR, with clothing for at least one year, with the intention, as stated in the said letter of request, of diminishing, should issues in the meantime, have been made.
2. Instead, in order to meet the most urgent demands, there were made, in turn, two requests for a total of 30,000 series (one for 10,000 for ex-P.O.M. and one for 20,000). Having reached an agreement with the Ministry of War for the acceptance of such a request, the said Ministry has already made known its endorsement to M.M.I.A., specifying the stores.

3. The stores of the Legions at present are, or may be considered to be without serviceable articles of clothing, therefore this General H.Q. has already ordered that all clothing which, because of being too small or worn out is no longer serviceable to the personnel of the Arm of the CC.RR, should be handed in to the Commissariat stores.

However, with some articles, (e.g. small overcoats), owing to the great needs, alteration has been ordered into trousers or berets.

4. The request for blankets, on a scale of three to each man can now be considered as cancelled, in that, according to a recent communication from the Ministry of the Interior, civilian firms must provide for the supply of such needs.

However, we have reason to believe that the firms supplying barracks materials are not at present capable of completely coping with demands, perhaps they will be able to do so shortly, the Ministry of the Interior having recently increased the wage, bringing it up to an amount of L.6 daily for military personnel.

5. Solely because of the deficiency in clothing items, there are, up to the present 9,922 carabinieri in civilian clothes, distributed in the following manner:

