Holdings of British equipment and the American equivalent should be reported separately. General instructions in regard to this will be forwarded through Staff channels in due course.

6. Where it is impossible at the moment to replace American equipment by a suitable British substitute, decision will have to be made as to whether the American equipment is really essential. CSOs are therefore requested to forward their recommendations as to which American equipments in their opinion should be retained temporarily. At Appendix "A" is list of Signal equipments with their corresponding British equivalents. CSOs will consolidate the opinions of formations under command and return Appendix "A" to this Headquarters not later than 15th October. Information required at this Headquarters in order to advise the War Office when they formulate their final policy is as follows:-

- a) quantity of American items held by Troops under command.
- b) quantity of spares for such equipments, that is one month's first line maintenance or more.

(c) As to whether the American item can be replaced by the nearest British equivalent. In arriving at this decision CSOs are asked to bear in mind that the relative merits as far as compactness and neatness of the two types of equipment should not weigh in favour of the American item.

7. As soon as it is impossible to obtain further supplies of maintenance spares for American equipments those with a low REME classification may be cannibalised so far as this can economically and efficiently be effected to provide spares.

8. In cases where it is decided that the retention of the American equipment is essential, such equipment must be conserved and to this end withdrawn from units to whom it is not vital and reserved for those who cannot operate without it.

DRAFTCONTROL OF ITALIAN TELECOMMUNICATION STORES

1. All State-owned ITALIAN Telecommunication Stores, including those of the Army, Navy and Air Force are in very short supply. Their control and issue, less those peculiar to a particular service, will be vested in one authority, the CSO AFHQ, except where this is delegated as in Para 5 below.
2. It is essential that all such stores are used to the best advantage, and that they are not frittered away on uneconomical and unco-ordinated projects.
3. If the Communications Sub Commission of the Allied Commission or any of the Service Sub Commissions wish to originate a project, it will first be co-ordinated by the originating Sub Commission with the remainder. The latter will then be in a position to recommend alterations to the project in order to meet any demands they may have in the area or areas under reference.

1. The proposal to amend AFHQ Circular No 23, 1944, to change the control of Italian Army Signal stores is not agreed for the following reasons:

a. Signal stores of the Army needed for purely Army purposes are, in most cases, of civilian types, and not peculiar to the Army.

b. Signal stores in Italian Army depots are made available on the following priority:

- (1) For use of both British and US Armies.
- (2) For use purely on Italian military business.
- (3) Surplus for civilian use.

c. All Army Signal stores are now controlled by AFHQ through MMIA, where an inventory is being compiled as quickly as possible of all such stores in Italy. Divided authority over control of stores in Italian Army depots will result in a complete lack of control by MMIA and orders, counterorders and confusion in the War Ministry.

d. The Allied policy that the Italian Army must maintain itself on its own resources and therefore must have its own resources primarily for its own use, under control of MMIA, would be changed. Practically all stores in Italian Signal depots could be syphoned off to civilian use outside of Allied control, and the Italian Army could then demand stores from the Allies to maintain itself.

e. Attention is invited to letter, this headquarters, file X511 of 4 April attached as Incl 1. 4240

f. The existing procedure is working satisfactorily in accordance with AFHQ directives. As in the case of all stores of the Italian Army, it is only necessary that MMIA be furnished a list of stores desired for any particular purpose; and if such stores are available, they are released on the priorities set out in sub-paragraph 1b above. This has been done in numerous times in the past. If the Communication Sub Commission will submit a list of desired stores, they will promptly be advised as to what is available insofar as our records go at that time.

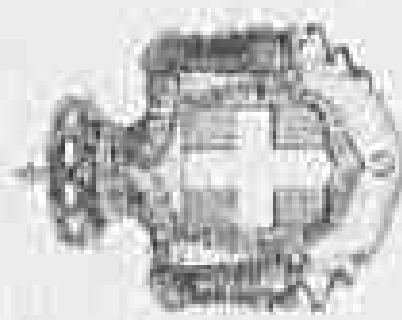

CONTROL OF ITALIAN TELECOMMUNICATIONS MATERIAL.

