Letter, this headquarters, file: 291.1, subject: "Marriage of Military Personnel", dated 19 February 1944, is rescinded and the following substituted therefore.

To be read +

1. a. Any officer or enlisted man of this organization contemplating marriage in this theater will submit application for permission to marry in triplicate to this headquarters at least ninety (90) days prior to the contemplated marriage date. The application will be in the form of an affidavit (See Appendix #1) and care will be taken to insure that the following information necessary for the preparation of the required certificates of marriage is correct.

- (1) The full christian and surnames of the parties.
- (2) The present address of each of the parties.
- (3) The nationality of each of the parties.
- (4) The place and date of birth of the officer or enlisted man.
- (5) The rank, serial number, assignment, and present duty being performed.
- (6) The full names of his or her (applicant's) father and the full maiden name of his or her mother, stating whether they are living or dead.
- (7) The domicile of the parties and their residence in the US.
- (8) The fact whether he or she was ever married before, and if

- (9) If divorced, full details concerning the divorce; if a widow or widower, full details concerning the first marriage and date of death of first husband or wife.
- (10) If naturalized, place and date of completion of naturalization.
- (11) The previous occupation of the applicant in the US.
- (12) Where one of the parties to the proposed marriage is not a citizen of the United States, there will also be included in the affidavit, the name and address of each parent of non-citizen prospective bride or groom or, if deceased, so state, and give the date and place of death. Present occupation of each parent, if living, or last occupation if deceased.
- (13) The affidavit (See Appendix #1 for proper form) will be sworn to before one of the persons designated in AW 114, MCM, 1928, as amended.
 - b. In addition to affidavit, if the applicant is under the age of twenty-one years, a letter signed by both parents or by one, if one parent is dead, consenting to the proposed marriage, is necessary. (Appendix #2).
 - c. Reports of serological tests for syphilis, for each party, performed by a US Army Medical officer will be submitted with application. (Appendix #3).
 - d. A letter of acquiescence, in triplicate, written in his or her own language, to the proposed marriage by the other party will accompany application. All copies will be signed. (Note: All statements written in a foreign language will be interpreted by a person competent and will accompany other party's letter of acquiescence submitted to this hq over the interpreter's signature.)
 - e. All applications submitted will contain a statement (Appendix #5) that applicant can and will comply with laws relating to marriage in the country where the marriage is to be celebrated except for troops located in North Africa; the latter will comply with Section II, Circular #4, NATOUSA which is quoted as follows for the information of all concerned:

"IX - SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR FRENCH NORTH AND WEST AFRICA

7. The French authorities have published an ordinance which recites: "Article I - Members of the United States Forces, including members of the Women's Army Corps, are eligible to marry in the territories governed by the French civil and military commander-in-chief, notwithstanding the existence of the provisions of the decree of 12 November 1938, upon presentation of the certificate referred to in Article II hereof."

"Article II - A certificate by the Commander of the United States Forces, or a person designated by him, showing the military and civil status, domicile and, in accordance with United States law, the eligibility of the person to be married will be accepted in lieu of copies of birth certificates or the notary's affidavit set forth in 70 and following articles of the Civil Code, as well as the "Certificat de Coutume" stating that the domiciliary matrimonial requirements are in order."

"Article III - The above regulations are the law."

8. The original of the written approval of marriage granted as herein provided, when presented to the officer of civil status, will permit that official to waive the requirements of French law, except as to publication of banns which may be waived by the Attorney for the Republic in the district where the marriage is to be celebrated. A true copy of said certificate of approval will be filed with the service or other appropriate record of the individual and remain a permanent part thereof.

9. The proposed wife or husband, if not covered by the ordinance quoted above, must comply with the laws of France with reference to marriage. The French law requires as a preliminary to the celebration of marriage (1) the consent of his parents if he is under the age of 21 years; (2) a birth certificate and indorsed thereon the parental consent, if the person is under 21 years of age; (3) or in lieu of the certificate of birth a certificate of identity procured from a Justice of the Peace, which certificate must be approved by the Tribunal of First Instance of the place where the marriage is to be celebrated; and (4) wait ten days during which banns are published."

2. Extreme caution will be exercised by unit commanders to see that applicants are familiar with instructions contained in War Department letter, file AG 291.1 (11 Sept 43) OB-S-SPCAL-M, subject: "Overseas Marriages of Military Personnel", dated 24 November 1943, and Circular #98, NATOUSA, cs, as amended, and that no application is approved until thorough investigation has been made by unit commanders approving the application.

3. Indorsements forwarding applications to this headquarters will be signed by the officer's or enlisted man's immediate commanding officer and will have incorporated therein, the following:

a. Approval or disapproval of proposed marriage.

b. Statement to the effect that enlisted man or officer has read ⁴⁴²⁴ and has been familiarized with Circular #4, NATOUSA, cs, and War Department Letter, file AG 291.1 (11 Sept 43) OB-S-SPCAL-M, subject: "Overseas Marriages of Military Personnel", dated 24 November 1943.

(1) All applications for permission to marry forwarded to this headquarters for approval in the case of an enlisted man will contain a statement from his immediate commanding officer giving the following information, which will be added as an inclosure to the application.

MALARIA CONTROL

1. In accordance with Peninsular Base Section directives, (See PBS Circulars #33 of 2 March 1944 and #53 of 30 April 1944), personnel of the 2675th Regiment will be governed by the following regulations as regards atabrine suppressive treatment beginning 1 May 1944:

a. Personnel who will not take atabrine: Those permanently located in an area bounded on the south by the Gulf of Naples and on the north by a line from Pozzuoli (10.0-46.7) to Trentola (15.0-64.0) to Aversa (17.5-64.0) to Frattamaggiore (23.5-60.0) and to the Gulf of Naples through Portici (28.4-46.0).

b. Personnel who will take atabrine:

(1) All personnel outside the zone described in a, above.

