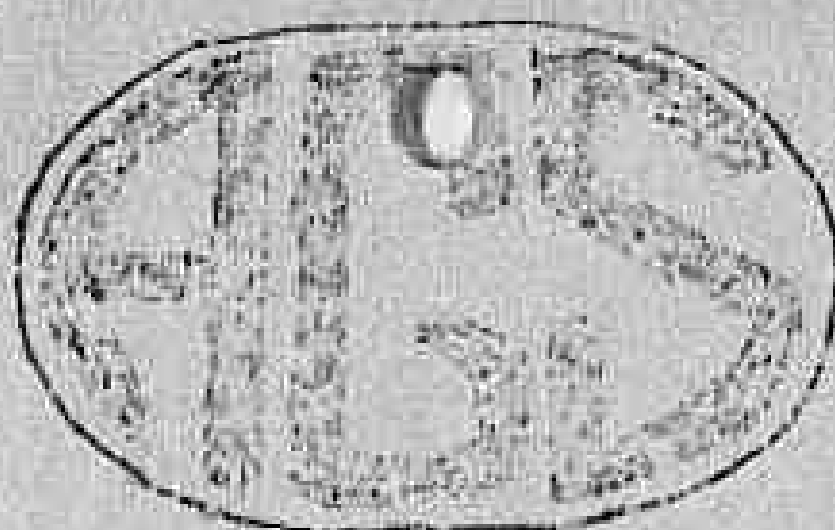

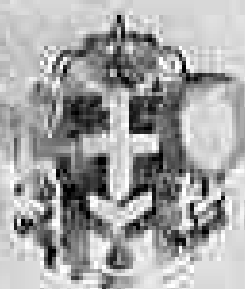

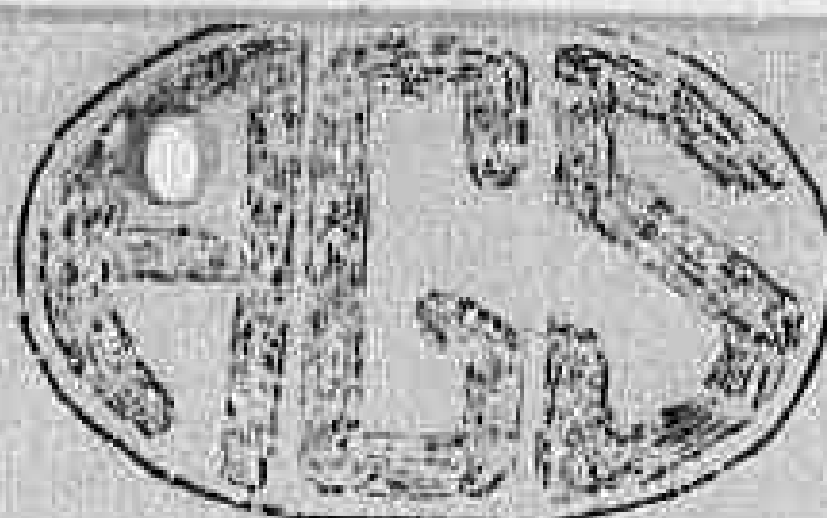

1. Approximately 1150 officers and men of the Royal Italian Navy have, since September, 1943, assisted this Detachment in the operation of Southern Sardinia, including the ports of Cagliari and San Antioco. The assistance includes such services as salvage, tugs, net tender, pilots, water barges, line handlers, minor boat repair, fuel depot, signal station, and mine sweeping. Enclosure (A) N. 2 contains a tabulation of the personnel involved.

2. During the seven months period this detachment has requested and received the full cooperation and reasonably efficient operation from the Royal Italian Navy.

3. At this time activity is increasing. In order to maintain operating efficiency among Royal Italian Naval personnel, certain supplies necessary for hygiene are essential. These are listed in Enclosure (A) N. 1.

4. The Allied Garrison Command of Sardinia has informed this Detachment that it has no authority to issue the supplies to Italian personnel. The Comandante, Comando Marina, Cagliari, states that his command is unable to obtain minimum requirements.

5. It is requested that provisions be made, similar to those in Sicily and Italy, to provide such supplies in the immediate future.

