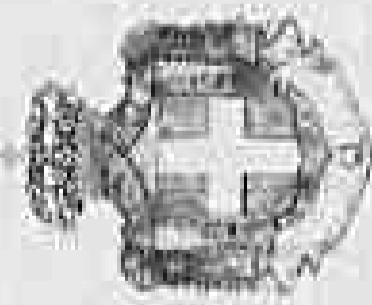

With reference to report of Force 399 dealing with conditions of Italian military personnel, patriots and civilians.

1. Italian military personnel:

It seems to me that policy should be decided by AFHQ as to whether

(a) Italian military personnel is desirable in Albania for internal security or other reasons. If it is required there, it should then be organized into regular units, placed under responsible command under Allied supervision for operational disposition. Questions of equipping, rationing and clothing must be also decided.

(b) Italian military personnel is not required in Albania. Should AFHQ decide upon such a policy, I do not see how the Provisional Government of the FNC can insist upon retaining the Italian Military personnel as it is the personnel of a Government whose military organization (such as it is) is the direct responsibility of the Allied nations. Therefore AFHQ can order the return of this personnel.

The Italian military personnel cannot be considered P.W. This in reply to Brig. Gen. Pucini's query contained in Message No 188. They are not PW because the Italians never declared war on the present Albanian Gov't, but rather aided and are aiding in evicting the Germans.

Patriots who are members of the Italian Army should be ordered back to their units.

Patriots who are civilian are a problem for G 5 AFHQ.

3. Italian civilians, Italian property rights, Italian Financial Interests.

These problems should go for decision to G 5 AFHQ.

4. Lt Col Deakin is the Foreign Office representative at Bari, and therefore under the jurisdiction of the British Resident Minister.

5. Force 399 is under SOM-AFHQ. I talked with Col Bauberie of that section to find out whether AFHQ has received copies of the reports. Returned my call to state that he is obtaining copies from Force 399 and will forward them to G 5 AFHQ. This action will still (over)

leave unanswered the problem of Italian military personnel.

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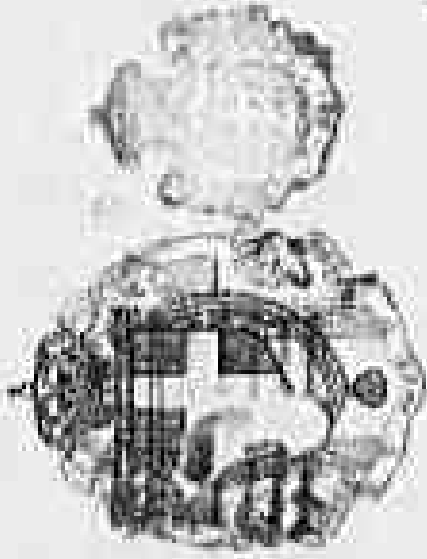

COMMAND OF ITALIAN TROOPS IN ALBANIA.

Object: Situation at the 13 Dec 44.

At the Office of Italian Headquarters,
Via Putinari 112,
Peri.

I transmit an extract from the official Albanian Bulletin number 62 of the 11 running month.

I have sublined the provisions that, to my opinion, interest us most directly.

In synthesis, the same treatment that is made to the Germans notwithstanding the important contributions given for 14 months by several thousand of Italians to the partisans war, against the Germans, common enemy, as combatants and as labourers.

No official recognition of this contribute; the Chief of Albanian Government has expressed himself, talking with us, in very flattering terms in regard of our troops; many Albanian Commanders and Politicians, in several occasions, have expressed to the Italians similar sentiments but, I repeat, no official recognition.

Up to the present, thousands of Italians are still in the Partisan formations.

Italians are paying service in those Partisan Bases sent towards Montenegro to put a stop, unitedly with Tito's Partisans, to the German resistance in those regions. Other Partisan Bases have been displaced towards the South in view of the evènements in Greece and also they have Italians in their ranks. Since, as it is known, the staff of the carous, mortars, --trailleuse and the staff of connections and services is everywhere almost exclusively Italian.

Meanwhile several thousand of Italians are still dispersed inland between the mountains. They are ragged and bare-footed soldiers, many of them affected by malaria without any protection even because there are no physicians, no medicines and no possibility to transport the sick, not even by mule back to the distant cure places. I have no way and no means to assist them. The hardest works are reserved to Italians in exchange of only nourishment, and very often without nourishment!

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A very skilful propaganda is being to persuade every one that the missed return depends by the Italian Government. The Italian Government, is said, has not yet sent word to the Albanian Government to ask our return. Everyone blames the Italian Government or, at the most, the English Government; no one the Albanian Government. It is looked in every way to instil aversion against English people; the movements in Greece, fully disguised, serves very well to the object.

I have already repeatedly said that the Albanian Government intends to use us up as labourers, as technicals, as army's specialists the longest possible even because, as it can not demobilise for internal motives and for external matters, it could not know how to answer to the families especially peasants, that are asking the return of their men or, at least, the permanence of Italians.

