AFHQ Liaison - Report No. 2

Liaison duties with AFHQ were undertaken on 2 December 1944.

Discussed with G 3 (Ops) the progress made to date on the ABRUZZI call-up, calling attention to the fact that all plans were ready with exception of getting:

- (a) Road transportation from CHIETI (the collecting center) to ORTONA (the rail-head) for transportation to TRAMI (the Allied camp) of two contingents of 800 each.
- (b) Rail transportation from ORTONA to TRAMI for an initial group of 800 between Dec 11 to 17 and a second group of 800 to be moved between Dec 17 to 22.

These 2 problems were immediately dealt with by contacting the two sections concerned and concluded in the following manner:

Rail transportation for 800 between Dec 11 to 17 would be bid for at the POM conference on Tuesday 5 December. Its acceptance was verbally assured by Movements and Transportation Section. The travel time between the two points will not be over 24 hours.

M and T Section will inform their RTB at ORTONA of the bid acceptance with instructions to determine and communicate the exact day our Liaison Officer in order that road transportation may be provided. This information, to assure absolute co-ordination will be passed on to 2 Maintenance and G 3 (Ops).

The bid for the second group of 800 should be submitted by us at the beginning of the week in our weekly stores bid."

2 Maintenance was informed of the above details. Necessary transportation was promised and it would be obtained probably from 3 District. It was pointed out that the original objection raised by 3 District that providing such transportation would be impossible because their vehicles would, of necessity, be deployed over a wide area to pick up the personnel was now overcome by our concentrating all personnel at CHIETI.

They requested to be advised of the date on which transportation would be necessary, at the very earliest possible time.

The exact combined strength of the 407 and 408 Infantry Regiments working with USAAF at FOGGIA is 25 officers and 630 ORs.

It was verbally communicated that the 30 Maltese officers are acceptable in place of MCO vacancies on Gruppi HLU WE. Information is requested by G 3 as to what the MCO vacancies are.

G 3 was informed that beginning Sunday 3 Dec, 800 muleteers

acceptance was verbally assured by Movement and Transportation Section. The travel time between the two points will not be over 24 hours.

M and T Section will inform their HQ at CMCNA of the bid acceptance with instructions to determine and communicate the exact day to our Liaison Officer in order that road transportation may be provided. This information, to assure absolute co-ordination will be passed on to 2 Maintenance and G 3 (Ops).

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They requested to be advised of the date on which transportation would be necessary, at the very earliest possible time.

The exact combined strength of the 407 and 408 Infantry Regiments working with USAF at FUGLIA is 25 Officers and 680 CRs.

It was verbally communicated that the 30 Maltese officers are acceptable in place of MCC vacancies on Gruppo LM WE. Information is requested by G 3 as to what the MCC vacancies are.

G 3 was informed that beginning Sunday 3 Dec, 800 muleteers per day would be available from TARANTO Camp in compliance with AAI request to furnish 2,000 at the very earliest. G 3 informed that in the meantime AAI has stated that they will accept 1,200 between the 11 to 17 December and 1,200 between 18 to 24 Dec for shipment directly to COLLE SALVETI. This will place an additional burden on the TARANTO Camp from the standpoint of housing, rationing, and equipping.

G 5 was approached with reference to problems that have arisen concerning the Italian Liaison Officers to be posted with SHAEP to find that they have turned the entire problem over to G 3. Specific questions were also discussed with AG Postal and the US Financial Director. AG Postal stated that the problem of correspondence between the Italian officers and their families and vice versa offers no difficulty providing that the Italian officers are attached to an American Headquarters and use an APC for an address. In such a case direct communication is possible both ways, the mail passing from civilian channels to APC on its way to FRANCE and vice versa for the return mail. An alternative was offered wherein MILA would collect the mail from the War Ministry, be responsible for censorship security and arrange for its onward transmission.

The problem of pay for Italian Officers was discussed with the Financial Advisor. An immediate solution could not be offered. The Deputy Director will be in FOE Monday 4 December at which time he hopes to have the answer and pass it on to MILA, otherwise it will be communicated at the earliest possible time.

G 3 is sending a cable to SHAEP requesting the information required by AG Postal as well as more detailed particulars concerning the additional 4 Italian Liaison Officers requested by SHAEP in FX 5763.

Considerable progress has been made by G 3 in drafting the details for the reinforcements scheme.

