1. For some months past this HQ has been effecting the replacement of 'A' Medical Category Personnel serving with certain X(1) List Units.
2. At the moment the withdrawal of personnel up to 25 years of age of Infantry, R.A., R.A.G., and R. Sig., in which Arms there was, and still is, a certain shortage of Manpower, is receiving particular attention. Replacements are drawn from Low Medical Category or Psycho-Morose Personnel who have passed through one of the Army Selection Centres.
3. All personnel used as replacement possess qualifications similar to those men they are intended to replace, or, they have been specially trained with an operating Unit and mastered, or recommended for mastering, by a technical Officer of the Arm to which they were being posted.

MEDICAL CATEGORIES FOR OTHER RANKS, 1944

A.C.I. 702 of 1943, the pamphlet "Medical Categories for Other Ranks, 1943," notified therein and all amendments thereto are hereby cancelled and the following instructions substituted. New matter which was not included in the previous pamphlet or the amendments thereto is shown by a black line in the margin.

PART I

1. The following medical categories will be used for all purposes in describing the degree of fitness for service of all soldiers. Every soldier will be told the category in which he has been placed. His original category and any subsequent changes will be published in Part II or Part III Orders and entered in his A.B. 64 (Part I), A.F. B 103 and on his Medical History Sheet, Part V (A.F. B 178 or 178A).

2. The army categories to be employed (subject to Notes below) are as follows:—

Note 1:—

Column (3) is intended to apply, in general, to all arms. All men permanently attached within the War Establishment of a *field force unit* authorized to hold personnel of medical category "A" only, will be found from the "A" Group of medical categories. Similarly all men permanently attached within the War Establishment of a *field force unit* authorized to hold "A" and "B" medical categories will be found from the "A" and "B" Groups of medical categories, subject to the proviso that attached personnel will not be of a lower medical category than that allowed for a *field force unit* within their own particular arm of the service.

All other ranks serving on the strength of a brigade, division or corps headquarters will be of a medical category appropriate to their arm as laid down in para. 6. In the case of a corps headquarters the following employments in addition may be filled by men within the "B" group:—

Batmen orderlies, sanitary duties, general duties and cooks.

Note II:—

The fact that a soldier is 41 years of age or over will be indicated by inserting "X" between the prefix letter A or B and the category number, e.g., AX3, BX5. The distinction will not be made in the case of category C.

3. Army medical categories are taken into consideration by the Ministry of Labour and National Service when making their selections for posting men to the General Service Corps, but no men will be enlisted into the Army in categories B, 7, C, 1 and C, 2; these three categories may be applied only to other ranks already in the Army, i.e., to soldiers who are being regraded. On completion of primary training soldiers will be transferred to a corps depending on their training recommendation, selection group and medical category as ascertained in accordance with para. 13.

4. Attention is directed to A.C.I. 369 of 1943 (as amended by A.C. Is. 1432 of 1943 and 164 of 1944) on "Visual Standards of Men Selected for Training as Tradesmen".

5. The table set out in para. 6 below specifies medical categories permitted for *field force units*, and does not include those authorized for static establishments except where stated. Men in categories lower than the minimum prescribed in para. 6 will be employed in units (at home and abroad) other than field force units on duties for which they are medically fit within the limits prescribed in para. 2, column 3.

All warrant officers, Class I and Class II, and N.C.Os. holding the appointment of Sqn. Q.M.S., B.Q.M.S. or C.Q.M.S., in War Establishments of arms concerned may be of medical category not below A, 3 unless a lower medical category is authorized by Note I to para. 2, or in the tables set out below in this paragraph.

7. Men of visual standard 6 may be employed as drivers only on station duties and will not drive in convoy (see A.C.I. 2054 of 1942).

Men of visual standard 5 will not drive in any circumstances.