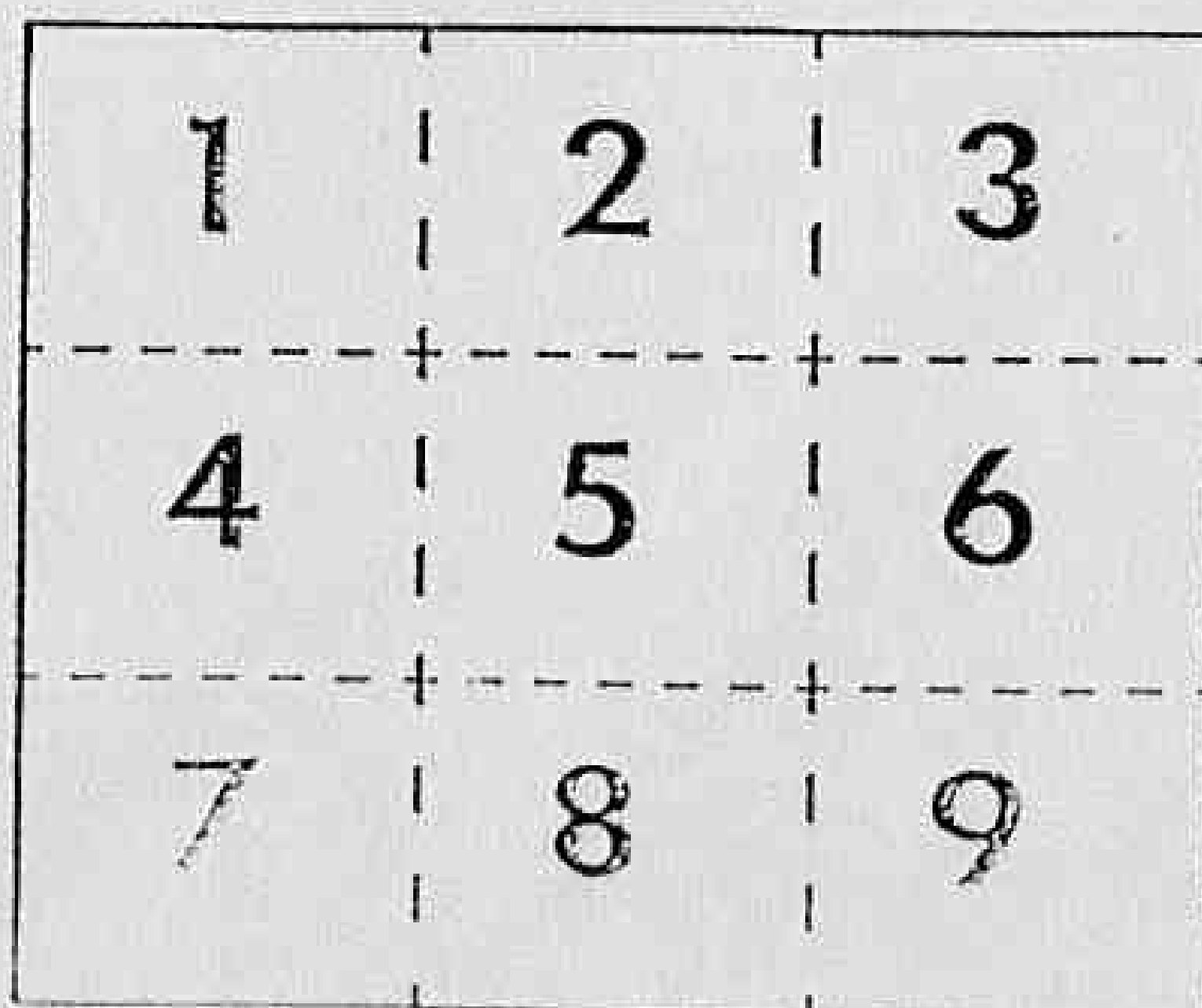
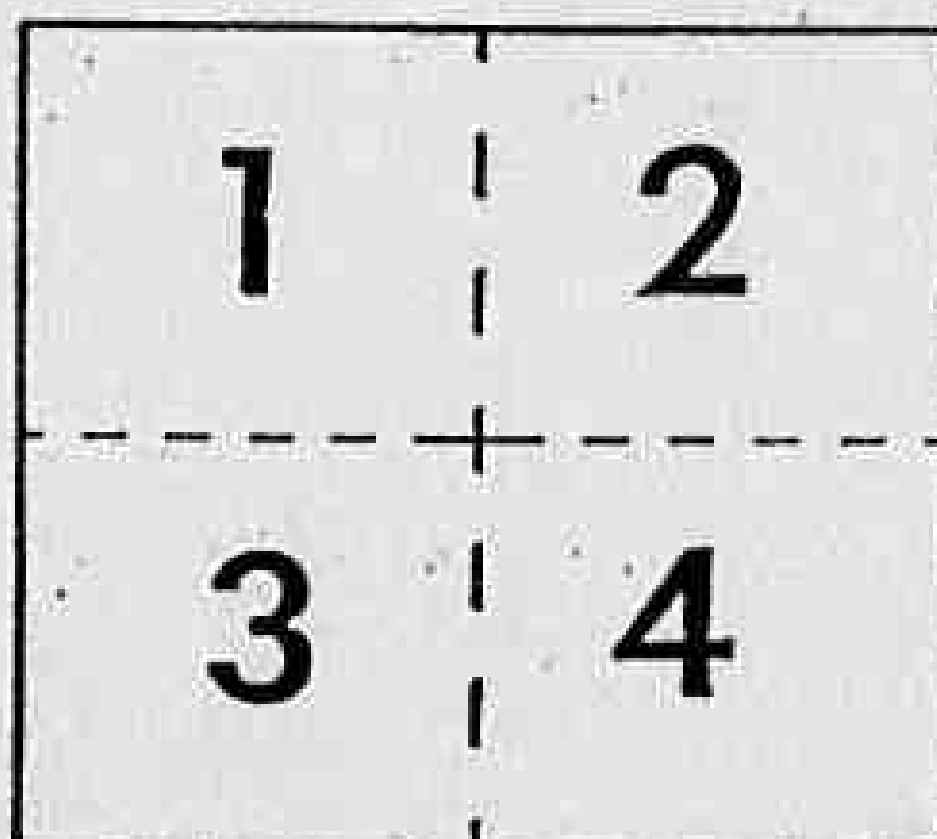
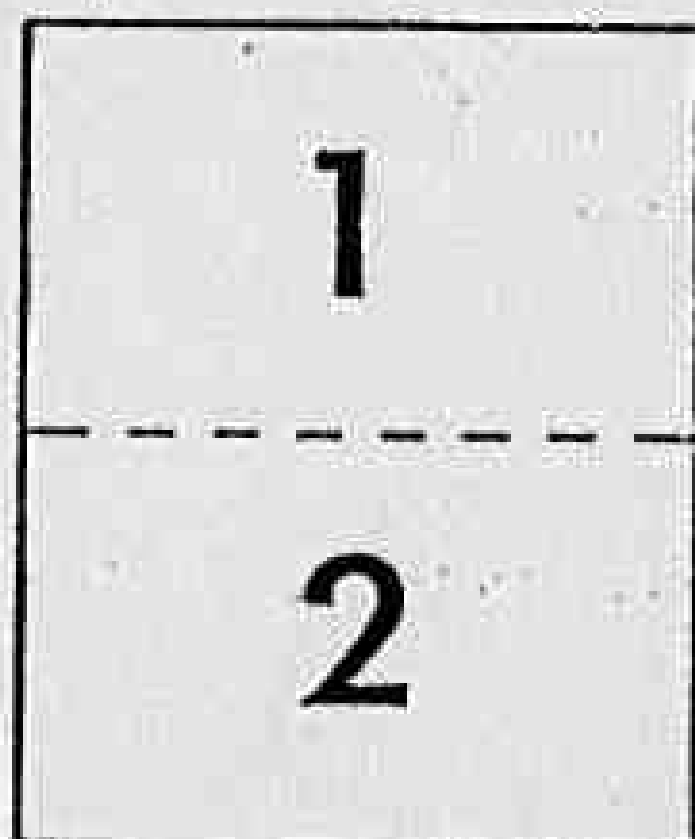