(2) Personnel, even though living in the zone described above, who have duties which routinely take them out of the area during the hours of darkness. This applies to many officers and men at Headquarters, Allied Control Commission who travel out of the Naples Area.

c. Method of Administration:

(1) Dosage. One tablet* (0.1 gram) daily, preferably at the evening meal, with a cupful of liquid.

(2) Supervision. The administration will be supervised by an officer or NCO when possible who will personally see that the drug is taken "on the spot".

(3) Sensitivity. Individuals found to be truly sensitive to atabrine may take in lieu thereof (0.6 gram) 10 grains quinine daily. This will be done upon written consent of the unit medical officer, who will critically estimate individual cases after a trial period on divided doses.

- a. Mosquito Bars. Sleeping under bednets will be required by all personnel. Nets are now available for all personnel. Mosquito nets will be properly adjusted and regularly inspected for tears.
- b. Repellent will be applied to all exposed portions of the body by all personnel at sundown and will be repeated at 3-hour intervals until bedtime. Repellent containing Indalone (See label on bottle) should be applied at one-hour intervals.
- c. Leggins will be worn by all sentries on duty at night and by all personnel outside of Metropolitan Area, Naples, whose duties require them to be outside of a screened tent or building after nightfall.
- d. Sleeves will be rolled down and buttoned at night.
- e. Spray killing of adult mosquitoes will be done in all sleeping quarters at dusk and before bedtime. Except in towns and villages, all civilian habitations, farmhouses, and stables within a one mile radius of each unit bivouac will be sprayed weekly with insecticide to eliminate infected adult mosquitoes.

(*Note: During the first week, one-half tablet (0.05 gram) will be taken daily.)

VEHICLES

1. A brief report of loss, damage, or destruction through enemy action, theft, accident, and salvage will be submitted to this headquarters within 48 hours by the responsible officer. Report will give time, place, serial number, kind of vehicle, and what occurred.

2. The following action will be required in addition:

a. Where the loss, damage, or destruction is by reason of enemy action, the property may be dropped on certificate with supporting papers of the responsible officer and no report of survey need be made (Par 7, Cir #76, NATOUSA, 43). This certificate will be forwarded in quadruplicate by a letter of transmittal to the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, ACC, for approval. If approved, a signed copy will be returned for Company files, to be used as a credit voucher (Par 7e, Cir #76, NATOUSA, 43). A replacement vehicle will be requisitioned by the Regimental Supply Officer, 2675th Regiment, ACC, supported by a copy of the certificate.

b. Where the loss or destruction is not by reason of enemy action, the responsible officer will either pay for the property or initiate a report of survey (Par 1 & 2, AR 35-6640 and Par 3, Cir #76, NATOUSA, 43). Failure to initiate a report of survey within thirty days, unless justified as being by reason of no fault or neglect, may result in a charge being made for the vehicle or property on the responsible officer's pay voucher (Par 3, AR 35-6640). It is the duty of the Company Commander to provide adequate clerical help to aid the responsible officer in drafting and initiating a report of survey. Before any officer initiates a report of survey, he should study the following regulations and forms: Cir #76, NATOUSA, 43; Cir #100, NATOUSA, 43; AR 35-6640; and WD AGO Form 15.

c. Where report of survey is initiated by the responsible officer, it will be referred along with all supporting papers, certificates and affidavits to Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, ACC. All papers to be prepared in quadruplicate (Par 8b, AR 35-6640).

d. In the case of enlisted men, where the loss or damage or destruction is not by reason of enemy action, a statement of charges will be preferred, or a report of survey will be initiated as in the case of an officer, by the Company Commander (Sec I, Cir #35, NATOUSA, 44).

3. In case of property worn out through fair wear and tear, the salvage receipt will be attached to the requisition and forwarded to this headquarters. The following certificate will be written on the requisition, and signed:

"I certify that the items listed hereon are replacements for like items which have been worn out through fair wear and tear while in the Public Service, and due to no fault or neglect on the part of any individual concerned."

4. To further clarify responsibilities of officers and to protect the Company Commander and the Regimental Commander, the following statement will be put on all Memorandum Receipts issuing vehicles to responsible American officers: (AR 35-6520)

"It is understood by signing this M/R I am personally responsible for the maintenance and condition of the above vehicle/s, I will submit all necessary reports called for by the Company Commander, I will not release the above vehicle/s to anyone without first clearing with the Company Commander, and that if I fail in any way to safe-guard the above U. S. Government property I am subject to disciplinary action as well as being financially responsible. I certify I have read and understand the above."

5. The following security measures for vehicles will be taken:

- a. No vehicle will be left unattended or non-immobilized at any time.
- b. Operators of motor vehicles will have in their possessions a Dispatch ticket at all times.
- c. The motor vehicle will not be driven by other than the driver in whose name the vehicle is dispatched.
- d. NO VEHICLE WILL BE DISPATCHED UNLESS IT HAS A LOCK AND CHAIN DEVICE ON THE STEERING WHEEL or equally effective locking device on the driver's controls.

I - DISCONTINUANCE OF RETURNS.

1. Effective 1 April 1944, the following returns will not be submitted to this headquarters:

a. Daily strength returns (Headquarters Command, AF, Form Number 1).

b. Monthly roster of enlisted men as required in letter, file: 200, subject: "Monthly Rosters of Enlisted Men", Rear Echelon, this headquarters, dated 15 February 1944.

c. Tabulation of strength by grades and ratings as required by paragraph 2a, Administrative Order No. 1, Rear Echelon, this headquarters, dated 1 December 1943.

d. Monthly roster as required by paragraph 7b, Administrative Order No. 1, Rear Echelon, this headquarters, dated 1 December 1943. This is not to be confused with the monthly machine records roster.

