Due to the extra ships coming in this week approx 50 military will be available for the S/S Abbazia 21 October. The rest of the 200 places will be turned over to civilians.

c "Q" Points. Rations. With the recent arrival of food on the S/S Abbazia no emergencies exist. The Abbazia is still in process of being unloaded and no report as quantity received available as yet. Many cartons, especially Canadian packed fish items, came broken in the ship before being unloaded.

1. Sunday, 14 October

a Day off.

2. Monday, 15 October

a Returned to Cagliari by plane from Rome.

b Conferred with Lieutenant from AC re requirement of number of Italian planes per week from Sardinia to Rome and return.

c Capt De Stefano conferred with Mr. Pernis, U.S.A., re the safeguarding of mail on U.S. Liberty ship unloading grain. Also conferred with Auto Directorate, CMS, re repair of Army transport.

d Destroyer Carini departed for Sicily loaded with 47 military personnel.

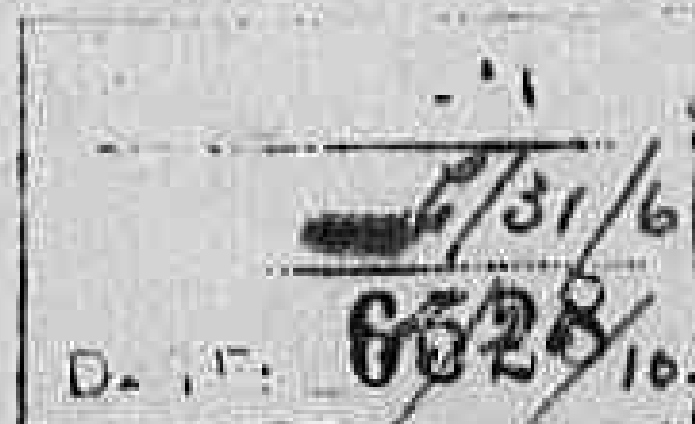
3. Tuesday, 16 October

a Conferred with Representative CMS re proposed loading of military on cruiser Garibaldi.

b Conferred with a civilian re the disposal of salvage in accordance with MIA Q/15/11 of 21 August 1945. Advised him to contact the Italians in accordance with MIA Q/8 of 19 September.

c Conferred with Commissary Section re turning over control of clothing and equipment in accordance with MIA Q/8 of 19 Sept.

d Sgt Gentile returns from Naples on S/S Abbazia escorting U.S. food rations.



4. Wednesday, 17 October

a Conferred with General Maccario. Commanding General Italian Forces in Sardinia, re (1) Training. He stated that they had been making "dry runs" putting their plan into effect as to quelling riots and disturbances. I informed him, as verbally instructed by General Browning, to put more emphasis on training. ✓

b Cruiser Garibaldi departs for Naples with 453 military personnel and S/S Gennargentu departs for Sicily with 16 military personnel.

5. Thursday, 18 October

a Checked unloading of food for Italians from S/S Abbazia. Many boxes were broken, especially the fish items, Canadian packed. The removal from dock was very slow so contacted, Commanding General, Territorial Office for Sardinia, to furnish more trucks. Flour was stacked on dock, gave instructions to move flour first on account of threatening rain.

b Conferred with Lt/Lt Leach, RAF, Elmas, re new regulations regarding air passage on RAF.

c Conferres with Capt Delogu, High Commissioner's Office, re sending refugees on Italian ship (See our signal Y 699 of 18 Oct).

d Capt De Stefano inspected vehicles in Category 5 at Paulatino (Vehicle graveyard near Abbasanta).

6. Friday, 19 October

a Checked the unloading of food for Italians from S/S Abbazia, going much better today. (See par 5a above).

b Checked the storage of food at Bulk Depot unloaded from the Abbazia. The Major in charge stated they had 500 - 100 lbs sacks of flour that was old and made the bread taste musty; this flour was sent from mainland on previous shipments. The flour did not smell musty to me or to my clerk. Am having a batch of bread made using 100% so called "bad flour" and also using 50% and will test some.

cc Inspected Cagliari Distributing Depot and 31 Engineer Battalion (See S & T Report).

d Destroyer Pacinotti departs for Naples loaded with 96 military personnel.

7. Saturday, 20 October

a Conferred with CIP re issue of grease to Italian Army in accordance with RHIA signal ST/1602 of 28 September (See our Y 705 of 20 October).

b Checked loaves of bread made from so called "musty" flour (See par 6b above) with 100%, 50% and 5%. Am making a further test of 25% to determine which should be used to consume the flour. The flour is not sufficiently musty to condemn.

c Checked unloading of food from S/S Abbazia. Learned that Italian guards were not doing their duty, informed Commanding General, Italian Forces in Sardinia to take disciplinary action.

d Checked a quantity of sweepings at Cagliari Forage Depot and issued instructions to issue part as full ration and part as $\frac{1}{2}$ ration.

e Capt De Stefano conferred with Auto Directorate, CMS, re load carriers held by Calabria Division.

f Destroyer Alisco departed for Naples with 70 military personnel and S/S Abbazia departed for Naples loaded with 59 military.

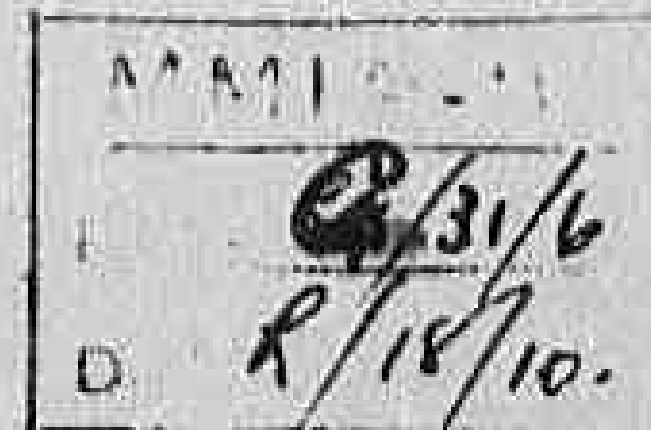

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PART I

MONTHLY REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER 1945

SARDINIA

1. Political interest is centered in the London Conference, the coming elections, and the National Constituent. Public opinion is concerned primarily with the improvement of the economic situation.
2. The amount of grain collected is still far below the expected yield due to the drought and the grasshoppers. Corn, pastures and vineyards have also been hard hit by the drought.
3. The exportation of livestock to the mainland has stopped due to drop in the market prices at Rome. It is expected that exportation will be resumed as an increase in price is foreseen in the near future. But this future exportation is not expected to reach the previous level.
4. During the month, coal production has gone up to 58,470 tons as compared to 53,238 tons in August. 53,000 tons of Sulois coal were exported during the month of September. 5,640 tons of foreign coal were imported on the S.S. Celtic Monarch during the month. Total imports for the month of September equal 1,987 tons. Total exports equal 14,800 tons.
5. There is increased unemployment due to the return of ex-prisoners and refugees from the mainland. It is understood that the Government is going to allocate a sum of money for public works to relieve unemployment in Sardinia.
6. Public safety is satisfactory but there is increased crime in Nuoro Province.
7. Public health conditions on the island are satisfactory.
8. There is a great need for tires and spare parts for vehicles on the island. The allocation of fuel is also below needs.
9. Plans are being drawn up for the institution of the bank of Sardinia.

MONTHLY REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER 1946

PART II

POLITICAL REACTION AND PUBLIC OPINION

The political situation has changed very little. The public shows a marked lack of interest due to the poor economic situation with the constantly increasing cost of living.

The transportation situation is an added handicap to local industry and unemployment is also increasing due to arrival of refugees and ex-prisoners of war.

The political parties are preparing for the coming elections. The Roman weekly "L'Uomo Qualunque" has brought strong reaction from the newspapers and propaganda organs of the political parties who denounce it as a new form of Fascism.

There is great interest in the London Conference of Foreign Ministers which will determine the status of Italy's colonies and the peace treaty.

There is also great interest in the National Constituent.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

The Sard Regional Assembly met on 9 September with special emphasis on public works to relieve unemployment.

In consideration of the precarious financial conditions of the Communes, it is hoped the government will give financial support for public works.

The amount of wheat collected is low due to poor harvest and to the low price fixed by the Government.

SALT

The export of salt amounted to 8,960 tons. A greater quantity could have been shipped had more shipping been available and with improved port facilities.

LIVESTOCK

Exported during the month of September:

1525 Sheep

The exportation of cattle has stopped due to a drop in the market price in Rome. A resumption of exportation is foreseen in the near future with an increase in price. However, due to the forthcoming rains, this future exportation is not expected to reach previous levels since grazers find it more advantageous to retain the animals on the island.

TUNA

Situation unchanged. During the month 500 qli of canned tuna was exported to the mainland.

EXPORTABLE SURPLUSES

The only exportable surpluses of foodstuffs are cheese and almonds.

COAL

On hand as of 1 Sept are 38,059 tons of coal. Production for the month of September is 55,470 tons, an increase over the preceding month of 2,232 tons. 53,000 tons exported during the month of Sept. 15,000 tons consumed and 24,869 tons on hand as of 1 October.

The S/S Celtic Monarch arrived with 3,640 tons of imported coal. With the stock of 2,779 on hand the supply should be sufficient until 10 November.

AGRICULTURE AND FORESTS AND FISHERIESAgriculture

The season continues to be unfavorable due to the drought, warm winds and hot weather. There was a small amount of rain at the end of the month but it was not sufficient to help matters much. The corn harvest was unsatisfactory and the vineyards have suffered greatly due to the prolonged drought. It is expected that rains will relieve the shortage of pasture by the month of November.

Forests

The increase of price, transportation difficulties and lack of specialized personnel have hindered charcoal production.

Fisheries

Production is limited due to lack of equipment.

LABOR

There is increased unemployment due to return of refugees and ex-prisoners. Agitation for increased wages threatened to bring about strikes, especially among employees of secondary railways.

PUBLIC WORKS

Public works are being started to absorb unemployed workers. The repair of roads contribute a large part of these works.

PUBLIC SECURITY

Lack of men and means continue to hamper the improvement of public security. Conditions are good in Cagliari and Sassari Provinces but Nuoro Province has a more serious situation.

PUBLIC HEALTH

The situation in general is satisfactory.

People coming from the area of Taranto are carefully screened for any signs of plague or other contagious diseases. Sporadic cases of contagious diseases have been localized and appropriate measures taken.

EDUCATION

The schools are still closed for summer vacation.

REFUGEES

An increased number of refugees returned to Sardinia during the month. The number of refugees leaving Sardinia has decreased.

COMMUNICATIONS

Road Transport

The situation is serious. There is a great need for tires and spare parts. Allocation of fuel is below needs.

Rail Transportation

The allocation of foreign coal is short of demands.

Sea Transport

The S/S Monconigo, after hitting a mine and being laid up for repairs, has returned to the run. However, the sailings are very irregular and it is deemed necessary to replace her with another ship.

Navy vessels have transported a number of passengers to the mainland.

PROPERTY CONTROL

Arms have been requested from the Ministry of War for the sworn guards in rural areas due to an increase in thefts and other crimes in these areas. This request was not approved.

FINANCE

Plans are being drawn up for the institution of the Bank of Sardinia.

c Cruiser Garibaldi arrives.

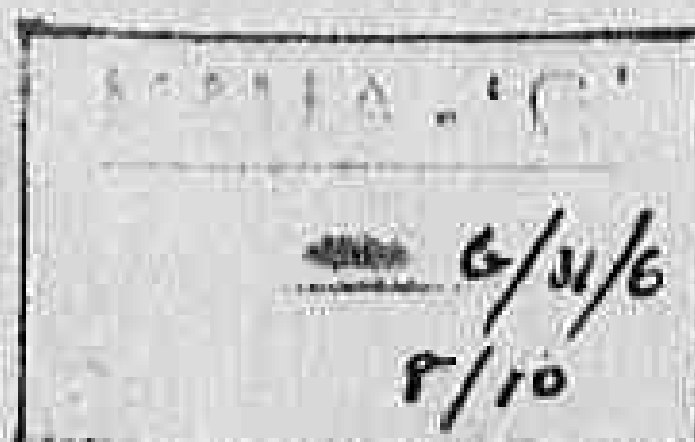

Requested Col Rossi to either have him to get on the job or replace him.

c Conferred with General Scalabrino, and Colonel Rossi, Commissary Section, re transportation for the Commissary Section at Depots. This matter I had previously taken up with General Scalabrino some time ago. Again requested that military MT should be made available to the Commissary Sec and Food Depots on call as it was urgent to move the food to and from the depots.

