- (a) Intending travellers from ITALY to places abroad should be advised that they will not be permitted to leave ITALY without proper documentation for entry into countries of destination and transit, (i.e. Italian Passport correctly vised for country to be visited) and further, that there will be no allocation of Allied shipping for this purpose for the present.
- (b) Travel to MMIA and GERMANY will only be permitted if the journeys are in the direct interests of the ALLIED ADMINISTRATION.
- (c) Military Travel Authorizations, except as in (d) and (e) below, are no longer required for travel from Italy, and their issue has ceased. (No further action will be taken with regard to outstanding applications.)
- (d) AUSTRIA: Allied Force Permits are still required for travel from ITALY to AUSTRIA as set out in letter AG/1443/30, dated 30 June, 1945, as amended by letter dated 14 July, 1945.
- (e) GERMANY: Allied Expeditionary Force Permits are required for travel from ITALY to U.S., British or French zones of occupation in Germany.

(a) Leave regulations will be the same for all categories, units, etc. of the Army.

(b) Leave will be regarded as a privilege granted only to men of good conduct and efficiency; it will not be regarded as a right.

(c) Leave may be granted on the following grounds :-

1. Privilege leave,
2. Compassionate leave,
3. Convalescent leave.

(d) Privilege leave may be granted once only in each six months service and will be of seven days duration, exclusive of travelling time, (except in the case of leave to or from SARDINIA when duration of leave will be adjusted to conform to ship sailings). Agricultural leave as such will be discontinued, but compassionate leave up to a maximum of 28 days may be granted for agricultural purposes in cases of necessity which are authenticated by CC.RR statements. The granting of such leave will be kept down to the minimum and such leave will be included in the unit leave Roster.

- (ii) The maximum period of Convalescent leave will be 14 days. All cases requiring longer periods will be referred to the Director of Medical Services of the Territorial Command concerned.

- (iv) Personnel given Convalescent leave are considered as patients and do not count against the percentage given in para 2(g) below.
- (g) The limiting factor in all cases will be that not more than 10% of the officers and men on the posted strength of any unit may be absent on leave at one time. This means that an unduly large number of compassionate leave cases which would jeopardise the granting of privilege leave every six months, must be avoided.
3. Control of Movement of leave personnel will continue to be regulated under the conditions set out in MMIA letter of A 020 of 17 July as amended by A 020 of 15 August.
4. Leave to SARDINIA will continue to be regulated under the conditions of MMIA letters A 020 of 14 July 45 and Q/14/3 of 11 Aug 45.
5. Rations. The issue by the despatching unit of up to a maximum of 2 days Travel Rations is authorised for the outward journey only. No other rations will be issued from Italian Army stocks.
6. Rest Camps and Leave Camps. Rest or Leave Camps, or any facilities serving similar purposes, will not be maintained by the Italian Army for Italian personnel on leave, except as authorised by MMIA in each particular case.
7. Further details for the granting of leave and prevention of its abuse will be laid down by the Minister of War, and made known to all concerned.

1. Reference is made to letter, this headquarters, from Chief of Staff, dated 24 July 1945 (not furnished all distributees).
2. Following the representations made personally by General BROWNING, ways and means have been considered whereby it will be possible to compromise between the operational requirements of the Allies as stipulated in the letter under reference, and the necessity for maintaining morale by the continuation of Liberation Leave.
3. You are requested to instruct the Italian authorities that a system may be put into operation immediately by which all Italian troops under Allied operational command will receive seven days' leave once every six months, such leave to be exclusive of travelling time and arranged evenly over the six-monthly periods so that the minimum percentage will be absent from one unit at one time.
4. In addition, as authority has now been given for the over-posting to units of up to 20% of their WE strength, liberation leave may continue, up to a total leave quota of not more than 15% of unit strength, provided an equivalent number of replacements is present with the unit before dispatch of leave parties. These replacements will NOT include those required in substitution for men to be demobilized during the same period.
5. This letter modifies paragraph 11 of letter, this headquarters, file AG 091.711/169 GCT-O, dated 16 November 1944.

4. With reference to Para 3b above, the Navy Sub Command, ALCOM advises that it will be possible to assign on a less permanent basis one destroyer, which can ferry 600 per month. Add this number to the 400 (Para 2) and a lift of 1,000 per month is permitted.
5. With reference to Para 3a above, it is known that a number of schooners are now in the hands of civilian owners. These schooners are not controlled by the Allies and the War Ministry can arrange with the owners for the hire of these schooners on a charter basis, or in case the owners refuse to so employ the schooners, it appears that the schooners could be requisitioned and operated by Naval troops furnished by the Italian Navy. (Schooners must be provided for transport from Palermo to Sardinia, as no other transport is available between Sicily and Sardinia.)

