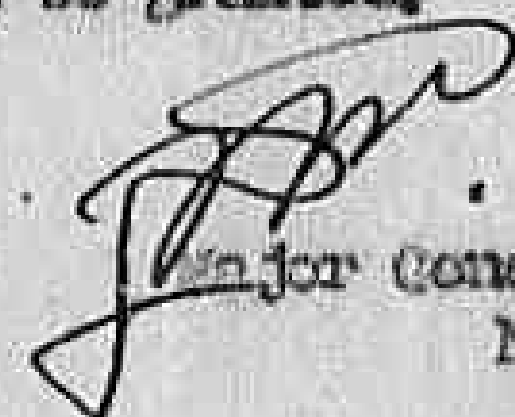

Port Security Instruction (Italy) No. 715

SUBJECT: Travel by civilians from Italy to the U.S., British and French Zones of Occupation in Germany.

TO: All Concerned

1. For the purpose of this instruction, the term "civilians" covers all persons not authorized to hold a recognized U.S., British (including Dominion), French or Allied Naval, Military or Air Force Identity Document.
2. Civilians traveling from Italy to the U.S., British or French Zones of Occupation in Germany must hold military permits issued by G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ. The only civilians exempt from this requirement are:
 - a. Merchant Seamen serving as members of ships' crews, or traveling as passengers or supernumeraries in pursuit of their sea employment and holding appropriate written authority to travel as such.
 - b. War Correspondents accredited to the U.S., British and French Zone Headquarters in Germany.
 - c. Displaced persons traveling under proper authority.
3. For the time being, the military permit in use for this travel will be the Allied Expeditionary Force Permit.

TO: All Concerned

1. Letter, this headquarters, file AG 371.2/015 GEG-0, subject as above, dated 7 November 1944 and amendments thereto dated 5 January, 27 March and 11 April 1945, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor.

2. a. The following instructions apply forthwith to travel from Italy to all destinations other than:

U.S.A.
U.K.
Malta, Gibraltar and other territories to which
British visa regulations apply
Egypt

b. Travellers to the above mentioned territories by direct means (that is, not transiting other territories on the way), who are in possession of U.S., British or Egyptian visas as applicable, may leave Italy without Military Travel Authorizations.

3. Persons leaving Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) for destinations other than those specified in paragraph 2 above, must be in possession of Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ, with the exception of persons listed in paragraph 4 below.

4. The exceptions are:

- a. Allied service personnel on duty.
- b. Allied Diplomats and Consular Officials.
- c. British and United States civilians employed by and travelling on duty for, the following Governmental Agencies:

- (1) UNRRA
- (2) Office of War Information
- (3) Psychological Warfare Branch
- (4) War Shipping Administration
- (5) Ministry of War Transport

h. Persons in possession of Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits or Allied Force Permits valid for Italy, provided that these documents are not indorsed "for single journey only", or of Allied Expeditionary Force permits valid for entry into territory controlled by SHAEF.

5. A person not included in paragraph 4 (of whatever nationality) wishing to leave Italian territory (including Sicily and Sardinia) should obtain application forms for Military Travel Authorization from the nearest Allied Commission Officer or from the Questura at the Capital of the Province in which he finds himself, or such other officer or agency as may be deputed. Two copies of the application form will be completed. They will be typewritten, or written in block capitals where no typewriter is available. The applicant must furnish, where photographic facilities exist, two full face and two profile photographs of passport size, which will be affixed to the two copies of the application form as indicated in the spaces provided. Where the applicants cannot provide photographs, right thumb prints will be made on the application form, in the presence of the agency accepting the application.

6. In the case of applications for diplomatic and consular officers and members of special economic or political missions, however, applications will be handled by Headquarters, Allied Commission. Photographs will not be required.

7. The agency receiving an application will satisfy itself as to the identity of the applicant and as to the reasons for his proposed journey, and will note in the first few lines of the "Remarks" section of the application form any information available locally concerning the applicant, and any comments. Otherwise, the receiving agency will indorse the Military Travel Authorization application forms "Nothing known against" ("Nulla Osta"). The agency will then fill in the items "Counter signature of Civil Affairs Officer and Office Stamp" and "Region and Province", but will leave the remaining spaces blank. The terms of this paragraph will not apply to applications under paragraph 6 above.

8. Both copies of the application form will then be forwarded by the receiving agency through Headquarters Allied Commission to G-2 (CI) AFHQ.