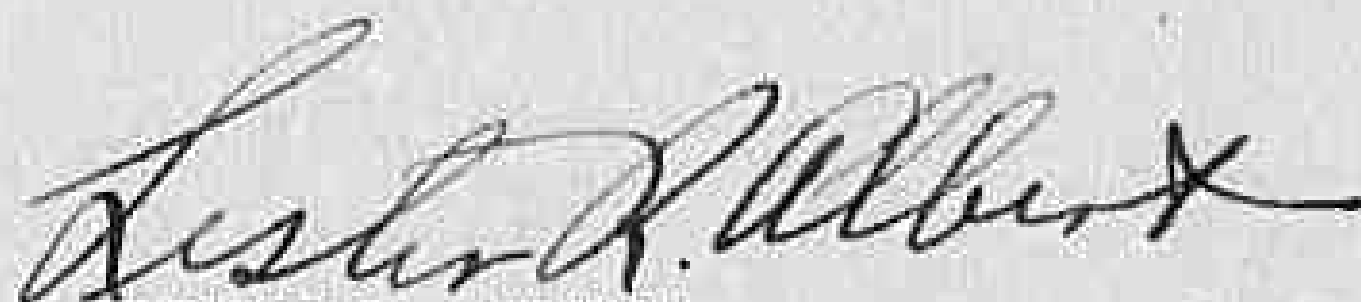

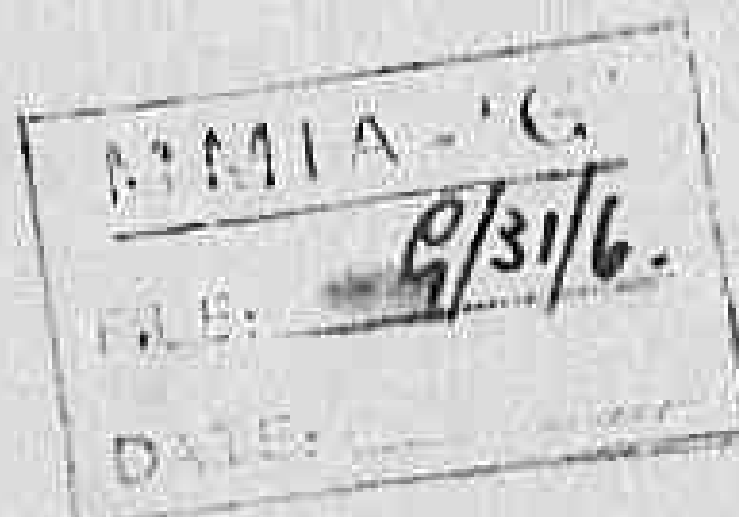

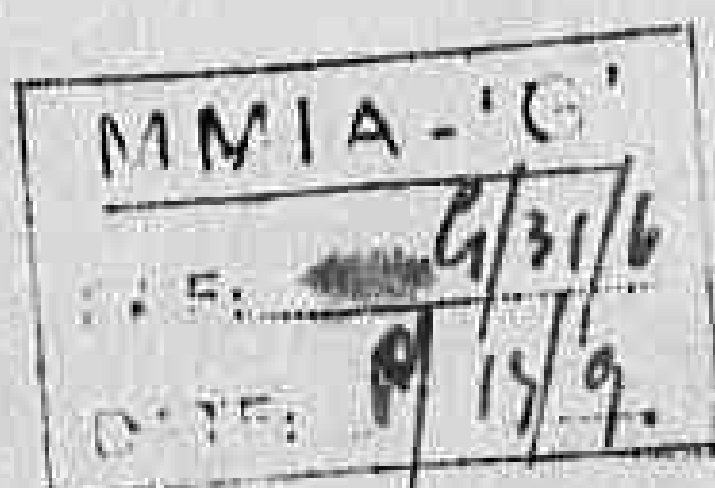

PART I

MONTHLY REPORT FOR AUGUST 1943

SARDINIA

1. The news of the Conference of Foreign Ministers brought hope to the Sardinian people of a more satisfactory status for Italy. It is particularly noted that in the Communes due to the present unstable political situation and poor financial conditions, most of the more able men decline any political appointments.
2. The drought has continued during the month of August with considerable effect on truck farming, vineyards and pastures. Finally a much needed committee has been appointed in each Province to make a survey on forest conservation.
3. Sardinia's contribution to replenish the livestock slaughtered by the Nazi-Fascists on the mainland is still going strong. During the month 1417 head of cattle, 568 horses and 2421 sheep were exported. The only feedstuff available for export was cheese. During the month of August 53,238 tons of Sulcis coal were mined compared to 50,981 tons for the month of July. 37,670 tons of coal were exported. Foreign coal is badly needed on the island as the supply on hand at 1 Sept was only 495 tons. Exports for the month (excluding coal) totaled 1,307 tons. Imports came to 842 tons.
4. The unemployed have staged demonstrations in some Communes demanding that public works be increased. The street car company workers in Cagliari have demanded the nationalization of the company.
5. Public safety and public health conditions on the island are satisfactory.
6. Transportation facilities between Sardinia and the mainland have been much improved by the addition of the 7/8 Mosenigo to the Olbia-Civitavecchia service. During the month of August approx 1800 refugees were returned to Sardinia from the mainland.

POLITICAL REACTION AND PUBLIC OPINION

Public spirit is low due to the difficulties of the current economic situation.

There was great rejoicing at the end of the Japanese war, and the people now feel that the Government can work more on returning the economic life to normal.

The news of the Conference of Foreign Ministers brought hope to the people of a more satisfactory status for Italy.

The political parties are preparing for the forthcoming elections.

Numerous demonstrations were held on the island for increased public works to relieve unemployment. The Ministers of Public Works and Post-war Relief arrived to investigate conditions in Sardinia.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Due to the poor financial conditions of the provincial administrations, most of the more able men decline any political appointments. This is also due in part to the unstable political situation.

Many of the Communes of Nuoro Province desire to become a part of a difference province due to the difficulties of transportation to the capital of the province, Nuoro.

The shipments for the month of August were not up to expectations and the S/S Langano did not always leave with a full load. Due to a shortage of pastures and forage, it is not possible to build a staging area for the animals at Olbia and often the sailing dates of the Langano are not communicated in time to transport a sufficient number of animals to the port to fill the ship.

Exportable Surpluses

The only exportable surplus on the island is cheese.

Coal

On hand as of 1 August is 32,791 tons of coal. Production for the month of August is 33,238 tons. During the month 37,679 tons were exported. Consumed in Sardinia were 10,300 tons. On hand as of 1 Sept were 33,069 tons.

Only 10,500 tons were allotted for use on Sardinia against an estimated need of 15,000 tons. With such a limited quantity, it is not possible to satisfy the needs of the island. Consequently, they will not be able to produce enough electricity and this in turn will cut the production of coal.

There are 496 tons of imported coal on hand. This quantity is sufficient for needs only until 6 September. More foreign coal is needed immediately.

AGRICULTURE, FORESTS, FISHERIES

Agriculture

The outlook is still unfavorable due to the continued drought and hot winds. Consequently, the crops mature irregularly. This has been especially hard on tomatoes, corn, vineyards and truck farming. The same is true of the pastures.

Forests

The High Commissioner has appointed a Committee in each province to make a survey on forest conservation.

Fisheries

There is still a great lack of proper fishing equipment.

LABOR

In some Communes the unemployed staged demonstrations for increased public works to provide employment. But the Commune administrations could not comply for lack of funds. Only the Central Government can provide the solution to this problem and they have already set aside money for public work projects.

There was some unrest among the street car workers in Cagliari who demanded, among other things, nationalization of this company.

There was some trouble among the workers brought from the mainland to work in the coal mines and it was considered better to return ^{some of} them to the mainland.

PUBLIC WORKS

The local administrations are working on public works which can be easily carried out and will employ large numbers of the unemployed. Since the lumber requested from the mainland has not arrived, it is suggested that the lumber held, but not being used, by the Italian Army be turned over for this purpose.

PUBLIC HEALTH

Health conditions on the island are satisfactory. Few cases of contagious diseases have been reported. Strong measures have been taken to prevent the spread to Sardinia from Corsica of the plague.

REFUGEES

About 1000 refugees returned to Sardinia in the month of August and they were immediately returned to their homes.

COMMUNICATIONS

Road Transport

The situation is difficult, especially due to lack of tires. The High Commissioner claims the POL allocations are not sufficient to cover the needs.

Railway Transportation

Nothing new to report.

Sea Transportation

The S/S Monconigo started service between Olbia and Civitavecchia. This will greatly facilitate the passenger service between Sardinia and the mainland. Within a short time it should be no longer necessary to control the passenger service as it should be back almost to normal.

PROPERTY CONTROL

The rural guards are handicapped due to lack of clothing, shoes, and firearms.

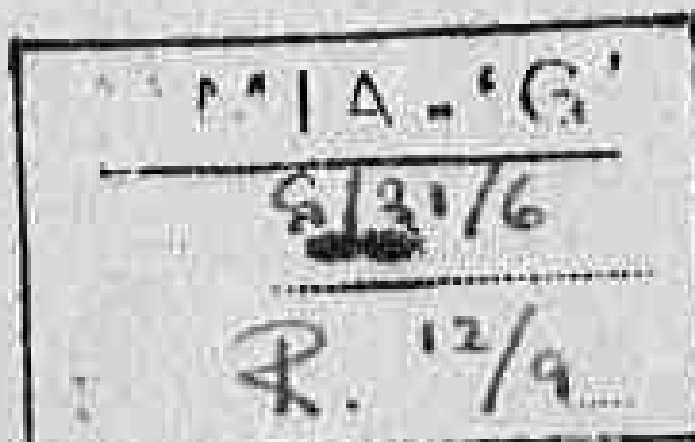

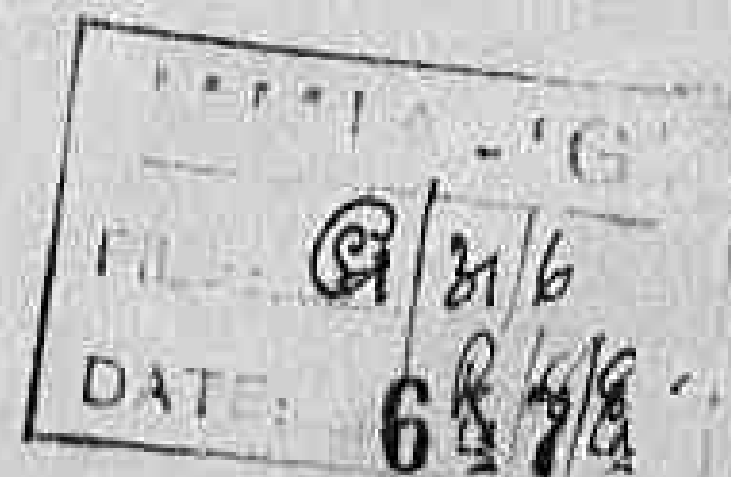

Our recent inspections of MT and the 14 Repair Unit indicate that vehicles are not properly serviced and steps to repair inefficient vehicles not expedited. Again I informed the Commanding General, Italian Forces in Sardinia that it was his responsibility to keep the vehicles efficient and take immediate steps to correct the deficiencies. He promised immediate action. (See our S 4 T Report).

1. In compliance with your letter G/31 subject as above of 4 June 1945 and supplement thereto dated 21 June 1945, submit the following:

a "Q" Points

- (5) No information of any Italians endeavoring to obtain any "I" information on any other nation.

b "A" Points. With three recent trips of the cruiser Garibaldi we have been able to clear the backlog on leave personnel from mainland and send all leave personnel from Sardinia to Mainland. So with the 200 places on the Abbia and Campidoglio each month, unless some unforeseen condition arises, we should be able to handle the transportation of leave personnel satisfactorily. However, we will have by the end of July approx 600 Italian Air Force callups to transport, which I am of the opinion we can sandwich in by using various Italian ships.

c "Q" Points

(1) TRE. If our request to you is approved to transfer the mechanics and Assistant mechanics from 5 Efficient Vehicle Park to 14 Repair Unit our auto repair situation will be in better condition.

(2) Rations - No change from previous report. Note that 56 tons of dehydrated vegetables were shipped to Sardinia on the Abbia middle of June and to comply with instructions to retain only

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60 days reserve on the island we shipped 20 tons of same to mainland on Joseph G. Cannon last week. However, in computing the amount to be sent on the Cannon figures were taken from ST/12 report as at 20 June and the 36 tons mentioned above were not at that time included.

(5) Clothing and Equipment.

(a) Just received a detailed report on clothing for callups which has been greatly delayed. They report some clothing unserviceable, and some needing cleaning and repairs. Stating that this clothing was issued to callups and later withdrawn from callups when rejected, in Hospital, went AWOL, etc. It is the usual Italian excuse, but on of the opinion there has been some "faggling", in other words an interchange of clothing with other military. We have been short shirts, shoes and drawers on the island. By 25 July when we receive the inventory, which I directed to include all clothing to be returned by recalls, we should know our exact status on these three items and will requisition accordingly. Until you receive our requisition, unless already in the process of being shipped, it will not be necessary to honor our previous requisition.

(b) Clothing Depot at Macomer to be consolidated with Cagliari Depot.

(c) In my inspection to Oschiri Clothing Repair Depot the officer in charge stated they rebuilt a daily average of 10 pairs of shoes per day. The Commissary Section advise me their output is 70 pairs per month.

The dry weather has taken some toll but estimate the crop as 80% (upwards) of normal, the heads were good length and in most cases well developed kernels. In the Provinces of Nuoro and Sassari where less grain is grown, the grasshoppers and drought have done more destruction, but still there is considerable amount of grain produced there this year. We interviewed many farmers and their first reply is that there is nothing and I.E. would have to feed them. But upon further investigation we found their statements greatly exaggerated. Am of the opinion that May, being a cool month, and although dry, the coolness aided the growing of grain.

(2) Forage and Pasture. Am of the opinion that the drought and grasshoppers have taken a great toll in both. Very little hay was produced and farmers are not selling any to the Army due to the shortage. In spite of the poor pasture, cattle are in very good condition for grassers and this time of year. The sheep are mostly milkers and of a very poor quality and are not in very good condition. Contrary to reports of stock dying from starvation could find no such cases when further questioning, the reports were unfounded.

(3) Fruits, Nuts and Grapes. Fruit crop is normal production this year. The grapes and nuts look healthy and promise a normal crop.

(4) Grasshoppers. In various trips up the island have observed the great number of grasshoppers, more plentiful in the vicinity of Macomer and farther north. In early May we authorized the loan of 2000 salvage Army tents to the High Commissioner to combat them in the crawling stage, in all my travels throughout the island the past 2 months only saw four civilians destroying grasshoppers. In certain areas when in the crawling stage millions could have been collected and destroyed with a little effort. We authorized the transfer of 150 tons, with authority to draw 500 tons more if required, of sulphur chloride from Army Depots on sale to the High Commissioner's Office, only 50 tons were collected.

b Inspected 5th Company, 40th Regt at Nuoro, satisfactory except kitchen dirty and many flies (See S & T Report).

c The Casermaggio Depot at Nuoro has been closed and equipment moved to Gagliari.

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d Inspected Micro Artillery Repair Shop and Depot. All carts and harness for mainland had been shipped to Cagliari. They have 180 civilian employees in addition to artillery repair work they are doing metal and wood repair work on vehicles for Abbasanta Repair Shop. They were preparing for shipment to mainland for 20.RR. 1899 machine guns, 3000 rifles and 1500 pistols. They also were dismantling 165 mm artillery guns.

e Capt De Stefano conferred with Automobilistico Directorate CMS re unauthorized vehicles and windshield labels.

f Sgt Gentile arrived from week pass to Rome.

