ADRIATIC BASE COMMAND NOW REQUESTS ALL-OCATION DEPOSITO DELLA 4AZAT (DEPOT OF 4TH ZONE ITALIAN) LOCATED AT MUNGIVACCA, BARI, ITALY. THIS DEPOT IS IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO OTHER ADRIATIC BASE COMMAND INSTALLATIONS AND FULFILLS ALL REQUIREMENTS OF SUPPLY SECURITY AND EASY ACCESS BY RAIL AND MOTOR TRANSPORT. THIS DEPOT IS AT PRESENT SUPPLYING ITALIAN AIR FORCE IN HEEL AREA OF ITALY. ACTIVITY IS LOW, ONLY 5 SQUADRONS BEING SUPPLIED, CONSIDERING SIZE OF INSTALLATION. MAJOR ARTHUR, BARI TOWN MAJOR HAS INSPECTED DEPOT AS WELL AS MAJOR BURD, MMIA LIASON OFFICER. MMIA HAS AVAILABLE SPACE IN LECCE WHICH COULD BE USED FOR STORAGE BY ITALIAN AIR FORCE. NO SPACE IS AVAILABLE IN BARI FOR ANY ARMY. THE FLOW OF SUPPLIES REQUIRES URGENT ATTENTION TO RELEASE OF SOME SPACE. AS THIS IS THE ONLY AVAILABLE SPACE, REQUEST THAT IT BE ALLOCATED TO ADRIATIC BASE COMMAND. FULL DETAILS OF DEPOT GIVEN LT.COL. SIMONS, G-4 SECTION, MTOUSA RECENTLY.

1. Your attention is invited to:

a. AFHQ Circular 13 of 1 May 1944 which provides in part:

* *

"1b. Italian Materiel. All Italian Materiel belonging to all arms and services of the Italian Ground Forces and in the possession of the Italians at the time of the armistice is considered as Italian Materiel and, except as otherwise directed by this Headquarters is reserved for the use of the Italian Army under the direction of the Army Sub-Commission. Allied Control Commission."

b. AFHQ Circular 29 of 9 December 1944 states:

1. Repeated instances have been reported of Allied troops removing materiel, supplies or stores from Italian Military Depots without proper authority. This is a violation of paragraph 1b, AFHQ Circular 13 of 1 May 1944.
2. No materiel, supplies or stores will be removed from any Italian Military Depot, factory, or Italian Military organization, by units or individuals of this command without express written authority of one of the following Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission at Rome;
 - a. For stocks from Italian Army Depots, Land Forces Sub-Commission (MIA).
3. The above does not preclude the right of operational commanders to make such use of the items mentioned as may be necessary for operational reasons only.
4. The appropriate Sub-Commissions, Allied Commission, will post notices in Italian Depots, covering these instructions.
5. All commanders are directed to publish these instructions to members of their command, and to take appropriate action on any violations.

2. No material, supplies or stores will be removed from any Italian Military Depot, factory, or Italian Military organization, by units or individuals of this command without express written authority of one of the following Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission at Rome;
 - a. For stocks from Italian Army Depots, Land Forces Sub-Commission (MIA).
3. The above does not preclude the right of operational commanders to make such use of the items mentioned as may be necessary for operational reasons only.
4. The appropriate Sub-Commissions, Allied Commission, will post notices in Italian Depots, covering these instructions.
5. All commanders are directed to publish these instructions to members of their command, and to take appropriate action on any violations."

c. S.A.E. Instructions, Fifth Army, Section R-1113, dated 7 December 1944 provide in part:

- "2. Restricted premises as listed below are reserved for special purposes (e.g. civilian rehabilitation, Army Service shops, manufacturing for military use, etc.) and will not be considered by the Army Engineer (Real Estate) for general occupancy without special investigation:

* *

- a. Installations belonging to the Italian Armed Forces."

d. A.A.I. letter 2030/12/Q2 dated 1 July 1944 of which the following are extracts:

"Cases have occurred (particularly in Rome and other newly occupied localities) where property, transport and materials belonging to the Italian Forces have been removed from them without proper authority and when the operational need for such action no longer existed.

