Under authority of AAI Adm Instr No 48 dated 8 Aug 44, (which has been subsequently endorsed by AFHQ letter AG 370.6/107 GCT-O dated 24 Sep 44), this HQ issued Operation Instruction No 10, "Aid to the Civil Power" (Copies attached for LAZIO and ABRUZZI/MARCHE Regions ACC).

1. Area/Sub Area/Grn commanders will ensure that their liaison with ACC Zone Commissioners (Regional HQ in SICILY) is such that they receive early information of any civil disturbances, should they arise.
2. While the quelling of civil disturbances, which do NOT directly affect Allied interests, is a matter for Italian administrative authorities, it will be borne in mind that the letter will normally only dispose of police and CC RR for the purpose. Area defence schemes will be drawn up in the light of this.
3. Where as in SICILY and CALABRIA the Italian authorities do dispose of troops, such will NOT, except in grave emergency, be employed without prior reference through ACC to the Area Commander, who will be kept fully informed of all incidents and actions taken.
4. Areas will forward full reports of all civil disturbances to this HQ, although Allied action may NOT have been called for.



In particular, information on the attitude, morale, political thoughts and general feeling of the Italian Army is required, including its leaders.
3. Action agencies will therefore submit a Security Report to each HQ monthly, earlier than the 25th of each month, starting on the 25th May 1944.
4. Reports will cover Italian Troops in each outstation's area and will be rendered on subjects listed in attached Appendix A.
5. Reports will be classified SECRET and will on no account be sent through Italian channels.

CENSORSHIP CIRCULAR NO. 282

ITALY.

1. This guidance cancels and consolidates all previous guidance and instructions on Italy. (This includes Guidance 132, 143, 189 and 244.)

2. STOP

2. Any mention of Italian troops being included amongst the enemy forces fighting on the Italian front.
2. Any references which may be made to the handing over of the Italian Fleet to the United Nations powers unless contained in an official statement.
2. Any statements regarding changes in the existing Italian Government or formation of a new Italian Government unless officially released (speculation on proposed changes is permissible and criticism of the present and proposed members of the Italian Government.)
2. Any details of the "Long Term Armistice Agreement"
2. Any mention of the Italian Navy, air or ground operations unless they have been cleared through the Field Press Censorship or are contained in an official Allied Communiqué.
2. In stories written around authorised statements regarding Italian operations, there is no reason to cut anything giving credit to the Italianne except the facts or figures stated are accurate and the content clearly the author's personal opinion.
4. All mention of Italian units, formations, weapons and equipment will be subject to the normal Allied Censors. Names of officers, if possible, should be referred to the Italian censors for clearance in order to avoid the publication of information which may enable the enemy to take reprisals against the officers' families.
5. Any mention of clashes between Italian Troops and Allied Troops including the French will be cut.