4. Thursday, 28 June

a Lt Colonel Cecce, new Chief of Staff, CMS, made courtesy call.

b Conferred with Major Palmi, Commissary Section, re (1) Issue of rations to Italian Air Force. (2) status of excess clothing from recalls and recruits. Told him to have the final report expedited and the clothing turned back and placed in the Clothing Sub Depot at Cagliari and taken up on stock records.

c Conferred with Colonel Parenti, High Commissioner's Office, re loan of 100,000 jute sacks to bag imported grain at Cagliari port. As they need them at once authorized loan of 5,000, rest pending authority from MHA Rome (See our signal Y 511 of 28 May).

d S.S. Joseph G. Cannon arrived with cargo of barley. When barley is discharged we will load with Italian cargo for mainland.

5. Friday, 29 June

a Inspected and condemned food at Bulk Depot (See S & T Report).

b Made an inspection for new location for Cagliari Distributing Depot. Also reconnaissance for warehouse suitable for storing U.S. concentrated cigarettes and tobacco. A satisfactory warehouse not found at yet.

c Capt De Stefano and Pvt Latona departed by air for Naples to pick up U.S. PK.

6. Saturday, 30 June

a Conferred with Mr. Pernis, Port officer, re loading of ship Joseph G. Cannon with Italian stores for mainland.

b Conferred with representative CMS re AFHQ Information News and Censorship Section Press and Radio instructions to assign an Italian Lieut at Sassari.

TO : Commanding General, Land Forces Sub Com A.C. (MIA).

1. In compliance with your letter of 21 subject as above dated 4 June and supplement thereto dated 21 June 1946, submit the following:

a "G" Points

(1) They are transferring personnel that have somewhat mechanical experience to 14 Repair Shop and are having some auto repair work done by mechanics at Artillery Repair Shop at Anore. So we have all promise of more efficient work from that unit.

(2) Although they have a brief training schedule as of the opinion they are more interested in going to mainland on leave.

(3) All depots in position.

(4) Not aware of any Italians endeavoring to obtain any "I" information on any other nation.

b "A" Points

(1) With the coming of the Garibaldi to transport leave personnel to the mainland and two subsequent ships the transportation difficulty of leave personnel will be solved. However, between 13 - 25 June we have returned 122 military on leave from mainland and sent 190 to mainland on leave.

c "Q" Points

(1) TMT

(A) See paragraph 1a(1) above. No particular shortage of motor transport now.

(B) Have instructed C.I.B. to collect all unauthorized Army vehicles, which they are carrying out.

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(c) Workshop progress see Paragraph 1a(1) above.

(2) Actions

(a) Availability of Allied provided items in depots satisfactory.

(b) As at 20 June there remained the following Italian and German foods: Meat 13 days, sugar 7 1/2 days, coffee 3 1/2 days, pepper 233 days. With the exception of pepper about all will be issued by end of July. Availability of Italian provided items satisfactory.

(c) Soap and cigarettes satisfactory.

(d) Cagliari Distributing Depot to move to vicinity of Bulk Depot, as the present building is to be occupied by High Commissioner, a more desirable place.

(3) Clothing and Equipment

(a) Satisfactory except shoes, shirts and drawers. The requirements will be shown when we submit the Monthly Clothing Report, to follow.

(b) Progress, output etc repair plants. See par 3a of Weekly Log No. 66 dated 24 June.

(c) Macomer Clothing Depot is being closed and after the items that are to be shipped to mainland the balance will be moved to Cagliari.

(4) Accommodation and Camps

(a) No demands by Allies or Italians foreseen.

(b) Plenty of barracks on the island.

1. Sunday, 17 June

a Capt Jerige, POL Section AFHQ, called re POL in Sardinia. Offered him our facilities and cooperation.

b Routine office work, $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

2. Monday, 18 June

a Lt Col Albert and Major Martin made a two day inspection trip to Northern part of island by special "Littorina" car to check up on the progress of shipment of equipment to Cagliari for mainland for bid 6 - 15 July. Report as follows:

(1) Abbasanta Workshop. In process of reorganising the 14 Repair Shop, not going full speed yet.

(2) Macomer Clothing Depot. All clothing for mainland had been shipped to Cagliari. Depot to be closed out soon, remaining clothing to be sent to Cagliari Depot. A quantity of salvage clothing and shoes to be sent to Clothing Repair Shop at Oschiri.

(3) Macomer Food Depot. Satisfactory (See S & T Report).

(4) 2d Bu 40th Artillery Regt at Macomer. Kitchen and surroundings very dirty. Directed C.O. to have remedied at once and Maj Martin would inspect 22 June on way to Nuoro. (See S & T Report).

(5) Plombe Engineer Depot. Most all equipment for mainland had been shipped. They were holding 3 tons zinc telephone wire to be sold to a commercial firm on orders from Engineers, CES, have investigated same and unless they have proper authority for sale instructed them to ship to Cagliari for mainland. They also had 4 large tents that need minor repairs, instructed them to ship to Cagliari for mainland. To close depot soon.

(6) Sassari Food Depot. Very satisfactory (See S & T Report).

(7) Sassari Casermaggio Depot. Most of equipment for mainland had been shipped, balance to be shipped by end of week.

(8) Sassari Military Hospital. As a whole in good condition. One third of patients are malarious. Am. of the opinion the Italians are not taking sufficient atabrine, and advised GMS Medical Officer. Need screens for windows, advised them where they may obtain it and instructed Engineers to issue same.

(9) 40th Artillery Mess at Sassari. Satisfactory. They have an up to date kitchen arrangement but last two days they were not using same for lack of coal and were using a substitute arrangement which was not too satisfactory. (See S & T Report).

(10) Had dinner with General Marchese, Commander VI Brigade, Calabria Division.

b Capt De Stefano conferred with Automobilistico Directorate GMS re turning in of Army vehicles not authorized under new T/A.

3. Tuesday, 19 June

a Oschiri Salvage and Repair Depot. Col. Simmons note. They employ 58 civilians (Some have been there 4 years) and have 2 officers and 21 NCOs. Work 6 days per week, 8 hours per day and average pay 60 lire per day.

(1) Clothing Repair. Employ 18 civilians and have 32 sewing machines. Were making new blouses and pants at time of inspection. Average output per day: 100 wool shirts, 50 wool blouses, 50 wool trousers or 15 wool caps. All appeared satisfactory. Sixty tons of rags that are useless - some being sold to civilians.

(2) Blacksmith Repair Shop. Twelve civilians repair casermaggio equipment - Iron pots, mess tins etc. Satisfactory.

(3) Laundry. Twelve women working, can employ 30 when required. Plenty of water and for hand washing good arrangement. Satisfactory.

(4) Shoe Repair Shop. Eight soldiers and 2 civilians working in shop. Practically all hand work, have some machines but need parts to operate. Average 10 pairs (rebuilt) shoes per day. It requires 2.2 kgs of sole leather and 1.2 kgs upper leather per pair, about 1/2 of upper leather is obtained from salvaged shoes, the other half is new. Fifty tons old shoes worthless, leather dead and cannot be used, selling some to civilians. Output too small, advised increase in personnel. Officer in charge stated due to small wage paid by Army not able to employ civilian shoemakers.

(5) Due to facilities, plenty of soft water, trained personnel recommend that the Clothing and Shoe Repair Shop remain at Oschiri.

(6) Inspected Detachment at Oschiri, mess satisfactory, quarters dirty (See S & T Report).

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b Ozieri Medical Depot, have shipped 317 tons of medicines and medical supplies and 98 tons of hospital equipment to Cagliari for mainland. Remaining some hospital blankets, socks, sheets, mattress covers, bed spreads, and handkerchiefs which will be shipped soon. Needed packing material which I arranged with Engineers to supply. Expect to close depot about 15 August.

c Returned to Cagliari by Littorina car.

d Capt De Stefano conferred with Requisitioning officer re the derequisitioning of villa occupied by AFM Petroleum Section.

e To 4 Gentile to Rome by air on pass.

4. Wednesday, 20 June

a Capt De Stefano conferred with Col Roccolato, Italian Air Force, re shipment of Italian Air Corps vehicles and equipment to mainland (See our letter subject Elmas Airfield of 21 June).

b Routine office work and 1/2 day off.

5. Thursday, 21 June

a Conferred with Commander Helms, RAF Elmas, re (1) tires and tubes taken from requisitioned car (2) Coiled barbed wire for 63 Staging Post bench at Poetto.

b Conferred with Director of Railways in Sardinia re loading of the Littorina (Special A.C. Railroad car) for mainland. He stated without special cranes the construction of the car is such as it would buckle in the middle. I told him to advise AS accordingly, as the directive of movement of same came to him.

c Conferred with Lt Col De Giudici, Deputy Chief of Staff, CMS, re allotment of personnel to be shipped on the Albatra in compliance with AFM letter 35/67 of 15 June.

d Conferred with officer from Commissary Section re issue of forage.

e Col D'Orso, now commander Italian Air Force in Sardinia, made a courtesy call.

f Major Martin inspected denayed food at Italian Air Corps. It is the first this had been reported to us, previously they had sent us a statement that all excess food held by them had been turned in to Cagliari Bulk Depot. Also weekly visit to Commissary Section.

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5. Capt De Stefano conferred with Guardia Finanza re confiscated U.S. cigarettes and tobacco. Also conferred with Captain of Abbazia re schedule to and from mainland.

6. Friday, 22 June

a. Conferred with Capt Luinasso, Commissary officer, CC.RR., re CC.RR. strength (See our letter subject Rations for CC.RR. in Sardinia, dated 22 June 45).

b. Conferred with representative CMS re strength of Army as at 15 June.

c. Conferred with representative IMBIA re shipment of refugees to mainland. Advised him we had no shipping space and further more was advised by IMBIA Rome that no refugees were to be shipped from Sardinia to mainland.

d. Major Martin inspected condemned food at Macomer Distributing Depot and Nuoro Distributing Depot (now closed) also re-inspected 2nd Bn 40 Artillery Regt at Macomer. Monday it was found in a filthy state, this inspection a great improvement. (See par 2a(4) above).

e. Captain De Stefano conferred with Automobilistico Directorate CMS re Monthly Vehicle return, changes requested by IMBIA Rome.

7. Saturday, 23 June

a. Conferred with Lieut Germani, AS Rome Agriculture Sub Commission, re crop conditions in Sardinia due to drought and grasshoppers. Inspected some wheat being threshed near Cagliari, estimate it to be about 75 to 80% normal crop. No grasshopper menace south of Oristano.

b. Routine office work.

TO : Commanding General, Land Forces Sub Com A.C. (MMLA).

1. Sunday, 10 June

a Col De Giudici, Deputy Chief of Staff CMS, called re absorbing all 390 recalls and recruits now waiting shipment to replace military to be discharged. (See our signal Y 491 of 10 June). The discharged personnel to be placed on civilian rations while waiting shipment.

b Routine office work and $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

2. Monday, 11 June

a Conferred with Major Sama, CG. SM., re replacement of Capt Palomba, who is to be discharged, by Maresciallo Sagus.

b Had a lengthy conference with General Macario, Commanding General Italian Forces Sardinia, Gen Scalabrino, of Territorial Office Sardinia and their staff officers in regard to the grave situation of MT repair on the island, as pointed out in par 6c of our Liaison Log No. 64 dated 10 June 45. Gen Scalabrino stated that there was a great scarcity of qualified personnel, tools, machinery, spare parts and auto supplies due to the "stripping" on the island to equip the 1st Mobile Park for the mainland and that most mechanics come from Northern Italy and some had been discharged. He also stated the War Ministry would not permit them to pay civilian mechanics a sufficient wage to entice them to work for the Army, and there were essential items of supplies and machinery on the mainland they require to do their work here. I advised him to comb the island for all available qualified personnel (military and civilian) and properly organize the MT repair

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Shop as a repair unit. Also advised him before making any requests for tools, machinery and supplies to be returned from mainland, to determine that same was not available here. Suggested that the machine shop facilities at the Nuoro Artillery Depot be used to the maximum along with the skilled civilians now working there. It must be born in mind that these vehicles are old and are put in efficient state with used parts that soon give away, the auto parks here have been picked over and the best vehicles and best parts have already been removed and it is difficult to secure parts from vehicles without the proper tools and qualified personnel, without destroying the part required. General Maccario agreed with me the situation was grave and he would take immediate steps to improve same.

c Capt De Stefano conferred with No. 5 Efficient Vehicle Park re vehicles allotted under the new T/E (W/E).

3. Tuesday, 12 June

a Conferred with Col De Giudici, Deputy Chief of Staff CMS, re (1) Units authorized by Ministry of War not included in IDIA Order of Battle No: 2/9 (See our letter subject Units for Services in Sardinia dated 12 June). (2) Training of Italian units (3) Disapproval of Cagliari Independent Mt Coy in accordance with your second letter A/180/1 of 1 June.

b Conferred with Capt Costa, Commissary Italian Air Force, re increasing the number of rations by 150 as they are discharging approx 40⁰ and recalling 150 at a time to get acquainted with their duties while their predecessors are here. The 150 additional rations be allowed until the personnel is shipped to mainland which will depend on available transportation (See our Y 485 of 12 June). Approved by your Q 355 of 14 June. (See par 6a below).

c Major Martin conferred with Commissary Chief, inspected 59 Inf Regt Mess and Cagliari Distributing Depot.

d Capt De Stefano conferred with Railroad Secretary re imported coal breakdown between AC and Military. Also conferred with Auto Directorate CMS re vehicles for No. 5 Efficient Vehicle Park.