Even if the Italian Government will retain possible to request the return to the Albanian Government, the negotiations will go on a long while because it is now certain that all of us are here merchandise to be exchanged at the latest.

We have no juridical estate and therefore no international law to protect us. Generically I must exclude all action of ill-treatment from the Albanians, but our tenor of life is really miserable and the way we are considered frankly degrading.

With one reason or other, by violence or good manners, we have all been despoiled and depredated: on the mountain, generally, they are almost naked, they are in want of wool, clothes, covers, all objects that the mountains Albanians have in very reduced quantity and not even sufficient for them selfs.

Many officers live fulfilling the most humble services waiting with anxiety the day of liberation. To be officer constitutes in many cases a sin.

Very active and intelligent the propaganda made by the Albanian Partisans towards our soldiers to induce them to remain here, some elements of our own (in reality they can be counted on the fingers) participate to this propaganda; well fed and systemized, they are resolute to remain here until the end of the war and even beyond if they will be able to transfer here their families. It is been said to them all - "Here you are free and sure".....'

A few days ago a superior office has initiated the gathering of adhesions for an unconditional request of return to Italy for the purpose to be immediately incorporated in the Italian combatant army. At once the voice has been spread that the Italian Government had put up another kind of ransom to the Italians of Albania: "Who does not want to fight can not return"..

All the Italians are mobilised for the reconstruction and, at least for the moment, without any pay, with the only nourishment. ^{Ag 656} the Italian firms, kept under control, must work to their own expenses for the reconstruction. Several public and private employees with family do not know any more how to keep on and I have no means to help them. In many houses the inventory of all wares possessed by Italians has been made.

Yesterday at Bank of Albania it has been imposed to the General Director and several functionaries living at the Bank to go out at once taking only the necessary for two or three days. They have all been, including women, undressed, to be sure that they had no values about. A requisition had to be made and nobody was wanted to be inside the bank.

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It seems that even the "Banco di Napoli" and the "Banco del Davoro" will be taken by the Albanians and incorporated in the "Banco di Albania".

At Devoli 300 labourers of our of the AIRA are working for the only food.

The Missionari Fathers of Berat have been chased from their house because the house was wanted for the people. The mass of Italian soldiers has been skillfully fractionated and separated from it's officers so that it is impossible to assist them and orientate them. Between Tivert and Durazzo are living about 6000 Italians, militaris and civils. Discussions between partits are already begun.

The return is necessary and it will only promptly occur if it will be imposed to the Albanian Government.

Or, at least, somebody should assure here, and quickly, with all warrants, our tutelage after having well established our juridical estate.

8. For each Department a fund in form of advance in base of the budget that will be presented.
9. Present to the Council Presidency a design of law for the confiscation of all goods of political exiles. To their families will be left the pure necessary for living.
10. Form a Commission by the National Economy Ministry to study the present state of landed properties and great wealths of exiles and in base of this state to present positives proposals about their regulations and their better administration. Like this Commission, others will be formed in each Prefecture by the National Council of liberation of the same Prefecture.

- 11. Form a Commission for the study of State law. This Commission will be composed of the following members: Mr. Gasp. Vasile, Ing. Gheorghe Cioba, Ilie Boso, Major Mihail Cioba, Sgt. Ion Iac, Sgt. Radu Cioba, Sgt. Vasile Cioba and others. The principal task of this Commission is to study as soon as possible the actual situation of the State's lands and to make positive proposals for with regards the distribution and the administration of such lands.
 - 12. The sum existing in the National Bank of Albania of thirty millions of Albanian banks in check-money will be put in circulation as soon as the Bank will be nationalized.
 - 13. Present, for the appropriation, from the Council Presidency, the design of law of postal, telegraphic and telephonic rates and of the substitution of postage-stamps, design of law that has been examined and signed by the Ministry Council.
 - 14. Fix the wages and the salaries of all employees and laborers in service of the State and take all measures in order to insure that such wages should be paid as soon as possible.
- The decisions of the Ministers Council continues for ulterior decisions.

When agreement reached on Italians return, Italian Government must ask Allies for transport. Partisans using strong anti-British propaganda on Italians to dissuade from returning ITALY. Urgent to establish our legal position so that I or some other can act with necessary authority. Refer to ROME. All above points confirmed by other sources. Local Italian resources enough to feed 3,000 for 60 days only. CAPECCIONI to acknowledge.

Following are in Italian for CAPECCIONI.

Your 211 reference Italians. HOXHA would give no concrete reply. ^{asked if} those Italians with Partisan formations would be given option terminating service with ANLA. Reply non-committal but stated did not regard such Italians as P.O.W. Said all other aspects still being considered and no answers yet but implied one might find need retain certain key Italian personnel. Would not say if they would be kept against wishes but think they have this in mind. STAB told PICCINI not to say request in my 186 came from FWG. Think they are now waiting to see effect. Please ask LAWSON for names and Italian or Partisan unit if any, as STAB want look in to each case.