1. As agreed with the Italian Communications Ministry, the Under-Secretary of State for Communications, Dr. FANO, controls the Italian telecommunications materials owned by the State, including such materials of the Army, Navy, and the Air Force, which are not truly and particularly service materials, for example parts of aircraft radio installation.
2. Up till now these materials have not been issued without authorisations from the C.S.O. of A.M.I. In future, Italian telecommunications materials, in territory administrated by Italy, can be used on Italian projects with the authorisation of the Allied Commission's Sub-Commission for Communications, and for special services with the authorisations of the Sub-Commissions for the Ground Forces, for the Air Forces, and for the Navy, whichever concerned. The Allied Commission can transfer its authority in this respect to the Italian Government, provided that a reasonable proportion of telecommunications materials are reserved for use in territory at present occupied by the enemy.
3. Similar conditions will automatically be applied to materials at present in A.M.G. territory, when such territory again comes under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government.

4. Italian telecommunications materials which are requested for urgent projects of the Allied Forces due to lack of Allied material, must continue to be demanded, as in paras. 3 and 4 of No. 45 of C.S.O. ADMF, with the difference that the demands must be passed to the C.S.O. AFHQ, or to the C.S.O. AAI, according to the territory in which the ~~xxxxxxx~~ project is to be carried out.

Whenever material requests are received from the Allied Authorities not in accordance with the A/M procedure, we beg that this Stato Maggiore Generale is informed telegraphically.
4. As in the past, the Stato Maggiore's of the three Armed Forces will forward, monthly, to this Stato Maggiore Generale the lists of the materials referred to in enclosure to letter 80082/T of 17 January 1944, held in their stores, and moreover, in order that this Stato Maggiore Generale may have the situation brought up to date of all the Telecommunications material held in the stores, they will also forward lists of the materials not included in the enclosure quoted (wireless sets, teleprinters, telephone sets, switchboards, electro-generating plants etc.).
Moreover, as already notified in letter 81577 of 23/11/44, the above controls affect the materials existent in all the territory placed under the control of the Italian Government, and therefore the stores located in the provinces recently restored to the Italian Government must also appear in the lists.

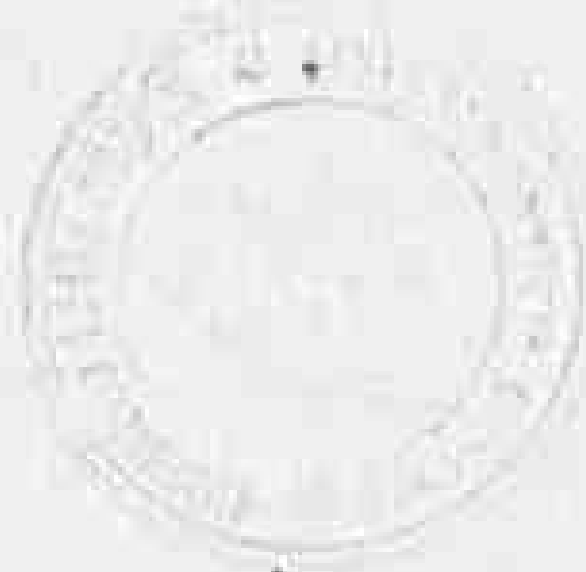

Italian Telecom stores which are required for Allied Forces urgent projects in the absence of Allied stores, should continue to be requisitioned as in paras 3 and 4 of CSO ACHF memo No. 5 of 10 Feb 44, except that demands should be passed to CSO AFHQ or to CSO MAF, depending on the area in which the project will be carried out.

CSO. ACMP, MEMORANDUM NO. 45

Control of Italian Stores

12 Feb 44.

1. In accordance with the agreed policy of the Communications Section (Italy), Lt. Pons, Under Secretary, Italian Ministry of Communications, will now control all Signal stores owned by the State and the Italian Army, Navy and Air Ministries. He will submit to CSO ACMP a complete list of all stores held, and will be responsible for maintaining accurate stock records in future.
2. Stores will not be issued without the authority of CSO ACMP.
3. Demands for Italian stores will be passed through the normal channels to CSO ACMP who prepares release orders in triplicate. One copy will be given to the unit requiring the stores, one copy will be passed to the Italian signal park or depot concerned who will prepare the stores for issue, and the third copy will be sent to Lt. Pons, for record purposes.
4. The unit drawing the stores will acknowledge receipt on the Signal Park copy of the release order.
5. To reduce the amount of work involved by numerous demands for small quantities of other stores, arrangements may be made to issue responsible officers of certain items to the CSO or Liaison concerned. In such cases all stores released will be removed from Report or Park in lots by authority to whom released, as Italian stockkeeping cannot be expected to run sub accounts.
6. This procedure will also be followed in respect of demands for stores by Italian forces, and issues will only be made against

4. The unit drawing the stores will acknowledge receipt of the Signal Work copy of the release order.

5. To reduce the amount of work involved by numerous demands for small quantities of minor stores, arrangements may be made to issue reasonable stocks of certain items to the CSC or Mission concerned. In such cases all stores released will be removed from the Signal Work in toto by authority to whom released, as Italian stores cannot be expected to run sub accounts.