4. Wednesday, 13 June

a Lt Col Spezialetti, new Port Commander at Sardinia, called and explained his duties. He requested MT. I advised him his unit was not authorized any Army MT but to contact either CMS for a loan from time to time or get a civilian requisitioned car.

b Major Martin inspected Cagliari Bulk Depot, and POL Depot. (See S & T Report R/11 of 14 June).

c Capt De Stefano conferred with Col Martire, requisition officer, re sea shore hospital requisitioned by Allies.

d Routine office work and $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

5. Thursday, 14 June

e Conferred with Col De Giudici, Deputy Chief of Staff CMS, re (1) Abandonment of Independent Rft Coy. (2) The Italians had received cable from SMERS re plan to send special cruiser about middle June to transport military to mainland. A tentative list of personnel was agreed upon if this cruiser arrives.

b Major Martin inspected Bulk Depot records and Cagliari Engineer Depot.

c Capt De Stefano conferred with High Commissioner re Sea Shore Hospital which had been requisitioned by the Allies.

6. Friday, 15 June

a Conferred with Capt Costa, Commissary Italian Air Force, re your authorization (See your Q 355 of 14 June) of extra rations for callups for Air Force. Authorized them a maximum of 4000 additional rations (400 personnel for 10 days). (See par 3b above).

b Conferred with Representative State Railways re the movement of the diesel car to mainland as ordered by AISCOR.

c Conferred with Lt Ulzega, Commissary Section, re sending ST/S's daily to this office. They did not follow our instructions in accordance with instructions in MIA Q/1/29-124 of 6 June. (See our letter subject Forwarding of ST/S Forms to MIA dated 15 June).

d Major Martin inspected spoiled food at Iglesias, which was left there after the depot was closed not being practicable to move.

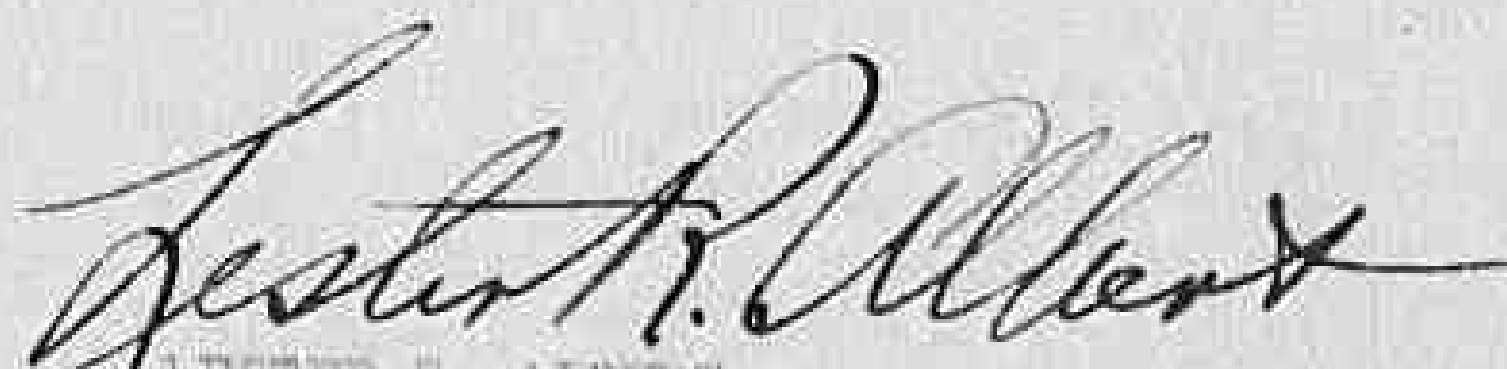
e Capt De Stefano conferred with Auto Directorate, CMS, re vehicle report.

7. Saturday, 16 June

a Conferred with Col De Giudici, Deputy Chief of Staff CMS, re movement of military personnel to mainland. He stated the Italian Navy had advised him that the Italian corvett Urania to arrive in Cagliari today and the Italian ship Monzabano to arrive 17 June. There may be a possibility of sending 80 military on the former and 100 on the latter ship. Advised Col De Giudici of what military personnel to send if either or both ships arrive.

b Conferred with Major Matthews (U.S.), A.C. Mining Div at Carbonia, Sardinia re civilian miners at Carbonia holding U.S. tires and tubes. Told him I had given instructions to CC.RR. to not molest personnel on the list he forwarded to this office until situation was clarified by MIA (See our letter subject Collection of Unauthorized U.S. Tires and tubes in Sardinia of 8 June). He stated AC was sending him certificates to give to these people holding U.S. tires and tubes. We will honor same here, so feel the situation is cleared up satisfactory.

c Pvt Wilder departs for Rome by air, permanent change of station.

TO : Commanding General, Land Forces Sub Com A.C. (MMIA)

1. In compliance with your letter G/31 subject as above dated 4 June 1945 submit the following:

a "G" Points

(1) The 14 Repair Shop does not have qualified personnel to do repair work, due to the fact that many mechanics had been sent to the mainland with 1st Mobile Park and upon requests for specialists. They also lack spare parts, tools and equipment for same reason. Too many of their personnel are doing guard duty at inefficient motor parks. Steps have been taken to correct all the above mentioned deficiencies within our resources and capabilities now on the island.

(2) The troops of the Calabria Division have a training schedule for a daily short period, but are of the opinion they are not doing a great deal of training.

(3) All depots in position.

(4) Not aware of any Italians endeavoring to obtain any "I" information on any other nation.

b "A" Points

(1) The Calabria Division is composed largely of personnel that have homes in Northern Italy and as news spreads that some are going on leave and leave percentages increased, most of their interest lies in that direction now. Due to shortage of transportation now and the fact that so many military on leave are continuing to arrive from mainland that have to be returned to the mainland, unless ships in addition to the Abbazia and Campidoglio are provided we will not be able to send many on leave to their homes in Northern Italy. Needless to say this will affect morale.

TO : Commanding General, Land Forces Sub Com A.C. (M.M.I.A.).

1. Sunday, 3 June

a Routine office work, $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

b Captain De Stefano and Pvt Wilder return from Naples on S.S. Campitoglio with PX rations.

c S.S. Pallade departs for Naples loaded with 14 huts (See our Y 469 of 4 June).

2. Monday, 4 June

a Conferred with Col Costantino and representative from High Commissioner's Office re (1) Shipment of refugees to mainland on Garibaldi. Advised them no change on previous instructions and none would be shipped. (2) Active military personnel to have priority over discharged military on Garibaldi. (3) Reinforcement Company at Cagliari. (See your A/180/1 of 1 June and our Y 474 of 6 June).

b Conferred with Col De Giudici, Col Costantino's replacement, re the arrival of 1100 Italian Military on the Garibaldi from mainland composed of discharged soldiers and on leave. He stated there were approx 30 Italian military come on 1 month's leave from the Garibaldi Div who were in rags, lousy, and in a filthy condition being dangerous to the health of the populace. I authorized a set of clothing each in this emergency for hygienic reasons (they to turn in old clothing) but advised him that we could not continue this policy as they should be properly clothed before they leave the mainland.

c Conferred with Italian Navy Commissary Officer at Cagliari re rations to be drawn for period 6-20 June in accordance with instructions contained in M.M.I.A. ST/6 dated 19 May and ST/6 dated 26 May. The Navy had a large stock of rations especially in the following items: Macaroni, Rice,

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Meat, Coffee, Cheese, Pulses, Sugar and Matches. Have compiled a chart showing just what items can be drawn beginning period 5-20 June. (Sending a copy to Italian Army Commissary Section).

d Major Martin inspected Cagliari Distributing Depot (See S & T Report of 5 June), and conferred with military IT officers re transportation status on the island.

e Major Martin checked Italian LCT loaded with U.S. Navy property transported here from Maddalena with orders to unload at Cagliari. Also conferred with Lieut Shaw, AACS officer at Elmas, and Lt Bonelli, Italian Naval LO, re movement of U.S. Naval supplies from Maddalena to Cagliari.

f Captain De Stefano unloaded PX supplies.

g Cruiser Garibaldi arrives to transport Military personnel to mainland.

3. Tuesday, 5 June

a Colonel Albert and Major Martin inspected loading of cruiser Garibaldi, last cruiser carrying callups. Going satisfactorily. Same departed for Duko (See our signal Y 468 of 2 June). Routine office work.

b Major Martin inspected and condemned food at Cagliari Distributing Depot.

c Captain De Stefano "broke down" and distributed PX.

d Sgt Gentile departed for Naples on Garibaldi escorting recovered U.S. supplies (See our Y 470 of 4 June).

4. Wednesday, 6 June

a Had a lengthy conference with General Maccario, re (1) Many matters in general (2) Administration and feeding of recalls and callups and personnel on duty from mainland waiting shipment (See our signal Y 474 of 6 June).

b Routine office work and $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

c Gave officers and EM holiday in accordance with instructions from SHAEP to commemorate anniversary of landing in Normandy.

5. Thursday, 7 June

a Lt Col De Giudici, Deputy Chief of Staff, CMS, re request for shipment of approx 1000 Italian Air Force to mainland on leave and discharge. Advised him to submit in writing giving availability as to dates and I would inform MEMA (See par 7b below).

b Conferred with Col Quercia, Commander CC.RR. Sardinia re (1) Replacement of Captain Palumbo CC.RR. who is working for this detachment on police matters. (2) Fluctuations in strength for CC.RR. ration strength. His Commissary Officer will contact me.

c Conferred with Lieut Piludu, Commissary Section in charge of Forage re hay and straw available on the island. He states they have sufficient straw here to supply the horses of the Army and CC.RR. (at 2/3 rations) until approx 1 September, they have requested from producers to submit bids for hay and straw but received none due to the shortage caused by the extremely dry weather and grasshoppers. (See our signal Y 477 of 3 June).

d Captain De Stefano conferred with Italian Customs Officials re smuggled U. S. tobacco and cigarettes, which are at parts scattered over the island. Arrangements are being made to bring same to Cagliari and then MSA will be advised as to quantity and condition.

e Sgt Gentile returns from Naples by air.

6. Friday, 8 June

a Inspected and checked barrack stores waiting shipment at Cagliari (See our letter subject Shipment of Barrack Stores to Mainland dated 8 June).

b Conferred with General Scalabrino and Col De Giudici, Deputy Chief of Staff, CMS, re status of military personnel to be shipped to the mainland and the use of the Abbazia and Campidoglio for same (See our signal Y 476 dated 7 June).

c Being of the opinion that the 14th Repair Shop at Abbasanta was not producing results sent Major Martin there to check. He found it to be a repair shop in name only, of the 50 military personnel and 76 civilians, there was only 1 soldier and 1 civilian actually mechanics at Abbasanta and 2 soldiers and 3 civilians at Cagliari (The Detachment of 14 Repair Shop at Cagliari is accomplishing more than at Abbasanta). The balance of the unit are mechanics' helpers, welders, tailors, carpenters, blacksmiths and ordinary soldiers doing guard duty at dumps throughout the island. There are 18 soldiers and 21 civilians actually engaged in repairing vehicles, the rest are doing administrative, general and guard duties. Three officers, including Commanding Officer 14 Repair Shop, the chief mechanic and 5 other military to be released this month without any replacements in sight. The C.O. was advised by Ministry of War not to hire any more civilians, unless he can hire mechanics don't see why he should. The C.O. gives following reasons for not being able to produce the necessary output: (1) Lack of skilled personnel, most were sent to mainland. (2) Lack of tool machinery, 1st Mobile Park

took all of it to mainland. (5) Lack of spare parts, the best of these have been stripped from the vehicles and does not have qualified personnel to remove them or tools for same (See par 5 of our signal Y 480 of 9 June). (4) Lack of consumer material; such as zinc, copper, lead, etc which is not available in civilian markets. (5) Lack of repair kits and materials for fixing tires and tubes. (6) Lack of proper hand tools, most were sent to mainland with 1st Mobile Park. There are still 10 vehicles, all of old vintage, at Abbasanta to be repaired to complete the 100 to be turned over to the High Commissioner, and now they do not have the parts, tools or personnel to repair same. Major Martellacci, C.O. 1st Mobile Park, advised me the middle of May that the last vehicle for High Commissioner was in the workshop and would be repaired before his unit left for mainland. Am of the opinion that the last 3 or 4 weeks that the 1st Mobile Park was at Abbasanta, they did very little repair work in addition to preparing their own unit for shipment. The 36 men left behind by Captain Varengo were never within the authorized strength that is why I requested we have authority to ration them (See par 1 of our Y 480 of 9 June). Am taking immediate steps to remedy the above as far as within the availability of the island.

d Captain De Stefano conferred Auto Directorate CMS re vehicles assigned 5th Efficient Vehicle Park also conferred again with Italian Customs Officials re smuggled U.S. tobacco and cigarettes.

7. Saturday, 9 June

a Captain Sprague and Capt MacBride, USMA, called regarding interchanging of medical items to save USMA's shipping to Sardinia from mainland and our shipping same items to mainland from Sardinia. Told them it was a matter for "higher level" to decide and as MIA Rome had a list of items we expect to ship to mainland in July (See our letter to MIA subject Status of Equipment to be Shipped to Mainland dated 21 May 45), suggested they recommend to their office at Rome to contact MIA Rome concerning the above.

b Conferred with Col De Guidici, Deputy Chief of Staff CMS, re latest information of shipping military to mainland. Invite your attention to your A 1112 of 8 June authorizing the shipment of 200 military from mainland to Sardinia and with the number that are continually arriving on various other ships and we only authorized to send 200 in return, the number waiting here to be shipped to the mainland will always be large (See our letter subject Military Personnel to be Shipped to Mainland dated 9 June).