MESSAGE No. 291 of 15 December from L.O. in TIRANA.

Saw HOXHA with following results, all Italian State property to be confiscated; Italian private property liable to confiscation but in fact will only be taken if owner was Fascist. Discrimination arbitrary now but may be made subject to legal process, this point still undecided. On evacuation HOXHA said Italians would get option leaving ALBANIA but still talk of retaining some. No final decision yet, still clearly waiting for reaction to my 186 for which acknowledgment required from CAPECIONI, meantime no Italians being released for evacuation and no exceptions for Mission servants, please warn all Missions to make no promises.

What are your intentions regarding repatriation Italians? Have already been approached by many civilians. 500 troops interned by Hun still in SCUTARI.

English speaking Albanians Hogeri XHAFFER drove JONES to SHENGJIN and back, arrested December 12. Captain BUFFA interred by Hun, arrested December 1 for protesting against Partisans stripping P.O.W.s in camp. Filthy prison packed, no court save STAB led by Tuku JAKOVA.

MESSAGE NO. 260 of 15 December from our L.O. in SCUTARI.

Reliable information. Numbers of Italian troops coming in from hills and steady drift South to areas TIRANA and DURAZZO to be on hand for evacuation. These men are destitute and if large numbers collect in one place will form a problem British will be expected to solve, by both Alebrans and Italians. 1,500 now said area SCUTARI. Separate problem of one complete Italian battalion now serving in 1st Brigade. See my 238 re feeding.

Subject: The Italian Situation in Scutari.

The Italians in the SCUTARI area may be divided into four categories: those who, on the dissolution of the Italian Armies in Albania at the time of the Armistice, joined the Partisan forces; those who at that time hid in civilian cottages in the mountains and who are now moving into SCUTARI after its evacuation by the Germans; about 1000 civilians who have been in the town for a period of about five years and a similar number of former internees who were held prisoner and used as working parties by the Germans and who were released on the departure of the latter from Albania.

The position of most of these Italians is now critical and many are destitute. Captain DURCAN reports that Italians serving with the Partisan forces are treated little better than animals and he has learnt from reliable sources (clerics and Italian doctors among others) that Italians have not been fed since the arrival of the Partisans in SCUTARI. It is still possible to buy food in the town but prices are rising owing to the absence of good communications, lack of transport and the blowing of bridges by the retreating Germans, and in any case many of the Italians are without money. Some of the former internees are being given a little food by the Italian civilians who still have stocks, but their position is definitely serious.

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Most of the labour in SCUTARI area is being provided by the Italians while the Partisans supervise. All Italians are first interrogated by the Partisan staff and if they can prove that their conduct during the German occupation was satisfactory, they are released but there is definitely an objection on the part of the Partisans to allowing any of them to leave the country. Those with technical or medical qualifications are being pressed into service with the Partisan forces and at least two civilian doctors have been sent to join Partisan units at very short notice.

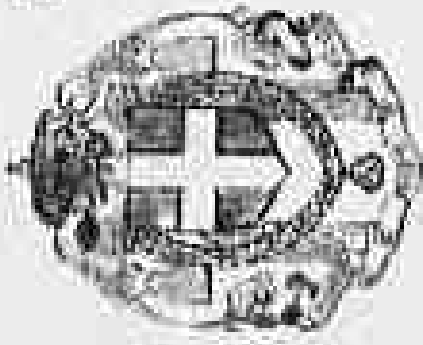

The Italian Legation at Stockholm have informed the British Legation that a number of Italians in Sweden have requested to be repatriated to Italy in order to fight against Germany. The names of these men, most of whom are connected with the sea, are contained in the following list.

2. The Foreign Office in informing the Embassy of this approach have pointed out that in present circumstances there can be no question of repatriating persons who are not either recommended by some Allied authority or particularly asked for by the Italian Government and that in the latter question of priority would arise. They have suggested however that the matter should be discussed with the Italian Government. Before doing so the Political Section would be glad to know whether the Forces Sub-Commissions have any comments to make.

"FOR CARBONONI. From FIGUINI. ALBANIAN Government want ITALIAN Government to make request for return of ITALIAN. When agreement on ITALIAN return ITALIAN Government must ask Allies for transport. Evident intention to keep labour for reconstruction and Specialists for ALIA at cost of giving them food only. Partisans using strong anti-British propaganda on ITALIAN to dissuade from returning ITALIAN. Urgent to establish our legal position so that I or some other can act with necessary authority. Refer to HQ. From Liaison officer. All above points confirmed by other sources. Local ITALIAN resources enough to feed 3,000 for 60 days only. CARBONONI to acknowledge."

2. Since the BRITISH and ALBANIAN Governments do not recognize the Provisional Government of the Albanian Nationalist Army of Liberation, it is suggested that to avoid any political issues it would be the best policy for the Supreme Italian Military Command to make contact on this question with HQ ALIA through this Organisation, using General FIGUINI, who is in the meantime in TIRANA, as their direct representative.