In future no buildings, real estate, transportation or other materials belonging to the Italian Armed Forces, or in the possession of effective units of the Italian Navy, Army or Air Force, will be occupied, requisitioned, seized or made use of without prior reference to this HQ.

The Italian Commanders concerned have been authorized to place notices on their property indicating its ownership. These notices will be respected."

e. A.C. Memorandum, 360/11/CA of 10 Aug 1944, provides in part:

"1. This constitutes a full authority for the Italian Armed Forces to collect all vehicles and other war material originally held on charge by them.

3. Every assistance should be given to the Italian Armed Forces in their efforts to maintain themselves by the salvaging and collecting into Depots of war material scattered throughout the country."

f. MIA Signal AQ2463 of 26 December 1944 provides in part:

Imperative that prompt and effective action be taken to prevent further dissipation of these vehicles and to insure that they are returned to Italian Army in their present operating condition, also to regularize this matter of principle throughout this theater."

But it is reasonable to expect the latter to abide by their rules and in case you have forgotten them I enclose a copy.

SUBJECT: Storage Space for Adriatic Base Command

TO: President, Allied Commission
FOR: Land Forces Sub Commission (MFA)

1. The Adriatic Base Command is having to expand its covered storage facilities by 200,000 square feet of storage space beyond that which can be provided without special construction.

2. The provision of this space is an immediate necessity yet the shortage of necessary materials and troops require that every other source be exploited before undertaking such a construction program.

3. It is desired that you investigate the possibilities of the Italian Army and Air Corps having warehouses or other buildings in the Bari area that could be adapted to the needs of the above command. Express to them the urgency of the requirement as it will save critical materials and labor for other important work.

MEMORANDUM: for Executive Commissioner, ALCOM

Reference your 998/EC of 14 March 1945, on the subject of removal of materials from Italian Arms Factory, Terni.

1. The report of investigation attached to your letter is returned herewith.
2. This report of investigation establishes:
 - a. That materials were actually removed by Lt Van Berde without authority, from the arms factory at Terni as reported by the Italian military command and as reported to you in our letter of 23 February.
 - b. That a part of the building has evidently been requisitioned by AMG for a civilian manufacturing concern.
 - c. That the officers concerned, including the Regional Commissioner of Lazio-Umbria Region, are not familiar with AFHQ Circulars 13 and 29, 1944, Hq AAI letter 1 July 1944, file 2030/12/Q2 and Hq ACC letter 10 Aug 44, file 360/11/CA, all of which are the basic regulations regarding the use of Italian Army property of all kinds.
3. Under the present instructions, this Sub Commission has no authority to delegate permission to the Provincial Commissioner or any other Allied officer to enter into, or remove Italian Army property except as directed in the regulations referred to above. It is a very simple procedure that has been established for securing permission to use Italian Army property, and it is being done every day throughout Italy by officers who are familiar with regulations. Under the AFHQ instructions Allied personnel is not permitted to enter Italian Army property without permission. Up to this date no requisitions for any Italian Army property in Terni have been received from Allied personnel there, nor has this Sub Commission been advised that any Italian Army property is desired.

4. With reference to the second part of Par 3 of letter Lazio-Umbria Region, file R/6338 of 12 March, the statement that this Sub Commission has set aside an order is not understood. The statement evidently has reference to Italian Army transport, and no agreements have been made by this Sub Commission, nor could they be made in regard to Italian Army transport beyond the directive issued by AFHQ. Experience has shown that Italian Army officers will comply with the requests of Allied officers in violation of the instructions which they have received, especially when the Allied officer is insistent in his demands. However, it must be remembered that Italian Army property is at the disposal of the Supreme Allied Commander, and agreements made unilaterally with Italian officers in violation of the Supreme Allied Commander's instructions have no force in effect.

5. It is suggested that appropriate action in this case would be for the Allied Commission to republish the directive referred to above for wide distribution among Allied Commission officers in order to eliminate further difficulties in connection with Italian Army property as the advance continues to the North.