1. Enclosed is copy of correspondence received through Naval Officer in Charge, Cagliari, from Comandante, Comando Marina, Cagliari, in which it is indicated that the Royal Italian Navy Ministry, acting upon advice received from the Allied High Command, has prescribed a ration for its personnel on operational duty afloat and ashore which is greater than the ration being imported into Sardinia by the Allied Powers for consumption by Italian Navy, Army, and Air Forces on the Island.

2. This headquarters has no information relative to the above other than that the greater ration referred to is the same as the "combat ration" which is being supplied certain Italian forces on the mainland. There is no advice that the "combat ration" is to be imported into Sardinia and the only ration available is that now being received, known as the "basic ration".

3. If you desire, this headquarters will forward the matter to the Allied High Command in Italy and in that event would appreciate an expression from you as Commander of all of the Italian Navy in Sardinia. In this connection it is requested that your remarks include a statement covering the number of Italian Navy personnel in Sardinia you believe would be entitled to the combat ration, were it provided, together with their duties.

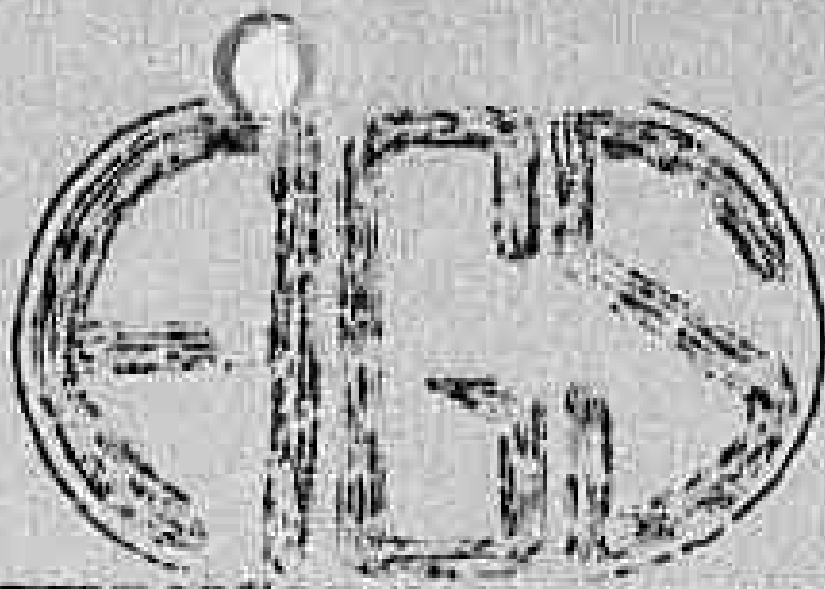

SUBJECT: Food Supply to Italian Naval Personnel.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of your letter dated 3 February, 1944, No. F3/850/2.

2. In order to insure that foodstuffs from stocks of Allied origin, intended solely for those units of the Italian Armed Forces rendering services in Allied interests, are not diverted to those units or portion of units not so employed, this headquarters adopted the policy of making such issues under Allied supervision directly to the kitchens of such units. This method of rationing these units has proven highly successful and has been applied in all cases.

3. Unless conditions at MADDALENA permit of supplying the 752 Italian Naval personnel mentioned by you in conformity with the abovementioned policy, your request that they be issued the full scale ration by the Italian Flag Officer cannot be favorably considered by this headquarters.

1. Reference is made to your letter dated 20 January 1944, file F3/723, same subject. It is noted that there are at Maddalena a total of 752 Italian Naval personnel employed to a very large extent in the Allied interests.

2. At present there is still an insufficient quantity of the Combined Chiefs of Staff scale ration in Sardinia to permit the feeding of the above-mentioned personnel. However, this headquarters has been advised that about 10th February a 30-day supply of the special scale ration for 200,000 Italian personnel (Army, Navy and Air) will be received at Cagliari. Maintenance shipments will be received subsequently at intervals. Preparations have been made to receive these rations and the Italian Navy's share, based upon its proportionate strength, will be distributed to its personnel by the Italian Flag Officer. The personnel mentioned by you will of course receive their share of this unless the procedure referred to in paragraph 3 below is adopted.

