ARMY SUB COMMISSION A.C.C. ARMY INSTRUCTION No 1BOOTS AND CLOTHING.

1. OBJECT. The object of this Instruction is to define the control and method of issue of BOOTS and CLOTHING supplied by the Allied Forces for the general use of the ITALIAN Armed Forces in ITALY, SICILY and SARDINIA.
2. ITEMS COVERED. This Instruction covers such items of clothing and boots as set out in LHM letter, LHM/AC/400 - 1 (ITALIAN) CES - ACI of 9 Jan, existing Italian Army clothing and boots already in possession of the Italian Army and any further quantities of "Common User" items as may be provided. It does NOT cover specialised items of clothing and footwear as may be provided under the arrangements of the Allied Navies or Air Forces.
3. CONTROL OF ISSUE.
 - (a) All items will be stored in the appropriate depots of the Italian Forces.
 - (b) Items will only be released on the instructions of the Army Sub Commission, A.C.C.
 - (c) The Italian Command will apply for release of such clothing and boots as in considered essential for special cases where the circumstances are unusual.
4. RESPONSIBILITY FOR DISTRIBUTION. The Italian Command will be responsible for distribution from the depots to the troops designated.
5. WITHDRAWAL OF ITEMS HELD ON BY NEW ISSUES.
 - (a) All items will be withdrawn on a "one for one" basis as far as possible.
 - (b) All withdrawn items will be returned to ITALIAN depots for classification by Boards of Officers which will be set up by the ITALIAN Command.
 - (c) All items will be classified by these Boards as under :
 - (i) Fit for immediate re-issue. These will be held in the depots for issue as instructed.
 - (ii) Fit for issue after repair. These will be repaired under Italian arrangements and then placed in the depots for re-issue.
 - (iii) Fit for use as repairing material only.

3. CONTROL OF ISSUE.

- (a) All items will be stored in the appropriate depots of the Italian Forces.
- (b) Items will only be released on the instructions of the Army Sub Commission, A.C.C.
- (c) The Italian Command will apply for release of such clothing and boots as is considered essential for special cases where the circumstances are unusual.

4. RESPONSIBILITY FOR DISTRIBUTION. The Italian Command will be responsible for distribution from the depots to the troops designated.

5. WITHDRAWAL OF ITEMS RELEASED BY THE ISSUES.

- (a) All items will be withdrawn on a "one for one" basis as far as possible.
- (b) All withdrawn items will be returned to ITALIAN depots for classification by Boards of Officers which will be set up by the ITALIAN Command.
- (c) All items will be classified by these Boards as under:
- (i) Fit for immediate re-issue. These will be held in the depots for issue as instructed.
 - (ii) Fit for issue after repair. These will be repaired under Italian arrangements and then placed in the depots for re-issue.
 - (iii) Fit for use as repairing material only. These will be used by the ITALIAN Command to enable para (ii) above to be carried out.
- (d) A copy of all reports of the Boards of Officers will be forwarded to HQ Army Sub Commission, A.C.C.

1. The following final instructions regarding certain elements of the Italian Army Forces have been received from higher authority and will be effective 13 July. These instructions supersede all instructions heretofore issued which are in conflict with the instructions contained herein.

2. The issue of rations furnished the Italian Armed Forces to personnel of the following units will be limited as shown under each unit:

(a) War Ministry. Authorized 'B' Scale Rations only. Rations will be issued only to bona-fide members of the Armed Forces and the civil officials whose duties are executive to the extent that they may be classified as having the equivalent of officer grades, and for actual mess attendants at general messes where military rations are consumed. Military rations will not be issued for private messes for civil officials, or for private messes for officers below the grade of Brigadier General, and will then be issued only for the military members of the mess. The number of rations issued to the War Ministry will not exceed 1300 without prior approval, and will be reduced to conform with this instruction.

A roster showing the names of all civil officials having the equivalent of officer rank, and the equivalent rank, will be submitted to this Headquarters.

A table showing the number of actual mess attendants authorized to draw rations will be submitted to this Hq.

The strength state of the Italian Army will hereafter show the following under the heading: "War Ministry.":

The total of the first three sub-divisions of the War Ministry will not exceed 1300.

2. The issue of rations furnished the Italian Armed Forces to personnel of the following units will be limited as shown under each unit:

(a) War Ministry. Authorized 'B' Scale Rations only. Rations will be issued only to bona-fide members of the Armed Forces and the civil officials whose duties are executive to the extent that they may be classified as having the equivalent of officer grades, and for actual mess attendants at general messes where military rations are consumed. Military rations will not be issued for private messes for civil officials, or for private messes for officers below the grade of Brigadier General, and will then be issued only for the military members of the mess. The number of rations issued to the War Ministry will not exceed 1300 without prior approval, and will be reduced to conform with this instruction.

A roster showing the names of all civil officials having the equivalent of officer rank, and the equivalent rank, will be submitted to this Headquarters.

A table showing the number of actual mess attendants authorized to draw rations will be submitted to this Hq.

The strength state of the Italian Army will hereafter show the following under the heading: "War Ministry.":

- (1) Officers and men of the Italian Army issued rations, (Excluding CC.RR)
- (2) Civil officials issued rations.
- (3) Mess attendants issued rations.
- (4) CC.RR

The total of the first three sub-divisions of the War Ministry will not exceed 1300.

