Subject: Salvaged Italian Army Clothing.

To : Colonel STAMONDS, M.M.I.A. Land Forces Sub Commission.

At the present time in SARDINIA the prisons, penal colonies and hospitals are in dire need of clothing, blankets, repair material etc. In the past a certain amount of salvaged material has been obtained from the Italian Military forces in SARDINIA but of late the supply has been practically nil. It would be very greatly appreciated if arrangements could be made whereby all spare salvaged material, irrespective of its condition, could be made available for the Civil authorities.

There are 6 Penal Colonies with 8600 prisoners, and 6 Judicial Prisons with 8000 prisoners making a total of 4600 prisoners.

In addition to this there are a number of hospitals where there is a great shortage of clothing, blankets etc. In the prisons and penal colonies a prisoner is lucky if he has more than one patched blanket as a covering at night. Other bedding is in a deplorable condition. Old useless blankets, tents, clothing material etc which may be useless for other purposes would be excellent for patching. Most of the clothing worn by the prisoners is already torn and tattered so that any salvaged military clothing etc would come in useful for patching and repair work. The prisons, colonies etc have repair shops where their clothes can be mended. If there are any worn but unserviceable uniforms, from a military point of view, these would be of untold value.

SUBJECT: Consolidation of Barrack Stores.

TO : Commanding General, Italian Forces in Sardinia.
Attention: Director of Commissary.

1. While we were in Sassari we inspected the barrack store depot there. At present this depot is housed in 5 widely separated buildings, none of which are very suitable. At other caserma depots which we have inspected the same condition exists.
2. We have been informed that orders are in effect which prohibits the issuing of barrack stores items, especially sheets, pillow cases, and barrack stores blankets to units at the present time. If this is correct, and it is expected that this policy will continue, it is suggested that a large warehouse in good condition be obtained, preferably in or near Cagliari. All barrack stores items with the possible exception of large pieces of furniture should then be consolidated in this new location.
3. This will facilitate accounting, repair operations and preparation for shipment to the mainland, if such shipment is ordered.
4. Request this office be informed as to the progress being made in consolidating present barrack store depots. Also request that this office be furnished an accurate inventory of barrack stores now held in all depots in Sardinia.

- 1) The Italian War Department has sent from Rome to Cagliari some dying material received from the A.C.C. for the purpose of dying ex American used clothing items available in Sardinia for the Italian armed Forces,
- 2) This is what it is about: green dying material ~~which~~ which ~~it~~ can be used very well for dying wool clothing but can also satisfactorily be used for cotton items.
- 3) The test made on ex American used woolen ~~pants~~ trousers was indeed very satisfactory.
- 4) The whole available amount of dying material (25 Kg.) is quite enough for dying the following amount of items:
 - about 2,000 woollen shirts
 - about 1,500 cotton items (~~and~~ coveralls, fatigue jackets and field jackets)
- 5) The dying work can be done by our own personnel employed in our plant at via Liguria 86.
- 6) It is necessary to give orders to the "Comando Militare della Sardegna" to turn in to the "Comitato Misto rifornimenti Militari" the dying material in question which is by the "Direzione di Commissariato del Comando Militare".

1. Reference your verbal request for 100 lbs. Green and 50 lbs. Blue Dye for use in dyeing Class "B" clothing for issue to Italian Forces.
2. Inquiries have developed no available supplies in Sardinia, Sicily, or North Africa. However, the Local Resources Section, Hq., A.A.I., Naples has advised as follows:
 - a. "50 lbs. Blue Dye can be obtained from: Cotecchia Pasquale, Piazza Tribunali, 46, Naples. Price 5,000 Lire per Kg. Each pound of Dye is sufficient for 40 lbs. of cloth.
 - b. Green Dye, in small packets, can be obtained from: De Caro, Piazza Dante, 91, Naples. Price 60 Lire per packet. Two packets are required to dye one kilo of cloth.
 - c. It is understood that Ord (BR) have made arrangements for the import of Green Dyes from the Middle East. It is suggested that the Service requiring these Dyes in Sardinia may instigate an enquiry to the Middle East to satisfy their requirements."


