COL FLAMMINI

1. Carabinieri for fascist cages:

(a) FLAMMINI stated that the OC.M. of the 240 Mir sec had been reassigned to reinforce the F.B. in the NORTH, by verbal arrangements with SA MELA and the movement was already under way. He proposed that the camp commandant be met with one of the three OC. Mir. secs belonging to the tall units of the group, which he considered were no longer fully employed.

(b) Later said FLAMMINI that edg had been sent to 2 District requesting transfer of one of the group's sec.

(c) In the event of this move NOT being effected in time to take over the FLORENCE women's Camp (22 Sep), FLAMMINI has arranged that the Carabinieri H.Q. in FLORENCE will loan 17.0. and 18 OMs.

(d) As regards camp 377, the Carabinieri G.H.Q. had already sent a further 50 of their own sec, bringing the strength at the camp to 2 officers, 6 NCOs, 90 OMs. The balance of the 120, if really needed, will have to be made up with part of the sec coming from the group.

2. Italian NO 2 District:

FLAMMINI raised the question of properly accrediting Capt GIOVANI, so that Territorial Commands in the NORTH would know who this officer was. Discussed with G 4 and later info FLAMMINI that:

(a) MELA would notify MELA 10s of GIOVANI's appointment, that GIOVANI should limit itself to informing Territorial Comds that GIOVANI had been posted to 2 District as an LO., but that this did not mean that F.B. would in future cut out the MELA 10 and deal direct with District through GIOVANI.

3. ORINA:

Further talk on the general org and work of the ORINA sec. Cited two or three instances of faulty staff work noted by MELA in the current edition, which FLAMMINI investigated. FLAMMINI made a plea for reducing proof corrections to a minimum, which the printers had stated was essential if the ORINA was to be processed by the 25th of the month. Discussed with G Branch MELA and later agreed with FLAMMINI that:

(a) Information in ORINA would be as at 6th of the month and amendments subsequent to that date would NOT be made by MELA;

(b) corrections of the first proof would be limited by MELA to printers errors. At the moment there were some

(d) As regards camp 377, the Carabinieri C.A. had already sent a further 30 of their own men, bringing the strength at the camp to 2 CAs, 8 MOAs, 90 CAs. The balance of the 120, if really needed, will have to be made up with part of the sec coming from the group.

2. Italian LO 2 District:

FIACCHINI raised the question of properly accrediting Capt CROCE, so that Territorial Commands in the NORTH would know who this officer was. Discussed with G 4 and later with FIACCHINI, that:

- (a) MILA would notify MILA ION of CROCE's appointment,
- (b) CROCE should limit itself to informing Territorial Commands that CROCE had been posted to 2 District as an LO., but that this did NOT mean that T.H. would in future cut out the MILA LO and deal direct with District through CROCE.

3. CROCE:

Further talk on the general org and work of the CROCE sec. Cited two or three instances of faulty staff work noted by MILA in the current edition, which FIACCHINI investigated. FIACCHINI made a plea for reducing proof corrections to a minimum, which the printers had stated was essential if the CROCE was to be produced by the 25th of the month. Discussed with G Branch MILA and later agreed with FIACCHINI that:

- (a) information in CROCE would be as at 6th of the month and amendments subsequent to that date would NOT be made by MILA;
- (b) corrections of the first proof would be limited by MILA to printers errors, or at the most where some correction of the draft had NOT been properly understood;
- (c) the second proof would still have to be seen by MILA, but to save time an MILA rep would do the necessary checking at the printers. Corrections would be printers errors only.

4. ALBANIAN personnel in the Italian Army:

LOMBARDI said that the project of settlement was under consideration by the various Ministries concerned, some of whom still had to give an opinion. It would then have to go before the Cabinet. In all a matter of days.

Subsequently the writer had Lt-Col SEMENOV of the above, without entering into any details of the settlement, which the writer has never discussed with the ALBANIAN reps.

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5. Mine clearance:

The letter referred to in para 7 (a) of log 10/15 Sep has gone forward to the President of the Council, but it is NOT known how soon a cabinet ruling can be obtained.

6. General BELLONO:

Handed to LOMBARDI original of the late General's letter dated 25 Aug. Quite of his own accord, LOMBARDI promised the best possible financial settlement for the General's widow. He referred to the whole business as "this most pitiful case".

7. Camp 337 (COITANO):

General ODIGONE has come whinnying back with drastic proposals for dealing with the ~~else~~ problem. Sixty - repeat sixty - three-man commissions are to be formed for investigating the 32,000 cases, and giving summary provisional decisions on the future of the detainees. One third of the personnel for the commissions will be military, the remainder civilians. LOMBARDI is planning to have the whole thing solved by 15 Oct. In the meantime the obstacle created by the CCS condition on release has been made all too clear by MIA letter A/107 of 18 Aug and attachment dated 11 Aug. Consulted C of S MIA and infd LOMBARDI that "release on parole" (liberta vigilata) will NOT be construed as contravening the above clause. LOMBARDI will accordingly proceed on this basis.

8. Accn in ROME required by Italian Army:

Infd LOMBARDI that C.O.C. had personally intervened with RAAG, and had been infd by Brig IOW that the whole policy on accn in ROME area was under discussion. A policy ruling was expected from AFHQ within a few days. The trouble was that different authorities were bidding for the same accn. In the meantime infd LOMBARDI that:

- (a) a number of buildings suitable for hospitals were already vacant in or near ROME (gave details of five such buildings). The Collegio SAINIATI is earmarked for a hosp for another authority.
 - (b) The Caserma MUSSOLINI is NOT ideal as barrack accn, being inside the town and inadequately provided with parade grounds. It was believed that in any event a bid had been entered, as soon for refugees, at present billeted in schools.
- LOMBARDI made the point that the Italian Army had a vast amount of property being used by all and sundry as emergency accn of one sort or another. All the Italian Army asks now is that the small proportion of their property which they want back for their reduced commitments shall atleast be the best of what there is, and of their own choosing, so as not to compel the tips of the interim army to live in the most antiquated bug infested barracks, with the repercussions on their morale only to be expected from such conditions.

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LOMBARDI made the point that the Italian Army had a vast amount of property being used by all and sundry as emergency accn of one sort or another. All the Italian Army asks now is that the small proportion of their property which they want back for their reduced commitments shall atleast be the best of what there is, and of their own choosing, so as not to compel the tps of the interim army to live in the most antiquated bug infested barracks, with the repercussions on their morale only to be expected from such conditions.

The writer recommended to LOMBARDI that a further bid be made, bearing in mind:

- location on outskirts of town;
- suitable facilities for drill and trg.

On the subject of location, LOMBARDI's opinion was that this cuts both ways, since the employment of the tps on gd duties being mostly near the centre of the town, considerable effort would be wasted getting them backwards and forwards to their billets outside the town.