Officers or men of the Italian Army in excess of the number authorized herein now attached to this unit will either:

- (1) Be demobilized and dropped from the rolls of the Army, and hereafter not issued Army rations under any conditions, or
- (2) Be reported to this Headquarters and be made available for assignment by this Headquarters to a unit of the Italian Army working under Allied command. When assigned to such a unit by this Headquarters such personnel will be required to report to the unit to which assigned before any rations are issued to them.

Report will be rendered this Hq forthwith as to disposition of this excess personnel.

(b) 11. Rep Auton. Minister. Authorized 'B' Scale Rations only. Rations to be issued only to personnel employed in the Royal Household, and not to exceed 15 officers and 50 other ranks. All other personnel, either military or civil, attached to this unit are not authorized to draw any Army

The strength state of the Italian Army will carry not to exceed 15 officers and 50 other ranks under this heading. Civilians now carried on the strength of this unit will be dropped, and will not hereafter be issued rations by the Italian Army under any conditions.

Officers or men of the Italian Army in excess of the number authorised herein now attached to this unit will either:

- (1) Be demobilised and dropped from the rolls of the Army, and hereafter not issued Army rations under any conditions, or
- (2) Be reported to this Headquarters and be made available for assignment by this Headquarters to a unit of the Italian Army working under Allied command. When assigned to such a unit by this Headquarters such personnel will be required to report to the unit to which assigned before any rations are issued to them.

Report will be rendered to His Hq forthwith as to disposition of this excess personnel.

- (c) Grenatieri Battalion. This is the battalion on duty as guard and escort for the Royal Household. Authorised 'B' Scale Rations only. Not to exceed 25 officers and 250 other ranks. 120

The strength state of the Italian Army will show this battalion separately, and not as a part of any Division.

- (d) Royal Military Academy. Authorised 'B' Scale Rations only. Not to exceed 40 officers, 250 cadets and 180 other ranks.

- (e) Royal Naval Academy. Authorised 'B' Scale Rations only. Not to exceed 450 all ranks including officers and cadets.

A table of organisation of this Academy, showing all personnel employed therein, will be submitted forthwith to this Headquarters. The Table of organisation will include a certificate that no other personnel of the Italian Armed Forces is employed in any capacity in the Royal Naval Academy.

The strength state of the Italian Navy will hereafter show the personnel of this Academy under a separate heading.

- (f) Corrado Supreni. Authorised 'A' Scale Rations as a special exception; the 'A' scale is subject to withdrawal at any time. The total ration will not exceed 600 all ranks, including officers, civil officials of officer rank and mess attendants in general messes.

The personnel included herein include the personnel shown in Parts 1 and 2 of the letter of the Corrado Supreni dated 9 May 1944, No. 12936/Op di prot, signed by General INFANTE. The total personnel authorised for

- (c) Granatieri Battalion. This is the battalion on duty as guard and escort for the Royal Household. Authorised 'B' Scale Rations only. Not to exceed 25 officers and 250 other ranks. 1120

The strength state of the Italian Army will show this battalion separately, and not as a part of any Division.

- (d) Royal Military Academy. Authorised 'B' Scale Rations only. Not to exceed 40 officers, 250 cadets and 180 other ranks.
- (e) Royal Naval Academy. Authorised 'B' Scale Rations only. Not to exceed 450 all ranks including officers and cadets.

A table of organisation of this Academy, showing all personnel employed therein, will be submitted forthwith to this Headquarters. The Table of organisation will include a certificate that no other personnel of the Italian Armed Forces is employed in any capacity in the Royal Naval Academy.

The strength state of the Italian Navy will hereafter show the personnel of this Academy under a separate heading.

- (f) Comando Supremo. Authorised 'A' Scale Rations as a special exception; the 'A' scale is subject to withdrawal at any time. The total ration will not exceed 600 all ranks, including officers, civil officials of officer rank and mess attendants in general messes.

The personnel included herein include the personnel shown in Parts 1 and 2 of the letter of the Comando Supremo dated 9 May 1944, No. 12936/Op di prot. signed by General INFANTE. The total personnel authorised for all of Parts 1 and 2 shown in said letter will not exceed 600 all ranks, regardless of where rationed.

Officers or men of the Italian Army in excess of the number authorised herein now attached to this unit will either:

- (1) Be demobilised and dropped from the rolls of the Army, and hereafter not issued Army rations under any conditions, or
- (2) Be reported to this Headquarters and be made available for assignment by this Headquarters to a unit of the Italian Army working under Allied command. When assigned to such a unit by this Headquarters such personnel will be required to report to the unit to which assigned before any rations are issued to them.

Report will be rendered to this Hq forthwith as to disposition of this excess personnel.

(f) Comando Supremo (Contd.)

A roster showing the names of all civil officials having the equivalent of officer rank, and the equivalent rank, will be submitted to this Hq.

A table showing the number of actual mess attendants authorized to draw rations will be submitted to this Hq.

Military rations will not be issued for private messes for civil officials, or for private messes for officers below the grade of Brigadier General, and will then be issued only for the military members of the mess.

The Comando Supremo is authorized to draw from Allied depots that part of the 'A' Scale Ration authorized from Allied sources. Repayment in kind will be made to the Allied Depot only on authority of this Headquarters. The Allied Depot will demand on H.M.I.A. for repayment, showing the exact quantity of each commodity issued, the ration strength covered by the repayment demand, and a certificate by the responsible Italian officer that no additional rations have been drawn from Italian Army Depots. If the Comando Supremo elects to draw from Allied Depots that part of the ration authorized from Allied sources, the entire part must be drawn from the Allied Depot, and Italian Army Depots will issue to the Comando Supremo that part of the ration authorized to be issued from Italian sources.