- The project is a partial success. The Italian SIM/CS Commission has worked with zeal and efficiency. A number of collaborators with the enemy have been detected and a certain amount of info of G-2 C.I. interest has been produced. The required speed of 500 interrogations per day has been maintained but at the cost of fuller info. The situation has been eased by the arrival of additional personnel on the SIM/CS Commission. The first arrivals at the camp were JCF sorted into units by the Italian Army authority, causing difficulty in obtaining corroboration of statements. Second arrivals were sorted into units and preliminary documentation made on arrival and improvement has resulted.
- The physical security of the camp has been weak throughout and though the state of the wire perimeter and the system of control of recess has been improved, the main weakness continues to lie in the efficiency of Italian gds. Many escapes have occurred.
- The scheme has been improvised in the lack of experience. In future similar schemes are envisaged, it is suggested that a lack of preliminary planning, the use of non-Italian gds and complete constancy of the camp be arranged in advance and that repatriates be treated as PW until released. It is further suggested that the process take place at certain limited pts in the Balkans before despatch as incentives to escape would be less. The flow of information could be regulated and greater opportunities for corroboration of statements would exist.

4. St. Andrew's PW Area, B. Camp.

- A sketch of the camp is shown in sketch A. It consists of nine compounds for repatriates, each with room for 1,000 men, a Brit admin compound, an Italian admin compound and a mess compound. It is staffed by Brit personnel for administrative purposes and for G-2 supervision and by Italian personnel for admin and discipline. An Italian SIM/CS Interrogation Commission screens repatriates under G-2 C.I. supervision and works in a small interrogation pen. Evacuation is arranged by NMBH.

4. St. Andrea's PW Camp, 3 Camp.

(c) A sketch of the camp is shown in annex 4. It consists of nine compounds for repatriates, each with room for 1,000 men, a Brit admin compound, an Italian admin compound and a help compound. It is staffed by Brit personnel for 8 hrs and purposes are for gen supervision and by Italian personnel for admin and discipline. An Italian SIA/CS Interoception Commission screens repatriates under 0-2 O.I. supervision and works in a small interrogation pen. Evacuation is arranged by MIA.

(b) Italian admin personnel were at first ineffective and supervising Brit personnel, though energetic, had insufficient staff to take over complete control. As a result no documentation of repatriates took place on arrival, soon was 1500 repatriates collected and the wire perimeter was breached at 1000 hrs. The disarmament of Italian Camp Compound and this replacement by Tenetel, GILLINI on instants from MIA resulted in an immediate improvement. Repatriates are now documented on arrival, placed in compound according to sex of spouse and organized into units inside the compound.

5. Arrivals.

Annex B contains a schedule of arrival of repatriates.

6. Screening Org.

(a) Physical Org.

The SIA/CS Commission at first worked in an open tent. Adverse weather conditions slowed down the output of screened personnel and the pen was rectified by the erection of a temporary Nissen hut. A small hut for 2000 men, interrogations and a second temporary Nissen hut for additional SIA/CS men and under const. A phone line was installed by 52 Area SIGA.

(b) Screening System.

Twenty repatriates at a time from each compound are taken to the interrogation compound where they are screened and documented and then taken to another compound for screened personnel. Suspects are taken to 4 Camp, St. Andrea's PW area where they are held in custody under normal PW conditions. When the compound has been cleared

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By this means, it becomes the reception compound for screened personnel.

(c) Rate of Screening.

Owing to the necessity of clearing the camp of representatives in the shortest possible time, the target agreed with J2 Area and MAIL was 500 interrogations per day. The SIM/CS Commission stated that they were unable to obtain full info at this speed and arrangements were made by ROI to supplement the Commission by the addition of further SIM/CS personnel, thereby increasing available time for each interrogation while maintaining the same rate of output.

(d) SIM/CS Commission.

Composed of 10 SIM/CS officers. The Commission works from 0700 hrs to 1400 hrs daily at the camp and from 1500 hrs to 0300 hrs on callation, clerical and other tasks. They have worked with seriousness and enthusiasm under conditions that have frequently proved trying. Col Macrelio di P.M.A. has acted as President and has frequently expressed his regret that the rate of screening and difficulties of coordination prevented his commission from obtaining maximum available info.

(h) Security Situation in Greece.

7. Physical Security

(a) Wire Perimeter.

When complete will consist of an outer apron and triple concert and an inner length of triple concert only. Far from complete when first used. Not nearing completion. Passage from concert to concert continues and the wire is constantly destroyed as an obstacle by repatriates especially beside inter-company gates. Punitive measures not as a partial deterrent.

(b) GAs.