9. G-2 (CI) AFHQ after consideration of the applications, will return one copy of the application form to the appropriate section of ALCOM with the decision as to grant or refusal, and where the application is granted will forward together with the form the appropriate Military Travel Authorization for transmission to the applicant. 1471

10. Agencies handling applications will on no account communicate to persons whose applications have been refused the grounds for such refusal; nor will they attempt to indicate, in view of the detailed research which will be necessary in many cases, the time which may elapse before applications are decided.

11. It should be made known to intending travellers that the Military Travel Authorization is merely an authorization to leave Italian territory and it does not authorize their entry to the country of destination, whose entry requirements must be complied with.

12. This instruction does not apply to Allied-organized parties of refugees, or repatriates, leaving Italy, Sicily and Sardinia. In the case of such refugees and repatriates a nominal roll with appropriate biographical data will be submitted by the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission ALCOM to G-2 (CI) AFHQ who will issue a block Military Travel Authorization if approved.

13. Military Travel Authorizations will be issued only to approved individuals proposing to travel for purposes which benefit the Allied War effort, and to:

a. Scholars, artists and members of the learned professions who are nationals of Italy or of one of the United Nations, if journey is approved for the purpose of free trade in knowledge and learning between the peoples of Italy and the United Nations. Ecclesiastics and journalists will not be considered in this category.

b. Officials serving at posts in the Vatican who are appointed to posts outside Italy involving permanent change of station.

c. Approved refugees and repatriates.

14. In cases where the appropriate Section of Allied Commission considers that the travel of an applicant is urgent, application may be made to G-2 (CI) AFHQ by telegram or telephone; and in the event of a favorable reply, the applicant may be authorized to proceed without being in possession of a Military Travel Authorization. G-2 (CI) AFHQ will in such cases warn the Security Control at the Italian port of exit. In such cases the application form will none-the-less be forwarded to G-2 (CI) AFHQ to complete their records.

The Security Controls at Italian sea and airports are instructed to forbid the exit from Italy of any traveller, to a destination other than those specified in paragraph 2 above, who may present himself without a Military Travel Authorization, unless he produces documentary evidence that he falls within one of the excepted categories detailed in paragraph 4 above. The application forms for Military Travel Authorizations, and the Military Travel Authorizations in current use will continue to be used.

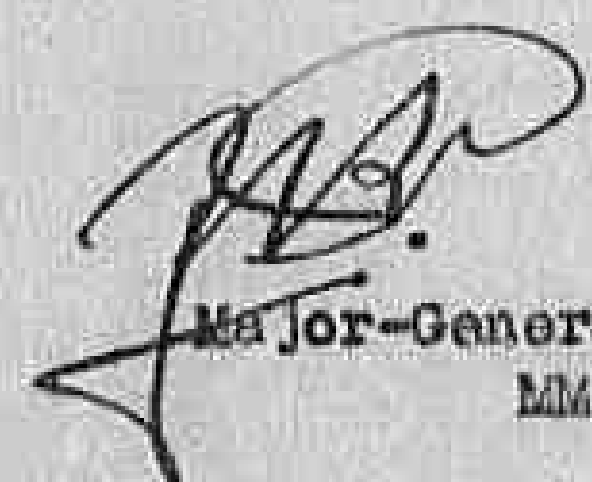

1. Cases have been brought to notice in which Officers have issued to Italian civilians documents purporting to certify that these persons have permission to travel to various places in ITALY; sometimes to places located in advance of the boundaries of the FIFTH and EIGHTH Armies.
2. The practice of issuing such documents will cease.
3. Only in very exceptional circumstances are Military personnel, other than specific Officers of the Allied Commission and AMG, permitted to issue authority for civilian travel and then only to such civilians who are employed by the Military and engaged on particular operational or intelligence tasks and under such circumstances that the urgent necessity of the travel makes it impracticable to obtain the appropriate AC/AMG Pass.
4. It is not considered that in this Command any such emergency is likely to arise and no such authorities to travel will be issued by any person in any unit in this Command without prior reference to this HQ.
5. The territory of ROME Area Allied Command lies within that part of ITALY which is under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government and all applications by civilians to travel into Restricted Zones must be made by them to the QUESTURA.
6. The Restricted Zones include all territory north of the Northern Boundaries or the Provinces of VITERBO, Rieti and TIERAMO and the commune of NAPLES (which includes the Port and city of NAPLES).
7. Officers will only give recommendations for the issue of permits to travel in cases where the identity of the Italian concerned is known to them personally and where the service to be performed is an officially authorised one.

1. In so far as this Headquarters is concerned, the matter of Palermo's unauthorized visit to Albania has been thoroughly investigated. In brief, there is no record of any specific authority ever having been given by this Headquarters for such a visit. Originally, an Air Forces Subcommittee operational report disclosed that such a trip had been made. Accordingly, a full investigation was immediately instituted.