8. To assist in the translation of civil medical grades into army categories, the following extracts from "Instructions for the Guidance of Medical Boards under the National Service (Armed Forces) Acts" are reproduced:—

"GRADES.—The four grades are defined in general terms as follows:—

GRADE I.—Men, who, subject only to such minor disabilities as can be remedied or adequately compensated by artificial means, attain the full normal standard of health and strength, and are capable of enduring physical exertion suitable to their age.

GRADE II.—Those who, while suffering from disabilities disqualifying them from Grade I, do not suffer from progressive organic disease, have fair hearing

and vision, are of moderate muscular development, and are able to undergo a considerable amount of physical exertion not involving severe strain. Where a man has been placed in this grade solely on account of either defects of visual acuity or deformities of the lower extremities, or both, in accordance with the directions in the appropriate paragraphs of these instructions, the letter "(a)" followed by the words "vision" or "feet" in brackets will be inserted after the grade, i.e., "Grade II (a) (vision)" or "Grade II (a) (feet)" or "Grade II (a) (vision and feet)."

GRADE III.—Those who present such marked physical disabilities or evidence of past disease that they are not fit for the amount of exertion required for Grade II.

GRADE IV.—Those who suffer from progressive organic disease or are for other reasons permanently incapable of the kind or degree of exertion required for Grade III. These men are unfit for any form of service."

9. (a) The standards of vision of the army categories are based on the standards used by civilian medical boards in the grading of recruits and are reproduced below.

"Visual Standards.—Men will be classified, so far as their visual acuity is concerned, according to the following standards:—

Standard 1.—Unaided vision is not less than 6/6 in one eye and not less than 6/9 in the other.

Standard 2.—Unaided vision is less than in Standard 1, but is either not less than 6/12 in each eye or is not less than 6/6 in the right eye, and not less than 6/36 in the left eye.

Standard 3.—Unaided vision is less than in Standard 2, but vision can be corrected to at least Standard 2.

NOTE.—In those cases where unaided vision is below 6/60 in either eye the man will be referred to an ophthalmologist. If a myopia of more than minus 7 in any meridian is found in either eye and there is not more than minus 2 myopia in any meridian in the other eye, he will be placed in Standard 6; if there is a myopia of more than minus 2 in any meridian in the other eye, he will be placed in Standard 7.

Standard 4.—Unaided vision is less than in Standard 2 and vision cannot be corrected to Standard 2 but can be corrected to at least 6/12 in one eye and to at least 6/36 in the other.

NOTE.—This standard includes those men whose left eye is the "master" eye and whose vision, with or without correction, is not less than 6/12 in the left eye, and not less than 6/36 in the right eye.

Standard 5.—The conditions in Standards 1 to 4 cannot be attained, but vision can be corrected to at least 6/24 in each eye.

Standard 6.—Vision in one eye, with or without glasses, is not less than 6/12, and in the other is less than 6/36 with or without glasses, or has been lost or practically lost and investigation as to the cause of the loss is satisfactory.

Standard 7.—Vision is below Standards 1 to 6.

Grading.—Men whose visual acuity is in Standards 1 to 4 will, so far as eyesight is concerned, be placed in Grade I and those whose visual acuity is in Standards 5 and 6 in Grade II. Those whose visual acuity is in Standard 7 will be placed in Grade IV by civilian recruiting boards. (Men who are placed in Grade II solely because their visual acuity is in Standard 5 or 6 will be graded II (a) (vision))."

(b) The standards of visual acuity for the various army categories will conform to the visual standards of the civil grades in accordance with the table shown in para. 11.

10. (a) The standards of hearing of the army categories are based on the standards used by civilian medical boards in the grading of recruits and are reproduced below:—

(i) Standards of Hearing.—Men will be classified, so far as their hearing is concerned, according to the following standards:—

Standard 1.—A man can hear a soft whisper with each ear separately; when testing the examiner should himself occlude the ear not under test and whisper towards that ear. Where it is considered that failure to reach Standard 1 may be due to the presence of wax, the man will be referred to his practitioner for the removal of the wax and his hearing will be subsequently re-tested.

