12. Conditions of animals : Of 16 horses I inspected, 6 are in awful condition and must not be used for at least a month. I advised to keep them on grass to improve the feeding, as the ration is not sufficient for ~~the~~ horses of that size. I also recommended to repair the horse-boxes, being in very bad condition with sharp stones sticking out preventing the horses ~~lying~~ down. The shoeing is comparatively good, though the shoes can't be properly fitted to the hoof for lack of steel

10. Cooking Equipment : Sufficient.
11. Technical equipment and vehicles : Vehicles are efficient (less 12) ~~and~~ and well kept; great part of them have to be consigned in few days to Italian Military depots. I noticed many carts in very bad state, ~~which~~ ^{who} cannot be used. The repair truck is efficient. For deficiencies see table No
12. Conditions of animals : Of 15 horses I inspected, 6 are in awful condition and must not be used for at least a month. I advised to keep them on grass to improve the feeding, as the ration is not sufficient for ~~the~~ horses of that size. I also recommended ~~to~~ repair the horse-boxes, being in very bad condition with sharp stones sticking out preventing the horses ~~lying~~ down. The shoeing is comparatively good, though the shoes can't be properly fitted to the hoof for lack of coal.
13. Weapons and ammunition : The weapons ~~of the unit~~ ^{in store} are well kept and efficient. The ones issued to the soldiers are badly looked after and some dirty; this is again the lack of attention on the part of the officers and N.C.O.S. For deficiencies see table No 3
14. Command and Discipline : On the whole good. I found lack of energy in the "word of command" amongst officers. The sentry on my request passed his rifle without calling the commander of the guard, which is against the regulations : strict attention should be paid to that.
15. State of Training : On the whole the Regiment left on me a satisfactory impression, but there is still a great deal to do ~~to~~ ^{to} improve the technical part of the drill. I am sure however, that Col. Motzo, being a ~~expert~~ ^{experienced} regular officer, will be able, shortly to get desirable results.

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16. Interpreters : None.

17. Date Unit is to move to destination : Unknown.

18. General Remarks : It is necessary to point out that the Regiment is greatly reduced, as part of the men are employed by the Allies in this country and others on the Continent.
This Unit is now reformed by new men coming from various other Regiments. The barracks are well kept; kitchens, stores, ~~the~~ latrines are clean and in order. I complimented the Commander of the Regiment for the good conditions in which are kept the offices and the ~~living~~ localities.
I spoke with the ~~chaplain~~ and the medical officers on the importance of their duties.
The ~~stretch-bearers~~ are not trained for their job; the medical officer should attend to this.
The Commander of the Regiment, Col. Moteo, with his activity, in spite of the difficult conditions, did everything possible to keep in efficiency his Unit: he left on me a very good impression.

12. Conditions of animals : I inspected 12 horses and am pleased to say that I found them in particularly good condition: it is evident that the personnel of the stables are diligent and competent. The shoeing was in order. The horse-shoes are not made to measure and don't fit perfectly as the shoeing is done "cold" for lack of coal.

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13. Weapons and ammunitions : The weapons of the Units, particularly the 36 guns, are efficient and well kept. The rifles were not properly cleaned, particularly in the stores. Many rifle-racks are missing.

For deficiencies see table No. 3

14. Command and Discipline : I noticed a great difference in the efficiency of the "word of command" of the officers. A bad command affects the execution of the drill. The discipline is satisfactory.

15. State of training : I saw the rifle-drill and march-past of all groups, who left on me the following impression:

2nd group : Moderate execution; good on march-past.

3rd group : The "word of command" were weak; rifles were dirty; the men moved after the command "attention"; one soldier left the ranks without asking permission.

4th group : moderate execution of the drill and march-past.

Bat. da 20 mm. : The Unit left on me a good impression on all point of views.

I must point out that there is a very serious lack of water, which interferes not only with the cleanliness of the men, but also of barracks, etc. I advised to put water-tanks in various part and fill them with water daily.

I spoke with the ~~chaplain~~ and medical officers, giving them advice to look after the moral and sanitary condition of the Units. The Col. in command, Meloni Nicolò, left on me a very good impression; he is efficient and his men are well disciplined, but he must pay particular attention to the young officers and N.C.O.'s., some of whom need more training.

 15. State of training: As it is pointed out the inefficiency of officers and N.C.O.S. reflects on the execution of the drill. Men present themselves not properly dressed when they "fall in". The march-past was moderate. During the drill some men move ~~after~~ after the command "attention"; bodies are not treated;

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Some soldiers stood with chests in and packing their stomachs forward.

Also here the sentries do not know the regulations: for instance, ~~when asked~~ addressed or asked to pass over the rifles do not call the commander of the guard.

18. General Remarks: In general barracks are well kept; localities, stores, and offices are in order.
The food good. The latrines clean and properly looked after.
I noticed in the mattresses the straw was't changed for months, which is unpardonable this time of the year.
I complimented the medical officer, being one of the few Units where the "stretchers-bearers" know their job.
Some officers and men presented themselves for the inspection, which they knew would happen, unflinched, which is against the regulation.

This Regiment needs energetic action from the Commander to get the standard of efficiency.

9. Tents : Half of the Unit is under canvas, which are in good condition. For deficiencies see table N°/.

10. Cooking equipment : Sufficient.

11. Technical equipment and vehicles: Vehicles are efficient but engines are dirty. The petrol-tanks were in the same localities with lorries, which is very dangerous in case of fire; I recommended to remove them immediately to other stores to avoid accidents. The saddle-room is in order, but the harness is not clean and covered with dust; the men in charge are responsible for that. For deficiencies see table, NO 2

12. Conditions of animals: I inspected 93 horses. Most of them were in moderate condition; about 15 should be given a rest as their physical state is very poor. I noticed that the stalls for the horses were too narrow and they couldn't lie down; I advised to enlarge them. The shoeing is in order.

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13. Weapons and ammunition: The ^{guns} ~~weapons~~ of the Unit are well kept. Many rifles were dirty, including some issued to the men: again I must point out that officers and N.C.O.'s. should attend better to their duties. The racks for rifles are missing in some barracks. Paint for ~~guns~~ ^{guns} is needed. For the deficiencies see table NO 3
14. Command and Discipline: The officers command well and the soldier are disciplined. Here too the guard on my request ~~passed~~ ^{passed} me over his rifle without calling the commander of the guard. On the whole I was satisfied ~~with the unit~~ ^{with the unit} ~~and the~~ ^{with the unit}
15. State of training: The execution of the drill was good and the command done by officers and N.C.O.S. was energetic. Some soldiers need more practice in the word of command. It is noticeable that the men move after the command for "attention"; they don't hold on "spall'arm" the rifles at 45° ^{angle} in their elbows.

18. General Remarks: I inspected all barracks and ~~stables~~ ^{stables}, finding them clean and in order. In some barracks I noticed too many spiders ^{which} ~~showed~~ lack of cleanliness.

There too I recommended to all the officers to increase their activities in improving the welfare of the Unit.

Ho parlato con l'ufficiale medico e mi sono complimentato con lui perchè porteferiti e infermieri si sono dimostrati addestrati nel loro mestiere che devono tuttavia ancora perfezionarsi. Alcuni ufficiali e molti soldati si sono presentati non sbarbati, il che è contro i regolamenti.

In complesso il Reggimento necessita di un abile ed energico assistente per metterlo in efficienza. Ciò dipenderà soprattutto dalla buona volontà degli ufficiali e dalla collaborazione della truppa.