The strength state of the Italian Army will hereafter show the following under the heading: "Comando Supremo."

- (1) Officers and men of the Italian Army (excl. CC.RR.) issued rations.

Part 1 - office of the Chief of Supreme General Staff, including Ops Branch, Comms Branch and Ufficio Affari Vari.

Part 2. - Ufficio Informazioni.

- (2) Civilian officials by name, issued rations.

- (3) Mess attendants issued rations.

- (4) CC.RR.

The total of (1), (2), (3), above will not exceed 600.

A new table of organization of the Comando Supremo in accordance with the limitations herein prescribed will be submitted to this Hq forthwith.

- (g) 1st Guide Group.

No rations will be issued to any member of this group who is employed.

The strength state of the Italian Army will hereafter show the following under the heading: "Comando Supremo.":

- (1) Officers and men of the Italian Army (excl. CC.RR) issued rations.

Part 1 - office of the Chief of Supreme General Staff, including Ops Branch, Comms Branch and Ufficiali Affari Vari.

Part 2 - Ufficio Informazioni.

- (2) Civilian officials by name, issued rations.
- (3) Mess attendants issued rations.
- (4) CC.RR

The total of (1), (2), (3), above will not exceed 600.

A new table of organisation of the Comando Supremo in accordance with the limitations herein prescribed will be submitted to this Hq forthwith.

- (g) 1st Guide Group. No rations will be issued to any member of this group while employed on its present duty. The personnel of this Group will either:

- (1) Be demobilised and dropped from the rolls of the Army, and hereafter not issued Army rations under any conditions, or
- (2) Be reported to this Headquarters for assignment by this Headquarters to some unit of the Italian Army working under Allied command.

The strength returns of the Italian Army will not carry this unit or any member thereof until the employment of the group or the individual members is authorised by this Headquarters.

3. None of the personnel in excess of the authorised numbers in para. 2 above, will be transferred, attached, detailed, hospitalised, or otherwise be made eligible for ration in another organisation except as specifically provided herein.

4. All units mentioned in para 3 above, except the Comando Supremo, will draw all rations from Italian Army Depots. Repayment for rations drawn by the Comando Supremo from Allied Depots will be made only on authority issued by this H.Q. No other repayment of rations will be made by Italian Army Depots without prior approval of this Headquarters for the issue to be made by the Allied Depot.

5. Italian Army Depots will not issue any rations, either Allied or Italian, to any Italian Military personnel which is not shown on the Italian Army strength state, or which is not employed on duties as shown on the strength state.

6. Except as specified herein for civil officials and mess attendants Italian Army Depots will not issue any rations, either Allied or Italian, to civilians, nor will any Army rations be sold or otherwise conveyed to civilians. (Italian civilians employed by Allied formations are furnished rations by such formations or are on the same ration status as other civilians.)

7. The strength states of the Italian Army will hereafter show under a separate sub heading the CO.RR attached to military formations or Headquarters of the Italian Army. The CO.RR attached to military formations is not included in the Army ceiling, but in the ceiling for the entire CO.RR.

8. No officer or man in hospital or convalescent camp will be carried on the strength state of I.A.F. for rations for a period of over 30 days, except personnel who are in hospital as a result of wounds received in combat against the common enemy since 1 Sept. 1943.

A roster showing Name, Rank, Nature of Wounds, when and where wounded, Date of hospitalisation, and approximate length of confinement in hospital or convalescent camp, of all personnel issued rations for a period of over 30 days in hospital or convalescence will be submitted to this H.Q. on the 1st day of each month.

Personnel, other than combat casualties, who have been in hospital or convalescent camp, over 30 days will either:

- (1) Be demobilised, discharged from the hospital or convalescent camp, and hereafter be issued no Army rations, or
- (2) Be transferred to civil hospitals and dropped from the strength state of the Army and issued no Army rations until they return to full duty with the Army, or
- (3) Be returned to full duty with the Army.

It is the policy that any member of the Italian Army, except combat casualties as defined herein, absent on account of injury or sickness from his unit for a period of over 30 days is considered as non-effective and not entitled to Army rations.

8. No officer or man in hospital or convalescent camp will be carried on the strength state of I.A.F. for rations for a period of over 30 days, except personnel who are in hospital as a result of wounds received in combat against the common enemy since 1 Sept. 1943.

A roster showing Name, Rank, Nature of Wounds, when and where wounded, Date of hospitalisation, and approximate length of confinement in hospital or convalescent camp, of all personnel issued rations for a period of over 30 days in hospital or convalescence will be submitted to this Hq. on the 1st. day of each month.

Personnel, other than combat casualties, who have been in hosp. bel. or convalescent camp, over 30 days will either:

- (1) Be demobilised, discharged from the hospital or convalescent camp, and hereafter be issued no Army rations, or
- (2) Be transferred to civil hospitals and dropped from the strength state of the Army and issued no Army rations until they return to full duty with the Army, or
- (3) Be returned to full duty with the Army.

It is the policy that any member of the Italian Army, except combat casualties as defined herein, absent on account of injury or sickness from his unit for a period of over 30 days is considered as non-effective and not entitled to Army rations.

Officers and non employed under Direct Allied command who are injured during such employment, other than by combat action against the common enemy, and who require hospitalisation in excess of 30 days will be reported to this Headquarters, with full particulars, and this Headquarters may authorise such personnel to remain in military hospitals over 30 days on Army Ration scale. Each case will be the subject of a separate report and action by this Hq.