9. GEN BOLOGNA:

Mentioned to LOMBARDI a propos of G.O.C.'s talk with JACINI on 25 Sep, that G.O.C. had intended asking the Minister his opinion of General BOLOGNA. In reviewing BOLOGNA's activities while in comd of MANTOVA Div, from the time in CALABRIA up to date, G.O.C. was satisfied that he had done very well throughout and that to-day the MANTOVA Div was in as good, or even better shape than the other Eps. LOMBARDI agreed that BOLOGNA had done well, but said that he had many enemies within his fm, although this was of relative importance.

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9. (cont'd)

It was all the more unfortunate added LOMBARDI, that BOLONGNA would reach retiring age at the end of this year and that nothing could save him. BOLONGNA is about 40th in seniority among the Brig Gens, and as LOMBARDI pointed out, there is no such thing today as accelerated promotion, other than promotion on the field, from which he was precluded since his firm never went into the line.

10. Recovery of Army vehs in the MAREM:

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Clarified with LOMBARDI the exact poem as intended by G.O.C. in his conversation with the Minister 13 Sep, i.e. no suspension of the withdrawals, but encouraging users to come fwd by making registrations of the vehs a first step, and secondly deciding in conjunction with A.C. whether the use by civilians was essential to the life of the community. If the services performed by the veh was considered NOT essential then it would be retained by the Army; if the service is an essential one, then the Army will supply an Army driver and loan the veh to the civilian on detail.

A new and precise instr is being prepared and will be sent up within the next 24 hrs, with copy to MIA.

11. San MARCO Regt:

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After consultation with G 1, Inf'd FLACCHINI that:

(a) A.F.H.Q. had agreed that as soon as the 10 Territorial Bde is two thirds complete (i.e. two hrs handed over to Italian cons and in working order) the San MARCO Regt will be withdrawn and handed back to the Navy.

(b) It is estimated that this will be about mid October.

(c) The proposal to relieve one San MARCO Bn as soon as the first Army Bn becomes available is NOT acceptable.

1. Sig Comms: Further talk on general situation of Italian Army sig comms:- continue to operate same.

(a) Italian Army has own telegraph lines to main centres and will comms can be maintained with all pts within 12-hr maxims - i.e. overnight.

(b) LOMBARDI has recd assurances from sigs office SMC that telegraphic comms can be maintained with all pts within 12-hr maxims - i.e. overnight.

(c) Inf'd LOMBARDI (as result of meeting with Lt-Col MILLAR, Comms S/C A.C.) that AFHQ agrees to removal of restrictions on use of W/Y transmitters, and outside serials etc, but frequency allocation will still be made by AFHQ. This is tantamount to AFHQ control, as a transmitter is of no use without a frequency.

(d) Control of frequencies will enable Italian authorities to regulate use of unauthorised transmitters, and thus keep a check on abuses of the proposed decree law, which was agreed by the cabinet during August. SMC was concerned over the use which might be made of W/Y by unauthorised subversive orgs.

(e) Advised LOMBARDI that if the War Ministry is seriously considering the need for W/Y comms they must apply to the Ministry of Posts and Telecoms, which is the coordinating authority that applies to AFHQ for frequencies. Warned him though that very few frequencies have been allotted to Italian authorities hitherto and that there are high priority needs outstanding.

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2. Meeting G.O.C./ JACOBI:
The Minister was indisposed a.m. 11 Sep and kept to his apartment. Saw JACOBI later in the day and arranged appointment for G.O.C. 16.30 hrs 13 Sep, this being the only half day JACOBI is free until after his return from the NORTH next week.

Tentatively arranged with LOMBARDI for the General meeting for Thursday 20 Sep at 09.30 hrs.

3. FISA Camp (327):
C of S

As the result of an alarmist report from the Chief of Police in FISA, on the "pitiful" conditions in the camp, the Italian Government is sitting up and taking notice and action is about to be taken. The War Ministry is sending GEN ODIERNE post haste to COLEMANO (12 Sep) to make recommendations in situ on the disposal or otherwise of the prisoners and internees. On his return the necessary machinery will be set in motion without delay.

Informed LOMBARDI at the same time of developments affecting Camp 326.

Appointments:

2. Meeting G.O.C./ JACINI: Comd

Tentatively arranged with LOMBARDI for the General meeting for Thursday 20 Sep at 0930 hrs.

3. PISA Camp (327): C of S

As the result of an alarmist report from the Chief of Police in PISA, on the "pitiful" conditions in the camp, the Italian Government is sitting up and taking notice and action is about to be taken. The War Ministry is sending GEN ODORICO post haste to COLEMANO (12 Sep) to make recommendations in situ on the disposal or otherwise of the prisoners and internees. On his return the necessary machinery will be set in motion without delay.

Informed LOMBARDI at the same time of developments affecting Camp 336.

4. Appointments: A

The following amendment is made to para 7 of log 3 - 8 Sep:-

- Brig Gen BORGARDI - to 2 i/o 230 Adm Div.

- Brig Gen CHIESALDI - to hospital for operation.

The post of Comd 5 Bde CHERSERA Div has NOT yet been filled.

5. Conveyed G.O.C.'s approval to appointment of Brig Gen ROMEO Comd to Comd CASANO in place of Brig Gen VERDI who is transferred to ROMA for special duties. A

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6. Reduction of offr cadres: Comd A

LOMBARDI now considers that the commissions for grading senior offr should be able to start work about 20 Sep. There will be three commissions, one for majors (headed by VERDI), one for Lt-Cols (headed by Maj Gen FERROVIZZI) and one for cols. The latter will be examined by the existing commission which has already dealt with gen offr.

7. Also spoke LOMBARDI on following points:

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(a) future policy on arms clearances: he confirmed War Ministry's opinion that this ought to be a national and not army commitment, and that the army's responsibility should be limited to providing the necessary instructors for training civilian operators. A letter requesting confirmation of this policy is being sent to PARRI.

(b) ALBANIAN subjects serving in Italian Army:

Following a visit to MILA by Lt-Col SUKACOV and Capt LERAKOVA, requested LOMBARDI if he could hasten the Govt decision on the policy to be followed in dealing with these people. LOMBARDI could not recall off hand what the position was and promised to find out and speed things up.

(c) Potential candidate for post of DEZ.

(d) Camp to be set up near FLORENCE for Fascist Women Auxiliaries.

(e) Need to shake up gen offrs as they are mostly office bound and rarely get out into their territories to visit depots and installations.

(f) Collected record card for Brig Gen PASCALE.

(g) The ten gen offrs have arrived from GERMANY, with the usual harrowing tales of German treatment. LOMBARDI had already spoken to four or five of them.

They report that in one camp in EASTERN GERMANY (presumably in Russians hands) there are 140 Italian generals and admirals. These are nearly all senior offrs who refused to cooperate with the Germans after the Armistice, and incl two of LOMBARDI's own brothers.

(h) Banks for partisan offrs: LOMBARDI has slipped in a cunning clause in the proposed decree law. Recognition of individual ranks will be based not on the numbers the partisan leaders say they commanded, but on the numbers of weapons handed in by each fm and unit. After all these months this project is still in the discussion stage.