2. On 22 February 45 the former Political Section received a memorandum from the Minister of Foreign Affairs stating that within the next few days it was expected Signor Palermo would ask MMIA for permission, etc., for a brief journey to Tirana (see incl 1). The Political Section referred the memorandum to Land Forces Subcommittee MMIA, and it was agreed that any expression of opinion on the proposed trip would be reserved until such time as the Minister of War directly approached MMIA (see incl 2). However, no such formal request was ever received by MMIA from the Minister of War and thus the matter was allowed to stand with no further following-up.

3. Meanwhile, however, Air Forces Subcommittee on 4 March 45 had received directly from the Italian Air Ministry a request for air transport facilities to be extended to Palermo in order that he might undertake an important Tirana trip (see incl 3). Believing that official permission for the trip had been settled on a much higher level, Air Forces Subcommittee arranged to facilitate the passage. The request was accordingly referred to the Balkan Air Forces Movement Section (see incl 4), where, eventually, aircraft was provided for the trip.

4. It has been reported that, in accounting for his actions to the Prime Minister, Palermo stated permission had been obtained from Air Forces Subcommittee, AG. The Air Vice Marshal Bowen-Buscarlet, AOC, states that at no time was permission or any specific authorization given to Palermo for such a journey by Air Forces Subcommittee. Your attention is further invited to the statement (see incl 5) made by Squadron Leader Bradshaw of Air Forces Subcommittee, who handled the original inquiry.

5. It is understood that during his visit to MMIA (General Browning on 25 March 45, Palermo was to give an explanation of his visit to Albania; however, the Minutes of this meeting do not disclose that any such explanation was given. Apropos of this, MMIA has this date (26 March) received from the Minister of War a proposed plan for repatriating Italian military and civilian personnel now residing in Albania. This plan, it is understood, was worked out by Palermo and Colonel General Hoxha, of the Albanian Government, during the recent Albanian trip. Action in regard to this plan is being held up pending the return of Major General Browning the latter part of this week.
6. In order to help prevent recurrence of similar incidents, the Civil Affairs Section, this Headquarters, has prepared and submitted to your Section a plan for processing trip requests of Italian officials.

He was not in possession of a Military Travel Authorisation such as is issued by G-2 to all Italian subjects who desire to leave Italy. It appears probable that Signor PALERMO left in an Italian plane from an Italian controlled air field and therefore did not pass through Allied security controls.

2. It is requested that an inquiry be made into this case and a report rendered to this Section in order that G-2 may be advised.

1. Certain senior officers of the Italian War Ministry and General Staff pay regular visits to this HQ in order to attend conferences or discuss business matters with MMIA staff officers.
2. The majority of these officers have been issued with A.C. Courtesy Passes. These passes, however, do not permit the bearer to come directly up to MMIA on the 7th floor. Officers are obliged to wait their turn at the Reception Desk to obtain a receipt form for their identity documents. Instances have occurred recently when Italian Brig Generals and Maj Generals have been kept waiting, thus arriving late for appointments and causing them considerable inconvenience and personal embarrassment.
3. In view of the above will you please consider issuing ^a special permit for senior Italian officers which would give them direct access to MMIA. Application for these permits would be made by this HQ, thus ensuring the authenticity of the officer.
4. In view of the fact that this HQ is expanding and that consequently liaison and duty visits by senior Italian officers will be a daily occurrence will you please give this matter your urgent attention.

TO : Ministry of War

1. Staff officers of MMIA HQ, Rome, as well as MMIA LO's, often make liaison visits to Italian units and depots in various parts of the country. It is not always possible to warn the Italian unit or depot of a proposed visit by an MMIA representative, and occasions have arisen when Italian officers in command of units or in charge of depots have refused admittance to these representatives.

On these rare occasions the Italian officer concerned has been justly carrying out his orders owing to the fact that the MMIA officer has been unable to produce a Ministry of War authorization.

2. In view of the above and in order to avoid misunderstandings, will you please issue a Ministry of War pass form, authorizing the bearer to enter Italian Army Depots and visit Italian Units. These permits would be applicable to certain named MMIA officers only.

3. It is suggested that a number of these forms be sent in bulk to this HQ where they would be issued, counter-signed, and stamped. A nominal roll showing the number of the permit issued to each officer would be forwarded to you.

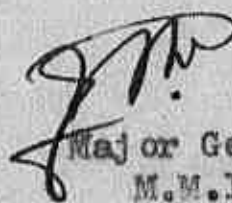