9. It is desired that a copy of the orders issued by you to ensure that these instructions are carried out be furnished this Headquarters.

2° - Allied Personnel will NOT enter this depot nor remove nor cause to be removed any contents there of, unless duly authorised to do so by the Army Sub Commission, A.C.C. (M.M.I.A.).

3° - Allied Personnel duly authorised by Army Sub Commission, A.C.C. (MMIA) to enter this depot, or to remove any contents, will first produce for inspection by the Italian authorities of the Depot, the written authorisation, signed by an Officer of the Army Sub Commission A.C.C. (MMIA), or signal message giving the authorisation.

4° - In every case of the removal of contents, a detailed receipt, signed by the Allied Officer concerned, will be handed to the Italian Authorities, before leaving. The authority for this removal of contents will always be quoted on this receipt.

5° - Where difficulties arise, the Allied and/or Italian Personnel concerned will contact immediately army Sub Commission A.C.C. (MMIA) Liaison Officers.

6° - Army Sub Commission, A.C.C. (MMIA) Liaison Officers are located as under:

1° - L'ingresso in questo magazzino è vietato a tutto il personale Alleato.

ORDERS FOR D.A.D.S.T. SUPERVISORY L.Os IN SECTORS.

1. The DADST Supervisory L.Os in Sectors will be responsible for the Inspection and guidance of Italian Army, Navy, and Air Force supply organization and all "ST" associated Allied advisory personnel in the following phases:-

- (a) Port Reception of Supplies.
- (b) Bulk Depots, Distribution Supply Depots and Petrol Depots.
- (c) Italian Unit Messing and interior economy, Supply and Distribution.

2. In regard to Port Reception the DADST Supervisory L.Os will ensure that a satisfactory organisation operates to carry out the following functions:-

- (a) That the Allied Port Detachment L.O. obtains advance information of the arrival of Ships including details as per Ships Manifest, that he informs the local Head of Italian Commissariato and communicates same to "ST" HQ, MMIA.
- (b) Identification and Physical reception of supplies.
- (c) Safe transit and storage of supplies into Italian Bulk Depots. 1110
- (d) Salvage and repair of broken cases carried out as and when necessary.
- (e) Creation of an agreed out-turn report of supplies received by Italian Port Detachment from each ship. He will ensure that such statement is made out in triplicate and signed by the Italian Officer in charge and countersigned by the Allied Officer. He will forward original to Italian War Ministry, copy to MMIA. HQ.
- (f) That the duties of the Italian Port Detachment are carried out in accordance with ST/1/2 dated 17th Feb 1944 - copy attached.
- (g) He will ensure that handling of supplies from Port to Italian depot is carried out economically both in labour and in transport.

3. In regard to Bulk Depots and supply installations, the DADST Supervisory L.O is responsible for inspecting and guiding the Italian Army on all aspects of Dept procedure, and specifically:-

- (a) Premises.
- (b) Weighing Facilities
- (c) Prompt off-loading and on-loading
- (d) Labour
- (e) Handling and Stacking.
- (f) Salvage and Repairs
- (g) Local Resources Intake.
- (h) Accounting of Supplies.
- (i) Drill for issues.
- (j) Consolidated accounts.

- (k) Stocktaking and Stock Reports.
- (l) Observations on Warranty Expiry Dates.

4. In the case of Distribution Supply Depots particularly, the DADST Supervisory L.O. is responsible for ensuring that Issues procedure is watertight, and that Supplies are in fact being issued to Italian units, no more and no less, than their actual strength warrants, on the basis of the appropriate scale.

5. In regard to the Italian Unit's messing, the DADST Supervisory L.O. is responsible for ensuring that the best possible use is being made of supplies provided by the Allies as to the manner of preparation, avoidance of waste, etc. He will also see that the Italian Soldier does in fact receive his full ration as far as is possible.

6. The DADST Supervisory L.O. is responsible to the Senior Army Sub Com L.O. of the Area for all matters, and is the A.D.S.T., Army Sub Comm's representative in the Sector.

7. The established principles governing the relations between MMIA and the Italian Army will at all times be observed by DADST Supervisory L.Os.

8. The DADST Supervisory L.O. will during every month visit in his Sector:-

- (a) All Italian Bulk Depots once a week.
- (b) All Italian Distribution Supply Depots once a week.
- (c) All Italian Petrol Depots three times a month.
- (d) Not less than six Italian Units, choosing different ones each month, with a view to checking Messing and interior economy Supply and Distribution.

An Inspection Report after each Depot or Unit visited will be submitted to A.D.S.T., Army Sub Comm, as soon as after inspection is made.

9. The DADST Supervisory L.O. will be called upon to take physical stock of certain commodities in Depots as at a certain time, whereupon he will be required to check stocks against ledger charge and reconcile it with issue and receipt vouchers.

(a) The movement of supplies from docks to Italian Depots will be accepted as an Allied responsibility for the time being.

(c) Army Sub-Commission will establish port acts at ports of entry for the purpose of identifying Italian supplies and for notifying depots to which supplies shall be consigned.

5. Movement of Supplies from Dock to Depots

(a) The movement of supplies from docks to Italian Depots will be accepted as an Allied responsibility for the time being.

8. Ration Scales

There will be two ration scales in operation for the Italian Armed Forces:-

The Combat Scale will be issued to:-

- (i) Italian Army personnel in front of rear army boundaries.
- (ii) Elements of the Italian Air Force performing combat duties.

