2. Summary - 10000 10000 6 Jan 12

It is assumed that some of these have been noted on the exercise held 27 - 30 Dec.

Results were: slow and unskilled staff work, lack of control of room movement, unwillingness to react to the tactical situation resulting largely from lack of knowledge of war, but communication, and almost complete breakdown of air services. The last caused the

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convince to be disturbed twelve hours early. There was evidence of lack of discipline and lack of control by officers during both nights of the exercises.

The exercises held 2 - 3 Jan showed many improvements on the previous. Good movement to the concentration area was good, mutual aid controlled. Further parties were sent on and worked efficiently. The Regiment completed their bridge by 0900 (only two hours late). Communications by line and R/T were excellent throughout. It was aligned and known to subordinates. As communications worked well. Light and in order for the attack were however bad, and the reaction of junior units to tactical situation was weak. There was a great improvement in control and discipline during the night before the attack, but no realization of the tactical impossibility of overrunning the and left in position shielded by the enemy or moving out by daylight on roads in full view of his line.

It was again necessary to cancel the exercises eight hours early, at the direct request of the Gp Comd, because on this occasion the Gp Comd, in his own words, did not consider that his officers would be able to control their men or enforce discipline to achieve other objectives. This attitude has been proved with quite well-trained but two to be fatal when they actually go into action. The two are undoubtedly coming on to what will happen when this is by one standard very much less than half trained and never having spent more than one night in the open, under real conditions when really adverse weather conditions and in particular to which it for days and nights on end. I feel that the lack of morale and discipline of the two should be given even more weight than the lack of law when any decision is being taken as to its equipment.
