NOTICE BOARD INFORMATIC.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU SHOULD READ THIS

107. Retention of Acting Rank or Lance Appointments by soldiers who are wounded in action or sustain injuries due to Army service.

1. From 1st July, 1944, soldiers holding paid acting rank or paid lance appointments who become absent from duty as a result of wounds or injuries due to army service may retain such acting rank or lance appointments for a period of four months from the date of being wounded in action or sustaining injury due to army service or until posted to a unit or formation to fill an authorized vacancy in a War Establishment, whichever is the shorter period. **Acting rank so retained will reckon towards the qualifying period for war substantive rank.** A lance-serjeant will reckon the period of retention of his appointment towards the war substantive rank of corporal.

2. Soldiers who on 1st July, 1944, were already retaining an acting rank or lance appointment under the terms of Army Order 70 of 1941 (which allowed retention of paid acting rank or lance appointment by soldiers wounded in action for a maximum period of three months) **will now be entitled to claim one further month, i.e., a total of four months from the date of being wounded, or the period until posted to a specific vacancy in the War Establishment of a unit or formation, whichever is the earlier.**

3. Previously acting rank retained under Army Order 70 of 1941 by soldiers wounded in action did not count towards conversion to war substantive rank, but **it has been decided that any periods during which acting rank (or the paid appointment of lance-serjeant) was retained under Army Order 70 of 1941, will now be allowed to count for the purpose of converting an acting rank held on or after 1st July, 1944, into war substantive rank.** Therefore, if by reckoning any period or periods before 1st July, 1944, during which you retained acting rank or the paid appointment of lance-serjeant you qualify to convert an acting rank held on or after 1st July, 1944, to war substantive rank **you should inform your present C.O.** stating the period or periods of retention of acting rank or appointment of paid lance-serjeant which you claim will give you sufficient qualifying service to convert an acting rank held after 1st July, 1944, into war substantive rank. **No case will be considered unless you make a claim.**

4. A soldier who had already relinquished or should have relinquished acting rank or lance appointment before 1st July, 1944, will not be allowed to make a claim for reinstatement.

There will always be enough fuel for cooking, and for drying your wet clothes.

Use all the coal dust you can once the fire is going. Add it to the fire carefully — don't chuck it on in heaps and put the fire out.

2. In the case of Civilian Hospitals and Clinics the procedure outlined above will govern except that applications will be submitted to Public Health Division, AMG, for screening prior to submission to Engineer Section, RAAC.

3. Each application for electrical current will contain the following information:

- a. Name, location and street number of building.
- b. Purpose for which current is to be used.
- c. Amount of current required.
- d. Time of day current will be required.

Subject: Purchase of Charcoal and Fuel Wood.

To : All Allied Units in Rome Allied Area Command.

1. There is at the present in the city of Rome a large civilian demand for Charcoal and Fuel Wood because of the shortage of gas and electricity.

2. Due to the shortage of transport facilities the quantity of Charcoal and Fuel Wood in the city of Rome is barely sufficient for civilian needs.

3. Individuals, units or agencies of the Allied Armed Forces will not purchase or requisition either of these items, in or around Rome, without authorization of the G-4 Section, Rome Allied Area Command.