(a) Cigarettes and tobacco for all Italian Armed Forces will be provided from Italian sources.

(b) The scale of issue will be as laid down for the Italian Army.

(c) PSS and ST this HQ will demand in advance 10 and 30 days supply respectively of cigarettes and tobacco as in para 6(a)(i) and (ii) above in respect of Italian Forces forward of Army rear boundaries. Issues will not be made from Allied stocks. Army Sub-Commission will notify PSS and ST the scale to be issued.

12. Strength Return

Army Sub-Commission will furnish Q, G-4 and ST this HQ, and PSS with a Strength Return in accordance with the pro-forma shown, Annexure 4 attached. This Return will arrive by the 12th of each month and will show the position on the last day of the preceding month.

13. Effective Date of this Instruction

This instruction will become effective on the mainland of Italy on 25 May 44. In SICILY and SARDINIA the effective date will be notified by signal to all concerned as soon as the date has been agreed. Until this date has been notified, supply will continue through present channels.

(s) Provision is made in the ration scales for the issue of 2 ozs preserved meat to Italian Forces on the Basic Scale employed on heavy manual labour.

(t) This extra ration will be issued by the Allied Employing Agency.

11. Cigarettes and Tobacco

(a) Cigarettes and tobacco for all Italian Armed Forces will be provided from Italian sources.

(b) The scale of issue will be as laid down for the Italian Army.

(c) PES and 30 this HQ will remain in advance 10 and 30 days supply respectively of cigarettes and tobacco as in para 5(a)(i) and (ii) above in respect of Italian Forces forward of Army rear boundaries. Issues will not be made from Allied stocks. Army Sub-Commission will notify PES and 30 the scale to be issued.

12. Strength Return

Army Sub-Commission will furnish Q, C-4 and 30 this HQ, and PES, with a Strength Return in accordance with the pre-form shown at Annexure A attached. This return will arrive by the 15th of each month and will show the position on the 15th of the preceding month.

13. Effective date of this instruction

This instruction will become effective on the mainland of Italy on 25 Mar 44. In SICILY and SARDINIA the effective date will be notified by signal to all concerned as soon as the date has been agreed. Until this date has been notified, supply will continue through present channels.

SUBJECT: Issue Allied Supplies and Stores to Italian Armed Forces.

1. These instructions pertain to the control of stores and supplies which have been or may be authorized for issue to the Italian Armed Forces by the Combined Chiefs of Staff on an allied basis. They do not apply to stores or equipment which have been or may be authorized by any Allied Nations working directly for or on behalf of that Allied Nation. It does not apply to Air Force Technical Stores nor to Naval stores, except as these stores may be common user items furnished on an international basis. These instructions apply equally to the Italian Mainland, Sicily, Sardinia and Corsica.

2. The following categories have been authorized and are being furnished on an international basis. Nations, medical supplies, clothing and fuel (POL). The United States has assumed primary responsibility for rations (subsistence). The United Kingdom has assumed primary responsibility for medical supplies. Joint responsibility has been assumed for clothing. POL procedures will be furnished thru the normal existing petroleum state procedures.

3. The Army Sub-Commission (Army's title IMA) has been designated as the executive agency for the supervision, distribution, allocation, and accounting for all its supplies and stores presently authorized by the CCS for issue to any or all of the Italian Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force). For all matters pertaining to these supplies and stores IMA will operate directly under the supervision of Headquarters AF. No other agency has authority to issue or allocate any of these commodities to any of the Italian Armed Forces.

4. To comply with the directive of the CCS that the ration of ownership shall exercise controlling authority over issues the following will apply, subject to policy control by GAO and the IMA, respectively, for British and United States commodities. The senior British officer at Headquarters IMA will supervise the supply of medical stores. The senior United States officer at Headquarters IMA will supervise the supply of subsistence. They will jointly supervise the supply of clothing recognizing the primary interest of the British in the supply of clothing to

tion from its own stores or on behalf of that nation's forces. These stores may be common user stores. Common user stores are those stores which apply to Air Force technical stores for to level stores, except as these instructions apply equally to the Italian mainland, Sicily, Sardinia and Corsica.

2. The following categories have been authorized and are being furnished on an International basis: rations, medical supplies, clothing and fuel (POL). The United States has assumed primary responsibility for rations (subsistence). The United Kingdom has assumed primary responsibility for medical supplies. Joint responsibility has been assumed for clothing. POL products will be furnished thru the normal existing petroleum state procedure.

3. The Joint Sub-Commission (short title JSC) has been designated as the executive agency for the supervision, distribution, allocation, and accounting for all the supplies and stores presently authorized by the GCS for issue to any or all of the Italian Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force). For all matters pertaining to these supplies and stores, JSC will operate directly under the supervision of Headquarters JSC. No other agency has authority to issue or allocate any of these commodities to any of the Italian Armed Forces.

4. To comply with the directive of the GCS that the nation of ownership shall exercise controlling authority over issues to following will apply, subject to policy control by GAO and DCLO and, respectively, for British and United States commodities. The member British officer at Headquarters JSC will supervise the supply of medical stores. The senior United States officer at Headquarters JSC will supervise the supply of clothing and subsistence. They will jointly supervise the supply of clothing recognized in the primary interest of the nation of ownership. All will continue to be handled as prescribed in JSC administrative memorandum No. 11 CS.