8. Fascist Women Auxiliaries: MORIACO will phone Gen DE SIGNORE to inform him that:

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(a) C of S MILA will be visiting FLORENCE on 14 Sep to discuss with Gen DE SIGNORE the transfer to Italian Army Authorities of 342 female prisoners now in US hands.

(b) buildings exist at MONTELEONE suitable for housing the prisoners, but that a civil authority in FLORENCE is trying to get its hands on the buildings for other purposes.

(c) Gen DE SIGNORE to start thinking about the matter and securing what information he can.

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(d) Camp to be set up near FLORENCE for Fascist Women Auxiliaries.

(e) Need to shake up gen offrs as they are mostly officer bound and rarely get out into their territories to visit depots and installations.

8. Fascist Women Auxiliaries: MARIANO will phone Gen DE SIENNE to inform him that:

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(a) C of S MELA will be visiting FLORENCE on 14 Sep to discuss with Gen DE SIENNE the transfer to Italian Army Authorities of 342 female prisoners now in US hands.

(b) buildings exist at MARMIANO suitable for housing the prisoners, but that a civil authority in FLORENCE is trying to get its hands on the buildings for other purposes.

(c) Gen DE SIENNE to start thinking about the matter and securing what information he can.

COUNT JAGINI

9. Accompanied G.O.C. for general talk on following subjects:
(13 Sep)

(a) BBC broadcast on Italian Army: the Minister thanked G.O.C. for his interest in arranging the talk and for his appreciation of the efforts of the Italian Army.

(b) Arrangements were confirmed for meeting 14 Sep 1030 hrs at HQ. MELA. It was stated that a copy of G.O.C.s address on the future of the Italian Army would be handed to War Minister who agreed that it should be translated and circulated only to those Director Generals who were immediately concerned.

(c) G.O.C. reported on his tour of the NORTH and his impressions of the Territorial Comds, whom he considered had been well chosen by CASATI. He had also seen Gen TOMASELLI comd 228 Adm Div, which would be broken up in the near future. G.O.C. stated that TOMASELLI had done very well during his period of association with 8 Army and deserved a good appointment when he leaves 228 Adm Div.

G.O.C. had also seen Gens SCATTINI and PRIALORSI. The former did well in combat but is apt now to find too many difficulties in everything that has to be done, and in particular made a very shocking and irrelevant remark about soon for offrs at GENANO.

PRIALORSI had done well since he took over the comd of the POLONEZ. He had a strong character, was a good general and had made a big improvement in the div since his arrival. G.O.C. mentioned that he was inclined to be restive over orders given by the Allies, and cited the conversation he had had with CASATI on this subject. It was NOT considered serious, as it was rather in keeping with PRIALORSI's character.

G.O.C. spoke also of the particularly good impression made by Gen NEGROVI and of the excellent relationship between him and the Prefect of BOLZANO.

(d) On the subject of Territorial Comds, the Minister mentioned the following reshuffle he had in mind

(e) The Minister deplored the situation he had been put into by the political attacks on his most senior generals. He said that there were numbers of gen offrs in prison awaiting trial on charges relating to the period of the armistice, who could only be tried by the few surviving top rankers of the Army. If the judges were to be impeached because of party whims he really did not know what he should do next. The last two who were senior enough to act as judges of senior offrs - AGO and AMANTIA - have been indicated as former senators, and the trials of the gens who have already languished for months in prison are again at a complete standstill.

(f) G.O.C. mentioned pay reductions which were subject of universal complaint throughout the Army. JACINI stated that matters are being arranged so that up to Lt-Col incl no one will suffer. G.O.C. recommended that publicity be given to this in LA PAVIA. It was also stated that steps were being taken to continue the 20 lire allowance for yrs formerly working in Allied service units.

(g) While the Territorial Comds showed a proper appreciation of the purpose and scope of GENANO, G.O.C. was under the impression that some of the Comds had other ideas on the subject. For instance, some Comds had the idea that trg should be done within their own fans, and were turning the fan into a sort of watertight compartment. It was important to correct this attitude.

(h) Try of Combat Comd ending in the

Gen. NICHICHI and of the excellent relationship between him and the Prefect of BOLZANO.

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(g) While the Territorial Comds showed a proper appreciation of the purpose and scope of CESANO, G.O.C. was under the impression that some Gp Comds had other ideas on the subject. For instance, some comds had the idea that trg should be done within their own fms, and were turning the fm into a sort of watertight compartment. It was important to correct this attitude.

(h) Trg of Combat Gps: owing to the scattered nature of their duties, little or no trg is being done. G.O.C. has recommended that some units of the div be fully employed on gd and security duties, thus liberating one or two complete bns or btys for trg. After a period of trg these bns and btys can replace the scattered units who will have their turn at trg. At the present time all units are partially engaged on gd duties and no trg is possible.

(1) JACINI raised the general question of soon for Territorial bdes and bns, and the need to secure derequisition of suitable buildings. G.O.C. promised to investigate the matter personally.

(2) JACINI read out parts of his letter of 12 Sep on the subject of need for modern arms for C.C.H.B. He said he was forced to bring the matter up again because of circumstances. G.O.C. agreed to review the matter

(b) Recovery of vehicles and spares: G.O.C. was able to inform the Minister of a big improvement in the situation. Sufficient reserves of army vns had been discovered to last the Army for five years. More vehicles were being recovered and placed in circulation.

JACINI explained his own position in this matter, being torn between his anxiety as War Minister to get the vns back from civilian use, and his responsibility as member of the Govt for maintaining the essential tpt services of the country in being. In consideration of the fact that some of these army vns were being used for vital services, G.O.C. proposed that all users of army vns be compelled to register at the Territorial H.Q.s and declare the use to which the vns are being put. It could then be decided whether the need was really vital.

An identical statement had already been submitted to MILA by another Albanian Offr, Capt. ASLAN LIBCHOVA, and forwarded by MILA to War Ministry.

LIBCHOVA had previously discussed the situation with CAMALE and the latter has been elaborating a settlement which has finally received the approval of the Italian authorities. CAMALE authorized the writer to inform LIBCHOVA that he would receive comm of the details of the settlement during the present week. SUKACEV's name was NOT mentioned during this conversation with CAMALE. The writer subsequently phoned SUKACEV and infd him as well. It was made clear to both sides during these conversations that the question at issue is fundamentally one to be settled directly between the War Ministry and the Albanian personnel concerned.

COL. LOMBARDI

12. Appointment for Col. NEGROMI:

Reminded LOMBARDI of the efforts made by NEGROMI to keep his liaison Sec alive after the disbandment of AAI, with the proposal to transfer the Sec to AFHQ. This scheme had come to nothing.