6. This procedure will also be followed in respect of demands for stores by Italian forces, and issues will only be made against projects or demands sponsored by the appropriate mission or Allied representative.

7. It is probable that at a later date it will become convenient to invest C.S.O. I of C ITALY with the authority to make releases of ITALIAN stores.

I. REMOVAL OF MATERIAL, SUPPLIES AND STORES FROM ITALIAN
MILITARY DEPOTS.

1. Repeated instances have been reported of Allied troops removing material, supplies or stores from Italian Military Depots without proper authority. This is a violation of paragraph 1b, AFHQ Circular Number 13, 1944.

2. No material, supplies or stores will be removed from any Italian Military Depot, factory, or Italian Military organization, by units or individuals of this command without express written authority of one of the following Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission at Rome:

- a. For stocks from Italian Army Depots, Land Forces Sub-Com (M.M.I.A.)
- b. For stocks from Italian Navy Depots, Naval Forces Sub-Com.
- c. For stocks from Italian Air Depots, Air Forces Sub-Com.

In an emergency only, authority may be granted by the appropriate Liaison Officer of one of the above Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission, in the area where depots or organization is located.

3. The above does not preclude the right of operational commanders to make such use of the items mentioned as may be necessary for operational reasons only.

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4. The appropriate Sub-Commissions, Allied Commission, will post notices in Italian Depots, covering these instructions.

5. All commanders are directed to publish these instructions to members of their command, and to take appropriate action on any violations.

This does not, however, preclude the rights of operational commanders to make such use of the items mentioned as may be necessary for operational reasons.

SUBJECT: Issue Allied Supplies and Stores to Italian Armed Forces.

1. These instructions pertain to the control of stores and supplies which have been or may be authorized for issue to the Italian Armed Forces by the Combined Chiefs of Staff on an Allied basis. They do not apply to stores or equipment which have been or may be authorized by any Allied Nation from its own stocks or depots to equip or maintain Italian units or services working directly for or on behalf of that Allied Nation. It does not apply to Air Force technical stores nor to Naval stores, except as these stores may be common user items furnished on an international basis. These instructions apply equally to the Italian Mainland, Sicily, Sardinia and Corsica.

2. The following categories have been authorized and are being furnished on an international basis: rations, medical supplies, clothing and fuel (POL). The United States has assumed primary responsibility for rations (subsistence). The United Kingdom has assumed primary responsibility for medical supplies. Joint responsibility has been assumed for clothing. POL products will be furnished thru the normal existing petroleum state procedure.

3. The Army Sub-Commission (short title MIA) has been designated as the executive agency for the supervision, distribution, allocation, and accounting for all the supplies and stores presently authorized by the CCS for issue to any or all of the Italian Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force). For all matters pertaining to these supplies and stores MIA will operate directly under the supervision of Headquarters AFI. No other agency has authority to issue or allocate any of these commodities to any of the Italian Armed Forces.

4. To comply with the directive of the CCS that the nation of origin

2. The following categories have been authorized and are being furnished on an International basis: rations, medical supplies, clothing and fuel (POL). The United States has assumed primary responsibility for rations (subsistence). The United Kingdom has assumed primary responsibility for medical supplies. Joint responsibility has been assumed for clothing. POL products will be furnished thru the normal existing petroleum state procedure.

3. The JMC Sub-Commission (short title ISIA) has been designated as the executive agency for the supervision, distribution, allocation, and accounting for all the supplies and stores presently authorized by the CCS for issue to any or all of the Italian Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force). For all matters pertaining to these supplies and stores ISIA will operate directly under the supervision of Headquarters JMC. No other agency has authority to issue or allocate any of these commodities to any of the Italian Armed Forces.

4. To comply with the directive of the CCS that the nation of ownership shall exercise controlling authority over issues the following will apply, subject to policy control by CAO JMC and MC.O. JMC, respectively, for British and United States commodities. The senior British officer at Headquarters ISIA will supervise the supply of medical stores. The senior United States officer at Headquarters ISIA will supervise the supply of subsistence. They will jointly supervise the supply of clothing recognizing the primary interest of the nation of ownership. POL will continue to be handled as prescribed in JMC Administrative Memorandum No. 11 cs.