Standard 2.—Hearing is less than in Standard 1, but the man standing with his back to the examiner and using both ears can hear a forced whisper from 10 feet away.

Standard 3.—Hearing is less than in Standard 2, but the man can easily hear a speaking voice under the conditions specified in Standard 2.

Standard 4.—Hearing is less than in Standard 3. Where hearing is below Standard 1, but the impairment appears to be due to a transitory cause, such as Eustachian catarrh following a cold, the examination should be postponed for an appropriate period.

(ii) Grading.—Men whose hearing is in Standards 1 and 2 will, as far as hearing is concerned, be placed in Grade I. Those who are in Standard 3 will be placed not higher than Grade II, and all those in Standard 4 will be placed in Grade IV."

(b) The standards of hearing for the various army categories will conform to the standards of hearing of the civil grades in accordance with the table shown in para. 11.

11. The chairmen of civilian medical boards have been instructed by the Ministry of Labour and National Service to amplify their remarks on the medical examination of recruits in order to indicate the standards of vision and hearing attained. Amplifying remarks, as shown in col. (2) of the table below, will in future be entered on the Medical Examination Record and History Sheet (N.S. (M.C.) 14, A.F. B.178A).

The term "foot defects" includes the following deformities of the lower extremities, as defined in the Instructions issued for the Guidance of Civilian Medical Boards—club foot, flat feet, hammer toes, hallux rigidus, hallux valgus, knock-knee and pes cavus.

The following table gives the civilian medical board gradings which are shown on the Medical Examination Record and History Sheet (N.S. (M.C.) 14, A.F. B.178A), together with the remarks to be entered on the Medical Examination Record in the space headed "Chairman's Remarks." These two entries will indicate the equivalent army categories.

12. Wherever it is necessary for any purpose to examine a serving soldier with a view to placing him in his appropriate army category, the Instructions for the Guidance of Medical Boards (M.R.B. 1) and the tables in paras. 2 and 11 of this pamphlet will be used to determine the appropriate category.

13. All recruits will be medically classified and available for posting in their true medical categories before the end of their six weeks' period at primary training units.

The medical officer will complete, in duplicate, a nominal roll of the recruits recommended for down grading, recording in addition his opinion regarding the true category in each case. A copy of this nominal roll will be submitted by officers in medical charge to the officer commanding the primary training unit and to the personnel selection officer not later than the 15th day of each intake.

At the same time A.F.B. 179c will be submitted for each recruit recommended for down grading to the A.D.M.S. concerned, who will arrange for examination by a medical board to take place within the first six weeks' training.

Recruits recommended for a period of training at a physical development centre will be sent there during the first fortnight of their primary training, provided vacancies exist.

14. Trivial degrees of "defects of locomotion" or other disabilities which do not or are not likely to interfere with the performance of a soldier's duties should be disregarded in determining medical categories.

It is the degree of the disability and its probable effect on function which is of importance in classification, not the fact that a slight disability exists. For example, the presence of a hammer toe which never has interfered and is unlikely to interfere with a soldier's marching powers should be disregarded.

This principle will be followed both at initial classification and at any subsequent re-classification during a soldier's service.

15. (a) Where an effective soldier is considered to be no longer fit for his present medical category, the officer in medical charge of the unit will (except as noted in sub-para. (b)) complete Part I of A.F. B 179c. A.F. B 179c will be submitted to the A.D.M.S. concerned, who will assemble a medical board and pass the army form to the President of the Board for completion of Part II, if the man is considered by the board to be fit for a medical category not below C. Specialist advice will be obtained where necessary to assist the board in forming an opinion.

(b) In cases of optical defect, the officer in medical charge of the unit will arrange for the man to be examined by the specialist, who will place the man in his appropriate medical category and record the same on the specialist report. A.F. B 179c will not be used in these cases, but the specialist report will be returned to the man's unit for action by the O.C. in accordance with para. 18 below.