II - MACHINE RECORDS UNIT ROSTERS.

1. It will be the responsibility of the Commanding Officer to insure that the monthly machine records rosters are checked in such a manner as to reflect all changes within the organization. Company commanders will be held directly responsible for correctness of returns. Regimental headquarters will be able to derive from the rosters all information necessary for the maintenance of Regimental records.

2. It can be seen from this that the Regimental records must rely on correct machine records returns. Special emphasis will be placed on the following information for enlisted men:

a. Name and serial number.

b. Grade and arm of service. Service records of enlisted men of this Regiment will be thoroughly checked, as it has been determined by NATOUSA that enlisted men will retain the arm of service of their previous organization.

c. Main civilian occupation.

For Officers:

a. Name and serial number, grade and duty. Codes for this will be taken from AR 330-40 and 330-63.

b. Arm or service.

c. Date of rank for present grade will be printed in the column headed "Current commission or enlistment date". The importance of correctness of this entry is emphasized as promotion papers show the relative rank of the officer in relation to all other officers of like grade within the organization. An incorrect entry may cause an undue hardship on the officer concerned.

III - MORNING REPORTS.

1. Morning reports will be submitted daily to this headquarters in duplicate, using the fastest available means for transmission. Units at a distance from this station are reminded that morning reports are considered War Department essential airmail.

1. SOLDIER'S DEPOSIT BOOK AND REPORT OF DEPOSITS.—a. Preparation of deposit book.—The personnel officer will furnish to each depositor W.D., F.D. Form No. 33 (Soldier's Deposit Book) in which will be entered the full name, grade, and Army serial number of the depositor. For each deposit, the personnel officer will enter the place, date, and amount, in words and figures. If the deposit is made in cash, the disbursing officer will, by his signature in the Soldier's Deposit Book, receipt therefor. Where a deposit is effected by a pay roll deduction (see AR 35-2600), the receipt of the disbursing officer will not be required, but, in lieu thereof, in the space provided for the disbursing officer's signature, will be shown a complete reference to the voucher on which the amount was deducted, as follows: "Deducted on Voucher No. _____, _____, account of _____"

(Month & Year) (Name of Disbursing Officer)

The company or detachment commander will cause those enlisted persons who desire to make deposits, either in cash or by pay roll deductions, to give timely notice to that effect to the personnel officer, so that the proper entry in the Soldier's Deposit Book may be made in advance of cash deposit, W.D., F.D. Form No. 10, Revised (Soldier's Deposits—Collection Voucher), modified accordingly, may be prepared in advance and the necessary data may be at hand prior to the preparation of the pay roll. As soon as a cash deposit has been made, the personnel officer will attest the receipt entered by the disbursing officer or class B agent officer in the deposit book and will make the required entry of the deposit in the service record. Where a deposit is made by a deduction on the pay roll, the personnel officer will enter the voucher reference in the deposit book from information shown on the copy of the W.D., F.D. Form No. 10 returned by the disbursing officer (see b (2) (b) below), which entry will be attested by such personnel officer in the same manner as for cash deposits. The personnel officer will make the required entry in the Service Record and, where the deposit was made by pay roll deduction, the voucher reference will also be shown in the service record. In each case of a deposit by an enlisted person, the corresponding entries in the Soldier's Deposit Book and the Service Record will be compared and checked, and the entries in the Service Record will be initialed by the personnel officer making the entries.

- b. Report of deposits.
 - (1) Cash deposits.
 - (a) Preparation.—Personnel officers will prepare and sign W.D., F.D. Form No. 10 in quintuplicate. Each copy of the form will indicate the date the funds

were actually turned over to the disbursing officer. Care will be taken to assure that the date of the deposit shown on the Form No. 10 is in agreement with the date of deposit recorded on W.D., F.D. Form No. 33. Personnel officers will check the enlisted person's name, Army serial number, grade, organization, and amount with the Service Record in order to insure that the detailed information entered on the report of deposits is correctly stated.

(b) Disposition.--The original, duplicate, and triplicate copies will accompany the Soldier's Deposit Book when presented to the disbursing officer. The quadruplicate will be forwarded promptly by the personnel officer direct to Army Service Forces, Office of the Fiscal Director, Attention: Pay Allotments Division, The Pentagon, Washington 25, D. C., when deposit has been accomplished. The quintuplicate copy will be retained by the personnel officer.

(2) Deposits by pay roll deductions.

(a) Preparation.--Personnel officers will prepare and sign W.D., F.D. Form No. 10 in quintuplicate, leaving the date of deposit blank. The names of enlisted personnel making deposits will be entered thereon in the same order as they appear on the pay roll. Personnel officers will check the names, Army serial numbers, grades, and organizations with the Service Records of the individual enlisted persons and will check the amounts with the respective amounts shown to be deducted on the pay roll in order to insure that the detailed information entered on the report of deposits is correctly stated.

(b) Disposition.--The original, duplicate, triplicate, and quadruplicate copies will be forwarded to the disbursing officer with the pay roll on which the deductions are being made. The quintuplicate copy will be retained by the personnel officer. The disbursing officer will process the original, duplicate, and triplicate as a collection voucher (retaining the triplicate). The quadruplicate after the date of deposit and complete voucher reference to the pay roll involved have been noted thereon, will be returned to the personnel officer, who will promptly forward it to Army Service Forces, Office of the Fiscal Director, Attention: Pay Allotments Division, The Pentagon, Washington 25, D.C.

