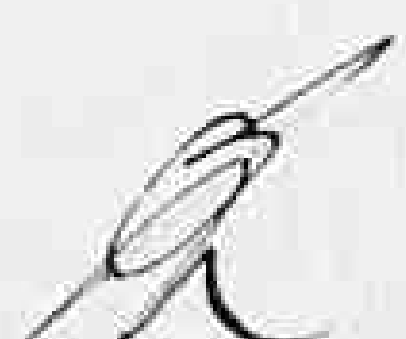

1. The villa "GILARDONI" is situated in SANTA MARINELLA, approx 40 miles north of ROME on Route 1.
2. The villa will be run by the following committee:-
Maj. BYATT - Capt. HYDE - Capt. PACINI
3. It will be ready for occupation for 30 April.
4. Beds are provided but officers must take their own bedding and personal kit.
5. Rations will be taken from ROME by arrangement with Camp Comdts RM and US.
6. Table wine will be provided but officers wishing for anything else must take it with them.
7. The period of the visit will be from after dinner to after dinner.
8. Approx 3 officers can be accommodated at any one time.
9. Each Friday at the morning conference, one member of the committee will produce the Roster for the week commencing the following Monday. Officers will enter their names under the day on which they propose visiting the villa. The Roster will at all times be kept in Maj. Byatt's office for future entries.
10. Some 30 officers voted in favour of the villa and they will be asked to subscribe Lire 100 each to cover initial expenses. Any balance at the end of the season will be divided among 488 Subscribers. Subscriptions should be handed to Capt. Hyde. There will be a maintenance charge of 50 Lire per month for those officers using the villa.
11. An attendance book will be kept by the NCO in charge. Expenses incurred for wine, fish, vegetables etc will be divided at the end of each month in the ratio of the number of meals taken at the villa. These amounts will be collected through the various mess bills.

12. The accounts will be kept by the NCO in charge, but supervised by a member of the committee.
