With reference to the attached letter from MMIA.

1. DDT will control flies, mosquitoes, sandfly, fleas, Tsetse Fly, ticks bed bugs, cockroaches, termites (white ant) midge and stored product pests, i.e., weevil, moth etc.
2. Scabies is caused by the itch mite (*Sarcoptes scabiei*), which is not a carrier of disease, but by irritation of its burrowing in the skin gives rise to irritation and indirectly to boils and other skin infections as a result of scratching.
3. It can only be passed from one person to another by close contact.
4. Lt. Col J.P.M. DONNELLY RAAC, a former DADM of this HQ and afterwards ADH HQ 3 District maintained that Scabies could not be passed on from an infected person by the use of the same blankets, unless these were still warm from body contact.
5. It is unlikely that blankets are being used in ROME at the present time but it is understood that MMIA have a villa near FREGENE at which the blankets may be used by all and may be used in a condition outlined in para

3. It can only be passed from one person to another by close contact.
4. Lt. Col J.P.M. DONNELLY RAMC, a former DADH of this HQ and afterwards ADH HQ 3 District maintained that Scabies could not be passed on from an infected person by the use of the same blankets, unless these were still warm from body contact.
5. It is unlikely that blankets are being used in HOME at the present time but it is understood that MMIA have a villa near FREGENE at which the bedding may be used by all and may be used in a condition outlined in para 4 above.
6. It is hoped that full malaria precautions are being carried out at this villa in FREGENE.
7. In conclusion the fact that the Eliseo Hotel is not clean is a unit responsibility.

SUBJECT: Venereal DiseaseTO : List "B" British

I draw attention to my letter No. 26A1 dated 12 AUG 44.

Unfortunately the incidence of VD in Rome is still unduly high, and I again call upon officers commanding units to make every effort to combat this menace.

There are some units which over a long period have a very good record in this respect, while others unhappily continue to show high returns. The inference to be drawn is clear, and I must warn unit commanders that failure to discharge their responsibilities will be severely regarded.

The first measure is education. I am of the opinion that lectures by medical officers are of no more value than lectures by responsible regimental officers who master their subject and have the confidence of their men.

Men should have it impressed upon them that sexual intercourse outside marriage is neither necessary, nor in 99% of cases, beneficial. It is unnecessary for me to emphasize the moral considerations. I would, however, stress the fact that our civilization is based on family loyalty, without which we shall be undone. It will appeal to many men to be reminded that to contract a preventable disease, and to divert medical officers and orderlies from more profitable work is a poor way to help their country in its great effort.

Reduction in the amount of sexual intercourse then is the true answer, and in this connection officers should be reminded of their responsibilities to encourage men to stay in their unit lines by providing recreation and facilities for relaxation at home. Entertainment and Welfare institutions are now provided on such a scale in Rome that there is really no need for men to be at a loose end in the streets, and in a sense in the case of units quartered at a distance from

regimental officers who master their subject and have the confidence of their men.

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When this first line of attack fails, men must be told that if they expose themselves to infection, it is their duty to resort to a prophylaxis. Unit commanders have the responsibility to ensure that adequate supplies of prophylactics are available to their units and that ET rooms are provided.

Further, there will be an element of compulsion. An order will be published by all units that all men who expose themselves to infection will apply preventative measures and will obtain and retain a certificate that they have done so. Any man who contracts VD and is unable to produce such a certificate, will be dealt with for disobedience of this order.

Appended are particulars of the lines to be followed in so far as concerns the method of procuring these certificates.

It will be explained that the purpose of this order is not to cause embarrassment, but to maintain the manpower of our Army, and the health of our nation, by employing all means to eliminate preventable diseases.

APPENDIX "A"COMV

1. All other tanks, before and after intercourse with a woman, will carry out the directions on their EP packets. They will visit the Pro Station (PA Centre) and make use of its facilities. There are 10 American and 2 British Pro Stations (PA Centres) located in Rome City. It is such installation is immediately available they will proceed to, and use, the EP Room provided by their units.
2. Pro Stations (PA Centres) MUST be used whenever possible and as soon as possible after intercourse. EP Rooms are not as efficient and should only be used when it is not practicable to visit the former.
3. Every individual who reports for treatment at a British PA Centre will enter his regimental number and unit in a register kept by the NCO i/c for that purpose. Each entry will be given a serial number and the user will receive a printed slip (COM Form 18), copy attached, certifying that he has used No. "X" PA Centre, and bearing the serial number.
4. Every individual who reports for treatment at an American Pro Station (PA Centre) will likewise insert his regimental number and unit in a register kept for the purpose, and will receive a Prophylactic Certificate, copy attached, certifying that he has used the Pro Station.
5. Every individual who for any reason cannot use a Pro Station (PA Centre) but has to fall back on a unit EP Room will likewise be registered as having attended there under arrangements to be made by the unit concerned.
6. Disciplinary action will be taken against any individual without exception who contracts VD, and who fails to produce the prescribed certificate that he has taken preventative measures after intercourse with a woman.
7. Where units are able to provide a guard or Orderly NCO, the following procedure will be adopted. Any soldier below Warrant rank, on return to his unit lines, must when returning from duty, will report to the Guard Room or Orderly NCO. The Guard Commander or Orderly NCO will ascertain the man's sobriety. He will interrogate any man under the influence of alcohol, as to whether he has had intercourse with a woman, and if so, whether he has used a PA Centre. A NCO will be interrogated by one of at least equal rank.