Italian. Two GAs and ... of CC, III. Posted at main gate and at entrance to ... Request for details from between external apron and internal triple concert. No evidence has come to it to show that a GA has positively performed his duty. GAs are psychologically closer to repatriates than to supervising unit personnel since, ill-disciplined, slovenly, inefficient, unaware of their responsibility and probably corrupt. The following incidents are typical.

(i) G2 was asked by First Camp Commandant, HQ CC 410 PSS on 22 Nov 44 why his rifle was cocked. He replied that it was unloaded. Upon the weapon was inspected it was found that it was inoperative to see through the barrel. When he was asked when he had last cleaned it he replied that he could not remember. When asked if it was this year or last year, he stated that he could not be sure, but that in any case it did NOT matter as his friend had all his own.

(ii) G2 discovered on 19 Nov 44 standing by while my partner conversed with his relatives outside the wire. When asked why he had come nothing to stop it, he replied "I told them to go away but they would NOT go".

(iii) Suspected SS agent 'LEGGI(?)' orally interviewed by SIM/OS Commission on 21 Nov 44. Having hesitated in giving his name, was sent back to his compound under escort to point out a witness who he claimed could identify him. At entrance to compound escort was told by same repatriates that he would be torn to pieces if he came inside and therefore decided that he would wait outside until his prisoner returned. 'LEGGI(?)' has NOT been seen since.

(iv) G2 at entrance to 9 Compound on 10 Nov accepted a letter from repatriates for onward transmission.

(v) At 2200 hrs on 19 Nov 44 all gas in compounds had left their posts.

It has been agreed between 52 Area and HQ that gas of non-Italian nationality will NOT be employed. An extra Italian gas cylinder was allotted on 29 Nov 44.