3. Plans for the receipt and issue of these rations contemplate that each Italian service will issue to its own personnel, except that the Allied forces will issue as in the past to those Italian units which are working directly under Allied supervision and in the Allied interests. The ration in the latter case will be the full scale ration.

4. The 752 personnel mentioned by you appear to belong in the latter category and if you will advise this headquarters that you will be able to handle the distribution of the full scale ration to the personnel involved, and desire it, the full scale ration will be set aside upon its receipt in Sardinia and made available to you for this purpose.

SUBJECT: Food supply to Italian Naval Personnel.

TO : Naval Officer in Charge, Maddalena.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of your communication dated 3 January 1944, reference No. 91/585, on above subject.

2. It is noted that 3150 Italian Naval personnel, exclusive of those employed in the anti-aircraft defenses, are reported as rendering services in furtherance of the Allied effort. In view of the fact that existing stocks of subsistence imported into Sardinia for the specific purpose of feeding Italian forces rendering such services are insufficient to supply the Italians under your supervision in addition to those now being fed therefrom, this headquarters requested AFM for an early shipment of supplies to take care of the 3150 Italian Naval personnel at Maddalena. An answer has just been received to the effect that additional food supply for this purpose is not available until its arrival from the United States. Other information indicates that this will probably not be until the middle of February or later.

3. It appears that, until the arrival of the combined Chiefs of Staff ration from the United States in February, the only relief available to the situation at Maddalena would be through the Allied Regional Commission for Sardinia which is receiving shipments of flour and a limited quantity of other foodstuff for distribution to Italians.

FOOD SUPPLY TO ITALIAN NAVAL PERSONNEL

With reference to Allied Garrison of Sardinia Memorandum Number 55-2 of 8th December 1943, the attached list submitted by the Italian authorities shows the duties being carried out by Italian naval personnel in this port, with the exception of 2227 who are employed in the anti-aircraft defences and who are already being supplied with food from U.S. sources.

2. As these naval A.A. personnel have been accepted as a whole for the purposes of food supply, it would appear that there is some case for accepting the other naval personnel similarly. However the degree of assistance rendered varies considerably and I have noted on the list ~~the~~ *the* headings under which the various units figure in my estimation.

3. I am willing to act as Allied Representative under the terms of the above memorandum in so far as reporting numbers of personnel is concerned, but have no adequate organisation to deal with the distribution of food to the Italians. It is suggested that supplies to all Italian naval personnel at Maddalena should be made direct to the Italian authorities either at Cagliari, Porto Torres or Olbia for Shipment by sea in their own vessels.