Inf'd LOMBARDI that a sig had now arrived from C.G. US Tps in AUSTRIA requesting Col. NEGROMI plus one Cofr and five ORs to serve as Liaison unit on Gen CLARK's HQ. It was NOT known what functions this unit would have, since there existed no Italian Tps in AUSTRIA. Simultaneously, a recommendation had been made by head of G-2 AFHQ that NEGROMI be appointed to command LAI (SIB). This latter move had been provoked by NEGROMI himself who had inf'd AFHQ that AGHIFOLLIO had already vacated his post.

LOMBARDI stated in reply that NEGROMI had been to him some time ago saying that Gen. CLARK would be taking him and a few others to AUSTRIA with his HQ. LOMBARDI asked him what he would be doing there and NEGROMI indicated that his work would be similar to that being carried out by FICKE VERMAZZA and other Italian Oftrs in FRANCE. LOMBARDI had mentioned the question of funds, but it appears that NEGROMI intended making the arrangements for himself and his followers, and would make no call on the War Ministry other than for normal pay and allowances in Lire. LOMBARDI added that while the Ministry had neither suggested this mission nor had official business to entrust to NEGROMI, at the same time he felt some good would be done by having this Det in AUSTRIA to help with the repatriation of PWs, refugees, etc.

As regards the second case, LOMBARDI said that there was no question of AGHIFOLLIO leaving the LAI service for the time being, nor was he convinced that NEGROMI was altogether the right man for the job when the post does become vacant. He knew that NEGROMI had aspired to the post, but he was certainly NOT authorized to talk to AFHQ about it. If MMIA would put this in writing he would see that it was taken up strongly with NEGROMI.

13. Italian Army Property (Recovery):

Asked LOMBARDI if he knew of any order from the Govt to the Prefects entrusting the latter with control of Army vehs and other property now in the hands of civilians etc. He stated that he had rec'd complaints from T. Hqs at GENOA, FLORENCE and was in comm with Ministry of Interior on the subject. He doubted whether a direct order existed, but thought that the Prefects might well be trying to take advantage of some existing regulations which they were interpreting to suit their own ends.

The writer has seen the last edition, which; (1) agrees that CESSARO must continue to serve as the central school for trg instructors, officer and NCO cadres and certain categories of specialists;

- (ii) draws attention to certain difficulties in equitably reducing an "annual class" of 250,000 to 100,000, (though it is clarified that these difficulties would NOT necessarily stand in the way of the "interim army");
- (iii) recommends a call-up twice a year (at six-monthly intervals) and as a corollary envisages numerous difficulties of a practical and adm nature in recruiting 10,000 men ~~in~~ each month, both in the call-up process and in the trg stages.

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(e) Ref (d) (ii) above, in a normal year the Army "votes" would be too small to permit of an equitable call-up of an entire age-group, and so as to obviate a disparity of military obligations, a larger number than budgeted for would be called up at the beginning of the Army year, some of the men serving only 3 months, and others six, seven or eighteen months. Thus at the end of the Army year the strength would be below the budgeted figure, but taken through the year the average would correspond with that allowed in the Army votes. This system of the "balanced force" (forza bilanciata) also gives the Army a proportion of trained personnel at any time of the year.

The imposition of a rigid ceiling creates a problem not easy to overcome: an "ad hoc" solution can be thought out for the "interim forces" but for the permanent army a satisfactory method has yet to be found. If it is the Allied intention that the authorized ceiling is a maximum strength NOT to be exceeded, this should be authoritatively stated now for the interim army, and in due course for the permanent force, to enable the War Ministry to plan accordingly.

Accompanied G-1 to SSMZ (6 Aug) for meeting on "Interim" Army:

(a) G-1 stated that the immediate future of the Italian Army had been under consideration at AFHQ, as a result of which certain proposals had now been put fwd to the CCS at WASHINGTON. The proposed ceiling and strength of the main categories were mentioned. At the same time, it was made very clear that the entire project was only in the examination stage, that no decisions had been taken, nor were any decisions to be implied by this announcement.

(b) Nevertheless G-1 considered that the time had now come for SSMZ to make a study of certain aspects of the proposals and submit their observations. It was agreed that SSMZ would reply as soon as possible on the following form headings.

(1) General observations on the whole project;

(ii) Proposed variations (if any) to MG's of Combat Gps, incl the provision, if required, of Arm car Units, and the conversion of one or more Gruppi to Alpini personnel with consequent provision of auxiliary units.

(iii) Reorganization and increase of Territorial Org from 2,000 to 7,000 all ranks. This info to be by main headings only, and NOT to incl MG's for the present.

(iv) Proposed source of Territorial Bde HQs and the missing 1st Bde. G-1 had outlined his proposals for converting existing Cd Bns and Coy's to Territorial Bdes, with an apparent deficiency at this moment of six Coy's.

(c) SSMZ reaction to above was wholly favourable, with the single exception of the proposed exclusion of Arty from Territorial Bdes and I.S. Divs. Grounds of objections were:-

(1) For quelling civil disturbances, Gps armed with small arms and automatic weapons only would have no advantage over the civil population, which is abundantly equipped with weapons of this kind. The Arty is rated by SSMZ to have very considerable moral value for maintaining law and order.

(ii) It would leave the Italian Army with only the Combat

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(ii) It would leave the Italian Army with only the Combat Gp Arty as a true medium for this branch of the service, which is proportionately very small for the size of the Army. They say they would also be faced with the necessity of converting large numbers of regular Arty Cofrs and MOCs to other purposes.

SARE will submit their observations and proposals in writing.

f. Discharge of 1915 Class:

Informed FIACENTINI that AFHQ had decided to demobilize the 1915 Class and that the Executive Order would follow in a day or two. FIACENTINI stated that the 1914 Class had all been sent home, with the exception of a few units who still held men on specialist jobs whom they had been unable to release without replacement.

5. Fascist prisoners and detention camps:

Accompanied G of S MIA on visit to the War Minister 7 Aug to convey Allied decision to hand over to Italian Govt the custody of 52,000 Fascist personnel in a concentration camp at FISA.

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(a) JACINI was told that GOS policy was that while the detainees were in Allied hands they would NOT be released before all cooperation had been reestablished. But as soon as they were handed over to the Italian Govt for safe keeping it would be up to the Italian Govt to decide what should become of them.

(b) Two Italian Gd Sns and a Regt Hq would be made available for administering and guarding the camp.

(c) The ration for the internees would continue on the same scale as hitherto (2,000 calories). The Minister was handed a list of items showing which were to come from Allied Army sources and which from Italian Army sources. In order to maintain Army control over distribution, it had been laid down that the War Ministry would be responsible for administering rations in the camp.

(d) The hand-over was required to take place as soon as possible, but until the Italian authorities had their machinery working properly, a U.S. Det would continue to remain at the camp in an advisory capacity.

(e) Fascist detainees in civil prisons in NORTH Italy:

A further 24,000 persons were congesting the civil prisons in the Northern Regions and AMG and Civil authorities were pressing for their removal. AFHQ had now offered to turn over to the Italian authorities for this purpose an existing camp site near MCDENA with a capacity of 50,000, until recently used for German PW's. Persons detained here would be on civil rations, but two Italian Gd Sns would be made available for Gd duties.