(c) Where the medical board or specialist in ophthalmology considers that the man should be placed in category E, the subsequent compilation of A.F. B 179 and the procedure laid down in Regulations for the Medical Services of the Army, 1938, paras. 527 *et seq.*, as amplified by the "Guide to Discharge Procedure," will be followed.

(d) An officer in medical charge of effective troops will be the authority and will be responsible for transferring an effective soldier to a higher category as soon as he considers him fit for such. Specialist advice will be obtained where necessary.

(e) In all cases where the category is altered, the medical officer authorizing the alteration will record it in A.B. 64 (Part D and A.F. B 178 or 178A (Part V) and will notify the O.C. the unit with which the soldier is serving in order that he may comply with para. 18 below.

16. A soldier will retain his army medical category on transfer or posting to another unit. If the medical category in which he has been transferred or posted is not known, the O.C. the unit to which the soldier has been transferred or posted will take immediate steps to ascertain it. Except to place him in a higher medical category, no re-classification of a soldier immediately he joins a unit will be permitted.

17. Pending posting orders from the officer i/c records concerned, those soldiers re-classified in a lower category will remain with their present units, or home details in the case of units under mobilization orders.

18. A soldier's medical category on joining the Army (see para. 13) and any recategorization (see para. 15) will be published in Part II/III Orders and will be recorded in A.B. 64 (Part I), Medical History Sheet (A.F. B 178 or 178A) (Part V) and on A.F. B 103.

In the case of men serving with an expeditionary force, the 2nd Echelon will publish the casualties referred to above in Part II Orders, and will be responsible for making the appropriate entry on A.F. B 103.

These Part II/III Orders will be in the following terms:—

19. Officers i/c records will maintain a record on A.F. B 102 of each soldier's medical category in order to enable them to supply information, as and when required, of the numbers in each of the medical categories.

20. The re-classification of soldiers in hospital will be carried out in accordance with the instructions in Part II of this pamphlet.

21. Attention is directed to A.C.I. 1203 of 1942 (as amended by A.C.I. 2141 of 1942 and A.C.I. 242 of 1943), on the "Provision of personnel for units mobilizing and drafts preparing for service overseas."

22. In order to maintain as far as possible the correct classification, the medical categories of all other ranks below A. 1 will be reviewed every three months if possible. In case of necessity this period may be extended to six months, in accordance with A.C.I. 315 of 1944.

PART II

Instructions for the re-classification of soldiers in military hospitals and convalescent depots

23. Whenever a soldier is NON-effective on account of sickness, he is "temporarily unfit—category D," whether in or out of hospital, and unless a man is under medical care he will not be considered to be in category D.

It is unnecessary to publish in Part II/III Orders or to record in a man's documents that he is in category D.

It will be necessary, however, to re-classify a soldier, at the conclusion of an ailment which has made him temporarily unfit, if his physical condition is such as to render him no longer fit for the medical category in which he was placed before the onset of the ailment.

24. Should re-classification be necessary in the case of a soldier who has been in hospital for 21 days or less, it will be initiated by the officer in medical charge of the unit to which the soldier reports on discharge from hospital.

25. Should re-classification to a category not lower than C2 be necessary in the case of a soldier who has been in hospital more than 21 days, it will be carried out in accordance with the instructions in the following table:—

26. Where it is considered that the soldier should be placed in category E, the procedure laid down in current regulations for discharge on medical grounds will be followed. (See the pamphlet "Army Discharge Procedure (Revised), 1943," notified in A.C.I. 1858 of 1943.)

APPENDIX

NOTES ON ARMY MEDICAL CATEGORIES

1. In order to distribute the available man power economically among the needs of varying army duties, it is necessary to take into consideration the varying physical attributes of the men available.