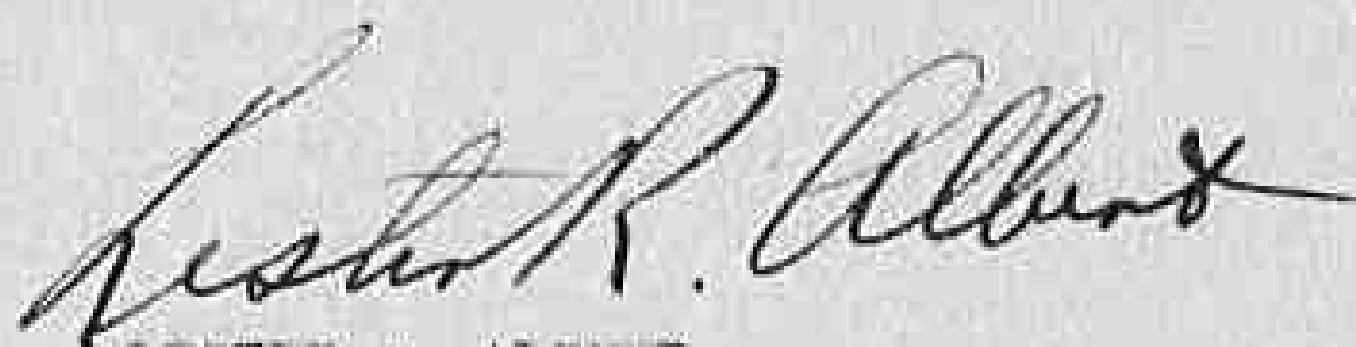

- b S. S. Carlton arrived to transport Italian stocks to mainland.

2. Monday, 21 May

- a Routine office work and preparing data on stocks for shipment to mainland to take to Rome.

b Captain De Stefano conferred with representative High Commissioner's Office re Status of Italian Cipher Team.

3. Tuesday, 22 May

a Conferred with Captain Scarace, Supply Officer, Italian Navy Cagliari re Italian food stocks. He had instructions from Ministry of Navy re holding 15 day of food beyond period contrary to instructions given by MMIA in your ST/6 of 11 May. Advise him I would get matter straightened out at Rome. As they have sufficient food for period 21 May - 5 June advised them not to draw from Army Depots food for said period. Also told him to submit a stock state (inventory) as at 20 May and we would adjust future drawals upon this stock state.

b Departed for Rome by Italian plane.

c Captain De Stefano attended conference held by High Commissioner re sanitary conditions in Cagliari Province.

d Cruiser Garibaldi arrives.

4. Wednesday, 23 May

- a 23-25 May in conference with various sections at MMIA Rome.

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b Routine office work at Cagliari, $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

5. Thursday, 24 May

a Major Martin inspected loading Cruiser Garibaldi

b Captain De Stefano conferred with High Commissioner re truck tires for civilian use.

c Cruiser Garibaldi sails for mainland

7. Friday, 25 May

a Major Martin conferred with Commanding General, Territorial Office and staff re preparation of shipment of stocks to mainland.

b Captain De Stefano conferred with Delegazione Trasporti re vehicle assigned by MMIA Rome.

7. Saturday, 26 May

a Returned from Rome by Italian plane.

b Conferred with General Maccario and Staff re (1) Preparation and movement of Italian stocks now in outside depots (from Cagliari), as approved by MMIA Rome, to Cagliari for shipment to mainland. Approx 1,000 tons to be moved and I stated we desired it at Cagliari Port by 1 July and directed General Maccario to use the Calabria Division in preparation for shipment, guards etc. General Maccario assured me it would be done. (2) Advised General Maccario that after the first cruiser in June (4 June) no more call-ups would be sent to mainland. Any call-ups returning from hospital, AWOL etc. would either be absorbed in the authorized strength of Italian Army personnel in Sardinia or given an indefinite leave to be called later to fill authorized vacancies. (3) No rations allowed to Italian personnel here on leave from mainland and waiting boat to return to mainland. A very large number of personnel have been coming to Sardinia from mainland on cruisers the past two months. I previously advised MMIA about same.

c Major Martin finished loading S.S. Carlton, will arrive Duko 28 May.

d Captain De Stefano conferred with band leader 59th Inf. Regt. (Italian) re music for Memorial Day observance and also conferred with Automobile Directorate C.M.S. re transportation.

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1. Sunday, 13 May

- a Routine office work $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.
- b Captain De Stefano conferred with High Commissioner re breakdown imported coal between civilians and military.

2. Monday, 14 May

a Colonel Albert and Major Martin inspected following installations to determine status of stores being prepared for shipment and closing of depots: (1) Oristano Food (practically cleaned out) and Barrack Store Depot. (2) Abbasanta Engineer, Auto Repair Park (also used car depot at Paulilatino where there are approx 600 vehicles could be made efficient). (3) Macomer Food, Clothing, Barrack Stores and Artillery Depots. (4) The preparation for movement of stores of all of these depots with the possible exception of the Auto Repair Park has slowed up considerable since VE Day. There is an immense amount of clothing at Macomer and more is arriving from various Calabria Division units. They lack sufficient personnel to cope with the situation also insufficient trucks to move stocks. Sufficient railroad cars are not being supplied. All these discrepancies have been brought to the attention of CMS for immediate correction. When it is determined by MMIA just what stocks you require from the list of stocks I will bring to Rome, recommend that the Calabria Div be utilized fully to prepare stocks for shipment. (5) Went to requisitioned villa at Badde Salighe for the night. Detailed report of Major Martin's and my inspection will follow in the 3 & T Report and the report I bring to Rome next week.

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b Captain De Stefano again conferred with High Commissioner re breakdown imported coal between civilians and military. Also checked loading of cruiser Garibaldi.

c Cruiser Garibaldi departed for Duke loaded with callups (See our Y 412 of 12 May).

3. Tuesday, 15 May

a Colonel Albert inspected main Artillery and Food Depots at Nuoro. Report to follow on Artillery Depot. Food Depot closed out. Returned to Cagliari.

b Major Martin inspected (1) Ploaghi Engineer Depot (2) Sassari Food, 8 Casermaggio Depots, 3 small depots of 60th Infantry and Campo Melo Artillery Depot (3) 40 Regt I.S. Mess and quarters (See our S & T Report to follow). Returned to Baddo Salghis for night.

c Captain De Stefano conferred with representative of Istituto Nazionale per il Commercio Estero re imports and exports for civilian use at Cagliari.

d Cruiser D'Aosta arrived.

e Pvt Wilder to hospital Naples by plane (See our Y 417 dated 14 May).

4. Wednesday, 16 May

a Conferred with Major Gill (US) P.B.S. re Memorial Day Services at U.S. Military Cemetery Cagliari.

b Conferred with Col Costantino re shipment schedule for rest of May (See our letter subject Schedule Shipment Military to Mainland of 16 May).

c Conferred with Capt Pala Italian Air Force re submitting average ration strength on 10th, 20th and last each month.

d Conferred with Commander Borghi, Italian Navy Cagliari, and his supply officer re excess stock of rations held by Navy in Sardinia. He stated it was necessary due to shipping to Maddalena Island for them to draw for 30 days and retain a 15 day excess there to take care of emergency. I advised him I would recommend same to MIA. He also requested that a reserve be held by the Navy for emergency ships. I disapproved and recommended to MIA that no issue be made to same without authorization by MIA (See our letter to you subject Surplus Rations Held by Italian Navy dated 16 May 1945).

c (1) Fuel pump of Major Martin's car broke, had to get a replacement at Abbasanta. (2) Major Martin went to Alghero found 1 wooden barrack standing. (3) Gates at Badde Salghis were locked. Major Martin sent for his equipment and stayed at Mrs. Albano's, Macomer.

5. Thursday, 17 May

a Conferred with Sig. Marchilli in charge MT High Commissioners Office re (1) Pick up of 25 vehicles at Abbasanta that have been ready for 2 weeks (Part of 100 vehicles turned over by Army) (2) Pick up spare parts for said vehicles that have been ready for three weeks. No action had been taken on either. Advised them to collect same at once as the 1st Heavy Mobile Workshops would soon move.

b Mr. Galpin, U.S. Information Service, reported to Cagliari for duty and made courtesy call.

c Inspected loading cruiser D'Aosta. They were to sail at 1700 hours and troops were not loaded. Requested Italian Navy Cagliari to delay to 1730 hours. Request granted.

d Had a lengthy conference with Major Palma who is acting Head of Commissary Section replacing Lt Col Alecci re (1) Many discrepancies in various ST reports (2) Alleged spoiled rice and wet sugar (See our letter to you subject Bad Food at Cagliari Bulk Depot of 17 May). (3) Confirming issue of Italian and German food first and having all such spoiled condemned and removed from the accounts (4) Excessive stock of Italian biscuits to be greatly reduced, although most of it is made from Allied flour (5) Distributing Depots have been opening cans especially dehydrated vegetables and reweighing for issue, thereby consuming a great amount of time and exposing the food to unsanitary conditions. Strongly suggested this policy be discontinued and if they desire to salvage the tins to have the recipient return the empty cans to the Distributing Depots (6) Suggested the packing and crating of clothing at Macomer Depot be speeded up. There is an immense amount of Italian clothing there but they are very slow in preparing for shipment (See our report re Status of Italian equipment to follow).

e Major Martin inspected: (1) Ozieri Medical, Chemical and Artillery Depots. Two portable huts not being used. (2) Orchiri Shoe Repair Depot (3) Monti Food Depot and Vehicle Park. Food Depot closed and locked, reported a small amount of food there is being sent to Sassari. (4) Telti Engineer Dump and Ammunition Dump

Very little Engineer equipment to be shipped. Ten portable huts full of mines, all types. (5) Olbia Engineer Dump, being closed out. (6) 256 Inf Regt at Tempio (See our S & T Report to follow). (7) Tempio Barracks Store Depot, great quantity still to be shipped.

f Cruiser D'Aosta departed for Duko (See our Y 419 of 15 May).

g Cruiser Garibaldi arrives.

h Captain De Stefano conferred with Automobilistico Directorate re vehicles and windshield labels.

6. Friday, 18 May

a Conferred with U.S. Graves Registration W.C.O. at Cagliari re Memorial Day Services at U.S. Military Cemetery.

b Conferred with Col Marelli, MT officer Territorial Office, and Capt Delmuro, Commanding Officer 14 Territorial Adm. Transport Co, re use of MT assigned to the 14 Territorial Adm. Transport Co, 38 of the 112 are inefficient. They claim that when repairs are made from used parts they soon break, and recommend that a small stock of most commonly used parts be placed at Cagliari repair unit to avoid loss of time in taking vehicles to Abbasanta. Approved. They also claim considerable time is lost at the repair units to dismantle the part and suggest some of the parts be dismantled beforehand. Approved. Advised them to contact the Commissary Office and supply them transportation where most required in order to speed up the transport of goods to Cagliari and expedite the closing of the surplus depots.

c Major Martin (1) picked up lists of stores at Macomer Clothing Depot (2) Conferred with Commanding Officer 1st Heavy Workshops at Abbasanta re turning in excess Italian vehicles (3) Returned to Cagliari by motor.

d Captain De Stefano conferred with Istituto Nazionale per il Commercio Estero re imports and exports to Sardinia. We, as ALCOM LO, are required to verify imports and exports according to this organization, yet it will be very difficult for us to have a man at the port to check same because of limited personnel. I advised them to have Mr. Thomas, British Ministry of War Transport at Cagliari, to submit a statement as to what was loaded on the ship and we would sign papers upon his certificate. This may or may not be satisfactory.

7. Saturday, 19 May

a Conferred with Col Costantino, Deputy Chief of Staff, C.S. (1) He requested authority to issue rations or part of bread ration

to 130 men guarding 270 military prisoners at Oristano, both guards and prisoners are now on civilian rations. Disapproved. I told him unless they came within an authorized category no Allied ration would be supplied to them and furthermore if they were unauthorized military they should be considered excess and shipped to the Mainland. No Allied rations to be issued to them after 15 May. (2) He stated an article appeared in L'Unione Sarde, published at Cagliari 18 May opposed to sending Sards to the mainland and as a result of such agitation callups are going AWOL. 125 deserted yesterday from total 650 coming by rail from Sassari and Oristano to Cagliari. Am forwarding to your headquarters copy of newspaper article (See our letter subject Newspaper Articles dated 18 May).

b Two French civilians called who had escaped from Germany requesting transportation to France. Advised them I had no authority to grant same and suggested they contact High Commissioner's Office.

c Major Martin inspected vehicles and tanks at Cagliari ready for shipment and conferred with 63 Staging Post RAF Elmas re shipment vehicles to mainland (See our Y 433 of 19 May). Major Martin conferred with CMS Officers re speed up of movement of stocks to mainland for shipment (See par 2a(4) above).

d Captain De Stefano conferred with (1) Commanding Officer 59 Inf Regt to secure band for Memorial Day observance. (2) High Commissioner re Italian Radio cipher team.

e Cruiser Garibaldi departed for Duke (See our Y 427 of 18 May).

a Conferred with Col Costantino, Deputy Chief of Staff, CMS, re submitting to this office actual strength of Italian Army and CC.RR. as at 9th and 24th of each month and matters in general.

b Captain De Stefano completed distribution of U.S. PX.

c Routine office work and $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

2. Monday, 7 May

a Conferred with Lt Col Sisto and Captain Starace, Italian Navy supply section re drawing of rations for Italian Navy. They estimated that they hold a stock of food in Cagliari and Maddelena Island of approx 25 days and have been drawing approx 5150 rations each 15 day period upon authority from Ministry of Navy which he stated was approved by MMIA. He also stated the actual strength was approx 4500 not including rations drawn for personnel on ships in emergency. I requested they give me more correct information as to number days rations on hand and strength and I would contact MMIA if they desired to have the Navy hold a stock of food here and what amount. But in the meantime we would not issue them food for the period 6-20 May as we previously instructed them because they have sufficient stocks on hand (See our letter to Italian Naval Forces in Sardinia subject Excess Rations Stores dated 28 April 45, a copy forwarded to your Hq).

b Conferred with Col Costantino, Deputy Chief of Staff, CMS re shipment excess personnel to mainland. Advised him to have all excess shipped by 15 May - no exceptions. Rations would be withheld w.e.f. that date.

