FIFTH ARMY AR-ITIS

1. CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

Att is a state showing :-

- (a) First allotment from Lt. Col. Moriarty. This was passed direct to 15 Corps and distributed by them (not incl in total).
- (b) Amounts held in 15 Corps P.M.S.
- (c) Second allotment from Lt. Col. Moriarty. This is now being collected, and will be held by 210 Div, till 231 Div can take over.
- (d) Third allotment from HQ, due 5 Dec.
- (e) Fourth allotment from HQ (MIA AQ2267 of 26 Nov refers)
- (f) Issues made by QD (not incl in total)

NOTES.

- (a) SAMOIS clothing was allocated and distributed by HQ through QD.
- (b) 81 x 56 lbs Duffin to all ERITIS (this will be a regular supply) was issued by QD on 23 Nov.
- (c) 18 bicycles have been loaned by QD to BRITI pioneers, until replacements can be made available from ITALIAN sources ("Loan" is the word used, but not entirely meant.)

2. SOAP.

There is a soap shortage - or was. 210 Div, however, found 2000 extra rations for ERITIS today. Hospitals require more than 300 grams per man per month, as laundry is high, and patients don't bring their soap. Suggest there should be a hospital scale, additional to normal ration.

4. BLANKETS

- (a) All 13 Corps UNITS have three blankets. I am checking to find their origin.

- (b) Most other units also have three, and none less than ~~two~~ ¹ ~~2~~ ¹ ~~3~~ again checking origin.

- (c) Where it is definitely considered units should have THREE, I intend to issue, where possible, one comforter, and to withdraw one blanket. It has been found that a blanket over a comforter will stand the weather.

5. 231 DIV.

- (a) Room is prepared - a barracks in good condition, except for some windows. Admisible for all purposes, incl Transit Camp. The latest

rfts have been housed there already. Name COSSA DI S. GIORGIO,
via Leonardo, FLORENCE.

(b) I have written a directive for 231 Div on Clothing (copy etc) which has passed all comment by HQ here, incl Col. Rich. This will await them on arrival. I have also prepared a memorandum of priority local tests for them.

(c) Br Inc are mootting the question of passing PRIMI rfts etc through 231 Div Transit Camp. Rations deem the only difficulty, and I have brought this to their notice. In General, I think it would be a good thing, and would help to prevent possible ill-feeling existing in various parts of the Italian Army (see also Welfare).

5. WELFARE

Free seats and occasional free performances are now given to Italian Tps in the Local cinemas. Likewise ENSA parties, run by ENSA but no distinction is, or will be made between any categories. This is essential and fully realised here.

7. CO-OPERATORS

A Co-operator W/tps has arrived at VILLENEUVE under comd Br Inv, to look after HQ vshs. It's a pity.

8. GENERAL

With the imminent arrival of PRIMI, there is a danger in the background, of tps in Green B/D becoming a lesser breed, and it is a possible source of ill-feeling, which might give certain Italian parties political propaganda.

This will be combatted by making Welfare General. That includes Clubs and so on. It would be a good thing if the following could happen too.

- (a) ENI to all tps in Combat Area (I know !)
 - (b) Bettie Dress coass to be dyed - at least for 2nd tps.

In this connection I feel it would do good if the Transit Camps of Adm Div HQ could be used as, or extended to embrace Combat transit personnel and perhaps fwd r/t centres. Rations and ENI would be the great problem.

I have brought this to their notice. In general, I think it would be a good thing, and would help to prevent possible ill-feeling arising in various parts of the Italian Army (see also Welfare).

6. WELFARE

Free seats and occasional free performances are now given to Italian Tps in the local cinemas. Likewise ENSA parties, run by ENSA but no distinction is, or will be made between any categories. This is essential and fully realised here.

7. CO-OPERATORS

A Co-operator Wrops has arrived at Florence under command of Inc., to look after HQ rents. It's a pity.

B. GENERAL.

~~REMARKS~~ This will be combatted by making Welfare General. That includes Clubs and so on. It would be a good thing if the following could happen too.

- (b) Battle Dress cease to be dyed - at least for fwd tps.

In this connection I feel it would do good if the Transit Camps of Adm Div HQs could be used as, or extended to embrace Combat transit personnel and perhaps fwd rty centres. Nations and NARCI would be the great problem.

9. MILITIAERS

Two reports from Italian sources on the Malteers re-inforcements are att.

Maj. Barbato, Italian OC 21 Pack Op was ~~shy~~ ^{shy} in tears. He loves his Gp and is proud of it, and rightly so. On the new Call Up from AGUZZI (house of Malteers, I'm told), he would like to come down and choose his fellows. Under AFHQ letter Command and Administration, setting up BRITI rty centres, this becomes a British responsibility, and ~~5 P. 1e2~~ ^{5 P. 1e2}

Both in the rfts and in his present Sp, there are a number of overage personnel. The Ministry of War has said they should be demobilised.