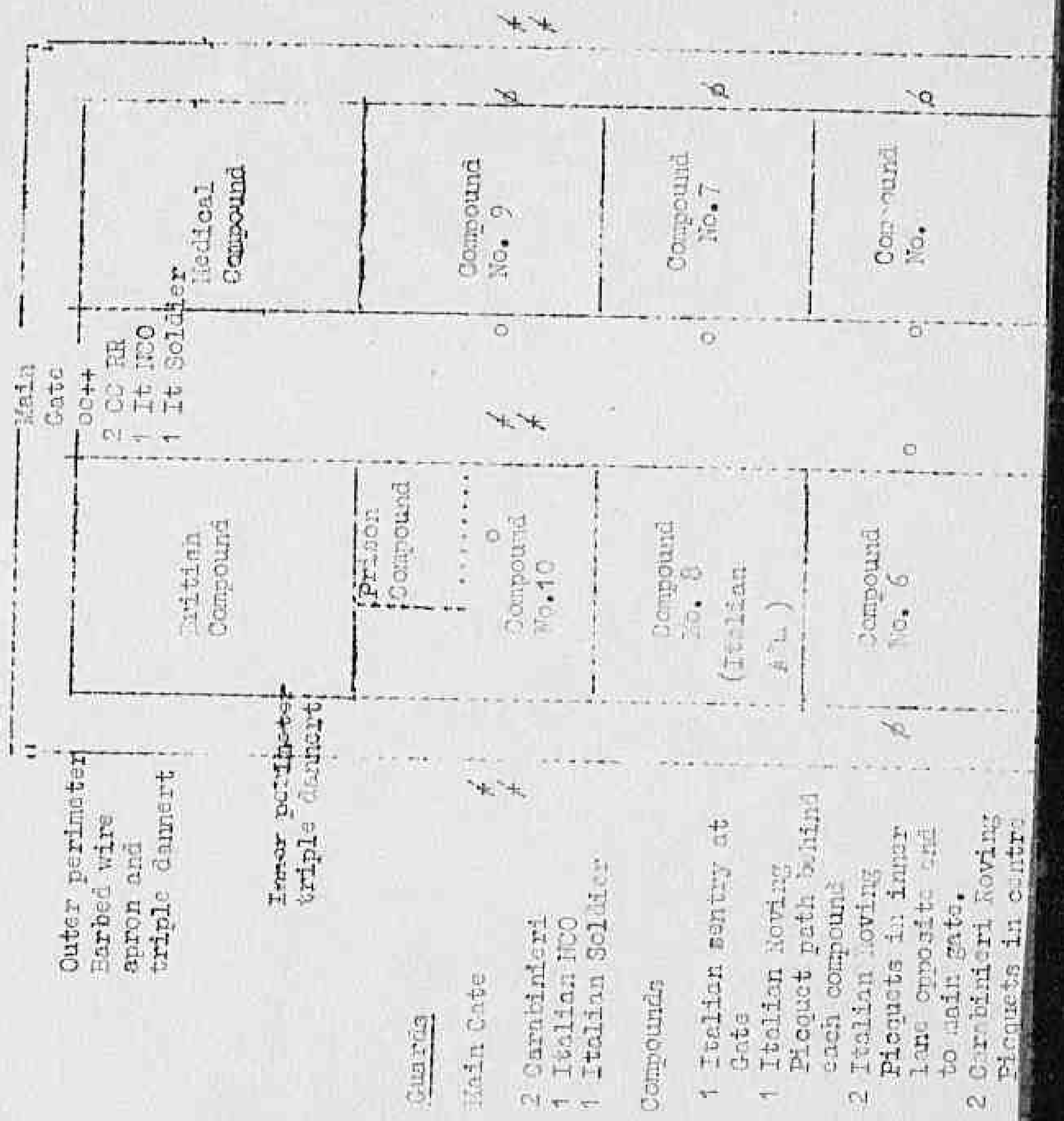

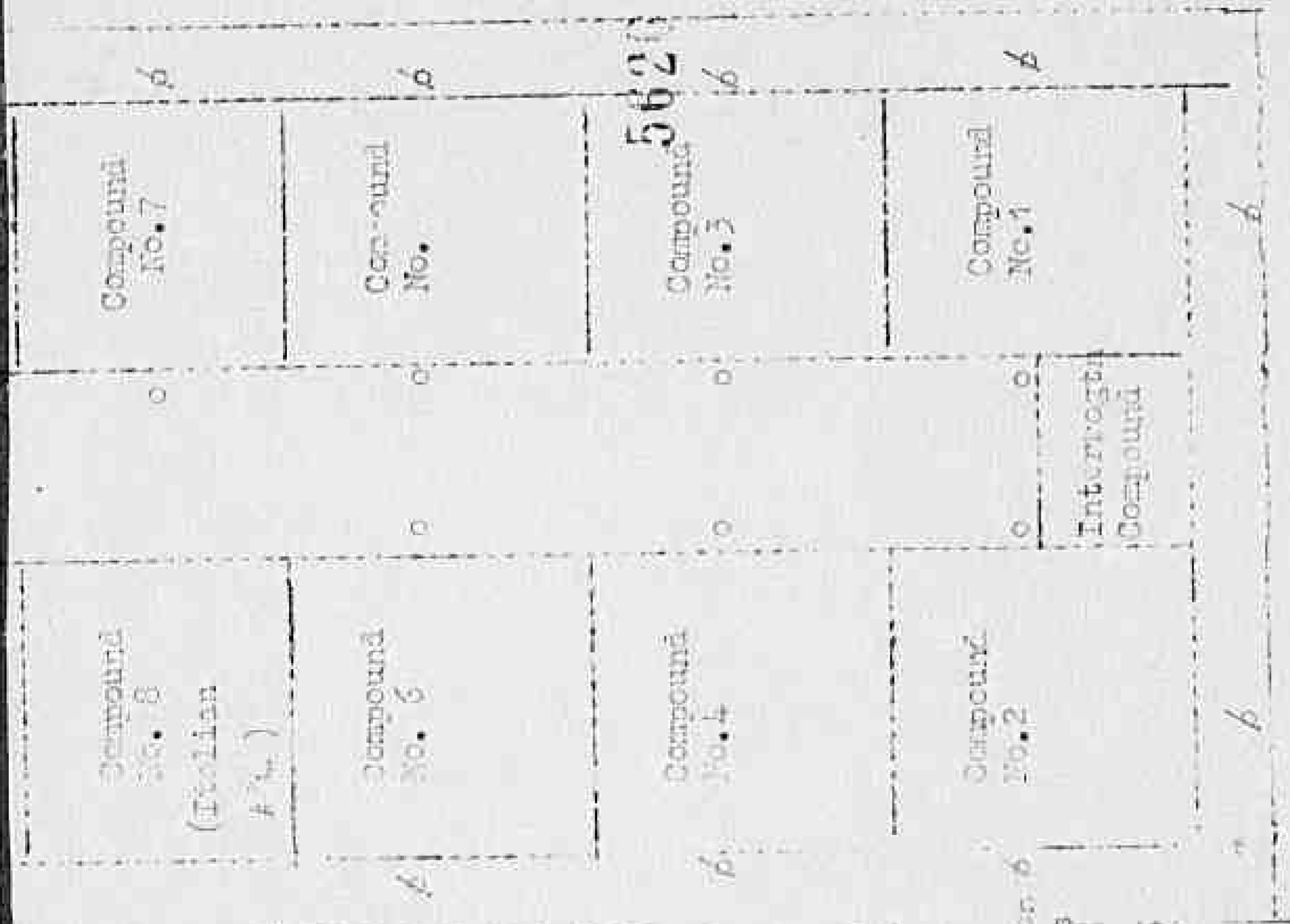

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APPX B

Gen. Notes on the Situation in Greece based on Statements of representatives

The country was governed by the E.L.A.S. meaning National Liberation Org. This cannot be said to have had any violent political convictions as it contained Liberals, Moderates and Communists. It was the central org for control of the parts of Greece NOT actually occupied by the Germans. Taking orders from this were K.A.S., E.L.A.S. and O.C. The first was entirely a violent Russian-type Communist Party, the second was the Greek national army and the third the city control org.