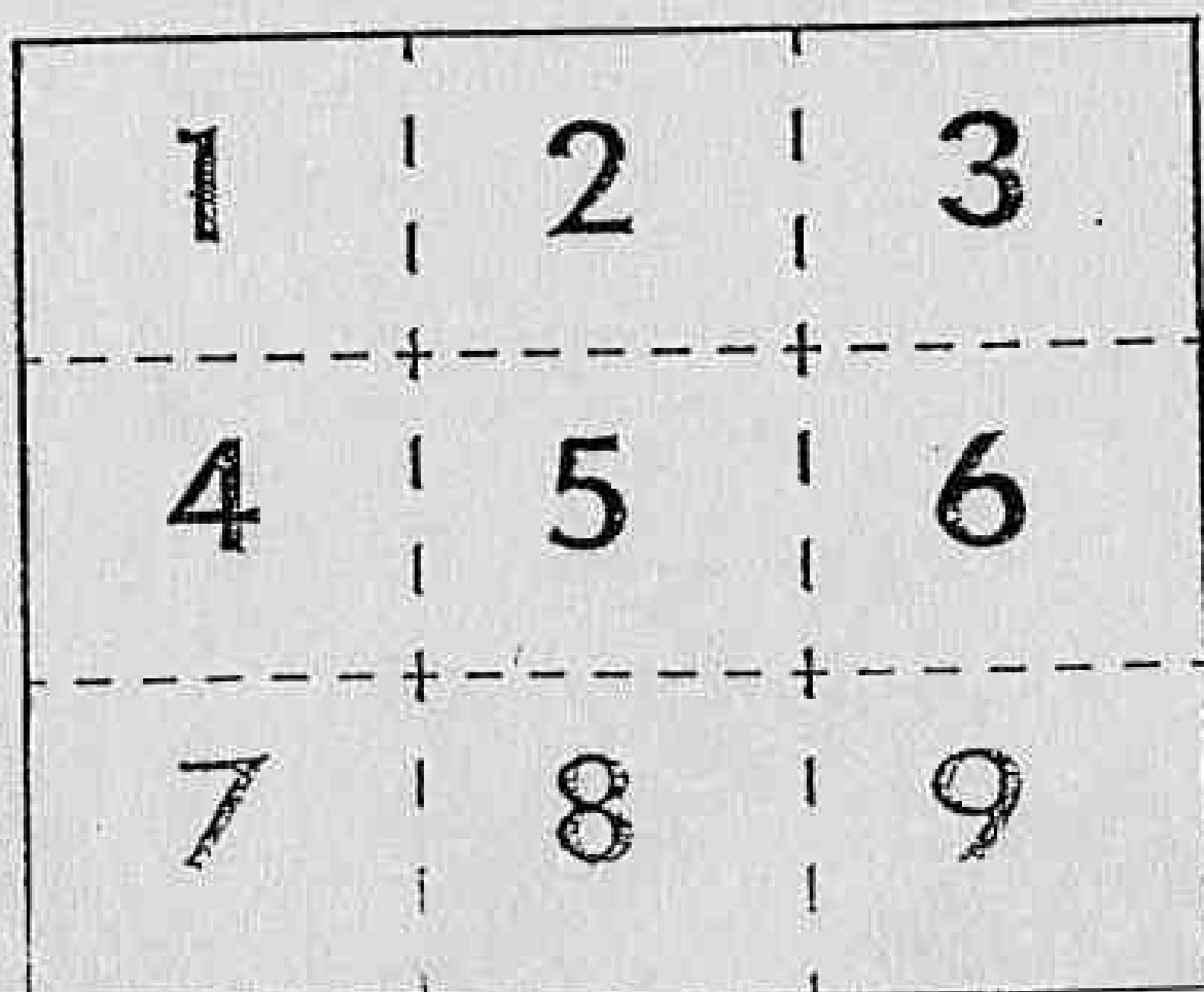
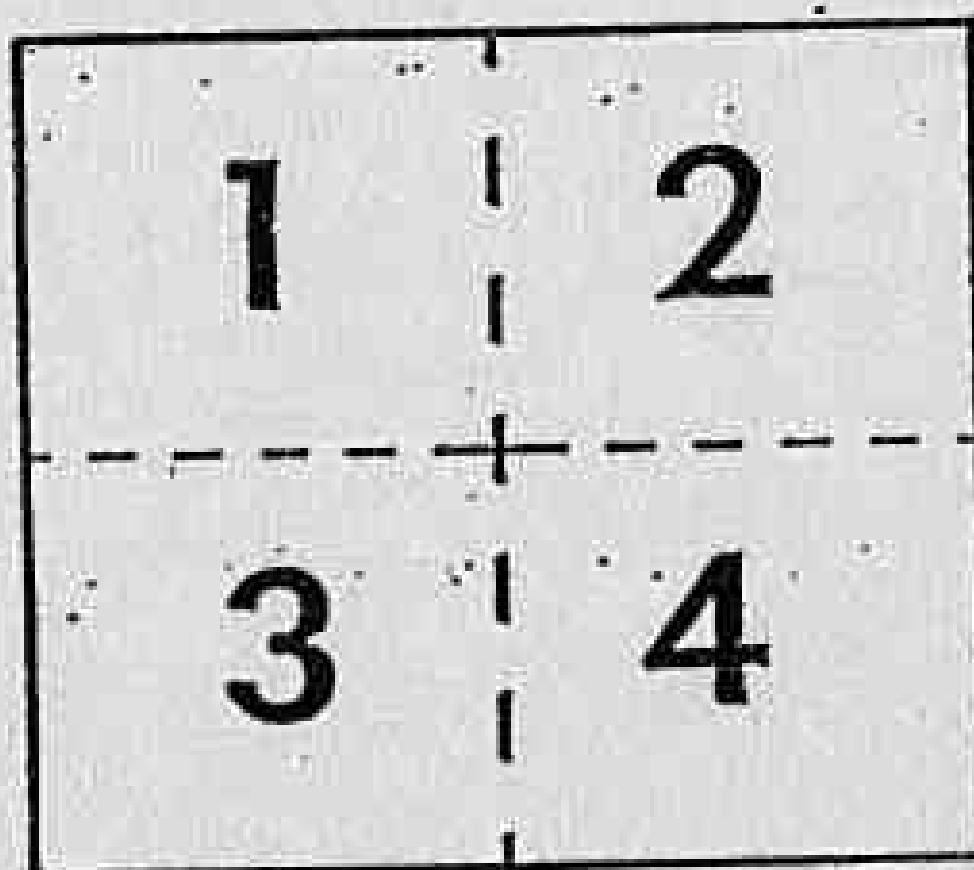

