I have received summary proposals from the Divisions
 Corps Automobilistico regarding the technical training of
 recruits for the MT Workshops of the Italian Army, after these
 recruits have completed their initial training at a C.A.R.
 These proposals which made use of a number of schools throughout
 the Territorial Commands seem to be open to the objections that
 there can be little uniformity in the standards of training
 at different schools, and that the supervision of these
 schools represents an extra burden for the Director of Repairs
 at R.M. Territorial Command. These Officers are I believe
 appointed mainly for their ability to re-activate and to
 control MT Workshops, and not particularly for their skill in
 controlling centres of instruction.

I recommend to you therefore that you should set
 up a Motorisation Repair Training Centre near ROMA where
 centralised technical training of recruits for the MT Workshops
 can be carried out. In this way a close watch can be kept on
 the standard of training given which is very important when
 forming a new Army, and at the same time a uniform standard
 of training can be imparted. Supervision by four officers of
 the training given will also be simplified if the Centre is
 close to ROMA.

there can be little uniformity in the standards of training at different schools, and that the supervision of these schools represents an extra burden for the Director of Repairs at A.A. Territorial Command. These officers are I believe appointed mainly for their ability to re-activate and to control AA Workshops, and not particularly for their skill in controlling centres of instruction.

I recommend to you therefore that you should set up a Motorisation Repair Training Centre near ROME where centralised technical training of recruits for the AA Workshops can be carried out. In this way a close watch can be kept on the standard of training given which is very important when forming a new Army, and at the same time a uniform standard of training can be imparted. Supervision by your officers of the training given will also be simplified if the Centre is close to Rome.

A reconnaissance of CROCHICHOLA was carried out early in January but the site then selected is occupied by the Signal School and I learn that there is little chance of this vacating the premises.

A second reconnaissance was carried out on the morning of 22 January at CROCHICHOLA at which I had hoped Lieutenant Colonel MORANI would be present. Buildings as shown on the attached sketch were viewed and have been reserved for the Motorisation Repair Centre should you decide to locate it there. It is understood that about 500 recruits will be allocated to the AA Repair Service and the buildings shown should be excellent when considering the layout of classrooms, workshops, offices and accommodation for the students. I imagine that accommodation for the officers and the instructors will be no more difficult than in the case of the two schools already

Should you agree that OECCHIGNOLA is suitable for the Motorisation Repair Training Centre, I should be glad to assist you as much as possible in the layout of classrooms etc and the organisation of the instruction. I must however point out that there is little time left for proceeding with the small amount of repair work that is needed to the buildings and that a speedy decision is required if the Centre is to be ready in time.

In passing I would point out that there will probably be space in the buildings indicated for the E & M School which I understand you are moving from CIVITAVECCHIA.

Herewith Progress Report for month of December 1945.

1. CENTRAL.

During the month, training of instructors for T.T.O's was completed. Although the courses were a little on the short side, results proved very satisfactory. The results are given in Appendix 'A' attached. It is recommended that in future the term C.A.L. be used instead of T.T.O., to save confusion when talking to Italians.

The move of the School of Signals to CECCHIGNUOLA has been completed, which marks the first step in splitting the GENIO into two separate entities. The School of Engineering being due to move to a temporary site in one of the barracks at CIVITAVECCHIA as soon as it is possible. It is hoped that this School will eventually go to an excellent site at PIETRALATA.

The R. & M. School at CIVITAVECCHIA is expected to move to CECCHIGNUOLA in the near future to link up with the D. & H. School, and be known as the School of Motorization.

S.I.V.A. will be remodelled after a short course which is being held in January-February. The tactical wing moving to CIVITAVECCHIA and becoming the School of Co-operation; the Administration Wing moving to Rieti, dealing with Services and Welfare. The hatted camp at MANZIANI now used for housing troops used to service the School will become a Field Firing Camp, to be used when required.

2. TRAINING OF INSTRUCTORS FOR T.T.O's.

The first courses have been completed as follows:-

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the move of the School of Engineers to Civitavecchia has been completed, which marks the first step in splitting the GENIO into two separate entities. The School of Engineering being due to move to a temporary site in one of the barracks at CIVITAVECCHIA as soon as it is possible. It is hoped that this School will eventually go to an excellent site at PIETRALATA.