6. It is not considered that the problem will be solved by the assignment of the destroyer (600 places per month), but for the time being all three courses enumerated in Para 3 above must be employed. At the same time it is necessary that only the classes of personnel shown in Para 1a above be considered by you.

7.
 - a. MMIA will proceed with securing the assignment of the destroyer from the Naval Sub Commission, and you will be advised of the final arrangements which must be handled by MMIA with the Flag Officer, Italy, who will deal with the Ministry of Marine.
 - b. You should proceed to charter or requisition schooners, as necessary, as outlined in Para 5 above.
 - c. The allotment of spaces on the two civilian ships will continue as heretofore.

8. I am directed to inform you that firm orders must be issued by you, and fully enforced, so that large numbers of men will not congregate at Naples awaiting transport to Sardinia. Only men in the classes outlined in Para 1a will be authorized to proceed to Naples and then only after proper arrangements for transport have been assured in advance. This will require a definite allotment of available space and an enforced order that men for whom transport is not available are not allowed in Naples, otherwise the use of the Naples Port may be prejudiced as large congregations of men waiting around Naples interferes with the Allied war effort.

9. It is desired that I be fully informed of the action taken by you, especially in regard to Para 7b and 8 above.

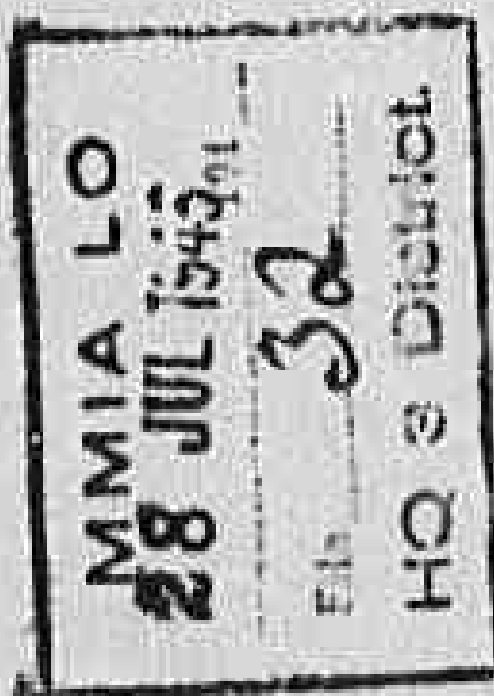

1. Due to the limited number of Italian military personnel permitted to go on leave from the mainland to SARDINIA, because of the shortage of shipping space, a strict control has always been maintained to prevent crowding and delay at NAPLES. This has been accomplished by a numerical allotment of leave to all major Italian commands, the total of which corresponds to the available shipping space. Regardless of this, personnel over and above the allotted number continues to pour into NAPLES in direct violation of existing orders issued by the Italian War Ministry.

2. To relieve the present congestion in NAPLES the following cable order was sent by the War Ministry to all Italian HQs on 22 July, 1945:-

Ministry of War, Cabinet No.215000/II. As of this date 426 soldiers are at Office for Assistance to Transient Soldiers, NAPLES, from all parts of ITALY and bound for SARDINIA to be discharged or going on furlough. This fact proves that lower HQs are not following instructions contained in aforementioned letter from Ministry of War, No.21500. Accordingly, I am requesting all HQs to comply with them strictly in order to avoid a repetition and continuation of undisciplined behaviour on the part of troops awaiting their turn for embarkation. In order to solve present crisis I order that no Territorial Command shall dispatch to NAPLES for trip scheduled for August, 1st 1945 the quota of soldiers corresponding to places allotted with aforementioned letter No.215000/II. Naples Territorial Command will ensure that all soldiers bound for SARDINIA who on and after to-day's date report at NAPLES for embarkation, be immediately returned to their unit; furthermore, it will inform this office every day by telegraph of the situation, in detail,

personnel permitted to go on leave from the mainland to SARDINIA, because of the shortage of shipping space, a strict control has always been maintained to prevent crowding and delay at NAPLES. This has been accomplished by a numerical allotment of leave to all major Italian commands, the total of which corresponds to the available shipping space. Regardless of this, personnel over and above the allotted number continues to pour into NAPLES in direct violation of existing orders issued by the Italian War Ministry.

