(b) Units disbanding did not render a return to this HQ before disbandment.
(c) Individual returns were, in some cases, sent direct to GHQ.
(d) Units drawing rations for smaller units counted than in their totals; these smaller units should be placed on a separate return, and shown as drawing through the parent unit.

1. Queries have been raised in regard to the cooking element of the cooked ration repayment rate and free ration entitlement of ORs.

2. The cooking element of one shilling will be charged for each full ration provided. For example: an OR's wife draws 12 rations per 14 days, of which 7 are free and 5 subject to repayment. The total recovery in this case will be twenty two shillings and ten pence, made up of twelve shillings for cooking plus ten shillings and ten pence for rations.

PAYMENT FOR GAS, ELECTRICITY AND SOLID OR LIQUID FUEL

41. Consequent upon the introduction of the new pay code married Officers and CRs occupying married quarters will be required to pay for Fuel and Light w.e.f. 1 July 46.
42. Solid and Liquid Fuel may be purchased from military stocks.
43. As rates of marriage allowance are universal, purchases of Fuel and Light will for the present be charged for at the following flat rates (applicable to both home and overseas stations)

(a) Coal.....	64 shillings per ton
(b) Coke.....	70 shillings "

44. Rates for Wood and Kerosene will be notified later. Wood for kindling purposes will remain free issue on present scales.

45. Unit Commanders and Military Managers of Married Family Hotels will be responsible for raising all charges.

46. The following procedure will be followed : 1414

(a) GAS and ELECTRICITY

Where meters are installed they will be read on (or as soon after as possible) 1 July 46, and thereafter on the first day of each month. Units will maintain a record of all meter readings and a card showing monthly readings will be attached to each meter. Debit vouchers will be raised in accordance with the terms of Para 43 above. Where no meters are installed, or in hotels, persons occupying quarters will be advised that charges for Gas and Electricity will be included in Rental when notified.

(b) SOLID OR LIQUID FUEL

(b) Debit Vouchers will be raised in accordance with the terms of Para 43 above, or where applicable at rates to be notified later.

(c) Occupants of quarters in hotels will be advised that their rental will include an element to cover solid or liquid fuel.

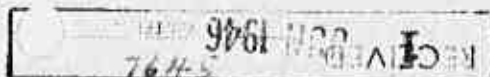

1. In future it is requested that all indents for items which are not held in DADOS Dump Rome or Foligno are only submitted to cover emergency requirements only. (See DADOS Circ. No. 12 Appendix "B").
2. RASC & H&M W/Shops please note that future indents for M.T. spares should be submitted to this office and should be only for emergency requirements. 2 months supplies are already held.
3. These indents must be marked "Emergency Requirements" in red and full reasons for the demand must be given.
4. Care should be taken to ensure that indents are properly prepared with section and part number and only one item is submitted on each indent.
5. Items held in DADOS Dumps will be issued as heretofore. Units must be prepared to accept reductions in their demands and only actual requirements should be indented for.
6. Because AFG 1098 permits of any item or items, it does not necessarily follow that these items will be issued.