The E. & M. School at CIVITAVECCHIA is expected to move to CECCHIGNUOLA in the near future to link up with the D. & H. School, and be known as the School of Motorization.

S.I.V.A. will be remodelled after a short course which is being held in January-February. The tactical wing moving to CIVITAVECCHIA and becoming the School of Co-operation; the Administration Wing moving to RIELI, dealing with Services and Welfare. The initial camp at LANZIANA now used for housing troops used to service the School will become a Field Firing Camp, to be used when required.

The first courses have been completed as follows :-

The not too high standard of students has been made the subject of a letter from S.M.A.E. to Commands, the main points being those of age, medical examination and, last but not least, Commands to get reprimanded for sending any bad material.

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3. PHYSICAL TRAINING SCHOOL (Cont'd).

The question of Sports 131 was hoped to have been solved at the Sports Board meeting at C.I.C., but unfortunately Italian claims were turned down. A further drive to get this from Italian sources is being made.

The clothing of students is now good but not warm enough for winter. P.F. kit was unsearched by D.A.D.O.S. on inspection at Italian stores, the kit being buried under piles of battle dress. A special issue of shoes has also been made.

The School is prepared to take such students as may be made available for training.

6. RECOMMENDATIONS.

Even the point of view of actual physical development of the Scuola Artieri, this month shows no change from the previous one. The Italian Ministry of War having decided that they wish to have the Engineer School at PIZZINATI, are unable to occupy the site until it becomes free. Current occupation is held by the 58 Rest Camp and it is impossible to know on what date it will be vacated, with tentative information suggesting that this date could be quite possibly as late as August 1945. In this event, the Scuola Artieri would not be in the position to accept the new recruit intake scheduled for March-April, and so a move to temporary barracks and training ground is inevitable. CIVILIANI is suggested as this temporary location.

The temporary move of the Scuola Artieri to any location will entail transportation of a considerable amount of equipment (Heavy bridge, explosive, etc.) and the temporary setting up of extensive training areas (including bridging pens, laying mine fields, etc.) is to be deprecated. However, without the early vacation of PIZZINATI by 56 Rest Camp, there is no alternative.

From the current training aspect, this month is a repetition of November, with training of Instructional Staff continuing; also the Recruit Course of 50 men, and the three-week "Line Clearance" Course for approximately 15 officers and N.C.Os.

Supplies of M.I. Stores and British Equipment have been satisfactory but no future demands from British sources will be accepted after this month.

(b) Control.

Conditions in the Italian Central Storehouse have greatly improved this month owing to the provision of more labour, which has enabled more stores to be taken in from D.A.D.O.S. Storehouse. On advice from D.A.D.O.S. a better system has also been adopted whereby clothing is stacked neatly in sizes and consequently quick issues of the correct sizes can be made to the Regiments.

Previously items of clothing could not even be found, an example being that some gym kit could not be issued until a representative of D.A.D.O.S. staff discovered it hidden under a large pile of Battle Dress.

The system of checking stores received by the Italian Central Storehouse is now entirely satisfactory.

D.A.D.O.S. Storehouse still holds quite a large stock of British Ordnance Stores, but it is hoped to clear these, and any "Dues in" received, by the end of January.

(c) Administration.

Noticeable improvements in the Regiments have taken place, for example, the system and neat layout of their quartermaster's stores and the more adequate supply of clothing and necessities of the correct size.

Herewith Progress Report for the month of November 1945.

GENERAL PROGRESS.

During the month training of Instructors for T.T.C.'s has continued as outlined in Progress Report No. 11.

The move of the D. & M. School to CECCHIGNUOLA has been successfully completed but difficulties in the hand-over of barrack accommodation has prevented all but a small advance party of the Signal School from moving.

As from the 1 December H.Q. "PIONEER" Division becomes H.Q., Central Military Schools, but it would seem that there is little intention to produce a really new organisation at present.

TRAINING OF INSTRUCTORS FOR T.T.C.'s.