(3) Separate W.D., F.D. Forms No. 10.--Deposits made in cash will not be listed on the same W.D., F.D. Form No. 10 on which deposits made by pay roll deductions are listed.

2. DISPOSITION OF SOLDIER'S DEPOSIT BOOK.--a. Upon discharge (other than dishonorable) or retirement.--If the service record shows that the enlisted person has deposits, his deposit book will be obtained from him and the entries therein checked with the entries on the Service Record, care being taken to see that the date, amount, and name of the disbursing officer correspond in case of each deposit. The book will then be forwarded to the disbursing officer with the final payment voucher (Final Statement or Final Payment Roll). The disbur-

sing officer will take up the deposit book, write or stamp across the entry of each deposit the word "Paid", with date of payment, and file it with the final payment voucher. If the enlisted person claims to have lost his deposit book, the personnel officer will cause his affidavit to that effect to be taken and attached to the final payment voucher. The affidavit must state the fact of, and the circumstances attending, the loss of deposit book and state affirmatively that the enlisted person has not sold nor assigned it together with a statement as to whether or not any part of the deposit has been withdrawn, and, if so, the amount thereof.

b. When discharged on W.D., A.G.O. Form No. 57 (Dishonorable Discharge from the Army of the United States).

- (1) Without confinement.--If the enlisted person has deposits, action will be taken as set forth in a above unless his dishonorable discharge is on account of conviction of the charge of desertion by reason of which his deposits are forfeited.
- (2) With confinement.--If the enlisted person has deposits, action will be taken as directed in AR 345-475, unless the discharge is a result of a finding of guilty under a charge of desertion, in which case deposits are forfeited.

c. In case of death.--A Soldier's Deposit Book found among the effects of a deceased enlisted person will be turned over to the personnel officer to be forwarded to the disbursing officer with the final payment voucher.

d. When reported missing, missing in action, captured, or interned.--When an enlisted person is reported missing, missing in action, captured, or interned, his deposit book, if found among his effects, or if in the possession of the personnel officer, will be forwarded to The Adjutant General with the Service Record as prescribed in AR 345-125.

3. TRANSFER, PLEDGE, OR SALE OF DEPOSIT BOOK.--The transfer, pledge, or sale of a deposit book is prohibited. Enlisted persons should be informed of the importance of preserving deposit books as the only certain means of insuring prompt payment of deposits upon discharge.

4. IF PAYMENT OF DEPOSITS NOT MADE ON FINAL PAYMENT VOUCHER.--If for any reason deposits, except those forfeited by desertion, are not paid on final payment voucher the enlisted person should forward his deposit book or the affidavit referred to in paragraph 2a to the Fiscal Director and request payment.

5. LOST DEPOSIT BOOK.--When an enlisted person loses his deposit book, and there remains sufficient time prior to the termination of his enlistment, he may make application to the Fiscal Director, through his company or detachment commander, for a deposit book to replace the one lost. The application must be accompanied by an affidavit as indicated in the last sentence of paragraph 2a. The personnel officer when forwarding the application will state the name, grade, organization, and Army serial number of the depositor, together with date, place, amount, and names of disbursing officers who received the deposits as shown by entries in the Service Record.

6. REPAYMENTS PRIOR TO SEPARATION FROM SERVICE.--Repayments prior to separation from service may be made to enlisted personnel under the provisions of AR 35-2600. See also AR 345-125. (AG 244 (22 May 44))

SOLDIERS' DEPOSITS

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1. Statutory provisions.--a. Deposits authorized.-- Any enlisted man of the Army may deposit his savings, in sums not less than \$5, with any Army paymaster (now disbursing officer), who shall furnish him a deposit book, in which shall be entered the name of the paymaster (now disbursing officer) and of the soldier, and the amount, date, and place of such deposit. Any amount heretofore or hereafter so deposited shall be held during such period of his service as may be prescribed by the Secretary of War; shall be accounted for in the same manner as other public funds; shall be deposited in the Treasury of the United States and kept as a separate fund, known as pay of the Army deposit fund, repayment of which to the enlisted man, or to his heirs or representatives, shall be made out of the fund created by said deposits; shall not be subject to forfeiture by sentence of court-martial, but shall be forfeited by desertion; and shall be exempt from liability for such soldier's debt: Provided, That the Government shall be liable for the amount deposited to the person so depositing the same. See U.S. 1305, as amended by act 12 June 1906 (34 Stat. 246), as further amended by sec. 1, act 18 December 1942 (56 Stat. 1057; 10 U.S.C. 906; M.I. 1939, Sup. II. sec. 1485).

5

b. Not subject to indebtedness.--* * * Provided, That no part of section 1305 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by the Act of June 12, 1906 (34 Stat. 246) of the Act of February 9, 1889 (25 Stat. 657), or of the Act of June 29, 1906 (34 Stat. 579), or of any other law, shall be so construed as to authorize the recovery in any manner of any indebtedness to the United States or to any of its instrumentalities from either the amounts deposited with the Government pursuant to law by any depositor in the military or naval service, or from the interest thereon. Act 28 February 1931 (46 Stat. 1448; 10 U.S.C. 906a; M.I., 1939, sec. 1485).

c. Interest on deposits.-- For any sums not less than \$5 so deposited for the period of six months, or longer, the soldier, on his final discharge or at such time or time prior thereto as may be prescribed by the Secretary of War, shall be paid interest at the rate of 4 per centum per annum. R.S. 1306, as amended by act 3 Mar 1883 (22 Stat. 456); further amended by sec. 2, act 18 December 1942 (56 Stat. 1058; 10 U.S.C. 907; M.I. 1939, Sup II, sec. 1485). See sec. 3, act 18 December 1942 (56 Stat. 1058).

d. Limitations.-- The amendments herein provided (see a and c above) shall be effective during the present war and for a period of one year thereafter.

e. Regulations.-- The system of deposits herein established shall be carried into execution under such regulations as may be established by the Secretary of War. R.S. 1307 (10 U.S.C. 908; M.L. 1939, sec 1485).