The following "characteristics" are of use in classifying men into groups according to their physical efficiency as soldiers:—

- (a) "Constitution."—Without defining this term too closely it may be said that freedom from organic disease, soundness of heart and lungs and adequate mental and muscular development combine to produce those qualities in a soldier which enable him to *withstand severe strain*.
- (b) *Keeness of vision.*
- (c) *Keeness of hearing.*
- (d) *Ability to march.*

2. The individual soldier in any army medical category exhibits to some degree all the above-noted characteristics, but the degree to which the several characteristics are present in individuals may vary.

The army medical categories are groups of soldiers in which individuals exhibiting one or more characteristics to a *similar degree* are placed in the same category.

DEGREES OF CHARACTERISTICS.

3. "Constitution."—Three degrees of "constitution" are made use of in the army categories and these degrees correspond to the constitutional elements of the Civilian Medical Board Grades I, II and III:—

*Army Standard.**Civilian Grades.**First degree.*

With only minor (remediable) disabilities, can undergo severe strain.

I.—Men who, subject only to such minor disabilities as can be remedied or adequately compensated by artificial means, attain full normal standard of health and strength, and are capable of enduring physical exertion suitable to their age.

Second degree.

With moderate degree of disabilities, can undergo considerable exertion not involving severe strain.

II.—Those who, while suffering from disabilities disqualifying them from Grade I, do not suffer from progressive organic disease, have fair hearing and vision, are of moderate muscular development and are able to undergo a considerable amount of physical exertion not involving severe strain.

Third degree.

Marked physical disabilities or evidence of past disease.

III.—Those who present such marked physical disabilities or evidence of past disease that they are not fit for the amount of exertion required for Grade II.

4. The following table shows army categories in relation to "constitution":—

A. 1, A. 2, A. 3, A. 4, A. 5	...	Men of first degree constitution.
B. 1, B. 2, B. 2a, B. 5	...	Men of second degree constitution.
B. 6	...	Men of first or second degree constitution with defective hearing.
B. 7	...	Men of first or second degree constitution with marked defects of locomotion.
C.	...	Men of third degree constitution are placed in this category.

In the case of category C personnel the medical officer must use his own discretion regarding overseas employment, referring any cases of doubt to the appropriate specialist. The following general indications will serve as guiding principles:—

C. 1—Men of first or second degree constitution and fit for a higher category but for very marked defects of locomotion or other physical defects which will not be aggravated by service overseas: with visual standards 1-6, hearing standards 1-3.

C. 2—(a) Men of third degree constitution with visual standards 1-6, hearing standards 1-3; or
(b) Men fit for a higher category but who suffer from a disability which will be aggravated by service overseas.

All men placed in category C on account of psychiatric disability will be classified as C. 2, and can be upgraded only on the recommendation of a specialist in psychiatry.

5. *Keeness of vision—Visual standards.*—The Civilian Medical Boards examine men for all three Services and the varying requirements of these (for their specialized duties) have necessitated what is apparently a plethora of standards. Army requirements can be met by three standards:—

- (a) Able to see to shoot (using the right eye), and to drive.
- (b) Able to see to drive.
- (c) Able to see for ordinary purposes (excluding shooting and driving).

Note I:—

Recruits placed in V.S. 7 by a Civilian Medical Board are made Grade IV, the Army equivalent of which is medical category E, and are rejected for service. A soldier already serving, however, will not be placed in medical category E for the sole reason that he is found to be V.S. 7. Higher degrees of myopia than those laid down for recruits in the note following the definition of visual standard 3 (para. 9) may be retained in the service. All soldiers who require visual correction of the following types or degree will be placed in medical category C. 2:—

- (a) A spherical correction of more than plus or minus 12.00 dioptres.
- (b) A total spherocylindrical correction of more than plus or minus 12.00 dioptres.
- (c) Any correction incorporating a cylindrical correction of more than 6.00 dioptres.
- (d) A prismatic correction.