6. Disciplinary action will be taken against any individual without exception who contravenes VD, and who fails to produce the prescribed certificate that he has taken preventative measures after intercourse with a woman.

7. Where units are able to provide a guard or Orderly NCO, the following procedure will be adopted. Any soldier below Warrant rank, on return to his unit lines, except when returning from duty, will report to the Guard Room or Orderly NCO. The Guard Commander or Orderly NCO will ascertain the man's sobriety. He will interrogate any man under the influence of alcohol, as to whether he has had intercourse with a woman, and if so, whether he has used a PA Centro. A NCO will be interrogated by one of at least equal rank.

8. Any man so interrogated, who is found not to have used a PA Centro after intercourse, will be immediately taken to the ET Room. This is to ensure that any man, who, under the influence of alcohol, has had intercourse with a woman, and who therefore may have omitted to use a PA Centro receives treatment at an ET Room at the earliest opportunity.

9. ET packets and condoms will be not available under unit arrangements. They will also be automatically replaced at PA Centres.

SUBJECT: HealthTO : Distribution "R" BritishFor the attention of all Officers Commanding

The present is a time when unless we are very careful those of us who are still serving in ITALY may see a decided deterioration of health. The reasons for this I will touch on later but I wish to bring attention of all Commanding Officers to the following points.

VENEREAL DISEASES A letter was addressed to all officers commanding units on the 20th March 1946 by the G.O.C. No. 3 District. This letter fully summarizes the present situation. In this connection I should like to draw attention to a letter issued from this Headquarters so long ago as September 1944, a copy of which is attached for the benefit of those units which were not at that time in the Area and may not have received it. Though circumstances have changed to a great extent since then, and though it is not in every detail still applicable, most of its contents still hold good and, in particular, the instruction contained in paragraph 8 is still to be regarded as effective in ROMEO and centres under Command of Rome Area.

Unfortunately it is the case that the rate of venereal disease is appreciably higher in ROMEO and elsewhere than it was a year ago, and the reduction in the numbers of troops stationed in the Area has not been reflected by a proportionate fall in the numbers of cases of V.D.

During the last two years in ROMEO it has been my invariable ex-

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During the last two years in ROME it has been my invariable experience whenever a unit has arrived new to ROME, three weeks later there has been a regrettable rise in the incidence. There have been no exceptions. The fact of the matter is that ROME and its women look so clean that the newcomer is lulled into a sense of false security. The U.D.F. in a campaign launched last year against V.D. made use of the following catch:

" IF SHE LIES YOU DO IN THE CHANGES ARE

SHE'S LET OTHERS DO IT:

IF SHE DOES IT, THE CHANGES ARE

SHE'S GOT IT,

AND YOU'VE HAD IT"

Grado no doubt, but unfortunately only too true. To an extent probably greater than they themselves realize, the cure for this state of affairs lies in the efforts of regimental officers, and I make a special appeal that everybody will do all that they can to reduce this evil which is still growing.

CAUTIONS. Medical reports generally throughout the theatre appear to indicate that there has been a noticeable deterioration in the standard of personal cleanliness, skin infection, due to uncleanness are increasingly common, and body-lice infestation is more frequent. There can be no valid reason for this state of affairs which can only be due to weakness in administration. Commanding Officers must make special efforts

both to ensure that all units have frequent opportunities for bathing and undergo frequent medical inspections.

IMMUNITAL DISEASES This is the season in which an increase may be expected of diseases of this character. In some ways it may be that the danger may be greater than in other years with the increase of tempting looking foods in Italian homes. Attention should be warned. Attention is directed to WHO 345 measures published, which prescribe the preventive measures which should be taken.

I realize fully too well the difficulties. Shortage of officers, particularly those with long surgical experience. Release happiness and consequently a very natural tendency to lose interest, and many others. I personally recall that during the period in the months that followed the last war there was a similar deterioration of personal cleanliness and consequent increase of disease. It must be our care that we make all the effort of which we are capable to see that this does not occur again. It is really too bad if a man who has been abroad for years during the war should, on the eve of release from the Army, fall a victim to a preventable and possibly serious disease.