2. Deposits, how made.--a. Amounts.-- An enlisted person not on the retired list may deposit his savings with any disbursing officer in even dollars and in sums of not less than \$5 each, the same to remain so deposited until repayment is made as provided in paragraph 3, or until the account is settled in case of a deceased enlisted person. When deposits are made in foreign currency, the amount of such deposits will be limited to such amounts that upon conversion to United States currency they will equal even dollars and a minimum of \$5 each. Only one deposit may be made on a given day.

b. Deposit books.-- Each Soldier's Deposit Book (W.D., F.D. Form No. 33) will bear the name, grade, Army Serial number, and organization of the depositor, and will show place, date, and amount of each deposit in words and figures. The entries will be attested by the personnel officer.

c. Procedure.

(1) Cash deposits.-- The disbursing officer or class B agent officer will furnish a receipt for each deposit made in cash, by signature in the Soldier's Deposit Book.

(2) Deposits by pay roll deductions.-- Deposits may be affected by deductions on monthly or supplemental pay rolls, by stating, "Deduct for deposit \$ _____," in remarks under the names of the respective enlisted personnel. W.D., F.D. Form No. 10, Revised (Soldier's Deposits--Collection Voucher), prepared in quintuplicate by the personnel officer, will be submitted with the pay roll to the disbursing officer. After payment of the pay roll, the disbursing officer will enter in the appropriate blank spaces on all copies of Form No. 10 the date of deposit and voucher reference to the pay roll as follows: "Deducted on Voucher No. _____, _____, account of _____" and return the quadruplicate

copy to the personnel officer. The date of deposit will be the date of actual payment. Receipt of the disbursing officer in the deposit book will not be accomplished, but in lieu thereof there will be entered by the personnel officer the complete voucher reference to the pay roll on which the deposit was deducted, as shown on the copy of Form No. 10. See AR 345-75.

d. Reports to the Fiscal Director, Army Service Forces.-- See AR 345-75.

e. Records and reports of disbursing officers and agent officers.

(1) Disbursing officers.-- The procedure to be followed by disbursing officers with respect to their records and reports will be as prescribed by the Fiscal Director Army Service Forces.

(2) Agent officers.-- Agent officers will make such prompt returns and reports to their principals of all cash deposits received to include the 20th of any month and, when practicable, of those received thereafter as will enable the principals to include such deposits in their accounts for the month in which the deposits are made. When it is impracticable for return of deposits received after the 20th to reach the principals before the closing of their accounts for the current month, such deposits may be taken up by them in their accounts for the following month, showing the actual date the deposit was received by the agent.

- (3) Liability of disbursing officers.-- A disbursing officer who fails to take up on his account current a deposit of an enlisted person is liable for the amount of such deposit, together with interest on same from the date of deposit to the date of the enlisted person's discharge. See 15 Comp. Dec 534.
3. Repayment on discharge, retirement, or pursuant to specific authority.--
- a. When repayment may be made.-- Deposits may be withdrawn by an enlisted person under the following conditions:
- (1) Upon discharge or retirement from the service, unless discharge results from the act of desertion of which the enlisted person has been duly convicted.
 - (2) Upon transfer to an inactive status in any of the reserve components of the Army.
 - (3) At any other time, when on duty within the continental limits of the United States, upon the approval of his regimental or separate battalion commander, when that officer considers that partial or complete withdrawal is necessary for liquidating important financial or contractual obligations incurred by the enlisted person in expectation of being discharged at the normal expiration of his service, or when the enlisted person is faced with an unforeseen emergency requiring the immediate use of his deposits. See paragraph 5.
 - (4) At any time when on duty outside the continental limits of the United States, upon approval of his regimental or separate battalion commander.

b. Form of voucher.-- Repayments made under the provisions of a (3) and (4) above will be vouchered on WD Form No. 366, Revised (Pay Roll (For Enlisted Men)), modified to include the date and amount of each deposit being repaid.

c. Partial repayments.-- Partial repayments under the provisions of a (3) and (4) above will always be made in an amount equal to any one deposit or the sum of two or more deposits, and will be accompanied by the enlisted person's deposit book. The personnel officer will execute the following certificate with appropriate modifications on the voucher covering partial repayments:

I certify that _____ has sufficient funds to his
(Name of enlisted person)

credit as deposits to cover the partial repayment stated herein.

The disbursing officer, upon payment, will completely "red line" all entries relating to each deposit repaid, and will enter and initial the following notation:

Repaid, act 18 December 1942 (voucher reference).

In the second column in the enlisted person's deposit book headed "Amount in dollars," The disbursing officer will then return the deposit book to the personnel officer, who will red line the corresponding deposit entries in the service record, note and initial fact of repayment.

d. Preparation of final payment vouchers.-- See AR 345-475.

e. Deposit book.-- See AR 345.75.

4. Payment of accounts of deserters, dishonorably discharged enlisted person, etc.-- See AR 35-248C.

5. Interest.--a. General.-- For any sums not less than \$5 deposited for a period of 6 months or longer, the enlisted person, upon repayment, will be paid interest at the rate of 4 per cent per annum on the amount repaid to date of repayment. Accrued interest will be paid at the same time that deposits are repaid, whether prior to or at date of final separation from the service.

b. Period during which interest accrues.

