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EVIDENCE IN RESPECT OF CHARGES AGAINST3245223 Rfmm DAVIDSON, W. Cameronians

On Sunday 15 July 45 I detailed 3245223 Rfmm Davidson to drive the 8-cwt truck No. 4617040 to FREGENE for the purpose of bathing. Haversack rations were taken. Other occupants of the vehicle were Capt. Lamb and 3328351 Pte Cunning, R. who was taken so that the driver could have the opportunity of bathing and that the safety of the vehicle was assured.

On arrival at FREGENE at 1300 hours Rfmm Davidson and Pte Cuning were ordered to report with the vehicle to the Car Park at 1800 hours to return to Rome. At 1757 hours Capt. Lamb and I arrived at the Car Park where we met Pte Cuning in his bathing costume. He stated that he had returned to the vehicle at 1510 hours as he had left his clothes in the truck but could not find either Rfmm Davidson or the truck.

At 1855 hours we got a lift back to Rome in a 3-tonner which called first at the Rest Camp at FREGENE to pick up 3 South African soldiers. Pte Cuning kept watch for Davidson from the front of the 3-tonner and Capt. Lamb and I kept watch from the back of the lorry. I didn't see Rfmm Davidson until 2215 hours on 17 July 45 at 'C' Mess, MHA. I rang up the C.M.P. and placed Rfmm Davidson under close arrest for being absent without leave for 55 hours/15 minutes.

Subject : Money belonging to Soldiers committed to
Penal Establishments.

To : List "B" (Br)

1. In some cases where SUS have been committed to penal establishments, money which has been found in their possession has been sent with them.

2. This practice places an unnecessary responsibility on Penal establishments which do not have adequate facilities for safeguarding these sums of money.

3. In future, therefore, in accordance with King's Regulations 1940, para 753, such sums of money will be paid into the unit imprest account for crediting to the account of the soldier prior to his despatch to a penal establishment.

4. Where, however, the circumstances appear to be such that:-

- (a) a restitution order may be made under Section 75, Army Act or
- (b) the money may be paid into a suspense account pending the determination of its true ownership in accordance with AMHQ letter CR/4058/GI(Br) dated 9 Aug 44 as amended by letter of same reference dated 7 March 45.

action will not be taken in accordance with para 3 above until the CC Unit has been notified by the confirming officer that no restitution order will be made or that the money will not be paid into a suspense account. If the soldier is committed before such decision is notified to the Unit, the money will be held by the unit until such decision is notified. The money will then be dealt with in accordance with instructions from the confirming officer or in accordance with para 3 above whichever is applicable. 398

W. Col. J. J. Aldman, R.A.M.C., M.M.I.A., having
been duly sworn, states: On Sunday 15 July
I departed 3245223 Rpm. Davidson W, when I
performed as the accused, I drove the 8. car. truck
No. 4617040 to Eugene for the purpose of collecting.
The other passengers were Capt. Lamb and his
belongings. The. Summary. Bathing costumes, were taken
by all. There was no engine trouble of any
kind on the journey.

We arrived at Eugene at 1300 hrs. Capt. Lamb
and I got out of the truck arranging with
the driver and Mr. Cumming. I met again at
1800 hrs. I return to home. The object of taking
Mr. Cumming was to allow Rpm. Davidson to
have a bath and at the same time ensure
the matter.

No. 3328351. The Cunningham T. Gordon Highlanders, attached M. M. I. A., having been duly sworn, states: On Sunday 15th July I went in a truck driven by Rpm. Davidson when I was recognised with W. Col. Holman and Capt. Lamb to Inverness. We arrived about 1300 hrs. and before we left the truck W. Col. Holman told us to be back at the spot when he left us at 1800 hrs. When the officers had left Rpm. Davidson tried to start the truck to go to the car-park. It would not start until it

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had been parked by the truck behind. On the car. Park was left the truck in charge of another police and went to bed. About 1445 hrs. Again. Davidson left me to return to the truck. I followed about 1500 hrs. but could find neither Davidson nor the truck. I searched around to see if the truck had been parked somewhere else but failed to find it. Lt. Paul Wilson and Sgt. Lamb returned at approx. 1800 hrs. and I reported to them. Again. Davidson and I sleep in the same room alone: C. West. on m. 1. A. I did not see him again until approx. 2200 hrs. on 17th July.

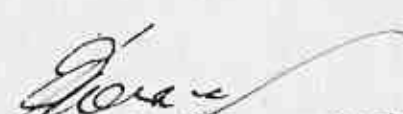
