1. Reference is made to your letter File No. 147AA subject "U.S. Rations", dated 2 May 1944.

2. The ration strength as shown in the above referred to letter was 155,658 officers and men for 23 April.

3. For the period 21 April to 30 April, 170,000 rations were issued to the Italian Army for a period of 10 days by the Combined Italian Armed Forces Supply Board.

4. In view of the fact that rations were drawn for a strength greater than the actual figure a deduction in rations drawn corresponding to the difference will be made by you for the next regular issue period.

SUBJECT: Rations for Italian Personnel.

TO : Commanding General, Allied Garrison of Sardinia, APO 534, U.S. Army.

1. It is requested that a supplementary meat ration be issued regularly to the twenty four (24) Italian soldiers of the 107th Telegraph Co. and to the twenty seven (27) Italian soldiers of the 69th Telegraph Co. who are working under the supervision of the Signal Officer, Allied Garrison of Sardinia.

2. These soldiers are engaged in heavy manual labor on telephone construction work. This type of labor involves more than average expenditure of energy.

3. Since the regular rationing of these troops is now handled by the Italian Military Command, the Detachment Commanders of these units have been advised to submit memorandums similar to this to their respective commands.

FROM MMIA RPT MMIA TO FALCON FOR SIMONS CITE ABLE QUEEN SEVEN EIGHT ONE

FIRST. WITH EFFECT FROM 25 MARCH ITALIAN ARMED FORCES ON MAINLAND BEHIND ARMY COMBAT LINE WILL BE MAINTAINED FROM SUPPLIES SPECIALLY IMPORTED AND NOW HELD IN ITALIAN DEPOTS AND ONLY IN MOST EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCE WILL ISOLATED UNITS AND SMALL NUMBERS OF ITALIAN TROOPS WITHIN ALLIED UNITS BE SUPPLIED FROM ALLIED DEPOTS.

SECOND. IN ARMY AREAS SUPPLY WILL CONTINUE AS NOW FROM ALLIED DEPOTS AND AND SUPPLIES ISSUED BY ALLIED WILL BE REPAID FROM ITALIAN DEPOTS UNDER ORDERS TO BE ISSUED SEPARATELY.

THIRD. EXTRA TWO OUNCES OF CANNED MEAT AUTHORIZED FOR ISSUE TO HEAVY WORKERS WILL AT PRESENT CONTINUE TO BE ISSUED BY ALLIED EMPLOYING UNITS FROM ALLIED STOCKS. QUESTION OF REPAYMENT FROM ITALIAN DEPOTS WILL BE CONSIDERED LATER.

FOURTH.