- (1) In computing interest the day of deposit should be excluded on the day of discharge or retirement should be included. See 16 Comp. Dec 30.
- (2) An enlisted person is entitled to interest on deposits to include date of discharge or retirement, but interest does not accrue on amounts which have been on deposit less than 6 months at date of discharge or retirement. See 8 Comp. Dec. 739.
- (3) An enlisted person is not entitled to interest after date of dishonorable discharge, although discharge certificate, by reason of his confinement, was not delivered to him personally, but to the commanding officer to be held pending release from confinement. See Dig. Op. JAG, 1901, par. 1052.
- (4) An enlisted person sentenced to confinement for a period extending beyond the date his term of enlistment would otherwise expire is entitled to interest on his deposits to the date of his discharge. MS. Comp. Dec., 23 February 1909.
- (5) Failure to present final payment vouchers leaves the money without interest until it is drawn and again deposited.

6. Redeposit on reenlistment.-- A discharged enlisted person who desires that, after reenlistment, all or a part of the money (including deposits and interest thereon) due him on discharge be deposited under the provisions of paragraph 2 must furnish to the disbursing officer who makes payment on his final payment voucher a written order requesting that such part of the amount due thereon, as he may desire so deposited, be transferred to his new account. The disbursing officer will file this order with the paid final payment voucher as authority for this disposition of the money due the enlisted person. The amount so deposited will be treated as if actually paid in cash and then deposited in cash. The written order for deposit of an amount due on final payment vouchers will be accepted as a valid acknowledgment of receipt of payment. See 14 Comp. Dec. 667.

7. Action on death of enlisted person.-- On the death of an enlisted person, W.D., F.D. Form No. 33 (Soldier's Deposit Book) will be attached to the final payment voucher.

8. Forfeiture of deposits and interest.-- Both deposits and interest will be forfeited by desertion, but forfeiture of them cannot be imposed by sentence of a court-martial. A deposit made during a fraudulent enlistment is not forfeited except by desertion after the deposit was made.

9. Application to indebtedness.--a. Though deposits and interest are exempt from liability for debts they may be applied to the satisfaction of indebtedness to the Government, if authorized by the enlisted person.

b. The amount of an enlisted person's indebtedness at date of desertion may not be offset against his deposits. The amounts of such deposits are forfeited at desertion. See AR 35-2480. (A.G. 244 (22 May 44).)

SUBJECT: Mess Requirements.

TO : Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission
(Provisional), APO 394, U. S. Army.

The following memorandum should be distributed to all officers and enlisted men charged with operation of messes. It should be prominently displayed in the kitchens in both the English and Italian languages.

1. Personnel.

a. All civilian personnel employed as food handlers will have an initial blood Wasserman examination and stool examination prior to employment. If these have not been performed, arrangements must be made immediately with this office.

b. All food handlers, military and civilian, must have a bi-monthly physical examination and a certifying roster prominently posted in each mess. Arrangements can be made with this office for a suitable time for inspection of personnel.

c. Daily inspection of all kitchen personnel as to personal cleanliness and proper hand disinfection is the responsibility of the mess officer.

2. Quarters.

a. Due to lack of sufficient screening for messes and dining rooms, the following procedure will be adopted for control of flies:

(1) Closing of all windows and doors of mess halls and using an aerosol (pyrethrum) bomb spray about one-half hour before each meal.

3. Food and Mess Sanitation.

a. Ample supply of soap and hot water must be maintained for washing of all kitchen utensils. Where supplies of boiling water for sterilization of dishes are limited, such as in hotels, restaurants, etc., after washing in hot soapy water, dishes may be immersed in a solution of Germicidal Rinse Compound (QM Item 51-C-1606; the contents of one package dissolved in a GI can containing twenty-five gallons of water) for not less than thirty seconds; or in a hypochlorite solution containing four table-¹⁰spoonsfull of HTH, Perchloron or similar product per GI can of water, for not less than thirty seconds.

b. Foods.

(1) Food supplies will be stored, issued, handled, prepared, and served in a sanitary manner. They will be protected from heat, sun, dirt, insects, rodents, and other damaging agents.

Mess Requirements (Continued)

(2) Local milk, cream, ice cream, and other dairy products will not be consumed, nor will they be purchased from street vendors. All milk products such as ice cream must be obtained from installations that have met the requirements of the Medical Department of the U. S. Army and have a certificate of inspection prominently displayed.

(3) Meat and other foods of animal origin have received the necessary inspection before issue to troops by the Quartermaster. Due to sewage pollution of sea water, raw shellfish, snails, and mollusks will not be eaten. The use of meat or meat products which are to be consumed more than four hours after preparation or opening of cans is strictly forbidden. Cooked foods will not be held over from one meal to another.

(4) Fresh fruits and vegetables which are to be eaten raw will be carefully washed, then placed in chlorinated water for thirty minutes, and then rinsed in clear water. The chlorinated water should contain the contents of one package of the Germicidal Rinse Compound per twelve gallons of water, or one teaspoonful of HTH, Perchloron, or similar product per gallon of water. Alternatively, fruit may be dipped for a few seconds in boiling water. Some human fecal fertilization of the soil is employed by farmers in this part of Italy.

(5) Fresh fruits and vegetables will be purchased only by the Quartermaster, PBS.

(a) The following vegetables will be cooked before they are eaten:

Turnips	Cauliflower	Asparagus	Green and Yellow Beans
Artichokes	Spinach	Peas	Green and Red Peppers
Squash	Broccoli	Potatoes	

(b) The following vegetables may be eaten raw only after being thoroughly washed and peeled:

Onions	Radishes	Carrots	Cucumbers
--------	----------	---------	-----------

(c) Tomatoes, fruits, separate leaves of lettuce or cabbage, and stalks of celery may be served raw provided they are thoroughly washed and then soaked for thirty minutes in a solution containing one package of Germicidal Rinse or four mess kit spoonfuls of high test hypochlorite (HTH or Perchloron) per twelve or fifteen gallons of water (one-half GI can). After this soaking, excess chlorine odor can be removed from fruits and vegetables by rinsing with plain drinking water.