(f) In reply to a question by JACINI, it was stated that movement of these 24,000 detainees from prisons to camp would be under arrangements of AMG/Civil authorities, and that their tpt would NOT be a War Ministry responsibility.

(g) The Minister said that it would be necessary for him to consult the Govt before adhering to the above arrangements. It looked as though the FISA Camp would become entirely a War Ministry responsibility for all purposes, the Ministry of Grace and Justice concerning itself solely with the classification, exami-

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(g) The Minister said that it would be necessary for him to consult the Govt before adhering to the above arrangements. It looked as though the FISA Camp would become entirely a War Ministry responsibility for all purposes, the Ministry of Grace and Justice concerning itself solely with the classification, examination and trial of prisoners. On the other hand, the MARELLA Camp would very likely have to be a "Grace and Justice" responsibility, with the Army providing the Guards.

(h) JACINI promised to secure a reply by the 11th, so that a Reece party could leave KME early in the following week to visit both Camp sites. The party would consist of:-

- Rep of War Ministry
- Rep of Ministry of Grace and Justice
- Col commanding the Regt HQ (if not already at FISA)
- (?) Rep of MARELLA.

(i) MARELLA to confirm the entire proposition in writing.

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COL. PLACENTINI

4. The Conference of Gen. Offrs duly commenced 10 Aug with a session presided over by Gen. CADEMA. A large number of current controversial problems were raised and discussed at length, chief among them being:-

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(a) Prestige of the Army is at a very low ebb:

The reasons are many and deep-rooted, and known to all, but the fact remains. Particularly is this serious if in the future the tps have to be used for maintaining law and order. Frequent attacks are made on the Army publicly and in the press, and the authority of those in comd is held in little respect. This has been especially noted by Territorial Comds in their dealings with Provincial Prefects.

The Minister has recently issued a circular reminding Offrs that they are NOT allowed to meddle in politics. The opinion of the Generals was that if the officers are not allowed to defend the Army this should be done energetically and adequately by the War Minister, which is NOT the case at the moment. (The writer has on previous occasions discussed with LOMBARDI - who is in full agreement - the need for a qualified PRO for the War Ministry).

(b) Pay and conditions of the tps:

(1) Gruppi Comds represented strongly that there should be no reduction in the pay of ORs who have taken part in ops, or drawn the higher rate of pay on the grounds of avoiding excessive discontent.

(11) An increase in the basic rates of pay of ORs was pressed for, it being pointed out that the Territorial tps, who were the lowest paid, were now the hardest worked, while the Allied Service tps received a bonus for doing little or nothing which was the situation of many units today.

(111) On the question of better pay and conditions for the Interim Army, it was explained to the Generals that the Italian Treasury was creating serious difficulties over present rates of pay, let alone increases for the future. In the same way, there was only a limited supply of uniforms and boots from Allied sources and little or no Italian Army stocks, so that none could be spared for new recruits of younger age Ops. The reaction of the Generals to this was that it would be infinitely preferable to start the Interim Army with fewer tps than authorized by the Allies, and only work up to the approved

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(c) MILA Liaison Officers:

Appreciation was expressed of the help given by LO's and it was stated to be very desirable to have an LO for each Territorial Hq.

(d) Recovery Units:

Dissatisfaction was expressed in some cases with the meagre results achieved by Recovery Units. It was recommended that these units be under the direct command of the Terr. Hqs, and NOT under control of MILA LO's, for reasons of expediency and discipline.

5. FOGGIA Round-up:
LOMBARDI was informed 3 Aug by phone from Ministry of Interior that the latter Ministry recommends that the Call-up is NOT implemented, to avoid possibilities of upsetting the population and causing public disturbances. Infd G-1.

GEN. PROPERZI

6. Called at the General's request to clarify pts raised by GOC at meeting on 31 July. Set PROPERZI's mind at ease that no personal attack is intended against him by GOC's insistence on the amount of attention to be devoted to the MT side of his branch, as distinct from the Arty side of the business. PROPERZI insisted that four fifths of the activities of himself and his directorate are devoted to MT and that all facilities for repairs, incl Arty shops are turned over to repairing engines and vehs.

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The General referred to the present efforts of the War Ministry to retake possession of Italian Army vehs in the hands of civilians and to the hostility of certain sections of the population and press. The matter was being discussed at a Cabinet meeting at which JACINI would have to face strong opposition from a number of his colleagues.

The conversation then turned to MT maintenance and to the need for a much greater degree of discipline in MT Units. A special Officer's D & M course at CESANO was discussed, and the possibility of 30 or 40 Officers being picked from other than MT Units on account of their capacity to command and instill discipline and sent on this course to replace the obviously incompetent and not-so-keen Officers now serving with MT Units. PRG ERZJ agreed that much could be done in this direction and promised to study the matter. He himself admitted that he had never been to CESANO!

Future requirements of dvr and mechanic rfts for the IMI-ITI Gate-sory were also touched on and it was explained to PRG ERZJ that the resources of CESANO would be available for this purpose in the not-so-distant future. In the meantime rfts urgently needed would have to be scraped together from units being disbanded.

7. Conference on 4 Aug on the future of RVC CESANO and the place it will occupy in the "Interim" Army and later. This raised a number of questions of a very fundamental nature, which had not hitherto been considered either on the Allied or on the Italian side:-

(a) Recruitment for the Interim Army: Sooner or later fresh blood will be needed to replace the classes who have already served in the Army for several years, and also to equalise the military obligations of the whole country. Normal conscriptive procedure is for the majority of the recruits to be called up simultaneously for a maximum period of 18 months, though some are released after 12 months because of particular family or economic conditions. It follows, therefore, that in a normal year the size of the Army is not constant, being at its maximum when a new class is called up, and there is still a residue from the previous class serving the last six of the 12 months, and at its minimum when the new class is between its sixth and twelfth month. This residue or overlap is fully trained and provides the cpls and L/Opls and framework for the new recruits, the Sgts and W/O's being regular soldiers. It appears not to have occurred to SAHE that they would not be permitted to exceed the authorised ceiling in the future to allow this fluctuation to take place. There is an alternative, and that is to conscript a class in three four-monthly blocks. At any period in the year this will result in the Army being 1/3 trained, 1/3 semi-trained and 1/3 with little or no trg at all.

Assuming, for the sake of argument, that of 140,000 Offrs and

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Assuming, for the sake of argument, that of 140,000 Oftrs and men, 40,000 are regular Oftrs, W/O's and Specialists, then 100,000 will need to be called to the colours on conscripted service. In parenthesis it can be said that the Italian General Staff would naturally prefer 140,000 regulars, but this is something that the Italian exchequer can NOT now afford. 1211

Since equality of conscripted service for the whole population is a "time qua non" it follows that the 100,000 will need to serve for twelve months, and will then be replaced by the next class, the whole operation being started and developed at four-monthly intervals.