This is being carried out as follows :

- At S.I.V.A. - 200 Senior Officers.
- At Infantry School - 443 Junior Officers.
- At 2nd Regiment - 1219 Senior N.C.O.s.
- At 1st Regiment - 971 Junior N.C.O.s.

Initially, difficulty was experienced with the organisation for the students at the 2nd Regiment as the accommodation was far from complete. This caused the programme to start a week late and gave a very bad start to the training. While the accommodation is still not ideal, it is now satisfactory and training is beginning to proceed quite smoothly.

At S.I.V.A. Infantry School and 1st Regiment the standard of training is quite good, considering the inexperience of the instructors. This inexperience leads to a number of elementary mistakes being made in methods of teaching.

It is now hoped to be able to extend the training period a little into the new year.

REMARKS OF LIAISON OFFICERS FOR 1943-44

This is being carried out as follows :

- At S.I.V.A. - 200 Senior Officers.
- At Infantry School - 440 Junior Officers.
- At 2nd Regiment - 1249 Senior N.C.O.s.
- At 1st Regiment - 971 Junior N.C.O.s.

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It is now hoped to be able to extend the training period a little into the new year.

In any case, even if all training must be completed at CERNINO by 20th of December, the courses run will have given the P.T.S.'s a fairly satisfactory start.

PHYSICAL TRAINING SCHOOL.

45 students are under training in their fifth week. The standard of students is again not high but on the whole they are very keen. A new Italian Instructor for Athletics has been added, also a Medical Officer. The addition of these two officers was very much needed and will help to fill in the previous weaknesses of the course. It is also being found possible to arrange various visits from civilian experts at Rome.

A limited amount of work is being done on improving sports grounds and facilities, but this is extremely difficult as all types of sports equipment appear to be almost unobtainable from Italian sources.

The clothing of students, previously deplorable, has been improved slightly.

Unless the Physical Training School is to be given proper facilities and equipment it is not worth running as a separate school.

B. Engineers.(i) General Progress.

Without any question this month has proved both real and heartening in the development of the Scuola Artieri for all those working towards that end, with the result that everything points to the attaining - by a long term policy - a School of paramount importance, settled in a new and adequate barracks and training ground, and staffed by an adequate and well-trained instructional staff.

The present location of the Scuola Artieri at BRACCLINO is neither suitable nor adequate for the future development of the School, and with a view to finding a new site that would lend itself to Engineer requirements many reconnaissances were made. That at PIETRALATA was the only one that was found to be most suitable for an Engineer School, having both wet and dry natural bridging sites, with ample training grounds, and barracks that are large enough to take care of the Scuola Artieri. Unfortunately, however, the site is at present occupied by the 56 Post Camp, and the date when it will be vacated is unknown. The Ministry of War have decided to sit tight and wait for this location to be freed in the future, meanwhile remaining at their present site.

The critical situation in Instructional Staff that had arisen over the last two or three months has been removed. At the beginning of this month sixty (60) officers and N.C.Os. commenced an eight (8) week course to qualify as instructors at the School. This course is progressing well, the general calibre of student appearing good.

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Perhaps one of the most notable improvements of this month is the sharp swing upwards of morale amongst the staff, brought on by the feeling that at long last the Scuola Artieri is developing into something important and worthwhile. They have ample potential staff, which they are training themselves. They environmentalise the occupation of the barracks at PIETRALATA, which they think is ideal and last, but not least, on the 15th of this month they were given by the Allies the power once more to greatly shape their own future.

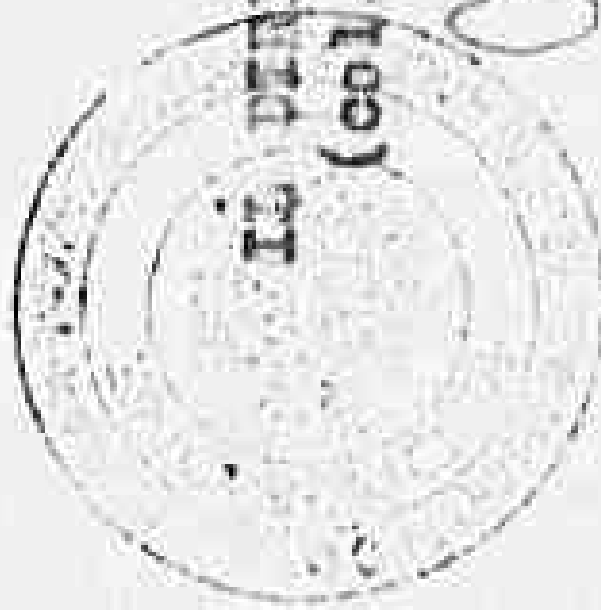

3. The proposed establishment of 10 Officers, 12 warrant Officers and 10 Troops is attached. They will also employ 19 Civilians.