5. At Headquarters JSC, the review and supervision of the supply system will be the responsibility of the GAO (for) for stores of British ownership and the DCLO (U.S.) for stores of United States ownership.

6. Issues of other common user stores and equipment except those which may be specifically authorized from National depots to Italian forces serving with National troops, will be controlled by JSC. Repairable salvaged shoes and clothing which are issued under the provisions of AFM 11-11, administrative memorandum No. 5, 7 January 1944, will be allocated by JSC to Italian forces and will not be issued directly by U.S. or British services without prior authority of JSC. Where practicable such items after repair will be deposited in Italian depots prior to issue. JSC will report monthly to the Chief Accountant the receipt of such salvage clothing received from allied services in the theater.

7. JSC will furnish to the Chief Accountant 100 monthly a state-

ment (with signed receipts) of the total amount of each subject commodity accepted by the Italian Armed Forces. MMLA will cause records to be maintained which will show all receipts, issues, and stockpiles in Italian depots and will furnish such information with respect to these matters as may be required by provisioning British or United States Services. MMLA will assure that the minimum stockpile or hold in Italian formations and units.

8. MMLA will not be responsible for pricing. The Chief Accountant AGC will keep quantitative records. The principles and procedure for pricing will be in accordance with instructions from the Combined Chiefs of Staff to AGC.

9. Scales of supply for all authorized issues have been prescribed. It is the definite responsibility of every Allied and Italian agency involved in the issue of any of the subject commodities to assure that the scale of supply is not exceeded. Over issues will be adjusted at the earliest opportunity by a subsequent withholding. Allied stocks issued from Allied depots will not be required unless previous authority has been secured or unless the issue is of such an emergency nature that previous authority was not practicable to secure.

10. None of the supplies or stores may be issued except to those who are bona fide members of the Italian Armed Forces in every sense, and who are borne on the rosters of the Ministry concerned, and who are within the list of those who have been approved as effective by the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

11. The MMLA is authorized to deal direct with the Air Force and Naval subcommissions, and with all major agencies (Armies, separate Corps, Districts, Base Section, Allied garrisons, Air Forces, Navies, etc.) to procure information as to strengths, organization and locations of Italian troops working for them or under their administrative control and to procure information as to the importation, issues and status of the commodities covered by these instructions. MMLA will bring to the attention of AII any irregularities which constitute a violation of the instruction of this or higher authority.

12. MMLA will submit for approval with the least practicable delay Standing Operating Procedure for the receipt storage, issuing and accounting of all commodities whose control is the responsibility of MMLA. This procedure will contemplate that local port commanders will be responsible for the unloading of the supplies and stores returned for the Italian Armed Forces and for the movement of these commodities to base depots operated by the Italians. Italian assistance in identifying commodities and for furnishing guards en route to warehouse will be as agreed at each port between MMLA and the port authority. Where arrangements can be made for the Italians to accept accountability for commodities at ship side, such arrangements will be made provided adequate Allied supervision can be provided to prevent theft and unauthorized diversion. Upon approval by AII this Standard Operating Procedure will be effective with the Italian Army, Navy and Air

Upon approval by IML this Standing Operating Procedure will be effective within the Italian Army, Navy and Air Forces, and will be issued by the IML for action by the Italian Government and Allied commanders concerned.

13. It shall be the aim of IML to cause the Italians to organize a flexible Italian supply agency, so that it may receive, store, issue and account for commodities furnished by the Allied Governments; assure against loss, theft and deterioration, over-issue and the proper and timely distribution of these commodities; make the maximum use of Italian supplies and equipment; repair, renovate, remodel and reuse supplies and stores whether of Italian or Allied sources; and by central control to procure, store and distribute items of local production (olive oil, fruits, nuts, etc.).

SUBJECT: Issue Allied Supplies and Stores to Italian Armed Forces.

38.

20 May 1944.

1. These instructions pertain to the control of stores and supplies which have been or may be authorized for issue to the Italian Armed Forces by the Combined Chiefs of Staff on an Allied basis. They do not apply to stores or equipment which have been or may be authorized by any Allied Nation from its own stocks or depots to equip or maintain Italian units or services working directly for or on behalf of that Allied Nation. It does not apply to Air Force technical stores nor to Naval stores, except as these stores may be common user items furnished on an international basis. These instructions apply equally to the Italian Mainland, Sicily, Sardinia and Corsica.

2. The following categories have been authorized and are being furnished on an International basis: rations, medical supplies, clothing and fuel (POL). The United States has assumed primary responsibility for rations (Subsistence). The United Kingdom has assumed primary responsibility for medical supplies. Joint responsibility has been assumed for clothing. POL products will be furnished thru the normal existing petroleum state procedure.

3. The Army Sub Commissioner (short title MMIA) has been designated as the executive agency for the supervision, distribution, allocation and accounting for all the supplies and stores presently authorized by the CCS for issue to any or all of the Italian Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Forces). For all matters pertaining to these supplies and stores MMIA will operate directly under the supervisor of HQ. MMIA. No other agency has authority to issue or allocate any of these commodities to any of the Italian Armed Forces.

4. To comply with the directive of the CCS that the nation of ownership shall exercise controlling authority over issues the following will apply, subject to policy control by CAO AAI and DCAO AAI respectively, for British and United States commodities. The senior British Officer at HQ MMIA will supervise the supply of medical stores. The senior U.S. Officer at HQ MMIA will supervise the supply of subsistence. They will jointly supervise the supply of clothing recognizing the primary interest of the nation of ownership. POL will continue to be handled as prescribed in AFHQ Admin Memo No. 11 es.

