SECURITY - MILITARY INFORMATION.

1. All officers and other ranks including A.I.S. personnel and any other persons working in military offices, orderly rooms or on switchboards, who, in the course of their employment, have constant access to secret documents or information, are required to sign a certificate in form similar to that set out in Appendix A to this A.C.I. Before signing the certificate the attention of all such persons will be drawn to the Extracts from "Instructions for dealing with Documents and Correspondence in Military Offices, 1934" set out in Appendix B to this A.C.I.

2. G.S. formations, units and establishments will be responsible for strict enforcement of the instruction quoted in para. 1 above and will draw the attention of all ranks who have signed, or may in future be required to sign, the certificate, referred to, that they continue to be bound by this certificate after they have left the Service.

3. A.C.I. 234B of 1944 and the General Staff pamphlet "Instructions for the Security of Documents, Information, etc., 1940, Section I, para 2 and Section 3, Appendices A and B are hereby cancelled.

APPENDIX A

CERTIFICATE AND DECLARATION.

1. My attention has been drawn to the Extracts from "Instructions for dealing with Documents and Correspondence in Military Offices, 1934", set out in Appendix B of A.C.I. 609 of 1944, which relate to the safeguarding of military information.
2. I understand and agree that all official and military information acquired by me in the course of military duty is to be regarded as the property of the War Department, and is not to be published or communicated, either directly or indirectly, to another person in any form except in the course of my official duties, whether during or after I have left the Service, without the previous consent of the Army Council.
3. I further understand and agree that any breach or neglect of the above-mentioned Instructions for dealing with Documents and Correspondence in Military Offices, both as regards the safeguarding of **3748** information and otherwise, is a disciplinary offence and may render me liable to proceedings under the Official Secrets Acts, 1911 to 1939.

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APPENDIX B

Extracts from

"INSTRUCTIONS FOR DEALING WITH DOCUMENTS AND COPIES -
POWER IN MILITARY OFFICES, 1934"

Disclosure of Information

15. No unpublished official document of any description may be given or shown to anyone not serving in a military office, except on the authority of the general or other officer in charge of administration. This rule applies also to papers or information which it is intended to publish, but which have not been actually issued.

16. No premature or unauthorized communication of information to which access is obtained in the course of official duties will be made to any newspaper or person, whether interested or not. Any dereliction of duty in this respect, whether the information is secret or not, is an offence under the Official Secrets Acts, and will be treated accordingly.

17. The communications against which these cautions are directed are not confined to matter still under discussion, but include also the unauthorized disclosure of matter, finally decided on, but concerned which the manner and the time of publication may be not less important than the matter itself. In all these cases THE PUBLICATION, WITHOUT AUTHORITY, OF OFFICIAL INFORMATION constitutes the offence; and the danger, to which all Governments are equally exposed, cannot be adequately guarded against if distinctions are allowed to be drawn between one kind of unauthorized publication and another.

26. Attention is drawn to section 2, sub-section (c) of the Official Secrets Act of 1911, as amended by the Act of 1920. Under this sub-section, CARELESSNESS, OR UNJUDICIOUS CONDUCT endangering the safety of (without necessarily losing) a secret document, information or article (which letter includes a key or other instrument affording means of access to secret information) is a STATUTORY MISDEMEANOUR PUNISHABLE BY UP TO TWO YEARS' IMPRISONMENT WITH HARD LABOUR.

It will be noted that this sub-section applies equally to indiscreet conversation, correspondence, or other communications.

In this respect, whether the information is secret or not, is an element under the Official Secrets Acts, and will be treated accordingly.

17. The communications against which these cautions are directed are not confined to matter still under discussion, but include also the unauthorized disclosure of matter, finally decided on, but concerned which the sender and the time of publication may be not less important than the matter itself. In all these cases THE PUBLICATION, WITHOUT AUTHORITY, OF OFFICIAL INFORMATION constitutes the offence; and the danger, to which all Governments are equally exposed, cannot be adequately guarded against if distinctions are allowed to be drawn between one kind of unauthorized publication and another.

20. Attention is drawn to section 3, sub-section (c) of the Official Secrets Act of 1911, as amended by the Act of 1920. Under this sub-section, CARELESSNESS, OR UNWITTING CONDUCT endangering the safety of (without necessarily losing) a secret document, information or article (which latter includes a key or other instrument affording means of access to secret information) IS A STATUTORY MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY UP TO TWO YEARS' IMPRISONMENT WITH HARD LABOUR.

It will be noted that this sub-section applies equally to indiscreet conversations, correspondence, or communications, within or without the office, in connection with official secrets, and the regulations relating to the treatment of secret and confidential information and documents **3747** in these instructions for dealing with documents and correspondence in Military Offices will be scrupulously observed by all members of the staff.

21. All employees in military offices will bring to notice in the proper quarter an incident, wherever arising, which they have good reason to believe may indicate a breach of fidelity or discretion, or be prejudicial to the security of the Army. Delinquencies or circumstances which may have any connexion, however remote, with the security of the naval, military or air forces, especially when a breach of the Official Secrets Acts is suspected, if appearing to require elucidation or investigation of an expert nature, will be referred without delay to the head of the branch in which the employee is serving.

22. Any employee receiving any communication, oral or written, anonymous or otherwise, which may be construed as a solicitation to commit or abet any action which is or may be an offence against the Official Secrets Acts, or observing or becoming aware of any such action, will acquaint the head of his branch forthwith. The latter will refer the matter to the War Office for any further investigation that may be necessary.

The attention of all officers is drawn to RA/C Routine Order No. XIII dated 14 Dec 45 which reads as follows:-

1. The War Office has decided further to amend Release Regulations para 326 to permit voluntary deferment of release for a period of six months instead of for 1 or 2 years or until general mobilization as heretofore, for officers WCs S/Spts and Spts of all arms except ATs and VDs.
2. Volunteers may be accepted at once.
3. The conditions of deferment for six months are identical with those now operative for DV (1) and DV (2).
4. Eligibility is at present restricted to personnel in A/S Groups up to and including 35.
5. The documentation for deferment for six months is identical with that already notified for DV (1) and DV (2) except that the prefix will be DV (6).
6. The War Office is considering extending this scheme to part in special-ists and tradesmen below the rank of S.4, but no definite instructions have been received as yet.

RATIONS

1. Difficulties are being experienced by the NCO i/c Rest Villa, in feeding Officers, due to the number of "Casual Officers" who arrive without any warning or rations, and demand meals.
2. A ration truck goes to S. Marinella with rations for the permanent staff on the following days:- Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays.
3. Rations for Officers are provided by the Mess to which they belong, and can be collected from Messes by arrangement with the Camp Comdt on the above DAYS ONLY.
4. In order to ensure that sufficient rations are sent, it is necessary, therefore, that the NCO i/c Mess is informed in good time, of the number of meals he is expected to provide.
5. Officers who intend visiting the Villa on days other than those stated in para 2 must take their rations with them.
6. Officers are asked to comply strictly with these instructions, as otherwise an unfair drain is imposed on the Staffs' Rations and on those of Officers who HAVE remembered to make the necessary arrangements.

ACCOMMODATION.

1. Officers are again reminded that there are only eight (8) beds available at the Villa.