E.L.A.S. controlled the whole of Greece not under the Germans as far as all matters were concerned. They and their adherents made up about 90% of the total population of the country. The leader was Gen. S.M. In the first place the above were the chief helpers of the Spanakidi Italis. In the first place in order to rob them of any bit of what they had, rifles, boots etc., later to allow them to work in specified areas under control of local E.L.A.S. authorities (they were issued with a pass for this area and picked up by E.L.A.S. agents in neighbouring countries if they strayed over the line).

Some Italians were allowed to fight with E.L.A.S. and all such were given a document to that effect. E.L.A.S. is mainly communist in attitude and was vastly disappointed when Brit instead of Russia the Disembarked in Greece. They had hoped for that following a visit to them by a British delegation and the pretty solid declaration for a sort of co-operation by the vast majority of the population. E.L.A.S. is also a party from which trouble for the Allies would come.

Great indignation is felt at the proposal to reinstate the King of Greece. E.L.A.S. regard the liquidation of the monarchy as one of the things they were fighting for. This feeling was aggravated by the presence of Brit within at the disembarkation of Brit troops, this being considered a definite threat of violence if the Brit more government was NOT received. The food imports are regarded by extremists as a sort of bribery. The present allied order they regard as the last straw. This is to the effect that E.L.A.S. troops are to lay down their arms and return to the Royal Hill Levaloy of Greece and undergo a new course and expelled or NOT enrolled in the Royal Greek Army. They consider that they have done more than anyone to win the war in Greece, have fought the great resistance from the Allies is the Greek Royalist Party, E.L.A.S. or the same people of G.A.K.O. The incidents that took place in the Greek Army at ALEXANDRIA are well known in Greece.

It has been said by Italian representatives soldiers that some of the extremists are considering going back into Italy and continuing the fight against the King and presumably the Allies should the former land in Greece. One such representative writing remarked that E.L.A.S. do not wish to persuade them to come back into the country with them when they were about to embark for Italy. This was from a unit which was sent on 23 May 44.

APPENDIX B (cont'd)

Italian Corps

The main unit was OLI, Organizzazione Levatori Italiani, which was mainly an assistance unit working under the direction of ELAS in their area. Any Carabinieri actually serving as such can be said to have sworn loyalty to the Germans, the same can be said for the P.S. agents, Guardia di Finanza serving as such. These were the closest in the seeking and arrest of anti-Germans or Sovietist Italians. The majority went with the Germans in the Republic Army, others were murdered. Those with families in liberated Italy may not know (?). Most of the names of the chief offenders are known. Others of the above services were interned or in hiding and were NOT collaborators.

The vast majority of SIM passed straight into the (post)war. The same goes for all Italian Army Int Services. Italians were recruited for the SS by asking for volunteers, most privates being offered to applicants. Almost all of these have gone with the Germans.

Adherents

These are the Italians who either signed a declaration of willingness to work or fight for the Germans (of which one only was sent to the German Reich) or took the oath which ran something like "I swear to follow the orders of the Duce and the Fuehrer". There were divided into two categories, Weckers in the TOIT unit who were a white command with a suitable inscription or levatori or combattenti making part of the German Army - those were a yellow command with the words 'Deutsche Wehrmacht' on it. These were recruited from conscripts by German or Italian propagandists, privates and less or more paid being used as a lever. On occasions, the public shooting of a few conscripts was used to influence a unit in the right direction. The combattenti or armed workers of the police usually did this on prime or early lines. As such adherents were allowed to go out freely as German soldiers. Towards the end the German command to distrust everyone and only those who served to fight were left at liberty - the others were sent to camp camps. The former went with the Germans.

The majority of the adherents were later interned even who considered as security dangers. The oath in most cases was most illegally administered and the main incentive was undoubtedly food. They all returned to their units. The fact that they lived better than the others who did NOT sign or swear was a reminder in some camps does not entitle the latter to better treatment from the Italian authority on the spot. It is unlikely that more than a very few police officers have remained in Greece at large. It has been suggested that they may try to get to Italy by boat from the WEST coast of Greece if they live in Southern Italy.

I quite understand the situation now from your remarks.

I have pressed for the evacuation at the earliest possible moment of the GARIBALDI Division back to ITALY, and I understand that this is likely to happen. As you say, it is the best answer.

I shall be glad when we have got all the Italian troops out of the BALKANS, including YUGO-SLAVIA, GREECE, ROMANIA and HUNGARY. This matter is very close to the Italians' heart and there are potentialities of trouble and international "incidents" if these troops are not evacuated.

Dear General

In your memorandum TS/G/31 of November 7th to Allied Force Headquarters, you raised the question of the Garibaldi Division in Montenegro. The Secretary General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs had also spoken to me on the same subject, and I thought it worth while mentioning to Mr. Macmillan the plight in which these soldiers were finding themselves.