(b) Using the above "cock shy" as a yardstick for considering the future of CESANO, it will be seen that every four months there will be 30/35,000 recruits to receive basic trg. CESANO, as at present organised, can deal with 7,500 men in 3 - 4 months (in addition to the specialist courses), so that the CESANO org would need to be multiplied four or five times to deal simultaneously with the normal intake of recruits. This is the long term plan advocated by

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LIUZZI, but is considered to be beyond realization at this time through lack of organized camp sites. Normal procedure in the past has been for recruits to be called up at local Military District offices and drafted to local regimental depots, where they received their basic trg. Fortunately, a rump of the Territorial Grp has been allowed to survive, and this can be adapted to the forthcoming requirements. There is the added advantage that by this method the movement by rail of the recruits is kept to local and purely minimum proportion.

(c) Having covered all this ground, LIUZZI was able to conclude and recommend that:-

(1) GESANO specialist courses be extended and intensified;

(11) GESANO basic trg units be composed as to rank and file of trained personnel (from the 1st category) to serve as training centre for officers and NCO's, under supervision of existing trg cadres. The intention would be gradually to pass all Oftrs and NCO's through this centre, in the same way as used to be done at the Central Army Schools at CIVITAVECCHIA.

(111) LIUZZI was most definite and categorical as to the great importance which the General Staff attaches to GESANO for the future of the Italian Army.

(11) CESAMO will be composed of trained personnel (from the 1st category) to serve as training centre for officers and NCO's, under supervision of existing trg cadres. 1. ALPINI Divs: Conferred with senior officials of SERR on the subject of the two Raggruppamenti ALPINI included in the War Ministry's proposals for an interim Army, and also subject of CADORNA's letter of 24 July.

2. Explained that the matter had cropped up again as the result of someone (? PARGI) talking to Admiral SERR about the need of two additional divisions for the interim Army. SERR knew no such proposals emanating from the War Ministry and agreed that it was probably the ALPINI proposal and that someone had got hold of the wrong end of the stick.

3. The writer proceeded to explain that while a decision was still awaited from Higher Allied Authorities on the "interim Army" it was not improbable that some criticism would be made on the disproportion of the "services" category, which was very small, particularly if judged by Allied standards. Accordingly it might be that some readjustment would be suggested increasing the latter category at the expense of the operational trps, probably the combat grp block, which could be considered less important at this moment than the internal security category.

4. It might well be therefore, that there would be no room in the combat group category for the two Alpin Divs. This possibility was not considered by MIA to be very serious, in view of the temporary nature of the proposals, and the probability that during the period of the interim Army, Allied troops would be so placed as to prevent frontier problems. The NORTH-SEAS frontier, for instance, would definitely be an Allied responsibility during this period, and in any case, no troops were allowed within 25 kms of the international frontier.

5. In view of the doubts which have arisen in certain quarters as the result of action mentioned in para 2 above, G.O.C. wished to have assurances from the War Minister

- (a) that no additional request for Alpin Divs had been made by the War Ministry;
- (b) that a readjustment of categories within the War Ministry's proposals for the interim Army, increasing service troops at the expense of 15,000 of combat group category, would be acceptable to the War Ministry;
- (c) that the urgent representation of the War Ministry to reconstitute one or more Alpin Divs could be met by converting one or more of the present combat groups to Alpin Divs on the existing Combat Group W.E., with the addition of auxiliary units when required for operations in mountains. The writer enlarged on the Allied policy in this matter of standardisation of costs and drew a comparison with current Allied practice for men warfare.

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4. It might well be therefore, that there would be no room in the combat group category for the two Alpini Divs. This possibility was not considered by MIA to be very serious, in view of the temporary nature of the proposals, and the probability that during the period of the interim Army, Allied troops would be so placed as to prevent frontier problems. The NORTH-EAST frontier, for instance, would definitely be an Allied responsibility during this period, and in any case, no troops were allowed within 25 kms of the international frontier.

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- (b) that a readjustment of categories within the War Ministry's proposals for the interim Army, increasing service troops at the expense of 15,000 of combat group category, would be acceptable to the War Ministry;

6. CADORNA gave affirmative answers to all above questions, underlining the fact that the conversion of a combat group to Alpini troops would need to be a 100% change of personnel. Requested CADORNA to discuss the whole question with the Minister before 1800 hrs.

He knows that (a), which is mainly CARABINIERI, is no concern of MILA, but he evidently wants it to be known that the Govt, in his opinion, has no intention of pressing for the reorg and re-equipment of the CARABINIERI which CALORNA considers indispensable to restoring the authority and effectiveness of the machinery for maintaining law and order. Heading between the lines, the suggestion seems to be that it will pay the parties of the left to allow the CARABINIERI (hitherto an instrument of the right) to fall still further into disrepute. CALORNA was all for the Allies insisting on an immediate and energetic reorg and re-eqpt of the CARABINIERI, ordering the Italian Govt to carry this out, and themselves (the Allies) supplying certain essential items of eqpt, such as arm cars for the mobile bus.

CALORNA maintains that until this is done, the people will continue to regard public authority with contempt and that the reorg of the Army itself will be prejudiced.

On the subject of (b), CALORNA is all for cutting down, but he talks in such general terms that one wonders whether he has really gone into the matter at all. He admitted having given no directives to this effect to his staff. He talked about Italian Army property in the NORTH not yet handed over to the Allies, but he had nothing to say when the writer asked about starting with cutting down in the SOUTH, where things were already stabilized and where there were no problems such as existed in the NORTH.

On the Ofrr question, CALORNA is already coming under the spell of the SOUTH, and is now singing a different tune to what he was in MILAN two months ago. On "getting rid of Ofrrs and cutting down" he is now saying that these things take time! There are two schools of thought in the Ministry on the method of making the big cuts, and CALORNA has not yet decided which horse he will back. 1. Maj. SCAPATI:

SCAPATI arrived in ROME 8 July and is being sent on two weeks leave. The enquiry into his case has NOT yet been completed, mainly, it is alleged by SCAPATI, because of delays by the HJ in supplying statements. SCAPATI complains that he has been misjudged and backs this by quoting ULLI as saying there is nothing against him. He is anxious for a further appointment with one of the other Gruppi.

2. STROCCHI:

Urged on LOMBARDI to get this individual to BARI with all speed in view of forthcoming trial at which he will be needed as witness. It appears that STROCCHI was recently demobilized, but continued to be kept under surveillance. During past month he was given permission to go to MR PIACENZA where his father had just died. The local CC RR Post and BLOCCA T.H. were signalled 2 July to instruct STROCCHI to proceed immediately to BARI. Further instrs were sent 5 July and on 6 July Gen PALMA who was going to BOLOGNA was told to ensure that there is no slip-up.

3. "ITALIA" (GARIBALDI) Div:

PALERMO and party duly left by air 6 July. The following further information has been collected about Italian Ipe in JUGOSLAVIA:

- ITALIA Div, referred to above (about 3000 strong) built up around the "MATEJOTZI", "MAGGI" and "GARIBALDI" Bns has always fought in Northern JUGOSLAVIA.