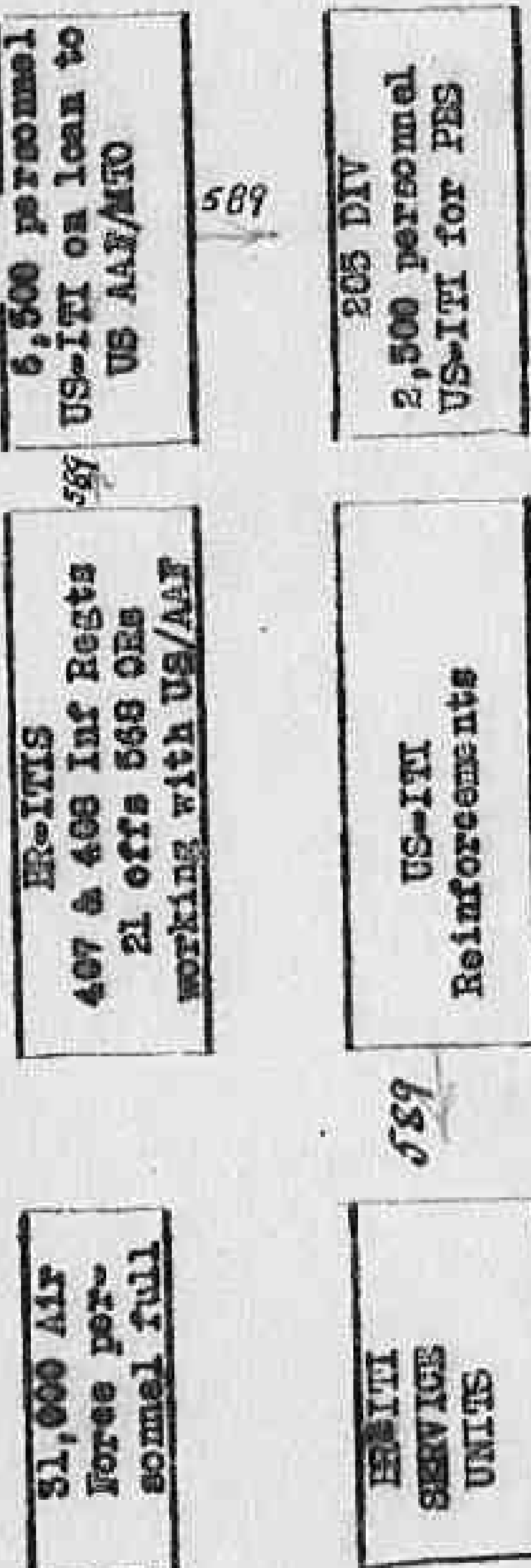

Exemptions from Call-up

My visit here coincided with that of Staff Capt. "A" 3 District on this subject. The number of unskilled exemption certificates appears now to be a much larger body than at first anticipated. There was a pile amounting to about 700 in 3 Dist HQ. These under the new directive are passed to MMIA for approval.

It was suggested:

- (a) That MMIA LO's be authorized to approve or disapprove exemption certificates.
- (b) That the exemption period be increased from 3 to 6 months.

Ref (a) This is in the interest of saving time and also that the men on the spot would probably have a better idea of whether an exemption should be granted or not.

Ref (b) This would considerably reduce the amount of "bumping" which this whole business is creating. At present as soon as an exemption is granted, another one is submitted for the next 3 months.

I also pointed out (a) that "Command and Administration" of 16 Nov states that leave will be governed by current regulations and that Current Regulations at the moment do not permit leave to SICILY or SARDINIA from the Mainland.

(b) That what is required now is "The Current Regulations".

It was agreed that the question of responsibility for leave for the Italian Army should be precipitated and that perhaps the best way to attain this would be for MMIA to ask by letter for the Current Regulations to be published. I stated that it might be possible to enclose a draft of such regulations.

G-3 Org was informed that leave to SARDINIA at the rate of 250 per month for the whole of the Italian Army would start when the Island was clear. The name of the leave ship is ABANZIA.

The onus of the preparation of a directive on exempting authorities and all matters relating to exemptions from call-up has finally and rather unwillingly been accepted by Col Br.

A draft administrative instruction was handed to me and has been passed to AA and QMG.

In view of exemption certificates piling up in AFHQ which are not being dealt with at the moment, the urgency and necessity of reaching a final decision and implementing a directive, cannot be too highly stressed. It will be observed that the draft directive proposes to pass 3 types of exemptions to MMIA for decision.