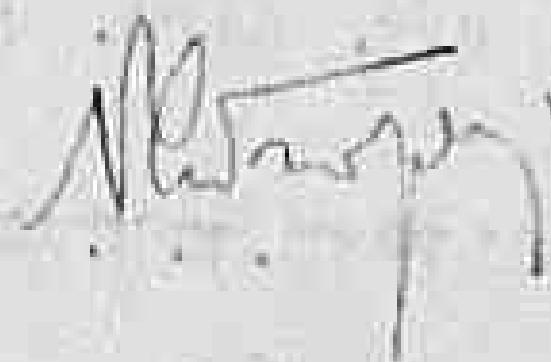

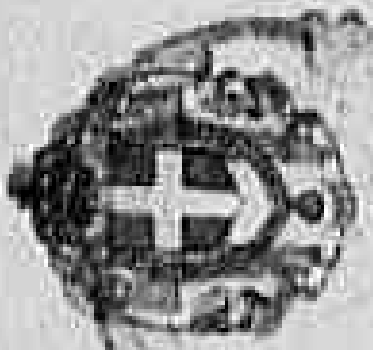

TO : Director, Land Forces Sub-Commission,
Allied Commission, (AMIA), Naples.

1. The following are extracts from Day and Night Shift Operations Reports, Port Highway, 8th Port of Debarcation, for the month of February 1945, which show ship detentions due to the inability of AMIA to accept cargo dispatched by truck to their depots:

"4/5 February 1945 - Hard 2 had considerable cargo being discharged which required guides. Three guides reported at the beginning of the night shift to take out Italian Engineer cargo but did not return for a second trip. A number of trucks had to be off-loaded because of this lack of guides. We were unable to make contact with any of the telephone numbers listed for AMIA."

"9/10 February 1945 - Referring to paragraph 1, day shift report concerning ITI Engineer cargo, Sgt. Rogers checked depot #290 at 2000 hours and found that there was a total of eight (8) laborers and no crane available at this point to handle heavy lifts during our shift."

"11/12 February 1945 - There is some ITI cargo backpiled in berth #18 which is to be dispatched to depot #599. It was necessary to backpile this cargo inasmuch as this depot was closed during our shift."

"13 February 1945 - It is suggested that an AMIA representative be "On call" at a designated locality during the night shift to furnish proper destination for Italian equipment. Removal of supplies at Hard 1 was prevented solely by the impossibility of contacting an interested AMIA representative during this shift."

"14 February 1945 - At 2100 hours this office notified Major Smith of the AMIA that a bargeload of ITI equipment at Hard #1 had no disposition information available. He informed us that this equipment would probably go to Depot #591, but that this depot would be unable to accept this cargo tonight because of a labor shortage. AMIA will furnish guides for this equipment, as well as other ITI items now backpiled at Hard 1 during the early part of the day shift, per Major Smith."

"20 February 1945 - The Italian rations being discharged from the Smileyte in berth #18 could not be accepted at depot #594 faster than 3 trucks per hour. At 1030 hours there were 9 trucks waiting and it was therefore necessary to discontinue dispatching until 1300 hours."

"25-26 February 1945 - Sgt. Reeves, road patrol for the 2nd AT Motor Pool, checked Depot #158 at 0900 hours and reported there were 10 trucks to be unloaded with ITI heavy organizational equipment from the SAMPSONIN

in Berth 18. The Italian soldier in charge of the depot advised him there was no crane available for unloading this cargo, trucks were ordered back to their pool and the 389th Port Bn. advised that he could not dispatch any of the heavy lift cargo designated by the Italian Soldier at wharves to go to Depot #158, until a crane was secured for unloading or another depot was designated by the MMIA for handling this cargo. Major Smith, duty officer for the MMIA, was advised at 0530 hrs. and he suggested that we contact his office at the start of the day shift with reference to this cargo as he believed it was IRI Engpr cargo and should be designated for Depot #290 or #688."