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3. It is desired that you contact the local Italian HQs /over

with a view to :-

- (a) assure that the above order is being carried out.

Moreover British and American drivers are often unwilling to give lifts to Italian Army personnel, so that the difficulty of reaching their homes and returning on time to their Units is considerable. Lack of leave is the main cause of absence in the Italian Army.
2. In view of the fact that a considerable amount of Allied transport is constantly moving empty, it is considered that Italian personnel could be moved by local arrangements with Allied Commanding Officers.
3. It is requested therefore that you instruct Unit Commanders that they should, if approached by Italian Commanding Officers, give every assistance to facilitating the movements of properly authorized Italian Army personnel, when such assistance will not interfere with the mission of the transportation concerned.

1. AFHQ have given instructions for the following arrangements to be put into effect forthwith for the transportation of Italian Army personnel and Italian Cooperators on leave:-

- (a) Box wagons on freight trains will be provided under arrangements Movements HQ/Areas on a basis to be laid down weekly in the POM programme. So far as practicable regular daily freight trains leaving starting points at the same time each day will be used.
- (b) Tonnage allocation on the above basis will be included in POM programme by G-4(Mov & Tn). Movements Liaison Officer MMIA will submit the necessary details.

2. Where Italian RTOs are available Italian leave personnel will report to them and they will arrange prompt and orderly entrainment. At stations where there is no Italian Movements staff this will be done by British or US RTOs.

- (a) Italian Army personnel will be in possession of Italian Leave passes "Certifico per VIAGGI or LICENZA" in the case of officers and "FOGLIO DI VIAGGIO or LICENZA" for Other Ranks. In addition they will have a bilingual document certifying the validity of their travel documents.
- (b) Italian Cooperators proceeding on duty or on leave will be in possession of movement orders issued by the Unit or Formation on whose strength they are held. On the authority of these documents RTOs will issue warrants which will be endorsed "Italian Personnel under Allied Command" covering the journeys to be made.

3. Italian personnel travelling on duty as individuals will also travel by the services outlined in para 1. Parties of 20 or more under arrangements Movements Areas or Sub Areas and

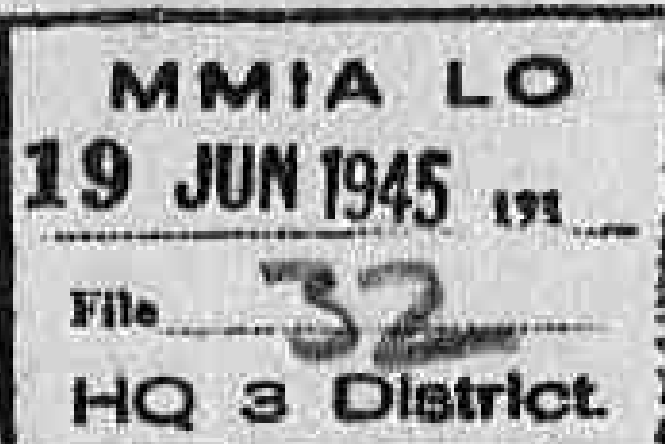

1. With the complete liberation of Northern Italy and the uncertain state of discipline in the Italian Army, it is considered that arrangements must be made for the granting of LIBERATION LEAVE to Italian soldiers whose homes are in newly liberated territory. It is anticipated that such action will result in a larger proportion of men returning to duty on the expiry of their leave than might be expected from the large numbers who will inevitably desert should such leave be forbidden.

2. Liberation leave of 14 days, exclusive of travel time, will be granted to Italian soldiers whose homes are in newly liberated territory. Allied Commanders may use their discretion as to the percentage to be granted leave at any one time up to the limit of 15% in any one unit. Where possible Allied transport will be used to assist in the movement of leave parties.

3. Detailed requirements for movement of Italian soldiers, outside Army Areas, will be submitted by MMIA to AMHQ through Mov channels immediately, and at intervals subsequently as bids for rail and/or sea movement. AMHQ will then arrange movement and issue the necessary instructions.