2. Mr. Broad, who is representing the Resident Minister at Caserta at the present time, has now confirmed to me that the conditions in which the Garibaldi Division is existing are in fact appalling. The problem was raised at last week's meeting of the Political Committee of A.F.H.Q. where it was pointed out that these Italian troops are all in areas being held by Yugoslav Partisans. The latter themselves are short both of equipment and clothing. They would therefore resent it if any supplies were to be ear-marked for the Italians. But an even stronger objection, which is a purely practical one, is the fact that it would be quite impossible to ensure that any supplies sent actually reached the Italians. The Partisans would be certain to seize them for themselves. In these circumstances the Committee regretted that they did not feel able to suggest that any special supplies should be sent to these Italian troops.

3. I understand that it is now proposed to repatriate this division. Perhaps in the circumstances, this would be best.

1. I urgently request that the question of the Dr Camp Staff may be re-considered in view of the following specific reasons.

All personnel must be expeditiously and accurately handled as to either take them into the Army as badly needed reinforcements, or send out into civil life, hospital, etc., if we are to obtain any benefit from the camp. This will not happen unless the personnel keep up a continual pressure on the Italian Staff.

7. Allied Commission have agreed to provide a Field Officer to take over the camp of the camp. He will arrive at TAVANU approx 7 Dec 44. It is not possible to provide further personnel from MIA sources. The only MIA in TAVANU is already controlling a station depot which includes a resident strength of 70,000.

8. I therefore request that the presence of the staff both of 5390 Captains and the 88 Area remain until the camp can be closed down.

to forces fully engaged with the enemy it would be wiser
not to send an Italian Mission to the Yugoslav Army of Na-
tional Liberation at the present time. They further express
the view however that it may be possible in the near future
to arrange for the evacuation of the Garibaldi Division by
sea and so solve the whole problem.

3. It is felt that in the circumstances the matter
of the Italian Mission should not be pressed further. A-

out that proposals for Missions from the French and Czech-

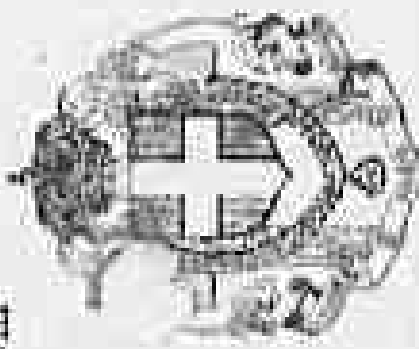

3. This H.Q. is informed that the question of evacuation of various categories of personnel from ROMANIA was discussed at a meeting of the Political Committee at AFHQ on 11 Oct 44. The Supreme Allied Commander approved in principle a procedure for such evacuation, involving submission of request by or on behalf of the applicant to the Allied Control Commission in BUCHAREST.
4. In accordance therewith, it is requested that you inform the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs that the Italian Minister in BUCHAREST should make a formal request to the Allied Control Commission, ROMANIA, for the repatriation of the personnel in question.

It has been reported that the Russian Authorities intend to deport the many military and civilian Italians at present resident in RUSSIA.

I deem necessary that such a proceeding should not take place especially bearing in mind that it has never been possible to obtain any news of P.O.W. taken by the Russians.

I beg you therefore, to take an interest in the fate of the Italians in RUSSIA and to do everything possible to enable them to be repatriated by sea, similarly to what has been done with the Italians resident in GERMANY.

Ref your letter of 22 Nov regarding Repatriation of GARIBALDI Div. from MONTENEGRO:-

1. I am all for this both on Military and Political grounds. We can take all suitable men for the Italian Army (Gruppi in particular) and demobilize the rest. Also I feel we should clear all Italians out of the BALKANS and GREECE as soon as possible, to avoid their getting mixed up in possible internal troubles. The Italian Ministry of War entirely agree with my views.
2. We can accept these men either at BARI or TARANTO, with the same procedure as has recently been laid on for Repatriates from GREECE. i.e. MMIA can use an existing camp at TRANI (capacity 2,500) for reception and screening. AFHQ to provide rations and salvaged clothing. Medical cases to go to civilian hospitals.
3. The orders for the above will, of course, have to be issued by AFHQ.

1. ACANFORA Hospital will be used as a TRANSIT hospital for immediate admissions from the sea of both Italians from Greece and REF.
2. MESSAGNE will be used for ^{re-patients} ~~patients~~ from GREECE admitted either from St. ANDREWS CAMP or ACANFORA hospital.
3. GIOIA DEL COLLE hospital will be used to house evacuees from MESSAGNE.
4. It is the responsibility of the Italian Military Medical authorities always to keep 100 beds vacant at MESSAGNE.
5. The above confirms verbally arrangements made between HQ 52 Area, Col. FISSANI, and self to-day.
6. Rations for "Greeks" patients at GIOIA will be drawn from 38 DIP, and the arrangements contained in my TLO/19 dated 10 Nov to PERSIDIO (para 2) will apply.