5. At HQ MMIA the review and supervision of the supply system will be the responsibility of the CAO(Br) for stores of British ownership and the DCAO(US) for stores of U.S. ownership.

6. Issue of other common user stores and equipment except those which may be specifically authorized from National Depots to Italian Forces serving with National troops, will be controlled by MMIA. Replaceable salvaged shoes and clothing which are issued under the provisions of AFHQ Admin Memo No. 5, 7 Jan 44, will be allocated by MMIA to Italian Forces and will not be issued directly by US or British services without prior authority of MMIA. Where practicable such items after repair will be deposited in Italian Depots prior to issue. MMIA will report monthly to the Chief Accountant the receipt of such salvage clothing received from Allied services in the theatre.

7. MMIA will furnish to the Chief Accountant ACC monthly a statement (with signed receipts) of the total amount of each subject commodity accepted by the Italian Armed Forces. MMIA will cause such records to be maintained which will show all receipts.

Repairable salvaged shoes and clothing which are issued under the provisions of AFHQ Admin Memo No. 5, 7 Jan 44, will be allocated by MIA to Italian Forces and will not be issued directly by US or British services without prior authority of MIA. Where practicable such items after repair will be depoted in Italian Depots prior to issue. MIA will report monthly to the Chief Accountant the receipt of such salvage clothing received from Allied services in the theatre.

7. MIA will furnish to the Chief Accountant ACC monthly a statement (with signed receipts) of the total amount of each subject commodity accepted by the Italian Armed Forces. MIA will cause such records to be maintained which will show all receipts issues and stockages in Italian depots and will furnish such information with respect to those matters as may be required by provisioning British or US Services. MIA will assure that the minimum stockages are held in Italian formations and units.

8. MIA will not be responsible for pricing. The Chief Accountant ACC will keep quantitative records. The principles and procedure for pricing will be in accordance with instructions from the Combined Chiefs of Staff to ACC.

9. Scales of supply for all authorized issues have been prescribed. It is the definite responsibility of every Allied and Italian agency involved in the issue of any of the subject commodities to assure that the scale of supply is not exceeded. Over issues will be adjusted at the earliest opportunity by a subsequent withholding. Allied stocks issued from Allied Depots will not be repaid unless previous authority has been secured or unless the issue is of such an emergency nature that previous authority was not practicable to secure.

15. None of the supplies or areas may be issued except to those who are bona fide members of the Italian Armed Forces in every sense, and who are borne on the rosters of the Ministry concerned, and who are within the list of those who have been approved as effective by the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

11. The MIAA is authorized to deal direct with the Air Force and Naval Submarine Command and with all major agencies (Armies, separate Corps, Districts, Base Sections, Allied Garrison, Air Forces, Navies etc) to procure information as to strengths, organization and locations of Italian troops working for them or under their administrative control, and to procure information as to the transportation, issues and status of the commodities covered by these instructions. MIAA will bring to the attention of all irregularities which constitute a violation of the instructions of this or higher authority.

12. MIAA will submit for approval with the least practicable delay Standing Operating Procedure for the receipt, storage, issuing and accounting of all commodities whose control is the responsibility of MIAA. This procedure will contemplate that local port commanders will be responsible for the unimpeding of the supplies and stores earmarked for the Italian Armed Forces and for the movement of those commodities to base depots operated by the Italians. Italian assistance in identify commodities and for furnishing guards en route to Warehouse will be agreed at each port between MIAA and the port authority. Where arrangements can be made for the Italians to accept responsibility for commodities at ship side, such arrangements will be made provided adequate Allied supervision can be provided to prevent theft and unauthorized diversion. Upon approval by MIAA this Standard Operating Procedure will be effective within the Italian Army Navy and Air Forces, and will be issued by the MIAA for action by the Italian Government and Allied Commanders concerned.

SUBSISTENCE FOR ITALIAN MILITARY

1. The following policy relating to subsistence supplied the Italian military from Allied sources is announced for the information and guidance of all concerned:

a. Italian Military--Consists of recognized elements of the Army, Navy, and Air Force and includes the CARBINIERI insofar as the provisions of this policy pertain.

b. Accounting--A summary report of subsistence furnished co-belligerents will be submitted each month to the Chief Accountant of AMG in accordance with detailed instructions issued separately. The report will be supported by priced shipping tickets or other appropriate signed receipts.

c. Ration Scales--The two rations, hereinafter referred to as basic and combat, consist of the following components:

d. Issue of Rations--In order that several services of the Italian military may be issued rations on a consistent basis the applicable ration scale, dependent upon conditions of service, is prescribed below:

- (1) The combat scale will be furnished:
 - (a) Elements of the Italian Army operating in areas forward of Army rear boundaries.
 - (b) Elements of the Italian Air Force performing combat duties.
 - (c) Ships of the Italian Navy performing combat duties.
- (2) The basic ration will be furnished:
 - (a) Elements of the Italian Army in rear of Army rear boundaries.
 - (b) Elements of the Italian Air Force other than those prescribed in (1) (b) above.
 - (c) Ships in the Italian Navy other than those prescribed in (1) (c) above and all naval shore installations.

(3) Pending the arrival of supplies specially requisitioned on the basis of the above scales, issues will be based in principle thereon, but alternatives may be substituted where necessary in accordance with instructions issued through supply service channels.