4. This will mean the approval of 188 rations in all, but will reduce rations in the units from which the students are drawn.

5. It is thought that the best method of obtaining students would be for an Officer from Motorisation Division to screen the 1924 class available at Orvieto, and work to smaller classes afterwards. The second course would then be available at approximately the time of the call up of the 1923 class.

6. The possibility of housing the students in the Spolietificio Depot is being reviewed by Mr. Gen. Arta, a Motorisations, but temporary accommodation can be provided at the Centro Studio.

7. It has already been agreed in principle that the School should be opened. May the W/S be approved, and arrangements made for the 188 rations, please.

Herewith report for the month of July '45.

GENERAL PROGRESS.

(a)

This report for the past month gives little information from the Infantry Training point of view particularly as there are now so few men available at the Centre for training and in turn available for selection to fill the various schools. However, all schools continue to make good progress and the past month has again shown good results with the emphasis on improvement in instruction and some attempts to make training more interesting.

During the past month several high ranking officers have paid visits to the Centre and this again showed what an effect this has in producing a higher standard when an effort is made.

The Divisional Inter Unit Drill Competition held in the middle of the month produced keen competition and was won by the Genio (Sappers and Sigs) Regiment. The most noticeable feature of this was the genuine steadiness of the men on parade after standing in the sun for nearly four hours. Under the recently agreed re-organisation of the Centre arrangements have been put in hand to fulfil the new training commitments and the Italian Comando Scuole training staff, using their past experience are planning for the new phase due to commence in about two months.

No. 1 Regiment.

Continued.(d) Infantry School.

The course specified in last months report was duly completed. The average standard reached by students is still low, due largely to the poor quality men available. The Tactical and Platoon Weapons Wing is now reorganised as an NCO's Training Wing and with a carefully arranged programme will instruct young NCO's from this Centre, a good standard being set and it is hoped that when the School moves to its new premises at CIVITAVECCHIA a larger number of suitable NCO material will gradually become available from the Infantry Advanced Training Regiment. The present need for well trained and disciplined Junior NCO's should be well met by the efforts of this School, which has every indication of developing first rate instruction.

(e) Infantry Specialist Training School.

The courses specified were duly completed and although producing rather a lower standard than previous courses as there fewer men to choose from at the Centre, the final results particularly in the Carrier Wing showed progress. 6pr and Mortar shooting was satisfactory but in general, a higher mental standard for students is necessary, this should be overcome eventually when more personal selection can be made from the Advanced Infantry Training Regiment. Progress in Instruction continues.

(f) No. 3 Regiment.(i) Signals School.

All courses have made progress. Intensive training of Wireless Operators has been a feature of the months training resulting in a notable improvement. Two communication exercises ranging over a distance of 70 miles have been held and points learned on the first contributed to making the second an outstanding success. Communication by speech and Morse was maintained between outstations for twelve hours without a break. There is still a general shortage of students again due to the small numbers available at the Centre for selection. Any students available from the Gruppi or instructors for exchange would be helpful.

Continued.(iii) Artillery Requirements

There has been continued progress during the month due largely to the quality of students which has improved. A batch of 22 Officers (or S.O.N.) have given examinations and are the best caliber in the school. The Artillery Branches have had for some time. The 25th Section shot last Thursday at the pistol range. The standard of shooting was good but slow. The response from the gun did not show the accuracy of laying is good. The 22nd was fired over the range at CIVITAVECCHIA. The 17th Section continues to give good performance. The 17th Section shot on the range at CIVITAVECCHIA. The 17th Section did not make such good progress owing to the loss of the Instructional Staff being away on leave. Laying appears to be the chief weakness and is receiving due attention.