1. With reference to the issue of rations to the Italians in Corsica, there is now loading at Algiers 60 days supply of Class I for U.S.A. Forces and Type C rations for Italians. As soon as the name of the ship is known, the XII Air Force will be advised.

2. Effective 1 February 1944, a 30 days maintenance supply of rations will be shipped direct from Pembark. The matter of projected strength for the month of February has been referred to the Operations Section of this Headquarters, and as soon as we can get some comments on it (if we can) you will be informed.

3. For Sardinia, there is now being loaded aboard the ~~Robert Jordan~~ at Oran, a twenty (20) days supply of subsistence, toilet paper, soap, matches, and gratuitous PI components. 1. The Commanding General, Allied Garrison Sardinia, recently received a message from the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean concerning the issuing of food to Italian merchant vessels. In compliance with this message, the following regulations are now in effect:

- (a) No allied provisions or supplies will be issued to Italian merchant ships. These ships shall draw supplies entirely from local sources. Allied Regional Commissioner, Brigadier Dunlap, should be contacted if merchant ships have difficulty locating supplies.
- (b) No imported coal is available for bunkering ships at the present time. Consequently, only local coal can be supplied in emergency cases.
- (c) Royal Italian Naval vessels will continue to draw supplies from the Royal Italian Navy Headquarters.

2. It is therefore requested that no allied provisions be issued merchant ships, and that Masters of ships requiring supplies be informed of the above regulations.

1. Port Party Organization.

Port Party, San Antioco, Sardinia, will operate directly under the command of Comandante, Comando Marina, Cagliari. A directive has been issued by this command including detailed instructions for operating the Port, and continuing essential repairs.

(c) There are 127 stevedores at San Antioco, including 55 coalers, and 72 for general cargo. This total is adequate to handle more than 65,000 tons of coal each month.

2. Communications.

(a) One direct and one indirect telegraph line is operating in good order between Cagliari and San Antioco. A telephone line has been repaired, is now in operation.

- (b) Effective 6 January 1944 a truck will leave San Antiooco at 0800 each day, report to R.I.N. Headquarters, Cagliari, and return.

3. Port Security.

- (a) A detail of twenty (20) guards of the now defunct Milizia Portuaria, Cagliari, now under the Royal Carabinieri, have been assigned to San Antiooco for policing and military control of the port area.
- (b) Three (3) 74/40 batteries, with central fire direction, and a group of 20 mm. batteries are stationed at San Antiooco. In addition, two (2) 90/53 batteries can operate from Carbonia in case of attack. These batteries are manned by Royal Italian Army personnel, under the control of the Carbonia District.
- (c) In view of the present efficiency of air attacks, the anti-aircraft assigned to San Antiooco is considered inadequate. It is therefore suggested that two 90 mm. batteries be added to the above-listed anti-aircraft units.

4. Port Facilities.

- (a) The proper Civil Engineering authorities have been informed of the major work necessary at San Antiooco. This involves getting the water pipe to the dock repaired for supplying ships, and repair of the eastern dock to make it available for ships.
- (b) Of the five (5) cranes at the port, two (2) are in operation, three (3) under repair. Of the last three, one (1) is expected to be in operating condition in the very near future.
- (c) There are no tugs at San Antiooco.

5. Minesweeping Facilities.

We are organizing a minesweeping squadron<sup>466</sup> duty at San Antiooco. It shall consist of the following vessels:
