1. General. The prompt collection, recovery and classification of salvage and captured enemy materiel and the early return to service of new and reclaimed property together with early return to the United States of certain scrap metals will greatly contribute to the successful prosecution of the war. In addition, a particularly grave problem is faced at the present time by the need of transportation and other materiel for the maintenance of tremendous numbers of prisoners of war and the civilian population. Accordingly, a concerted and continuous effort must be made by all echelons to collect and evacuate salvage and captured enemy materiel.

2. Definitions.

a. Salvage is excess, abandoned, or condemned property of the Allied Forces. Salvage may be new or used, serviceable or unserviceable property.

b. Captured Enemy Materiel (short title C.E.M.) is all equipment and supplies previously belonging to the enemy.

3. Disposition of Salvage and C.E.M.

a. All salvage and all small lots of C.E.M. except ammunition will be evacuated to either the nearest Army Quartermaster Class I installations or to the nearest installation of the appropriate Army Service.

b. Large quantities of C.E.M. in enemy dumps and depots will be placed under guard and the location and contents reported to this Headquarters.

c. Captured enemy ammunition will be marked, guarded and reported to the nearest ASF, Ordnance installation or directly to the Ammunition Section, Army Ordnance Service. This ammunition will be moved only under supervision of Ordnance personnel.

d. Materiel which cannot be handled due to size, weight, or quantity will be reported to the most appropriate Service personnel of the next higher echelon.

4. Retention of C.E.M.

a. Vehicles (including trailers): All captured enemy vehicles will be turned in to the supporting Ordnance Service except under conditions described below:

4. Retention of C.E.M.

a. Vehicles (including trailers): All captured enemy vehicles will be turned in to the supporting Ordnance Service except under conditions described below:

(1) Vehicles specifically approved for retention prior to 14 April 1945 by Headquarters Fifth Army.

(2) In case of a dire operational necessity, and then only when a T/E shortage exists for which there is no stock vehicle available for issue. Retention under these conditions will be made only upon the written approval of the Commanding General, Fifth Army.

(a) Vehicles described in 4 a (2) above will be deadlined in the unit pending decision on retention.

(b) If request for retention is approved, the unit will submit a request to the Army Ordnance Service for assignment of a "C.I.P." number for the vehicle (corresponding to a "M" number on a U. S. vehicle). Request will include following information:

- (d) The letter (or a true copy thereof) approving the retention will be carried by the driver of the vehicle to avoid question and delay due to enforcement of this directive by Military Police.
- (e) Retained "CAP" vehicles will be turned in to the Army Ordnance when unit receives order for overseas movement: "CAP" vehicles will not be shipped out of the theater.
