1. Pursuant to authority contained in cable PX-51909, WFOUSA (our 3511), the 226th Slav Company and the 233rd Slav Company will, upon call from Transportation Officer, NORBS, move from present station to SOUTHERN FRANCE by surface transportation on or about 6 April 1945. The Adjutant General, NORBS, will issue necessary orders for complement of United States supervisory personnel who will accompany units. Effective upon embarkation units are relieved from assignment to WFOUSA and are assigned WFOUSA.

2. Five days rations will be transported. Unit commanders are responsible that rations consumed enroute do not exceed one ration per individual per day. Upon arrival at destination all unused rations will be immediately turned in to the nearest Quartermaster Depot.

3. All excess supplies and equipment above that authorized by T/A and all unauthorized items will be turned in to the issuing agency prior to departure. All garrison prisoners of this unit presently confined in NORBS Stockade will accompany unit upon departure from this Base Section.

4. Transportation Officer, NORBS, will coordinate the movement. You will contact the Transportation Officer, NORBS, at once to receive instructions relative to the movement.

5. Attention is directed to letter, Headquarters NORBS, file AG 370.26 (EMGCT), subject "Instructions for Movement by Water (Slav Units)" dated 4 September 1944, which will be complied with.

6. Clearance will be obtained from NORBS Real Estate Office before departure to the effect that property has been properly reported and vacated according to NORBS Circular 31 dated 30 July 1944 and NORBS Circular 41 dated 9 September 1944. Unit will also clear with the various services and complete attached certificate in duplicate and present same to Transportation Officer, NORBS, before embarking.

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7. Organizational commander or convoy commander will be held responsible that there is no firing of weapons of any type by personnel in the unit or convoy, at wires, poles, insulators, or other objects during the march.

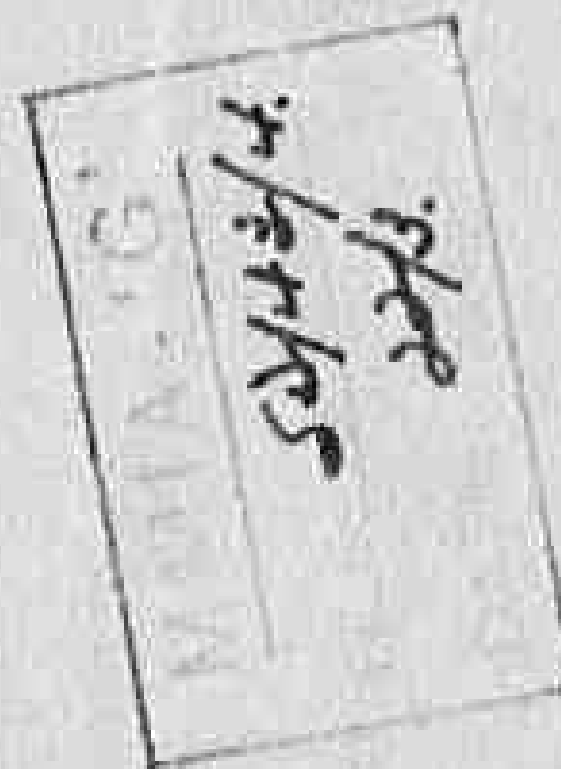

Subject: Italian HQ for non-Italian speaking, Italian Troops in Corsica

(F. 74 SD/63/1) Referring to your letter SD/65/1 dated 25 Feb. 45 with which you answered to the query put forward by me in letter SD/55/12/1 dated 21 Dec 44, I take the opportunity in pointing out the following:-

When the American HQ in Corsica and General LACZINSKI agreed to withdraw from Corsica Italian officers and senior NCOs and staff, non-Italian speaking Italian units with American personnel, the American HQ named above assumed that questions regarding discipline and administration of the Italian section would be dealt with by the Italian HQ representing such section.

It is probable that actually, in practice, the Italian HQ in Corsica is left with the only duty to acknowledge receipt for the Italian Government for materials supplied by the United States but the HQ in question has also an important formal function which is necessary owing to the particular system of administering these units, i.e. the function of representing Italian Mil. Authorities to non-Italian speaking Italian units of the regular army which depend from the Italian HQ.

This Ministry judges that such of duties could not be conveniently carried out by Lt. AMOROSI.

Having stated the above, I beg you to examine the advantage in keeping, also after the transfer to France of non-Italian speaking Italian units, the Italian HQ for non-Italian speaking troops.

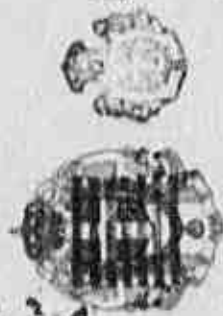

Può darsi che oggi, in pratica, al Comando Italiano in Corsica non sia rimasta altra attribuzione che quella di rilasciare ricevute, per conto del Governo Italiano, dei materiali forniti dagli Stati Uniti, ma il citato Comando ha anche una importante funzione formale, necessaria dato il particolare sistema di inquadramento dei reparti: la funzione di rappresentare l'Autorità Militare italiana alla quale i reparti alloggiati, reparti regolari dell'esercito italiano, sono soggetti.

Questo Ministero giudica che tale funzione non potrebbe essere convenientemente assolta dal tenente Ambrosi.

Per quanto precede, prego di voler prendere in esame l'opportunità di mantenere in vita, anche in seguito al trasferimento delle unità alloggiati in Francia, il Comando Italiano Truppe alloggiati.