NOTES FOR DISCUSSION WITH NATO ON CC.RR.

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1 Provision of clothing and all types of equipment.

a) The position is serious. Regional Reports for August refer to the lack of uniforms and boots as being one of the most serious problems. There are, in LIGURIA, 300 CC.RR. who cannot be used on police duties because they have no uniforms.

b) Regions have to resort to hiring unavoidable and uneconomic transport from civilian truck pools for use by Carabinieri.

c) If in general correct that, despite the high priority to be given to the needs of the CC.RR., practically no issues can be expected from Italian Army sources?

d) If so, it would seem that AFHQ must be so informed with some indication as to requirements and that some special arrangements must be made for fully equipping the CC.RR.

2 Notice required to obtain provision, either through NATO or under special arrangements.

a) At present, an inventory of all clothing and of all weapons held by the CC.RR. is being made.
A transport scale exists for Legions and Mobile Battalions. Deficiencies should be known.

b) Public Safety S/C has neither the organization nor staff to check whether or not a demand made by CC.RR. is fully justified. 5 Increase in Strength of O.L.R.R.

a) The proposal is, at present, at ask for an increase of 10,000 bringing the total up to 75,000. If such an increase is agreed to, it will be necessary to ensure that the present as well as increased numbers can be properly equipped.

Subject: Clothing for CCRR Assigned to Northern Italy.

To : Ministry of War - General Directorate of Commissary
and Administrative Services, Rome.

Your Ministry with letters N. 16625/VC and 16066/VC, both dated 21st April 1945 authorized the release from Rome, Naples and Bari Depots of the clothing allotted by MMIA for the CCRR assigned to Northern Italy. Upon the withdrawal, we have noted that various items (blouses, trousers) cannot be used, being too short to fit CCRR. Recently, Bari Legion HQ has informed us that it was not deemed appropriate to draw 3,200 blouses from the local clothing depot, since said blouses apart from being in poor condition, are of a very small size. Naples Legion has also informed us that 5,000 trousers to be drawn from Naples clothing depot, letter N. 16276/VC, dated 23rd April 1945, are too long, worn, from Allied Sources, dark green dyed.