Detailed requirements for movement of Italian soldiers, outside Army Areas, will be submitted by MILA to AFHQ through Mov channels immediately, and at intervals subsequently as bids for rail and/or sea movement. AFHQ will then arrange movement and issue the necessary instructions.
4. For Italian units in Army Areas and under command Armies, **no 2728** arrangements will be made direct by HQ at Armies.
5. Where civil train services are in operation, movement of personnel on Liberation Leave will be made by such services. Where no other means of movement is available the use of Allied transport is authorized.
6. The scheme outlined above will be operated from 1 June and meantime the proposals should be publicised to the personnel concerned through the MILA so that the men may know they can expect leave in an organized manner and by a given date.
7. The percentage leave rate for the remainder of the Italian Army will remain at 5% in any one unit, to be included in the 15% authorized in para 2 above. On completion of Liberation Leave, the whole of the Italian Army will revert to the present leave rate of 5%.

B. Leave will not be granted to areas other than those specified from time to time by HQ 15th Army Group. The area at present available for Italian Army leave is:

West of River FLAVE from north to road-river crossing G 6494 thence road B 6712, B 7562, B 8875 thence due north to AUSTRIAN frontier.

No moves for any Italian Military leave personnel will be permitted east of this line nor into prohibited frontier zone which is a belt 25 kilometres in depth along MURATH, SWISS and AUSTRIAN frontiers.

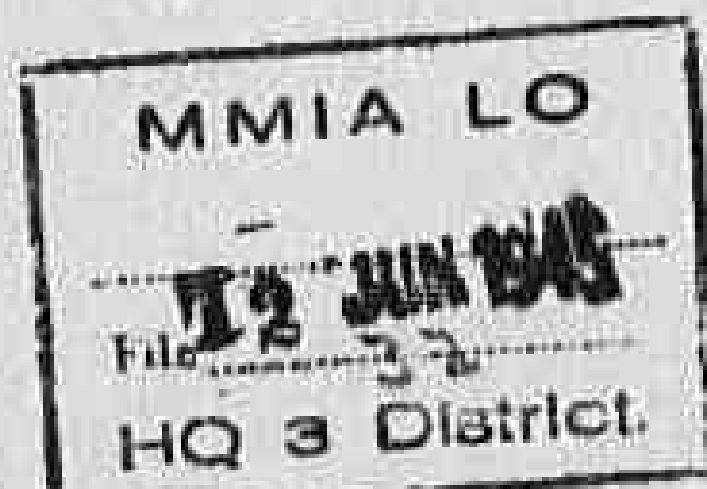

1. The following are the present regulations governing movement of Italian Troops on duty, leave and demobilisation:-

(a) The control line for movement of Italian Army, and Italian Cooperator personnel on authorised leave is now the line river PIAVE from mouth to head-river crossing, 26494 thence road VITTORIO VENETO B6712, - PIAVE DI CADORE B7562- S. STEFANO DI CADORE B8875 thence due NORTH to AUSTRIAN frontier.

(b) No moves for any Italian personnel is authorised EAST of this line nor into prohibited frontier zone, i.e. belt 25 Km in depth along FRENCH, SWISS and AUSTRIAN frontiers, except as in paras C and B below.

(c) Demobilised personnel may move EAST and NORTH of line sec (a+b) above with proper documents from M.M.I.A. (i.e. MMIA. L.Os. will countersign Demobilisation papers in cases where the individuals' home is EAST or NORTH of the control line (a))

(d) Italian personnel on duty may travel as far as the Control Line sec (a+b) above with "Teglio di Viaggio" and Identity Documents.

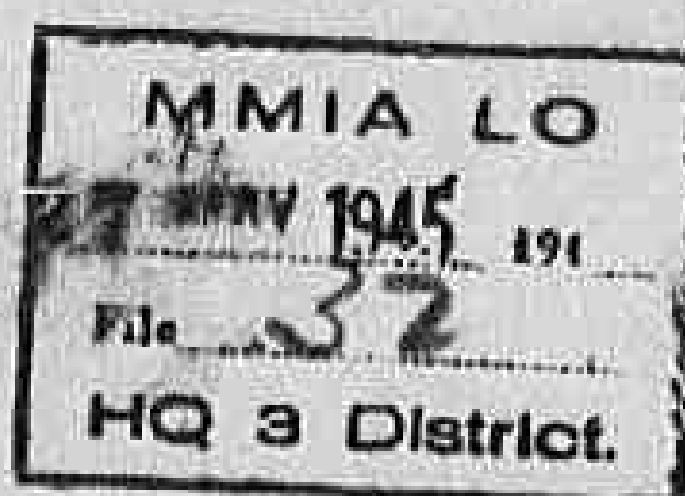