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c General Maccario, Commander Italian Forces in Sardinia, called accompanied by his staff to congratulate us upon the end of the war in Europe and the military strength and successes shown by the Allies.

d Major Martin inspected 5th Efficient Vehicle Park - in good condition.

e Major Martin contacted 63 Staging Post RAF, Elmas re Army vehicles loaned to them. They stated they would require said vehicles for an indefinite time (Reference your signal Q/249 of 6 May).

f Captain De Stefano conferred with Col Achenza, High Commissioner's Office, re monthly AC reports and also conferred with Automobile Director, CMS, re vehicle report.

g Cruiser Garibaldi arrived at Cagliari to transport Military personnel to mainland.

3. Tuesday, 8 May

a Holiday V.E. Day. A parade was held in Cagliari after the unconditional surrender of Germany was announced by the Big Three. U.S. and Italian military participated and they were reviewed by U.S., British and Italian commanders and staffs.

4. Wednesday, 9 May

a Conferred with Col Quercia, Commander CC.RR. Legion in Sardinia, re movement of approx 800 CC.RR. to mainland. He advised that they had been assembled for shipment but were later instructed to return to their stations awaiting call. (See par 1 e of our Log No. 59 dated 6 May).

b Colonel Albert and Major Martin inspected loading of cruiser Garibaldi - going satisfactorily.

c Captain De Stefano conferred with Major Odone, High Commissioner's Office, re monthly report for AC.

d Cruiser Garibaldi departed for Duko with military personnel (See our signal Y 405 of 9 May).

e Sgt Gentile to Naples with C & R for overhaul (See our signal Y 401 of 7 May and Y 407 of 9 May).

5. Thursday, 10 May

a Routine office work and $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

6. Friday, 11 May

a Colonel Albert and Major Martin conferred with Col Alecci, Chief of Commissary Section, and Major Palma, charge of Italian Food Depots, re discrepancies in the issuing of Italian and German Food during 21 April - 5 May period (See our letter to Commanding General, Italian Forces in Sardinia subject Consumption of Food Stuffs of Italian Origin dated 11 May, copy to you). Many excuses and alibis were given. I emphatically pointed out that instructions from this office were to be carried out and he had the liberty to contact our office at all times when any instructions were not understood and have them clarified.

b Dr Giaru, High Commissioner's Office, called re (1) The retention of U.S. tires on a vehicle used for relief which I had previously disapproved. Granted them permission to retain said tires until 19 May then they must be turned in unless they obtain proper authority to retain same. (2) They requested passage for 33 civilian prisoners on cruiser to mainland. Disapproved, but advised them they could send them with the 20 civilian passages already granted the High Commissioner on each cruiser.

c Conferred with Col Costantino, Deputy chief of staff, CMS, re (1) Shipment of military personnel 14 May. He stated that he is sending mostly Phase II because they are of a more disturbing element here and more likely to go AWOL in the homeland. (See our signal Y 413 of 12 May). (2) Status of Phase II callups. Approx 50 to 60% are now called up and expect to have all by 19 May that intend to come without force. He estimated approx 4000 would be the final figure rather than 6000 due to the elimination of classes 1914 and 1915, approved by Ministry of War. He also stated Ministry of War approved crediting the excess of Phase III, approx 500, to Phase II. A delay was caused this week by "VE" Celebration.

d Major Martin got statements from all members of Liberty ship (U.S.) Watterson re larceny of paint from ships paint locker.

e Captain De Stefano conferred with Col Achenza, High Commissioner's Office re monthly report for AC, and Automobile Directorate, CMS, re vehicle report.

f Pfo Platzer departed for Duko on Abbazia with 52 cases crated furniture for AFHQ (See our signal Y 406 of 9 May).

7. Saturday, 12 May

a Conferred with Col Costantino re request of High Commissioner for 500 quintals of cloridina solforica from Ozieri Depot for destruction of grasshoppers. General Maccario states same available and it will deteriorate if not used (See our signal Y 414 of 12 May).

b Professor Cardea, President of Italian Red Cross in Sardinia called regarding (1) Tires for his ambulances. Advised him to see High Commissioner. (2) To retain U.S. Tires and tubes loaned by AC. Informed him he could retain same until 19 May, after which date all unauthorized would be picked up.

c All U.S. personnel saw picture "Two Down and One to Go" at Elmas.

d Major Matthews (U.S.), AC Mining Division, called re unrest at Carbonia. Told him I had previously warned the Army and CC.RR. but it was a civil matter and no action could be taken until called upon by the civil authorities.

e Major Martin inspected (1) Barracks stores and food depot at Iglesias. There are still 1 truck load of food and 4 truck loads of barrack stores to be moved. (2) Tank park at Cagliari, Dolianova and Guspini (See our signal Y 415 of 13 May).

f Captain De Stefano conferred with Major Matthews, Mining Section AC from Carbonia re coal mining and labor situation at the mines. There is still unrest there.

g Sgt Gentile arrived on Garibaldi with repaired C and R.

TO : Commanding General, Land Forces Sub Com A.C. (LMIA)

1. Sunday, 29 April

a Attended conference held by High Commissioner of Sardinia. General Pinna gave a rather lengthy report of what he had accomplished and two Italian civilians from Nuoro stated they did not want Sardinia separate from Italy but they desired to elect their own representatives and not have them appointed by government at Rome.

b Conferred with Commander Holme, 33 Staging Post, RAF, Elmas re authority to retain Italian Army personnel. He stated he knew of no authority or of any Italian Army personnel there. So I will instruct that the six Italian Army personnel that are carried on A.C. Platoon at Elmas be considered as excess personnel and sent to mainland without delay.

c Colonel Quercia, Commander CC.RR. Legion Sardinia advised me that he has been instructed by CC.RR. Headquarters Rome to send 800 CC.RR. to mainland.

d Observed loading S.S. Vanderlip with Italian cargo for mainland. Due to it being Sunday there was a shortage of civilian labor at port and not to delay loading 36 Italian soldiers waiting shipment to mainland were used on night shift. As this personnel were on travel rations and had consumed same for the day I authorized 36 additional rations be issued to these men. (See our Y 377 of 1 May)

e Major Martin supervised loading of S.S. Frank Vanderlip.

f Major Martin and Captain De Stefano checked on U.S. Furniture in warehouse at Cagliari required by AFHQ.

g 1/4 day off

2. Monday 30 April

a Chief Agent Lo Pinto CID and assistants departed by plane for Naples. They will forward a report to LMIA Rome on Borda case in

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due time.

b Inspected loading of cargo on S.S. Frank Vanderlip - progressing favorably.

c Major Fossett and Major Martin inspected, condemned and observed destruction of canned food at Cagliari Distributing Depot and gave instructions for its use and stated its equivalent value.

d Captain De Stefano arranged with Italian Army Engineers to have U.S. Furniture crated for shipment to ALHQ.

e Sergeant Bevan (Pr.) arrived from Rome to pick up special Engineer equipment. (See paragraph 5m below.)

3. Tuesday, 1 May

a Conferred with Colonel Pontiglio, C/S Military Headquarters Sardinia re plans for celebration for Victory Day.

b Conferred with Colonel Costantino Deputy C/S Military Headquarters Sardinia re status of excess Italian personnel and in spite of previous reports to me that same would be sent to mainland by 1 May there are approximately 600 on the island as at 24 April. Early dates were fixed when all excess personnel on island would be sent to mainland.

c Conferred with Captain Pisone, General Staff 808 C.S. Bn. Det. re the removal of 8 Enemy agents to mainland on Abbazia.

d San EFFISIO (Sardinian Patron Saint) Day celebration. Practically all Italians in Sardinia cease work, another Italian holiday.

e Conferred with Adjutant Sergeant 63 Staging Post, Elmas, re Victory Day celebration.

f Captain De Stefano and Pvt. Latona flew to Naples to pick up U.S. P.X.

g. Cruiser Montecuccoli arrives at Cagliari to pick up military personnel and refugees.

4. Wednesday, 2 May

a Conferred with Lieut Shaw Detachment AACSS Elmas (U.S.) re training of U.S. soldiers participating in Victory Day celebration.

b Inspected loading of cargo on S.S. Frank Vanderlip - going satisfactorily.

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c Conferred with Capt Caddeo (Italian) re progress of recovering Allied wire. He stated the job would be completed by end of May. Instructed him to report to me on 15 and end of each month.

d Conferred with Col Quercia, CC.RR. Legion in Sardinia re: Release of some MT and horses. He stated to give up any M.T. would affect his duties and having 456 horses for 106 stations in the mountainous areas none could be spared. In addition to the 106 stations where horses are required he has 159 other CC.RR. stations. (See our signal Y 392 of 4 May).

e Major Martin conferred with Col Costantino Deputy Chief of Staff C.M.S. re shipment of Engineer equipment to mainland.

5. Thursday, 3 May

a Conferred with Lt Col De Guidici, Deputy Chief of Staff C.M.S. re Engineer equipment to remain on island. Advised him to submit list he requested keeping it reasonable with the number of Italian troops remaining here and I would forward same to MMIA for approval. In the meantime to prepare all Engineer equipment for shipment. (See our letter subject Signal and Engineer Equipment to Remain in Sardinia dated 7 May 1945).

b Conferred with Donna Vera, wife of owner of Villa at Badde Salighes (formerly occupied by Major Hall and Major Austin) re (1) Use of Italian Army vehicle - advised her that her request had been disapproved. (2) Derequisitioning of her own personal vehicle. Advised her if it were held by the Italian Army would have it derequisitioned without delay. Contacted Major Hall re letter as to its present location. (3) Informed her not to remove any articles from the Villa without approval from MMIA, as the Villa and furniture was requisitioned.

c Conferred with Lt Shaw (U.S.) AACB Detachment, Almas, re tentative plan for Victory Day Celebration.

d Conferred with Captain Delogu, High Commissioner's Office, at noon re shipment of refugees. He stated 60 of the 310 refugees slated to go on the Montecuccoli were agriculturists. He had sent no cable to Displaced Personnel, ALCOM as I had instructed in writing.

e Colonel Albert and Major Fossett conferred with Lt Col Alocci, Commissary office, re (1) Matters in general and principally deficiencies noted recently and what we had previously requested be corrected in writing, i.e. not taking inventory in food depots at end of month, over issue of rations, laxity in accounting, tardiness of reports submitted, etc. (2) Tibben (May) to be supplied in Sardinia. He agreed it could be (See our Y 365 of 3 May).

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f Conferred with Colonel Uasi, CC.RR. re request to send 71 CC.RR. on Montecuccoli this date. Advised him his request came too late, to submit it again and consideration would be given.

g Conferred with Colonel Mirelli, Territorial Office, and Captain Paderi, Calabria Division re LT and horses (See our Y 392 of 4 May).

h Colonel Albert and Major Martin conferred with Major Austin re (1) status of vehicles at Abbasanta and on the island. (See our Y 392 of 4 May). (2) Repairable tires and tubes for mainland - he stated none had been sent from Abbasanta but were being repaired for shipment.

i Conferred with executive officer Fox, 63 RAF Staging Post at Elmas acting for Commander Holme re the British participating in the Victory Day Parade at Cagliari. He stated he did not feel that they should participate giving many reasons. I again requested that they would but told him it was an invitation and for him to decide and advise.

j Accompanied by Major Martin inspected the loading on cruiser Montecuccoli - only 273 refugees of the 310 promised at noon this date were loaded. It was too late to alert more military for loading (See our letter to High Commissioner of 3 May copy to MMIA).

k Major Fossatt and Major Austin sailed on the Montecuccoli for Duke - permanent change of station for both.

l Major Martin investigated alleged report of rifling of Italian clothing being loaded on S.S. Vanderlip. Later 3 British seamen identified as having stolen Italian goods, evidence was found in their cabin and other goods found in sick bay (See letter to Mr. A.G. Thomas, British Ministry of War Transport Agent, Cagliari, subject Rifling of Italian Cargo on S.S. Frank Vanderlip dated 4 May - copy to MMIA). Also there were 3 Italian stavedores involved in the looting, they will be prosecuted.

m Sgt Bevan departed on Montecuccoli with special engineer equipment (See par 2h above).

6. Friday, 4 May

a Conferred with Captain Palombo CC.RR. re quartering CC.RR. guard at office in our office building. Disapproved, insufficient room.

b Conferred with Mr. Plociao, Collecting of Refugees Office, Cagliari re request of 20 large Italian salvage (unserviceable) tents to be made up into sacks for collection of garbage. Advised him to learn where and quantity available, and I would submit request to MMIA for approval.

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c Lt Ness, (British) LO to Italian Navy and Lt Cator, British Navy from Maddalena Island, called for authorization air passage Cagliari to Naples. Granted.

d Conferred with Col Costantino, Deputy Chief of Staff, CMS re status of Chemical Warfare Detachment at Ozieri (See our signal Y 394 dated 5 May).

e Captain De Stefano and Pvt Latona returned from Naples.

f Pvt Hebert departed for Naples as courier.

7. Saturday, 5 May

a Lieut Guratelo (U.S.) Radio Sardinia, called regarding the movement of personnel PWE Unit to mainland. Advised him they were disbanded as at 30 April and would be moved to mainland on next cruiser.

b Conferred with Major Matthews (U.S.) AC Mining Division at Carbonia re U.S. tires held by the Italian Mining personnel for operation of mines.

c Major Martin inspected crating of U.S. furniture for AFHQ. It will be sent on the Abbazia next week. Also accompanied CC.FR. on raid, considerable amount of Allied property revealed.

d Captain De Stefano broke down and distributed PX.

e Pvt Hebert returned from Naples from courier duty.

TO : Commanding General, Land Forces Sub Com A.C. (MMIA).

1. Sunday, 22 April

a. Conferred with Colonel Quercia, CC.RR. Legion re status of Captain Palombo, a Carabinieri, who originally did police work for AC. It was agreed that he be under Colonel Quercia's control but to continue to clean up work started, namely (1) Recovering Allied property in Sardinia (2) Robbery at Post Office (U.S. money involved) (3) Recovering Allied tires and tubes (4) To handle any police work that MMIA may have in future.

b. Conferred with General Pinna, High Commissioner, re (1) His request for loan 2000 small individual Italian tents from salvage to combat grasshopper menace (see our signal Y 337 of 22 April). Col Kerr authorized the loan later by phone to Colonel Albert. (2) Balance of trucks to complete 100 allotted him. (3) Gen Pinna estimated there were approx 1000 refugees in Sardinia whose homes are on the Mainland of which approx 400 were in Cagliari and vicinity. Would require one day to assemble the latter for movement and 3 or 4 days to assemble those at a distance. (See Par 6g below).

c. Started moving radio equipment to new office at noon.

d. $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

2. Monday, 23 April

a. Conferred with Lt Col Constantino Deputy Chief of Staff GMS re: (1) To confirm load for cruiser this date (2) Availability of full 6000 for Phase II Callup which starts 24 April and first shipment of 1000 to be ready 1 May and 1000 every 4 days thereafter until callup is completed.