Recently, the clothing depot of Rome, though authorized by your Ministry, refused to change 71 blouses, wool, grey-green, worn and very short, for reason that stocks on hand were new and no salvage was available. Furthermore, it must be noted that for the past, similar occurrences have happened, so that actually a small quantity of clothing is stored in the Legion Depots, particularly odd shoes, which cannot be usefully used by this HQ. Some Commissary Directorates have informed us that they cannot release the entire stock allotted by your Ministry because not available, while the final period set by MMIA for drawing a/m clothing expires on 15th May. Thereafter, the allotment must be regarded as cancelled.

As a result, instructions are being issued by this HQ to its subordinate Legions to turn over at once to the Clothing Depots the materials which can be used -- on the other hand, your Ministry is kindly requested to authorize its Depots to change said material, instructing them to bear in mind, for the present and future, the necessity of preserving the prestige of CCRR, especially of those assigned to Northern Italy, who will be very frequently in contact with Allied Troops.

1. The equipping of the CC.RR with suitable vehicles awaits the implementation of the "compromise" agreement providing for the transfer of Allied vehicles from the Ministry of Transport to the War Ministry in lieu of Army vehicles retained by civilians under AG/AGC control. The compromise agreement provided that a considerable number of vehicles would be turned over to the Army by 29 October 1945 (none of which have been received) and a further turn over of 500 per month beginning 1 November 1945. When these vehicles are received by the Minister for War, he will make allocation to the CC.RR.
2. The issue of new weapons depends upon the action of AFHQ on request made to release automatic weapons (C.B.M.) in the Breda factory. AG and ISIA have put this matter up to AFHQ, but no decision has been received.
3. We discussed the above personally today.

2. The Chief Commissioner trusts that this re-equipping will be put in hand as early as possible and would be grateful for a report thereon in due course.

The policy laid down in this Headquarters letter Q.8 of the 19 Sep. should result in a more satisfactory state of affairs.
2. In view of the new policy your proposed arrangements are not approved. Any further difficulty should be straightened out between the C.O.C. of the CC.RR and the War Ministry.

SUBJECT: Police Clothing.

TO : Headquarters Allied Commission,
Public Safety Sub-Commission.

1. With reference this HQ letter PS/3.6 dated 4 October 1945 and enclosures, and previous correspondence in connection with the above, it is desired to point out that it is colder in Milan than it is in Rome and it is much colder still in the Frontier Regions.

2. Most of the police are still without greatcoats and many have received no uniforms or warm underclothing.

3. May the releases for materials please be forwarded without delay.

4. Failing obtaining the necessary releases it will be necessary to purchase some unblocked material which is at a figure of about 1300 lire per metre.

5. It would be easy in many ways if the open release order could be made out in favour of Colonel Guzzardi of Milan who could then furnish periodical reports of his purchases and the purposes for which they were made, which could if required be endorsed by this office as to their correctness. Alternatively if this is not approved, Colonel Guzzardi could make individual applications if it were known who could effect the releases. The Carabinieri and Finance Guards must, of course, be dealt with separately, but as with the other police they unfortunately cannot report any success as yet.

1. General Brunetti, Commanding General CC.RR, has just returned from a visit to the Florence Brigade (a BRI-ITI unit) and reports that only 3,500 serviceable uniforms have been issued. Strength of brigade is 10,000.

2. He goes on to say that no blankets, overcoats, underclothes or shirts have been made available. The boot situation is satisfactory. Further, no issues have been made of the other minor items listed in the scale of equipment as laid down in Appendix H to MMIA Adm. Instruction No. 12 of 12 October 1944.

3. AC Liaison officer Bologna, has submitted a report giving a similar picture of the situation, and goes on to say that the dyed clothing being issued is affected by rain, which causes the dye to run onto the skin of the wearer. The dye is said to have caused the garments to shrink to such an extent that some are not large enough for use by male adults.

4. No transport has been issued to the Brigade from British sources, which seriously interferes with their Police functions. The Bologna Legion in particular is faced with serious Partisan difficulties and it is important that the Legion be made as mobile as possible. The transport being used at present is that held by the CC.RR when the Force was organized on a 55,000 ceiling.