4. Disposal of Wastes.

a. A two percent solution of creosol will be kept in a suitable container in each latrine and all food handlers and kitchen employees instructed in its proper use.

b. Garbage disposal will depend upon facilities available in each locality. All garbage must be properly covered pending its removal from the kitchen areas.

I - PERSONNEL.

1. All civilian personnel employed as food handlers will have an initial blood Wasserman examination and stool examination prior to employment. If these have not been performed, arrangements must be made immediately with the Surgeon, this Regiment.

2. All food handlers, military and civilian, must have a bi-monthly physical examination and a certifying roster prominently posted in each mess. Arrangements can be made with the Regimental Surgeon for a suitable time for the inspection of personnel.

3. Daily inspection of all kitchen personnel as to personal cleanliness and proper hand disinfection is the responsibility of the mess officer.

II - QUARTERS.

1. Immediate steps should be taken to provide proper screening for kitchens and dining rooms.

III - FOOD AND MESS SANITATION.

1. Dishes, mess kits, and utensils:

a. Mess kits will be dipped in one can of boiling water before eating and will be washed in one can of hot, soapy water and rinsed in two cans of boiling, clear water after eating. Mess gear will not be scrubbed or polished with dirt or sand.

b. Kitchen utensils and other dishes will be washed in hot, soapy water, sterilized in boiling water, and air dried. Where supplies of boiling water for sterilization of dishes are limited, such as in hotels, restaurants, etc., after washing in hot soapy water, dishes may be immersed in a solution of Germicidal Pine Compound (QM Item 51-C-1606; the contents of one package dissolved in a G.I. can containing twenty five gallons of water) for not less than thirty seconds; or in a hypo-

chlorite solution containing four tablespoonsfull of HTH, Perchloron or similar product per G.I. can of water, for not less than thirty seconds.

2. Foods:

a. Food supplies will be stored, issued, handled, prepared, and served in a sanitary manner. They will be protected from heat, sun, dirt, insects, rodents, and other damaging agents.

b. Local milk, cream, ice cream, and other dairy products will not be consumed, nor will they be purchased from street vendors.

c. Meats and other foods of animal origin will receive veterinary inspection and approval before issue to troops. Due to sewage pollution of sea water, raw shellfish, snails, and mollusks will not be eaten. The use of meat or meat products which are to be consumed more than four hours after preparation or opening of cans is strictly forbidden. Cooked foods will not be held over from one meal to another.

d. Fresh fruits and vegetables which are to be eaten raw will be carefully washed, then placed in chlorinated water for thirty minutes, and then rinsed in clear water. The chlorinated water should contain the contents of one package of the Germicidal Rinse Compound per twelve gallons of water, or one teaspoonful of HTH, Perchloron, or similar product per gallon of water. Alternatively, fruit may be dipped for a few seconds in boiling water. Some human fecal fertilization of the soil is employed by farmers in this part of Italy.

e. Fresh fruits and vegetables will be purchased only by the quartermaster, PBS.

(1) The following vegetables will be cooked before they are eaten:

(2) The following vegetables may be eaten raw only after being thoroughly washed and peeled:

(3) Tomatoes, fruits, separate leaves of lettuce or cabbage, and stalks of celery may be served raw provided they are thoroughly washed and then soaked for 30 minutes in a solution containing one package of Germicidal Rinse or four mess kit spoonfuls of high test hypochlorite (HTH or Perchloron) per twelve to fifteen gallons of water (one-half G.I. can). After this soaking, excess chlorine odor can be removed from fruits and vegetables by rinsing with plain drinking water.

IV - DISPOSAL OF WASTES.

1. Human Excreta.

a. Units within buildings and in city limits where the city sewers are in function will use the available facilities for waste disposal.

b. A 2% solution of creosol will be kept in a suitable container in each latrine for the dipping of hands before leaving the latrine.

2. Garbage.

a. Liquid garbage will be dumped in soakage pits or into the sewage system if it is available.

b. Tin cans will be washed out so that no particles of food remain inside and stored inside a fly-proof box with a tightly fitting lid. A can of water will be placed beside such a box for the purpose of washing the cans.

c. The tin cans, together with waste paper, cardboard, glass bottles, and wooden boxes will be sent to the QM Salvage Dump #555, located just southwest of the Nostra Fairgrounds, near Bagnoli.

d. Cooking fats and greases will be saved for collection by a QM salvage contractor. Each unit commander is responsible for notification to the Quartermaster as to the location of the grease collecting point. (This applies to the Naples area only, for the present).

e. The remaining garbage and rubbish will be disposed of - in the Naples area - by contacting the Quartermaster who will arrange for its pick-up and disposal to civilians by contract. Outside the Naples area, the remaining garbage and rubbish may be incinerated, buried, hauled to city dumps, or disposed of to civilians in accordance with AR 30-2175.

SUBJECT: Rotation of Military Personnel.

TO : All Company Commanders, this Regiment.