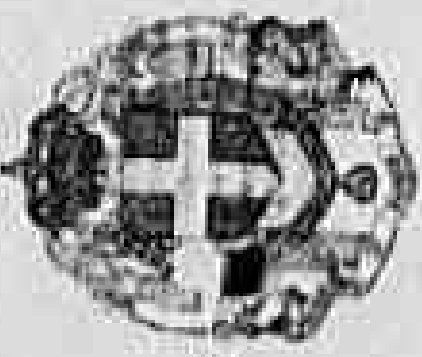
"26 February 1945 - It was necessary to shut off the supply of trucks hauling IRI cargo to Depot #158, ex the SACOPHIN, B-18 from 1100 to 1300 hours due to a congestion of 20 trucks and no labor at the depot. Heavy cargo was backpiled by the Port Battalion during our shift, as there were no crane facilities at the depot. Major Smith, MMIA has promised that there will be sufficient labor on hand at Depots #158 and #290 to handle discharge of merchantable cargo only. Suggest that you continue to backpile the heavy cargo as there will be no crane facilities during the entire night shift. Water Division notified."

"27-28 February 1945 - Considerable difficulty is being encountered with IRI Engineer Depot #290. The time of arrival at Depot is being entered in the space provided for depot count. Major Smith of the MMIA was contacted and stated that he could do nothing about it until the Italian Officer of this depot could be contacted, which would be during your shift."

2. In order to maintain efficient port operations in handling MMIA cargo, it is necessary that immediate steps be taken by MMIA to increase the receiving capacity and stabilize the operations of the Depots under their control.

1. An investigation of the matter reported by you reveals that the salvage actually was removed by the U. S. Army. From the sworn testimony of Lt Col Mario Scarnati, it appears that he knew that authority to remove the material had been given by a British officer and that he did not question the authority of the British officer, which he should have done.
2. From the testimony of Lt Col Antonio Malato, it appears that he did not protest the removal of this material because a previous protest to a British officer did not do any good.
3. Necessary instructions have been issued to all Allied Units not to remove Italian Army property without the permission from MMIA. It is suggested that you issue instructions to all Italian officers in charge of all Italian Army property to refuse to permit anyone, including Allied officers and men, to take property without the permission in writing from MMIA, and in such cases, where property is removed without permission of the Italian officers, an immediate report to the nearest Allied authority should be made in order that prompt steps may be taken to correct the situation.
4. It is desired that all cases of unauthorized entries or removal of property by Allied personnel be forwarded to this Headquarters as quickly as possible after the incident, in order that effective action may be taken. The report should give details of names, places, dates, and vehicle numbers.

387. - ELECTRICITY.

1. The following extract from Rome Area Allied Command General Order No 24 dated 21st September 44. is republished for compliance by all units:-

2. No Military Unit or individual is entitled to the use of permanent current without the authority of the Electricity Control Board, Rome Area Allied Command.

No electric elevators, cooking appliances, refrigerators, fans or other small electric power units will be used without special authority. All such appliances at present in use will be disconnected forthwith.

The following restrictions will apply to the actual consumption of electricity within billets and premises occupied by military personnel:-

- (a) One bulb (medium power) only will be in use in each bedroom, sitting room or anti-room.
- (b) 60% of all normal light bulbs will be disconnected in corridors, messes and lounges.
- (c) No electric light will be used during daylight except where absolutely essential for work.

Civilian staff employed in hotels and military units will be advised of these restrictions.

No exemption will be given to these rules except in the case of hospitals and selected places of entertainment, etc., sponsored by Welfare or Special Services. In all cases strict economy will be observed and the instructions contained in paragraph 4 (a) above will apply to all resident Welfare personnel.

All applications for exemption will be submitted to the Chairman, Electricity Control Board, Rome Area Allied Command.

Military units and personnel will allow entry to authorised agents of the Electricity Power Companies bearing a pass stamped by G-4 Section, Rome Area Allied Command, to examine meters and make necessary disconnections where ordered by the board.

The Military Police have been instructed to enforce the observance of these orders.

3. The display of all Electric Advertisement signs by Neon or incandescent lamps on the outside or the inside of military or civilian premises is specifically prohibited. This prohibition also applies to signs that are supplied with electricity from private generating sets.