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b Moved office to No. 51 Via Vittorio Veneto.

c Inspected loading of cruiser Abruzzi with callups and other Military personnel, progressing satisfactorily.

d Chief Agent Lo Pinto and Agent Manfredi, CID, reported on their assigned mission. Went over Borda case briefly with them and offered all assistance and cooperation in the matter.

e Colonel Albert and Major Fossett inspected clothing and barrack depots at Cagliari. A great amount of same has been prepared for shipment to the mainland. Many individual items were enquired in- to to determine status of preparation for shipment. This depot is to be closed soon. (See Par 5f below).

f Colonel Albert, Major Fossett and Major Martin discussed Borda case Monday evening with Agents CID.

g Cruiser Abruzzi departed for Naples loaded with Italian Army, Air Corps and Navy personnel, and some cargo (See our signal Y 334 dated 21 April).

3. Tuesday, 24 April

a Conferred with Major Austin (LO Rome) re (1) Status of 100 vehicles to be turned over to High Commissioner Gardinia - 71 turned over, 9 at Abbasanta waiting collection, 15 in workshop ready approx 2 or 3 weeks. (2) List of spare parts for 1 year supply to High Commissioner would be forwarded to me soon. (3) A quantity of repairable tires and tubes for mainland would be sent to Cagliari first of next week. (4) Request for transportation by Donna Vera at Villa Badde Saligas (See our signal Y 341 of 24 April).

b Lt Col Usai, CC.RR., called for authority in writing re turning over to Chief Agent Lo Pinto, CID, documentary evidence in the Borda case.

c Conferred with Col Costantino, Deputy Chief of Staff CMS, re drawers for Phase II Callups. (See our signal Y 347 24 April).

d Mr. Discoe, W.O. (U.S.), AC Mining Div at Carbonia, called re the checking on Allied tires on miners cars at Carbonia. I advised him to send us a list of tires giving manufactures number of all properly authorized tires and same would not be molested. (See par 5c below).

e Conferred with Commander O'Donnell (British) L.O. with Italian Navy at Maddalena Island and Lt Ness (British) L.O. with Italian Navy Cagliari. Learned about 2 Italian C.D. Batteries stationed at Maddalena (See our signal Y 349 dated 25 April).

f Major Fossett and Major Martin inspected Cagliari Food Distributing Depot. Records were not up to date (S & T Report to follow). They also gave specific instructions as to priority of material movement to close Cagliari Clothing Depot (See par 2e above). Major Martin accompanied Major Fossett to learn routine in order to take over the depot and unit inspections upon the departure of Major Fossett early May.

4. Wednesday, 25 April

a Conferred with Commander Holme, 63 Staging Post RAF Elmas regarding attaching 20 Italian Army drivers for 2 months (See our signal Y 352 of 25 April).

b Conferred with Colonel Costantino Deputy Chief of Staff, CMS, re: (1) Availability drivers mentioned in 4a above. (2) Not sending remainder of excess personnel to mainland as had been reported to me verbally that it had been done. (3) Available Military personnel for cruiser Montecuccoli 29 April (See our signal Y 352 of 25 April and Y 366 of 26 April).

c Conferred with Commander Borghi, Italian Navy Cagliari, re: (1) 2 batteries CD (Italian) at Maddalena Island (See our signal Y 349 of 25 April). (2) He informed me that Montecuccoli would arrive Cagliari 27 or 28 April and depart 29 April. (See Par 7a(1) below).

d Conferred with General Pinna re allotment of 350 refugees on Montecuccoli 29 April.

e Major Fossett and Major Martin inspected Cagliari Bulk Food Depot (S & T Report to follow). Inspected food turned in by Italian Air Force and checked to see if items of Italian origin are issued in lieu similar Allied food. Italian Navy was drawing rations and were being issued Italian canned meat, pasta, sugar, matches, tomato paste and surrogate.

f Captain De Stefano conferred with CMS re automobile census for vehicles remaining in Sardinia.

5. Thursday, 26 April

a Commander Borghi, Italian Navy Cagliari, called re the Navy being issued surrogate (Italian substitute for coffee). Advised him our instructions were that all Italian food must be issued before a similar Allied food and was sorry but there would be no exceptions.

b Lt Green, Naval Control Service (British) called to request transportation be assigned to his Detachment. Advised him we had no authority to assign Italian Army vehicles as they were required for the mainland.

c Mr. Discoe W.O. (U.S.) brought partial list of U.S. tires held by Italian civilians in mining area (See par 3d above).

d Captain Atzini and Signor Marcellis from Police Unit High Commissioner's office called regarding individuals retaining U.S. tires. I advised him we had a list of tires AC had authorized civilians to keep and they would not be molested or any other tires that are held on proper authority.

e Conferred with Commander Holms, 63 RAP Staging Post, re disapproval of Italian Army drivers for RAP (Reference your SD 2635 of 28 April).

f Major Possett spent most of day with Chief Agent Lo Pinto, CID, on checking records and files in Borda case. He also conferred with Major Palma of Commissary Office re accounting procedure on Model "p" and the matter of issuing German food. Written instructions were issued to issue German food same as Italian food and before Allied food.

g T/4 Gentile TD to Naples on S.S. Abbazia to accompany vehicle (See our signal Y 346 of 24 April).

h S.S. Frank Vanderlip arrived at Cagliari.

6. Friday, 27 April

a Conferred with Lt Woodcut re Italian guard Detachment for DID. Advised him to submit a list of guards required as they would have to be furnished from the Calabria Division and not carried any longer as AC overhead.

b A lengthy conference with Lt Col Costantino which was nothing more than a rehash of what we discussed 25 April (See par 4b(2) above), with an additional number of alibis. In conclusion I instructed him to send all excess personnel to Mainland on 1st cruiser in May.

c Conferred with Capt Delogu, High Commissioner's Office, re shipment of refugees, prison guards and public security agents on the Montecuccoli 29 April. He stated the latter two were requested to come to mainland by the Ministry of Justice and Ministry of Interior respectively and was considered priority over refugees. Accepted his recommendation. 350 refugees authorized to go to mainland.

d Conferred with Col Costantino re discrepancies in instructions from Ministry of War as shown in MMIA (Blue Book) Italian

Army as at 9 March 1945 with Amendments to 22 March as known No. 2/8.
Letter to follow to EMIA for clarification.

e Conferred with Major Austin re his departure to Mainland
and CC.FR. guards for Abbasanta workshop.

f Major Fossett spent most of day with Chief Agent Lo Pinto,
CID.

g Captain De Stefano conferred with CMS re over strength
of Italian personnel in Sardinia.

7. Saturday, 28 May

a Conferred with Commander Borghi, Italian Navy Cagliari
(1) Postponement of sailing of Montecuccoli from 29 April to 3 May
to be loaded with 500 Military and 350 refugees (2) He requested
auto spare parts for Italian Navy vehicles - advised him to submit
list but no promises were made.

b Inspected Italian Ammunition Dump at Monserrato (near
Cagliari). There was a large quantity of Italian ammunition all
types, also a small quantity of German, Russian and Polish. They
were taking inventory, checking and destroying dangerous lots. The
ammunition was neatly stocked, safety precautions were taken and as
a whole all in good order.

c Flight Lt Moore, RAF Blmas, called requesting this office
as ALCOM L.O. screen High Commissioner request for flights to Naples
on Allied planes. Agreed.

d Major Fossett checked Distributing Depot at Cagliari to
see if Italian food was being issued.

e Major Fossett and Major Martin inspected 14 Administrative
Transport Company. Records were in order and vehicles well kept but
kitchen and food storeroom needed to be cleaned up (S & T Report to
follow).

f Captain De Stefano conferred with Lieut Shaw, AACB Detach-
ment (U.S.) re unauthorized Italian Military with his unit. He has

- a Conferred with Captain Varengo re tank personnel to be sent to Naples (See par 4 of your ST/1507 dated 12 April and our signal Y 304 of 15 April). He does not have the required personnel at Guspini but steps had been taken 14 April to obtain same and they will be sent to Mainland without delay (See par 3b below).
- b Conferred with 3 Italian officers from Requisition Office re derequisitioning of building occupied by Italian Military attached to this office.
- c Conferred with General Pinna, High Commissioner re (1) Auto spare parts from Abbasanta Dump in accordance with Q/5/9 of 13 April. (2) Shipping of refugees on cruiser - I informed him that military had priority but if any extra ships (over the seven scheduled for April) arrived and if there were vacant space after Military were accommodated I would contact MMIA for authority to ship refugees. He stated there were approx 500 to 600 refugees here and he was going to request to Ministry of War for a cruiser earmarked to carry refugees to Mainland. He stated the refugees were not financially able to pay passage on the Abbazia. (3) General Pinna had no information re movement of Italian cipher team to Mainland (reference your SD 2580 of 7 April). He stated there was available cipher personnel (Italian) to code his messages if they were recalled. (4) He stated approx 45 of the vehicles that were to be turned over to him had not been. I advised him I would take the matter up with Major Austin. Major Austin stated approx 30 vehicles remaining to be turned over and they were completing same.

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d Observed loading cruiser Montecuccoli - going very satisfactorily.

e Conferred with Colonel Costantino, Deputy Chief of Staff, Italian Forces in Sardinia, re shipment of callup for future shipments, hutting for Air Force at Elmas and disposition of personnel formerly in AC Platoon. He stated that of the approx 1400 Recruits (Phase III) reported waiting for shipment only approx 700 were really available, the remaining were AWOL and sick in Hospital, of this number available for shipment would be problematical. (See our signal Y 321 of 18 April).

f Colonel Munzo, Commanding Officer 59th Inf Regt, called and invited our officers to attend "Feast of 59th Regt" 18 April. Told him we would send a representative to same.

g Major Fossett inspected Distributing Depots at Macomer and Sassari, checking in detail with representative of Director of Commissary's office re Italian food items to be issued without delay (See S & T Report of 21 April).

h Captain De Stefano conference with Lieut Pelter, Italian officer commanding AC Platoon re release of building occupied by AC Platoon and equipment at same.

i Cruiser Montecuccoli departed for Naples loaded with callups.

3. Tuesday, 17 April

a Conferred with Signal Officer (British) Elmas re arrival and departure courier planes carrying mail.

b Conferred with Major Austin re following:

(1) Reference your ST/1507 of 12 April; Par 3 - WE to follow. Par 4 - Arrange to ship 1 officer 24 tank men to Naples 23 April (See Par 2a above). Par 5 - Major Austin will turn 1 year supply spare parts over to High Commissioner at Abbasanta, the High Commissioner to furnish mechanics to dismantle.

(2) Batteries removed from tanks at Guspini for Abbasanta vehicles Major Austin stated none to replace them. Tanks will have to be moved to Mainland without battery for each.

(3) Repairable tires and tubes for Mainland (Reference your ST 1529/2 of 31 March). Major Austin advised same would be shipped in trucks going to Mainland at first opportunity.

c Major Fossett traveled from Sassari to Cagliari.

d Captain De Stefano conferred with Automobile Directorate re census of vehicles.

4. Wednesday, 18 April

a Colonel Albert and Major Martin attended 59th Inf Regt "Feast of The Regt". General Maccario, Commander Italian Forces in Sardinia and staff; General Pinna, High Commissioner, were present.

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The officers and men made a very good appearance in the review. It being an anniversary for the Regiment and the gist of all the speeches was "they wanted to fight for the Allies and redeem the name of Italy".

b Major Fossett inspected Distributing Depot at Cagliari and barracks store material ready for shipment at Cagliari.

c Cruiser Abruzzi departed for Naples with callups.

5. Thursday, 19 April

a Colonel Quercia, Commander CC.RR. Legion Sardinia, called. Discussed with him the availability of CC.RR. in coping with any disturbance that might arise over labor troubles at Carbonia coal mines and when called upon for reinforcements by the Prefect. He thought sufficient strength could be mustered to take care of any situation that might arise.

b Conferred with Intelligence Officer RAF at Elmas re intelligence matters (See our Security Intelligence Report of 20 April).

c Colonel Albert and Major Fossett made an inspection of the Military Hospital at Cagliari. Lieut Col Dettoro in command escorted us through the entire Hospital. The Hospital is in process of being restored and repainted, the wards and operating rooms were in exceptionally good condition and clean. The kitchen was clean and in good order but the storeroom was not. Instructed him to make corrections in the storeroom and suggested that he look into the matter of obtaining wire screening for windows from the Engineers, as there were quite a few flies around. He stated he would act on same at once. Major Fossett stated there was a remarkable improvement over his inspection 2 months previously. We visited bulk and distributing depots at Cagliari, inspected surplus food being turned in by Air Force and Artillery equipment for 210 Italian Division that just arrived from Nuoro. (See our signal Y 326 of 19 April).

d Major Fossett conferred with Commissary Section Chief on shoe repair and issue of clothing. Also inspected 59th I.S. Regt Mess (See S & T Report of 21 April).

e Captain De Stefano conferred with Colonel Costantino re billeting Italian personnel assigned to UNIA (now a total of 17).

6. Friday, 20 April

a Conferred with Agent Demos GID who arrived to investigate Colonel Borda case. Chief agent Lapino to arrive near future.

b Captain Sprague and Lieut Ogden, UNRRA, called and discussed matters in general.

c Conferred with Lieut Colonels Costantino and De Giudici, C.M.S., re latest developments in troop movements. One thousand Military will be available to go to Mainland 23 April. Colonel Costantino stated he would start Phase II Callup 24 April and 1000 would be ready for shipment 1 May and 1000 every four days thereafter until the Phase is completed. He also stated he was instructed by Ministry of War to send 1st shipment of Phase II to Frosinone and balance to Orvieto. He further stated all Italian Military personnel not authorized would be shipped to Mainland during April.