1. Reference is made to Circular #56 as supplemented by Circular #75, both of Hq NATOUSA, cs.

2. The procedure for rotation insofar as this Regiment is concerned is as follows:

a. Company commanders may submit, so as to reach this headquarters by the 10th of the month, the names of those men who have had 18 months' continuous overseas service, total not to exceed one percent of the assigned and attached strength of the unit as of the day of submission. This report will include the following:

- (1) For Field Officers: A separate letter will be submitted for each such officer giving the following information: name, rank, ASN, arm or service, present duty in detail, military background and experience, description of civilian occupation, age, race, organization (parent and sub unit), limited or general assignment, whether qualified for promotion, manner of performance, date of present rank, and whether or not vacancy can be filled by limited assignment personnel. (Inclosure to Appendix "A").
- (2) For Officers below Field Grade including Warrant Officers, exclusive of Army Mine Planter Service. - See Appendix "A".
- (3) For Enlisted Personnel. - See Appendix "B".

b. Wounds received as a result of combat, combat service and decorations will be noted.

c. It will be noted that the Regimental percentage, upon consolidation, is one-half of one percent, and company commanders are hereby advised that names of individuals submitted to this headquarters will not in entirety be approved. It is also possible that no one from an organization will be approved for rotation.

(This class becomes eligible and may be rotated when such individuals have had at least twelve months' continuous overseas service, of which six months must have been accumulated continuous service from the date of violation, exclusive of the time required to be made good.)

4. Promotions are not authorized for personnel after recommendation for rotation.

TO : All Concerned.

1. The following consolidation of errors have been noted in the organizational morning reports submitted to this Regiment for the period of 19 June 1944 to 24 June 1944.
2. It is desired that all commanders study this letter and acquaint the personnel concerned with its contents. Company commanders will instigate the policy within their organizations to check personally the morning report each day to see that it is correct.
3. AR 345-400 has been prepared by the Army as a guide and is to be used for reference when any question is raised. Letters of correction originating from this headquarters indicate that commanding officers who certify to the correctness of the morning report by their signature are not complying with AR 345-400.
4. The following errors have been noted:
 - a. Par 26, AR 345-400 is not being complied with when reporting personnel sick in hospital. The above authority directs that on all hospital cases the duty status of the individual and the hospital where hospitalized be stated at all times. If this is unknown at the time, so state and then correct the remark when it is known.
 - b. Section III, Circular #64, Hq NATOUSA, dated 5 May 1944 has not been followed in designating general hospitals as (US) or (BR).
 - c. Par 24, AR 345-400 states that promotions or appointments to Private First Class will be reported to the Machine Records Unit immediately upon receipt of an order announcing the promotions. Copies of company orders appointing Privates First Class have been received, but no notation indicated in the morning report until instructed to do so by pertinent letters from this headquarters. 4402
 - d. In many instances the remarks in the Remarks Section do not substantiate changes made in the strength section figures.
 - e. Authorized abbreviations are not being used. Paragraph 5, AR 345-400, specifically states that only those authorized by AR 850-150 will be used.
 - f. In reporting officers' duty only one principal duty will be

g. When a copy of any SO is attached to the Morning Report, all paragraphs and names not applicable to a group remark on the Morning Report will be lined out in compliance with paragraph 10, AR 345-400.

i. The term "Region" will not be used in the morning report as the regions are composed of American and British personnel. Companies were organized to administer the American personnel of a Region and a transfer of an individual will be between companies.

j. Upon moving from one location to another, many organizations are omitting the proper remark as directed in paragraph 28, AR 345-400, to be entered under "Record of Events".

k. When personnel report to your headquarters for TD they should be reported by ASN, name, branch of service and rank, as "On TD fr (atchd to this orgn for rat & qrs only) per Par SO Hq eff _____," and carried in Part III of the Rations Section and NOT carried in the Strength Section figures as attached from other organization.

SUBJECT: Application of Insect Repellent.

TO : All Unit Commanders, this Regiment.

1. A report from the Regimental Surgeon indicates that officers and enlisted men, upon being ordered to proceed to various points throughout Italy, are proceeding without the use of insect repellent.

2. Since these convoys are of necessity making repeated stops in malaria-infested regions, all Company Commanders will stress the necessity for proper preventive action, and will see that sufficient quantities of mosquito repellent are not only supplied the individuals, but that instructions are issued as to its application. American officers proceeding on the convoy will make sure that upon a convoy stop at night all enlisted men can apply sufficient repellent to cover the next part of the journey.

3. Insofar as the application is concerned, repellent will be applied to all exposed portions of the body by all personnel at sundown and will be repeated at 3-hour intervals. Repellent containing Indalone (see label on bottle) should be applied at one-hour intervals.

SUBJECT: Reduction of Non-Commissioned Officers.

TO : All Unit Commanders.

1. Attention is directed to Par 15, Sec II, AR 615-5, which outlines the procedure to be followed in the reduction of non-commissioned officers for misconduct or inefficiency. Subparagraph a is quoted below:

"Misconduct or inefficiency. - a. General. - The misconduct or inefficiency believed to make termination of appointment necessary will be reported by the immediate commanding officer of the non-commissioned officer concerned through military channels to the appointing authority, who will carefully and expeditiously examine into the facts in the case, through a board of officers, or by other similar methods if he so elects, to determine the facts in connection with the alleged inefficiency or misconduct and whether or not there is just cause for the termination of the appointment."

2. Where a reduction is requested, unit commanders will supply particulars on alleged misconduct or inefficiency to the Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment, Allied Control Commission, on form inclosed and request that enlisted man be brought before a board of officers under the provisions of above-mentioned Army Regulation.

3. In the case of privates, first class, Par 13 c (1), Sec II, AR 615-5, provides that ".....the authority competent to appoint may terminate an appointment in the grade of private, first class, when in his opinion such action is in the best interests of the service....."

4. It is the obligation of unit commanders to exercise the above provisions for the replacement of incompetents by those meriting appointment, in order that the efficiency of the Allied Control Commission may be maintained upon a high standard of operation. 4391