(2) Schools(1) Prevent School

Also the principles of First Aid.

Due to lack of Training Transport, D & M instruction is not included in current training.

(2) Medicines School

Since the last report a number of instructors and students were made available through the Ministry of War and the courses are proceeding although at half strength. Of 326 men originally allowed to attend the course only 160 arrived at the Centre, they were given a thorough test to qualify for the course and 76 only were passed as suitable to attend. The majority of the remaining students were sent on to the D & M School to fill this course. It would appear that in the future these courses

- (i) The third SIVA course duly finished on 21 July '45. Results were up, to expectation. Nothing outstanding to report. Instruction showed a general improvement particularly in the handling of discussion and the tendency of Instructors to become over confident and too complicated has been remarked upon and noted by the staff. There is still a tendency to edge away from use of British Methods particularly the sand model but the importance of the correct teaching and sequence of Tactical Instruction is continually emphasised and Instructors encouraged to be quite clear in their ideas before handling discussion.

The extra week has again allowed all students to spend extra time on the study of British weapons and methods.

- (ii) The School of Administration is settling down. It is still found a difficult subject to put over as Italian methods of administration are so different to normal British procedure but the Chief Instructor has been given access to all practical experience available here, and is at present, during the break, visiting the Gruppi to clear up outstanding points they are not clear on. The Man Management Course due to start on the next course is well organised and ready to commence instruction. Eventually it is hoped this course will tour the Gruppi.

1. At present there are no facilities in existence for the training of Workshop specialist personnel in the ITI-ITI Category of the Italian Army.
2. The Mechanics School at Cesano at present is for the training of Br-ITI personnel only, on British vehicles.
3. With the suggested new layout of the ITI-ITI Repairs organisation to include Northern Italy, it is essential that immediate steps are taken for the provision of specialists of all trades, especially Vehicle Mechanics and Electricians.
4. It is felt that the late AC Driving School at Centro Studi, Rome, should be reopened by the Italian Army for the training of ITI-ITI Specialists, for the following reasons.
 - (a) These premises were an Italian Army Mechanics School before the War, are designed for the purpose, and have the necessary equipment.

This will mean that for the first 5 1/2 months no vehicle mechanics courses would be organised, but approximately 270 driver mechanics will have been trained, - may be potential Vehicle Mechanics.

9. This progressive system, as suggested, may appear somewhat lengthy but I am sure that in the long run it will prove to be the most successful.

10. There is one other point. When I called at No.3 GP Coy to vet the tradesmen I found that students failed by the School were posted to fill their W.B. as tradesmen.

11. I am of the firm opinion, after viewing the training and the posting that it is imperative for:

- (a) A Senior Technical Officer to control the training.
- (b) That before tradesmen be posted, the School be consulted as to ability and suitability. If this is not done the real object and value of the School is lost.

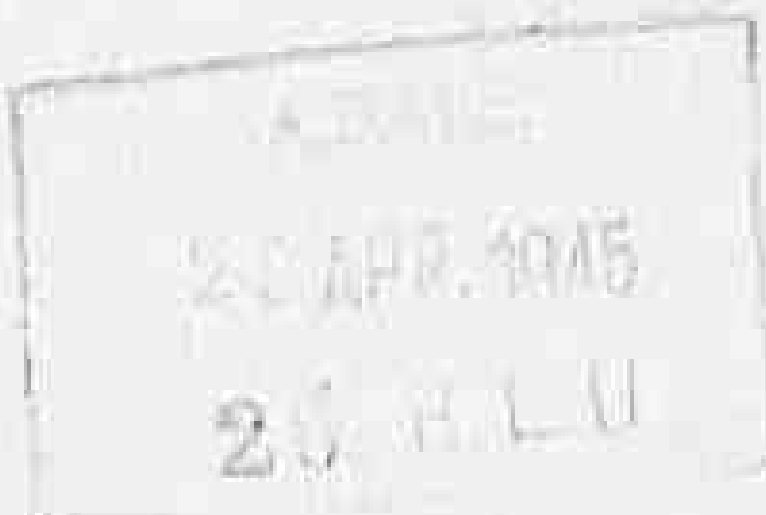