5. At Headquarters ISIA, the review and supervision of the supply system will be the responsibility of the CAO (Br.) for stores of British ownership and the MC.O. (U.S.) for stores of United States ownership.

6. Issues of other common user stores and equipment except those which may be specifically authorized from National depots to Italian forces serving with National troops, will be controlled by ISIA. Repairable salvaged shoes and clothing which are issued under the provisions of AFH Administrative Memorandum No. 5, 7 January 1944, will be allocated by ISIA to Italian forces and will not be issued directly by U.S. or British services without prior authority of ISIA. Where practicable such items after repair will be depoted in Italian depots prior to issue. ISIA will report monthly to the Chief Accountant the receipt of such salvage clothing received from Allied services in the theater.

7. ISIA will furnish to the Chief Accountant JCC monthly a state-

ment (with signed receipts) of the total amount of each subject commodity accepted by the Italian Armed Forces. MIA will cause records to be maintained which will show all receipts, issues, and stockpiles in Italian depots and will furnish such information with respect to those matters as may be required by the British or United States Services. MIA will assure that the minimum stockpile is held in Italian formations and units.

8. MIA will not be responsible for pricing. The Chief Accountant ACC will keep quantitative records. The principles and procedure for pricing will be in accordance with instructions from the Combined Chiefs of Staff to ACC.

9. Scales of supply for all authorized issues have been prescribed. It is the definite responsibility of every Allied and Italian agency involved in the issue of any of the subject commodities to assure that the scale of supply is not exceeded. Over issues will be adjusted at the earliest opportunity by a subsequent withdrawal. Allied stocks issued from Allied depots will not be made to less previous authority has been secured or unless the issue is of such an emergency nature that previous authority was not practicable to secure.

10. None of the supplies or stores may be issued except to those who are bona fide members of the Italian Armed Forces in every sense, and who are borne on the rosters of the Ministry concerned, and who are within the list of those who have been approved as effective by the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

11. The MIA is authorized to deal direct with the Air Force and Naval subcommittees, and with all major agencies (armies, separate Corps, Districts, Base Section, Allied Garrison, Air Forces, Navies, etc.) to procure information as to strengths, organization and locations of Italian troops working for them or under their administration control and to procure information as to the importation, issues and status of the commodities covered by these instructions. MIA will bring to the attention of A.I. any irregularities which constitute a violation of the instruction of this or higher authority.

12. MIA will submit for approval with the least practicable delay Standing Operating Procedure for the receipt storage, issuing and accounting of all commodities whose control is the responsibility of MIA. This procedure will contemplate that local port commanders will be responsible for the unloading of the supplies and stores earmarked for the Italian Armed Forces and for the movement of these commodities to base depots operated by

The IMI. is authorized to deal direct with the Air Force and Naval Subcommittees, and with all major agencies (armies, separate Corps, Districts, Base Section, Allied garrisons, Air Force, Navy, etc.) to procure information as to strategic, operational and locations of Italian troops working for them or under their administration control and to procure information as to the importation, issues and status of the commodities covered by these instructions. IMI. will bring to the attention of IMI any irregularities which constitute a violation of the instruction of this or higher authority.

12. IMI. will submit for approval with the least practicable delay Standing Operating Procedures for the receipt storage, issuing and accounting of all commodities whose control is the responsibility of IMI. This procedure will contemplate that local port commanders will be responsible for the unloading of the supplies and stores earmarked for the Italian Armed Forces and for the movement of these commodities to base depots operated by the Italians. Italian assistance in identifying commodities and for furnishing guards enroute to warehouse will be required at each port between IMI. and the port authority. Where arrangements can be made for the Italians to accept accountability for commodities at ship side, such arrangements will be made provided adequate Allied supervision can be provided to prevent theft and unauthorized diversion. When approval by IMI this Standing Operating Procedure will be of effective within the Italian Army, Navy and Air Forces, and will be issued by the IMI. for action by the Italian Government and Allied commanders concerned.

13. It shall be the aim of IMI. to cause the Italians to organize a floodable Italian supply agency, so that it may receive, store, issue and account for commodities furnished by the Allied Governments; assure against loss, theft and deterioration, over-issue and the proper and timely distribution of these commodities; make the maximum use of Italian supplies and equipment; repair, reassemble, rebuild and replace supplies and stores whether of Italian or Allied sources; and by central control to procure, store and distribute items of local production (olive oil, fruit, etc.).