(e) Prisoners of War--The above-listed ration scales are not applicable to Italian prisoners of war, who will be furnished subsistence in accordance with ration scales previously announced.

f. Civilians--The above listed ration scales are not applicable to civilians. Civilians will not be furnished subsistence from Allied and Italian military stocks without authority of this headquarters, except in emergencies when the D/DAO, AFHQ Advanced Administrative Echelon may authorize necessary issues.

g. Hospitals--Italian Army, Naval, and Air Forces personnel who are patients in British or United States Army hospitals will be furnished the normal hospital ration, including the hospital ration supplement issued to other patients in the hospitals.

h. Individuals, Liaison Officers, and Missions-- These instructions are not applicable to individuals, liaison groups, or missions which are on duty with or attached to United States Army or British Army organizations or headquarters where conditions make it more appropriate for such individuals, groups, or missions to be subsisted in regular United States Army or British Army messes.

i. Cigarettes or Tobacco--Will be furnished from Italian sources for those Italian combat and line of communications troops on duty with the Allied Armies. The scale of issue will be that of the Italian Army. 1090

j. Post Exchange or MAFI supplies--Are not authorized for issue or sale to the Italian military.

k. The above instructions will likewise apply, where authorized, to other co-belligerent military forces.

2. Separate instructions are being issued by this headquarters on the procedure for handling rations and clothing for the Italian military.

SUBJECT: Supply Organization - Italian Military.

TO : Acting Deputy President, Allied Control Commission.

1. The amount of supplies to be imported from Allied Sources for feeding and clothing the Italian military makes it essential that the Italian Army assume full responsibility, with certain minimum supervision by the Allied Armies, for implementing and maintaining their own supply system in ITALY, SICILY AND SARDINIA. Allied operations require full and continuous use of all British and United States service units. The lack of supply organization and limitations in transportation, particularly motor transportation under direct control of the Italian Army, are appreciated. Therefore, to provide the means necessary and without delay, it is desired that the Italian High Command be notified that the Italian Army (including Navy and Air Force) will be required to receive, warehouse, and distribute the clothing and rations furnished through Allied channels for use of the Italian military. It must be impressed on the Italian authorities that speed in organization is essential. The procedure which follows is announced as a basic policy under which the Italian military will be governed in this matter.

a. Responsibility.

- (1) The Italian military will accept responsibility for all imported supplies made available for its use by the Allied Forces at designated locations or at ship-side, as considered advisable by Allied authorities.
- (2) Acceptance will include positive assurance on the part of the Italian military that the supplies received will be issued on the scales announced and used for the purpose intended and that they will not be bartered, sold or otherwise disposed.

b. Transportation.

- (1) The Italian military will be responsible for arranging transportation, rail and motor, necessary for the movement of all supplies from the point of acceptance to warehouses and from warehouses to distribution or issue points.

(2) In ITALY, AFHQ Advanced Administrative Echelon will assist as necessary insofar as Allied transportation is available in meeting requirements incident to the movement of the supplies. In SICILY and SARDINIA, assistance will be given as necessary by the Allied Commander concerned.

c. Warehousing.

(1) Shelter sufficient to house properly all supplies received will be provided by the Italian military. The location of all points of storage will be reported to the Allied military commander concerned in each of the several areas.

(2) Supplies will be warehoused in accordance with recognized procedure, which will insure safety from theft, pilferage, weather, damage or loss from insects or vermin, and permit inventory and distribution with ease and efficiency. (See paragraph 1 f. in regard to supervision)

d. Distribution.

(1) Italian military will be responsible for the distribution and issue of clothing and rations on the scales and under the conditions contained in Appendix "A".

(2) In general, the scheme of distribution will be in accordance with the following:

(a) Rations and clothing for units or elements of the Italian Army operating with the Allied Armies in areas forward of Army rear boundaries will be moved from warehouses under Italian Army control to designated Allied Army supply points, either by the Italian Army or through the Allied movement organization. Further distribution of these supplies to Italian troops within Army areas will be in accordance with instructions issued by the Allied Army commanders.

(b) Rations and clothing for units or elements of the Italian Army operating with the Allied Armies in line of communication duties and other duties in rear of Army rear boundaries will be moved from warehouses under Italian Army control to designated supply points in accordance with mutually agreed arrangements by the base section or area commanders and Italian authorities.

(c) Rations and clothing required by Italian units other than those specified in (a) and (b) above will be distributed as arranged by the Italian Army.

e. Troop Requirements.

(1) The Italian Army will provide a sufficient organization of the proper type and strength and with proper equipment to perform efficiently and expeditiously the duties referred to above, based on the quantity of supplies to be imported from time to time for use of the Italian Army. This personnel will be selected from trained units of the Italian Army in order that the responsibilities charged herein may be properly performed.

(2) The Italian Army must complete at least a temporary organization in time to meet the initial shipment of supplies due on or about 30 January 1944. The organization may later be perfected as time is available.

f. Supervision.

(1) The Allied Armies will provide a minimum number of officers and enlisted men for supervisory purposes. The use, manner of operation, and maintenance of any motor transport provided by the Allied Armies will be actively supervised. Supervisory personnel will be authorized to inspect, require inventories to be made as necessary, and otherwise satisfy themselves that all supplies turned over to the Italian Army are received, warehoused, accounted for, and issued in accordance with the intent of this directive. 1007

2. Attached for your information as Appendix "B" are data pertaining to future importations of food and clothing based on interim policies announced by the Combined Chiefs of Staff.