2. STROCCO:

- Smaller gps, scattered here and there, about which no further details are available.

For those in SCUTARIST and CENTRAL JUGO-SLAVIA there is a collecting post at RAUSA, which has already repatriated some thousands and is steadily increasing its radius of action.

On the other hand it has been impossible hitherto to do anything for the men located in NORTH JUGO-SLAVIA, not withstanding repeated efforts through Allied and JUGO-SLAV authorities.

Major BOSCARDI

4. Collecting Post at RAGUSA (see above):

BOSCARDI stated that AFHQ had agreed in principle to supplying rations for former Italian Army personnel concentrating at RAUSA from the interior of JUGO-SLAVIA. Rations had been supplied on two occasions, the last time authorized by (State) letter of 30 Mar, when 25,000 rations were issued by 22 GRASS (BARI). This was negotiated locally through 37 Military Mission which no longer exists. BOSCARDI now requested information on proper channels for further supp of rations, since the last lot will be exhausted by mid-July. Dismissed wife of MARIA, Displaced Persons S/C (who would not play) and IFW S/C. Suggested to BOSCARDI in the meantime to push the matter through Italian Commissioner for refugees.

5. Italian women's services: discussed with Lombardi the contents of 8 Army Comd's letter on the future of 8 Army WVS ladies. War Ministry was about to write to MIA on this subject, proposing fusion with GAF. In view of delicate situation which exists, Lombardi stated that he was confident there would be no objection to WVS continuing to operate independently (as long as they are under contract to some Allied HQ), particularly if they were to concentrate on the static welfare centres, and leave all the mobile elements to the CAF. This is a practical view, in view of the increased benefits accruing to the Italian tpe.

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On the other hand Lombardi did feel that at least nominally the WVS ladies should give some allegiance to the War Ministry, and that he should have a list of their names etc. He rightly pointed out that if anything should happen to them and a question of compensation arose it would be to the War Ministry that they would turn and NOT to the Allies.

Lombardi went on to say that conditions for the CAF ladies were much inferior to those of the 8 Army contract, but what was more serious still was the fact that the Italian Treasury had stated that they would produce no further funds for any women's services.

Gen. ROMEO

1. Demobilization of older classes:

ROMEO still somewhat agitated about the slow progress of sending home men of the 1914 and older classes, and would like to see the rest of the 1914 class demobilized in the next week or two. In particular, he stated that Gen. VENTURINI of 212 Div had reported 1500 men of the older classes at LEBBERE whom IHS refused to allow to go home. This was contrary to the statements made at the meeting held at MIA 17 Jun, when it was announced that all older men of 210 and 212 Divs would be sent home without delay, as no replacements were required.

On the question of further classes being demobilized, the writer advised ROMEO that MIA was endeavouring to work out a definite programme, but as this was dependent on size of the army, availability of rfts, etc, it was not possible to make an announcement until some of these decisions had been made.

2. Article on demobilization for "LA FARKLA":

Handed in to ROMEO's Office suggested article with message from OOC. They will integrate with another article on similar lines which had already received MIA approval.

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The report on the enquiry into this Officer's conduct in connection with Republican prisoners is overdue. LOMBARDI gave assurances (2 July) that he will take hastening action and that SCAPATI will be transferred to ROME forthwith.

4. CAPIBARDI DIV (ex JUGOSLAVIA):

After two day's uncertainty as to 8 Army decision on PALERMO's intervention, was able to inform LOMBARDI (4 July) of arrival in ROME by air on that day of MARRAS, the present comd of the Div, (strength under 3000). (a) It was agreed by both sides, bearing in mind current disciplinary procedure in the Italian Army that the new correction centre would receive the younger offender rather than the "old law". In practical terms, this is the distinction between punishment awarded by unit or pen code for disciplinary offences and charges and sentences for "crimes" against the penal code, which are handled by the mil tribunal.

Maximum award by pen code is now 60 days, but longer periods of detention at the disciplinary centre can be achieved by "transferring" men from the unit to the centre. In practical terms, this is the distinction between punishment awarded by unit or for code for disciplinary offences, and charges and sentences for "crimes" against the penal code, which are handled by the mil tribunal.

(b) C of S MMA opened the meeting by stating that the demobilization of the older classes was NOT proceeding nearly fast enough. Immediately steps must be taken to bring this phase to a conclusion.

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1. (h) in reply to a question he stated that no penalty would be inflicted on those men who had arbitrarily come home: there was no loss of pay or bonus (except on those volunteers entitled to a bonus) but of course their papers would NOT be in order. This was only relatively serious, as there had been over 500,000 deserters all told in this war and it was inconceivable that they could all be dealt with. Such an arrangement would bring the expenditure within reasonable limits, and would still give the Minister the medium he required for publicising ideas and facts among the type.

GARIBALDI Regt: discussed with the Minister the present very unsatisfactory situation of this unit, which is due to leave in the near future and is below 50% of its strength and still losing strength. Reminded him of the pressure brought to bear on MMIA by the War Ministry for the retention of this unit on its repatriation from MONTE-NEGRO, which GOC had succeeded in obtaining on account of:-

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- (a) The traditional ties of the GARIBALDI name

Resentment has been expressed by PALERMO over the lack of enthusiasm shown by SIRE in supporting his request. As a minor concession SIRE now ask to be allowed to utilize 5 all ranks for a period of 30 days to wind up the affairs of the fm and give help of a welfare nature to the personnel being disbanded. The 5 all ranks would count against the present unallotted vacancies in the War Ministry establishment.

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SUMMARY OF CONVERSATION ON RECRUITMENT OF PATRIOTS IN NORTH

Patriot enlistment into the Army

1. Gen C. ORINA and patriot leaders are pressing for the implementation of the promised enlistment into the Army for two basic reasons:

- a) in order to ease the handing over of arms, dead line for which is now 7 June.
- b) in fulfillment written agreement which is alleged to have been signed between patriot leaders and AME about the end of last year or early this year. Under this agreement entry into the Army and granting of rank were to be sponsored by the Allies. It is asserted that non-fulfillment of this agreement would increase sense of discontent and handicap disbandment etc. IV Corps C of S (Col LADUE) and J5 (Col WALKER) did NOT display such a sense of urgency over the enlistment problem though agreeing that it would undoubtedly help the situation. IV Corps immediate concern is with handing in of arms, which is giving some results and proving a big problem, to date. They have NOT apparently connected the two.

On the other hand, senior AME officials for LOUISIANA Region (Cols POLSTRI and HANCOCK Regional and Deputy Regional Commissioners) were well informed and anxious to learn what action is being taken to meet patriot demands.

2. Numbers involved: the numbers of patriots directly concerned with enlistment into the Army and Polios is generally estimated at 20/25000, though there is scepticism on all sides as to the numbers who would in fact avail themselves of a chance to enlist. Both Cadorna and Walker were convinced that the numbers would be quite small, and that the clamour is probably raised by those who have an axe to grind or a position they wish to perpetuate. Nevertheless, the premises were made, and at least some show must be forthcoming of their implementation, if only on political grounds.

