MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Trip to Ajaccio, Corsica on 19 March 1944

1. Left Elmas Airdrome with Col F. L. Simmons and Col J. P. Doyle on 19 March at 1000. Arrived Ajaccio airport 1100.
2. Arrived at Colonel Ratay's headquarters 1140. Made an appointment to see Brig Gen Lazzarini, commanding Italian troops in Corsica, for 1200.
3. Arrived at Gen Lazzarini's headquarters with Col Simmons, Col Doyle, Lieut Col James, G-3 NORBS. The following points were discussed:
 - a. The Italians had 167,000 rounds of ammunition, Beretta, cal 9mm. Gen Lazzarini stated that if he could obtain a letter from NORBS addressed to the French authorities permitting the Italians to draw the ammunition in question from the dumps, he could have all the ammunition at Bonifacio within a period of one week. Lieut Col James stated that he would get approval for General Lazzarini.
 - b. Gen Lazzarini stated that he would like to have 5000 of his men clothed in American uniforms. He was in accord with the proposal of sending about 2500 uniforms to Sardinia to be repaired.
 - c. On the question of sending cheese to Corsica from Sardinia in order to supplement the ration, General Lazzarini estimated that 50 kilos of cheese per day would suffice.
- Left Italian Headquarters at 1240.
4. Left Ajaccio airport 1520. Arrived Elmas Airdrome 1620.

MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Personnel
TO : Col. Simmons

Attached hereto is listing of all personnel of Italian Army in Corsica as of 6 March 1944, together with notation of how they are rationed.

Gen Lazzarini claims that Italians working with French are being fed very little. He would like to supplement that mess (about 1200) with cheese.

Gen Lazzarini would like to retain the clothing of the personnel of foreign origin who now have arrived or will arrive in Corsica as labor companies, and for whom it is contemplated Allied clothing will be issued. He has no facilities to repair this clothing other than the tailor kits in the individual organization. He claims the uniforms of the other Italian troops are in very bad condition. In my opinion the repairing of the clothing in Sardinia would result in a larger proportion of salvage. I recommend this matter be submitted to the Italian Command in Sardinia for decision.

SUBJECT: Motor Transport in Corsica

TO : Col. Simonds

As of 17 March 1944, the Italian Army in Corsica, had under its control, the following motor vehicles:

Definite information as to the number of above vehicles which can be put in good running order was unobtainable as the officer in charge of the vehicles, Lt. Tommasi, claims he has not yet had time to inspect them, his mobile repair unit having moved into the present location only about two weeks ago. The best estimates made appear in parenthesis in the above list. Lt. Tommasi claimed that no repair materials are on hand, the French having taken all repair materials on the island. The above vehicles have been earmarked for shipment to Sardinia. The claimed reason why these vehicles are so poor is that the French authorities after inspecting all of the Italian vehicles, selected the best for themselves.

In addition to the above vehicles the Italians have under their control at present, and available for their use, but earmarked for transfer to the French, the following vehicles:

All of these vehicles are claimed to be in good running order.

The mobile workshop unit is located at Sauro about 20 miles from Ajaccio. At present it is composed of the workshop unit, wrecker and trailer, 3 officers, 10 mechanics, and 80 others.

Submitted herewith is a list marked 1, submitted by Capt. Vacchi, Acting Chief of Staff for General Luzzarini, purporting to show the disposition of motor vehicles. It will be noted that discrepancies exist between the first column "Situazione Iniziale" and the sum of the remaining columns. These discrepancies cannot be reconciled and when pressed for an answer, the Captain could only shrug and say the initial figures were based on reports received and no explanation could be given. The figures in ink were entered to bring the situation up to 17 March 1944.