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d Major Fossett inspected clothing Sub Depot. Checked on food items being turned in by Italian Air Force and inspected Subsistence Co. Mess.

7. Saturday, 21 April

a Conferred with Major Hatch (British) AC Mining Div and Mr. Allen (U.S. W.O.) re (1) Sending of signals. We would handle his urgent and secret signals. (2) Moving the ICE (National Institute for External Commerce) to an undesirable location without telephone. Phoned the High Commissioner's office and requested they be provided with suitable office, furniture and phone. Request granted.

b We entertained at dinner General Maccario, and 3 members of his staff, General Pinna and General Scalabrino Saturday evening.

c Conferred with Lieut Curetolo (U.S.) Radio Sensor Sardinia re transfer of Marescialli in Italian cipher team. As both Marescialli are to go to Rome, application for transfer could be made there.

d Cruiser Abruzzi arrived.

- a Conferred with Captain Newgate, A.C., re disposition Italian personnel with A.C.
- b Checked loading of cruiser Abruzzi.
- c Captain De Stefano conferred with Captain Newby and Lieut Scanlan, A.C. Sardinia, re transfer of property and equipment.
- d Cruiser Abruzzi departed for Naples (See our signal Y 267 of 7 April).
- e Routine office work and $\frac{1}{2}$ day off.

2. Monday, 9 April

- a Mr Railsback, O.W.J., called re travel orders, mail, rations and PX for himself. Advised him we would take care of all.
- b Captain Gallagher, Hq Command AFHQ, called re crating, transporting to dock and shipping office equipment held here in warehouse by AC to mainland. Advised him the possibility of Italian Engineers doing work and we could arrange for transportation to dock, shipping in accordance with priorities from higher level.
- c Chaplain Waldon, 310 Service Group, U.S. Air Force, called and requested transportation 2 days to "marry off" G.I.'s. It was granted.
- d Courtesy call to Commander Holme, RAF at Elmas Air Field. Commander Holme was away so conferred with Executive Officer Fox.
- e Major Fossett conferred with Head of Commissary Section re issue of Italian items in lieu of Allied items. Also inspected Barrack Stores at Cagliari.
- f Captain De Stefano supervised the transfer of property and equipment of EM from AC billet to new billet and established new EM mess.
- g Cruiser Montecuccoli arrived for callups.

3. Tuesday, 10 April

a. Conferred with General Scalabrino and Major Palma, Territorial Hq Rome, Sardinia Office, re shipment of clothing to Mainland. The General made many requests re retaining several items of clothing in Sardinia - advised him that we would immediately weigh all requests and give him a reply soonest, but mainly instructions previously given would stand.

b. Attended Farewell given Colonel Pennycuik, AC, by General Pinna, High Commissioner. Many military and civilians were present. Made acquaintance with Prefects from the Cagliari, Nuoro and Sassari Provinces, with whom I will have to deal later as LO ALCOM, and many other civilians under the High Commissioner.

c. Major Fossett inspected Bulk Food Depot at Cagliari to determine Italian items in stock and checked Cagliari Food Distributing Depot re issue Italian items now in stock.

d. Captain De Stefano conferred with Lt Colonel Costantino re billeting and messing Italian MM that will be retained by MTA, the total including Italian Radio Section is 17.

4. Wednesday, 11 April

a. Conferred with Lt Col Costantino re changes in schedule for April shipments on cruisers in compliance with your signal SD 2586 of 9 April.

b. Captain Chi (Montecuccoli) and Captain Talarigo (Abruzzi) called. We discussed shipments for April.

c. Inspected loading of cruiser Montecuccoli (Personnel) and S.S. Hildur I (Cargo) - progressing satisfactorily.

d. Major Fossett conferred with Lieut Col Costantino re report of missing clothing for re-calls.

e. Capt De Stefano conferred with Automobiliistic Directorate re completion of windshield labels on vehicles remaining in Sardinia.

5. Thursday, 12 April

a. Conferred with Lt Col Dottore, Medical Director Sardinia and he advised me as follows:

(1) Malaria. He stated that an educational plan re malaria and methods to combat same would commence 16 April, mepacrine would be issued to troops in malarial areas but he had not been informed as to quantity. I advised him to have instructions completed to all troops by 1 May and start issue six (one a day) mepacrine tablets per week until he received instructions as to quantity from Ministry of War, commencing 1 May (In accordance to verbal instructions given me by Major Haggie 23 March). Also advised him to issue mepacrine to all troops in Sardinia regardless of location. He stated the Italian troops did not take mepacrine last summer but an Italian anti-malaria medicine.

(2) Hospitals and Hospital Supplies. Average patients at Cagliari 200 and Sassari 145, increase due to callups. Supplies satisfactory - shipping some to mainland. Informed him of a very satisfactory report made by Major Fossett on the Hospital unit at Sassari (See par 4c of our Log No. 55 dated 3 April). Italian Air Force draws medical supplies from Army but not the Italian Navy.

(3) Hospital Diet. Receiving all right and satisfactory.

b Captain De Stefano conferred with Lieut Felter, Italian AC Platoon Leader, re transfer of Italians employed by AC to the mainland (They will be sent on cruiser 16 April).

c Corporal Zimmerman departed by air to Naples as courier.

6. Friday, 13 April

a Observed loading of tanks and heavy trucks on 3 British L.C.T.'s which was being efficiently accomplished.

b Lt Bonelli, Italian Naval LO, called and expressed condolence on the death of President Roosevelt in behalf of Commander Borghi Italian Navy at Cagliari and stated the Italian flags would be at half mast until interment. I thanked them for the expression of sympathy.

c Captain Sprague, UNRRA Cagliari, called re general matters concerning her office.

d General Maccario, Commander Italian Forces in Sardinia, and Staff, and General Scalabrino, Territorial Hq of Rome, Sardinia Office, called to express in behalf of the Italian Garrison in Sardinia and themselves sympathy at the death of President Roosevelt. I thanked them for their sincere expression of condolence and gave them a brief on the life of the late President and method of succession.

e Inspected the cruiser Abruzzi on board.

f Conferred with Major Fossett and Major Martin re recent shipping priorities and checked to see that steps had been taken to expedite all movements.

g Major Fossett conferred with General Scalabrino re civilian ration for callups from collecting center to reinforcement battalion.

h Captain De Stefano conferred with PWB representatives re disbandment of the Italian Military personnel and equipment at once.

i Cruiser Abruzzi departed for Duko loaded with personnel and equipment.

7. Saturday, 14 April

a Returned courtesy of Commander Borghi Italian Navy Cagliari and discussed shipments on cruisers for the remainder of April. He stated there would be a cruiser sail from Cagliari on 16, 18, and 27 April and possibly another in April, probably on the 23rd. He requested that we permit shipping of refugees on the last ship. I advised him that according to our schedule all ships would be loaded with Military personnel and priority would be given to same, but if any vacant spaces became available I would contact MMIA Rome for authority to ship refugees

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b Routine office work forenoon. Afternoon office closed
to pay our respects to the late President.

c Cruiser Montecuccoli arrived for callups.

TO : Commanding General, Land Forces Sub Com A.C. (MMIA), Rome.

1. Sunday, 1 April - Routine office work and 1/2 day off.

a. Conferred with Flight Lt Bates, 251 Air Sea Rescue (British) re quarters for his detachment. Advised him that AC would vacate quarters soon and he could take over quarters now occupied by AC Italian Service Platoon when abandoned.

b. Major Fossett conferred with Captain Newby, AC, re general matters.

c. Captain De Stefano conferred with British DID re rations for British personnel going to eat at our mess.

2. Monday, 2 April

a. Lt Kocheleff, AC Export Officer, requested that MMIA cipher take over signals for the High Commissioner's office. Due to the inability to increase getting through to Rome and the estimated additional load, we were unable to grant the request. There is a possibility of retaining the cipher unit AC had (See para 5c and 6a below).

b. Colonel Albert, Major Fossett and Capt De Stefano went over repair plans with Italian engineer to prepare the new office and EM quarters.

c. Conferred with Lt Colonel Costantino, Deputy Chief of Staff, C.M.S., re location of Calabria Division and Service Units on the island.

d. Colonel Albert and Captain De Stefano had dinner with Colonel Penrycuik, AC Commander, who will leave the island 10 April.

e. Major Fossett checked with Port Office to arrange for unloading food supplies notified to arrive from Naples.

f. Captain De Stefano conferred with Captain Newby, AC, re turn over equipment after AC moves.

g. Captain De Stefano conferred with Lt Scanlan AC re rations and PX after AC moves.

3. Tuesday, 3 April

a. Paid courtesy call on General Scalabrino, Commander Sardinia Office Territorial Hq Rome. He stated he required 6000 sets of uniforms for Recalls (class 1916-18) to be called up 7-15 April. I advised him to send me a letter giving particulars.

b. Captain E. I. Sprague, UNRRA, called for assistance in securing rations, PX and mail delivery. Promised her to assist as far as possible with the facilities available. Being the senior U.S. unit on the island, we will have to assume the responsibility of drawing from the mainland rations and PX and issuing in bulk to the various small units here.

c. Commander Borghi, Naval Officer (Italian) in charge of Port, called to pay his respects and desired to send refugees to mainland on cruiser each trip. Informed him that the cruiser was to be used primarily to transport callups and military personnel to the mainland and our new policy was not to give passage to civilians as the ABBAZIA was for that purpose. (See modification of above policy per 7a below).

d. Major Fossett inspected following installations at Macomer (To follow on next bi-weekly report):

- (1) Records and stock Food Distributing Depot.
- (2) Clothing Depot - gathered information on items ready for shipment.
- (3) Reinforcement Battalion - inspected ration accounts and mess.
- (4) 2nd Battalion, 40 I.B. Regiment - inspected rations account and mess.

4. Wednesday, 4 April

a. Discussed many matters with Major Martin on his return from Rome.

b. Mr. Discoe, W.O., Sardinia Mining Region, A.C., called for Major Matthews re this office handling their signals and mail, approximately 12 messages per week. Told him I would contact MMIA if they could handle same at other end and if MMIA agreed we would accommodate them unless the load got too heavy. (See our signal Y 257 dated 5 April and MMIA reply). As long as the Italian cipher team MMIA is operating here under our control, we will use them to the maximum for mining signals.

c. Major Fossett inspected following installations at Sassari (To follow next bi-weekly S & T report):

- (1) Stock and accounts of Distributing Depot - quarters too small and over crowded, creates confusion.
- (2) Barrack Stores Depot - and material ready for shipment.
- (3) Military Hospital - kitchens for both patients and unit cleanest seen in Italian Army.
- (4) Recruit Battalion - accompanied by General Ferrari, Commanding General 6 Brigade, Calabria Division. Barracks clean and orderly but kitchen not satisfactorily cleaned. Men seem satisfied with rations and are clothed.

d. Cruiser Montecuccoli arrived with Major Martin, Sgt Gentile and Corporal Fair (British Ciphers) on board from mainland.

5. Thursday, 5 April

a. Conference with Lieut Colonel Constantino, Deputy Chief of Staff, Territorial Hq Rome, Sardinia Office, re April shipments of personnel to mainland. (See our ltr of 5 April subject Personnel Movement from Sardinia).

b. Conferred with Lt Col Usai Pasquale, Commanding Officer, Group CC.RR. at Cagliari regarding his dealing with Allied matters on the island. Advised him to go through this office unless it was an urgent police matter then direct and advise this office.

c. Conferred with Colonel Pennycook, Commander AC Region Sardinia re taking over Italian cipher team (See our cable Y 257 of 5 April).

d. Major Fossett inspected following installation at Ozieri (report to follow):

(1) Medical Supply Depot - saw veterinarian supplies and medical stores that are ready for shipment.

(2) Artillery Depot - saw saddlery being repaired and prepared for shipment.

(3) Chemical Supply Depot - saw 600 cases of chemical stores such as gas masks which are ready for shipment.

e. Major Fossett inspected repair unit at Ozieri and saw unit repairing clothing and shoes and large quantity of clothing no longer of military value.

f. Major Fossett inspected barracks, mess and ration accounts of 236th I.S. Regiment at Tempio (Report to follow).

g. Conference with Captain Newby, AC, re Italian personnel with AC Platoon.

6. Friday, 6 April

a. Conference with Lt Rocheleff, AC representative; Drs. De Magietris and Masci, High Commissioner representatives, to complete arrangements of taking over the Italian cipher team NALA Cagliari.

b. Conferred with General Fava, First Territorial Hq, and Col Contantino, Deputy Chief of Staff, completing schedule for shipment of personnel during April.

c. Inspected the loading of cruiser Montecuccoli. Conferred with Captain Chi.

d. Major Fossett inspected Artillery Depot and workshops at Nuoro - saddlery material is being repaired and prepared for shipment. Much material is now ready.

e. Major Fossett inspected mess of 1st Mobile Workshop at Abbasanta - conditions fair. (Report to follow).

f. Major Fossett inspected Military Laundry at Tadasuni, which has now been closed. Small quantity of clothing no longer of military value stored here but it is to be moved to Macomer Clothing Depot.

I informed him that the High Commissioner's Office would be allowed 20 spaces on each cruiser for personnel from his office on duty, families of Military, refugees and other civilians, when available and did not interfere with the movement of Military.

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b Conferred with Mr Discoe, W.O. (See par 4b above) re transmitting his signals. Advised him that the Italian cipher team would handle his signals and his official and personal mail could be forwarded to us from MMIA Rome.

c Lt Thompson, U.S. Navy, who is picking up "blimps" on the island called.

d Sgt Tarantino returned from mainland (Discharged from Naples Hospital 4 April).

e Routine office work.

f Colonel Albert, Major Fossett and Major Martin attended dinner given by General Maccario Saturday evening.