In discussing a token figure for NORTH WEST Italy, both CAUCINA and his political committee (which he consults on all matters affecting patriots) stated that 10,000 was a minimum to start with.

3. Method: the policy for the recruitment of volunteers into the Army was explained in detail to Cadorna, and discussed with Walker and Col CRIPPS (AC Patriot Branch) who were already familiar with current procedure. The obstacles to be overcome in the present system are that

- a) the problem is much vaster, geographically, numerically and on every other count than anything attempted hitherto;
- b) the authority and organization of the Italian Army are NOT yet established in NORTH WEST Italy;
- c) Patriot Branch do NOT have the machinery to feed, transport etc on such a scale;
- d) Organised Italian Army units are NOT yet established.

- d) Organised Italian Army HQ's are located a considerable distance away.
- e) the screening agencies type 'B' are for dealing with officers and regular HQ's only. They are NOT recruiting agencies, and in any event it is stressed that it would be impossible to do the job with personnel sent up from the SOUTH, who are NOT acceptable to patriots. Screening agencies type 'A' are still under Patriot Branch command, and Col CRIPPS was NOT able to state just where they are located. He considers ~~the~~ work is done and that they should be handed back to Italian comd.

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After discussing all these points in detail with Cadorna, he proposed the following solution :

- 1) to be allowed to recruit up to an agreed token figure in NORTH WEST Italy based on Territorial HQs, Districts and Depots ;

- ii) personnel employed for such recruitment, i.e. officers, NCOs and cadres to be former Italian Army personnel selected by Cadorna from local patriots ;
- iii) volunteers to be accepted as individuals and enlisted automatically into the Italian Army; at each centre the rfts to be organised as rfts bns 1000 strong.
- iv) rfts to be drafted in small numbers, to Adm Divs and posted to units as required to make up deficiencies.
- v) responsibility for feeding, clothing, accommodation and general organisation to be Cadorna's responsibility up to the time rfts arrive at Adm Divs.

The above plan was discussed with Cols LAMUS and KALKER, and a draft was prepared for IV Corps to send to AFHQ. This was submitted (as a working basis) to Cadorna who was asked explicitly whether he would accept the responsibility for his part of the plan. The writer accompanied Cadorna to submit the plan to his political committee, who accepted the scheme, but made two requests :

- i) that consideration should be given to enlisting complete bands and allowing them to serve together ;
- ii) that enlistment into the ARMY was a right due to them (vide 1 b) and not a favour to be granted.

The difficulties inherent in (i) above were explained to the committee.

The results of this meeting were communicated to Col Walker on 24 May and discussed with Cripps, Vining and Howard 25 May.

4. Other Factors

- (a) Cadorna is well aware of the undesirability of enlisting complete bands and knows Allied policy in this matter. His personal inclinations can be said to be midway between the extreme patriots and the Allies - he would NOT oppose the keeping together of small numbers - pls or coys - as he considers these elements would be assimilated in the character of the parent unit.
- (b) Cadorna is violently opposed to the bulk of the officer element from the SOUTH. He considers the majority to be incompetent and escapist and that few would find a place in a New Italian Army. Therefore the employment of any such officers in the NORTH at the present time has to be proceeded with very warily.
- (c) It has been carefully explained to the authorities contacted by the writer, both Allied and Italian, that the strength and ceiling of the Italian Army just at this moment are rather unknown quantities and that it follows that the requirement of rfts is equally uncertain.
- (d) It has been made equally clear to the Italian Authorities that the Italian Army in the SOUTH is practically destitute of all the

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- (c) It has been carefully explained to the authorities contacted by the writer, both Allied and Italian, that the strength and ceiling of the Italian Army just at this moment are rather unknown quantities and that it follows that the requirement of rfts is equally uncertain.
- (d) It has been made equally clear to the Italian Authorities that the Italian Army in the SOUTH/practically destitute of all the sort of stores needed for an enlistment of volunteers on a large scale. Therefore anything that had to be done in a hurry would have to rely on local resources.

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5. Conclusions

It was the common opinion of Allied and Italian authorities that

- a) enlistment of volunteers in NORTH-WEST Italy should be implemented soonest, in any event NOT later than 7 June;

Partisans: Gen Cadorna flew down from Milan for urgent consultations with the Italian Gov't. Patriots in the NORTH were one of the main subjects. Already a trickle had started (about 5% absent without leave in 212 Div) and if the dam bursts the older men will desert en masse and the younger ones will go as well, and the whole army will disintegrate.

Ronco proposes that firm comds be given the power to send the older men home, by arrangements with local Allied authorities, and according to the circumstances prevailing in each unit. Thus without laying down any complicated regulations, the question of numbers to be sent home straight away would be regulated by unit commitments. This would be understood by the men, and providing they saw a start being made and the situation is explained to them, they will respond and discipline will be safeguarded. But the necessary orders must be issued forthwith to avoid what RONCO called a "catastrophe".

1. Chief of Staff SMRE : Called at the Minister's request (3 May). Casati said that the President of the Council had that morning requested the Chief Commissioner AC for approval to appoint Gen CADORNA Chief of Staff of the Italian Army, with RONCO as deputy C of S. The minister stated that this would be an excellent move tending to bring together the forces of North and South, and was a well-deserved gesture towards CADORNA for the invaluable work he had done as head of the patriot forces in the North. The appointment was very acceptable to Cadorna and Ronco had readily agreed to serve under Cadorna as Deputy C of S. In any event the appointment which RONCO held was that of acting C of S, on account of his rank. I pointed out to the Minister - in passing - that this had not been made clear to GOC at the time. The personal impression on the writer is that this is something the Minister has had in mind for some time, but has not wished to disclose for reasons best known to himself.

Casati continued to say that things would remain unchanged for the moment, ~~and~~ Ronco would continue to direct things from here and Cadorna would remain in Milan until the transition and fusion periods are completed.

The Minister concluded that he was most anxious to have GOC's personal opinion on this proposal before the cabinet meeting later that morning, and he only regretted that this com had been somewhat delayed.

Spoke GOC and subsequently notified Lombardi of GOC unqualified personal approval, which had already been passed to Chief Commissioner the previous day.

2. 'V. Day. handed to the Minister letter from GOC in connection with invitation to senior War Ministry official for 'V. Day. Casati very pleased with the suggestion, discussed also in very general terms SAC's intention as to the sort of way the day should be spent by Allied units.

3. Visit to NORTH Italy: Casati was just back from a visit to newly liberated territory, in company with the Prince and Gasparatto the Air Minister. During the journey they visited MODENA, REGGIO, PARMA, BERGAMO, BRESCIA, etc. Everywhere they were enthusiastically welcomed. Some time was spent with Gen UTILI, and one day with Gen BRITTLBERGER, CO IV US Corps. The latter had expressed great satisfaction.