Note II:—

Any man who has to wear spectacles for the efficient performance of his duties and who suffers from nickel dermatitis will be classified as medical category C. 2.

6. The following table correlates army categories with visual standards:—

- A. 1, A. 2, B. 1, B. 2, B. 7 (see to shoot and drive) = Visual Standards 1, 2 or 3.
A. 3, B. 2a (see to drive) = Visual Standard 4.
A. 4, A. 5, B. 5 (see for ordinary purposes) = Visual Standards 5 or 6.

Note.—B. 6, C = Visual Standards 1 to 6; men are placed in these categories for causes other than visual defects.

7. *Keeness of hearing—Hearing standards.*—The existence of three standards of hearing enables men of the keenest hearing to be picked out if required for special duties while ensuring that all men in the higher categories have good hearing.

Men with defective hearing who are otherwise fit to serve are placed in a separate category.

8. The following are the relations between army categories and hearing standards:—

Note.—

C.—Hearing standards 1 to 3; men are placed in this category for causes other than hearing defects.

9. *Ability to march.*—The presence of certain deformities of the lower extremities may interfere with the ability to march. Such defects are flat feet, club foot, hammer toes, hallux rigidus, hallux valgus, knock knee, and pes cavus.

The degree of disablement caused by the above deformities determines the grade in which a man is placed by the Civilian Medical Board and reference should be made to the pamphlet Instructions for the Guidance of Medical Boards (M.R.B. 1) on this point.

Where such defects are absent or if present do not cause disablement, the man is considered to be "without defects of locomotion."

Where deformities of the lower extremities cause a degree of disablement which necessitates a man being placed in "Grade II (a) (feet)" by a Civilian Medical Board, the man is considered to have "*slight defects of locomotion*."

Where the deformity causes more marked disablement such as would necessitate a man being placed in Grade III, he is considered to have "*marked defects of locomotion*."

10. The three standards of defects of locomotion enter into the army categories as follows:—

A. 1, A. 4, B. 1	Without defects of locomotion.
A. 2, A. 5, B. 2	With <i>slight</i> defects of locomotion.
A. 3, B. 2a, B. 5, B. 6	May be without defects or may have <i>slight</i> defects of locomotion.
B. 7	Every man in this category has a marked defect of locomotion.
C. 1	A man with a more advanced defect of locomotion than B. 7 who may have associated defects of vision and/or hearing, i.e., V.S. 1-6; H.S. 1-3.
C. 2	A man with a more advanced defect of locomotion than B. 7 who may have associated defects of vision and/or hearing, i.e., V.S. 1-6, H.S. 1-3, and/or other physical defects and/or psychiatric condition liable to be aggravated by service overseas.

ANALYSIS OF ARMY MEDICAL CATEGORIES.

11. The present army medical categories are combinations therefore of varying degrees of "constitution," visual acuity, hearing acuity and "ability to march."

Read in conjunction with the foregoing remarks, the following analyses of the army medical categories are intended to assist medical officers in placing men in their correct categories.

12. A. 1	...	First degree constitutionally; no foot defects; V.S. 1 to 3; H.S. 1 or 2.
A. 2	...	Is an A. 1 man except that he has <i>slight</i> foot defects.
B. 1	...	Second degree constitutionally; no foot defects; V.S. 1 to 3; H.S. 1 or 2.
B. 2	...	Is a B. 1 man except that he has <i>slight</i> foot defects.
A. 3	...	First degree constitutionally; V.S. 4; H.S. 1 or 2; slight foot defects may be present.
B. 2a	...	Second degree constitutionally; otherwise as for A. 3.
A. 4	...	First degree constitutionally; no foot defects; H.S. 1 or 2; V.S. 5 or 6, i.e., too low for shooting or driving but sufficient for ordinary purposes.
A. 5	...	Is an A. 4 man except that he has <i>slight</i> foot defects.
B. 5	...	Second degree constitutionally; V.S. 5 or 6; H.S. 1 or 2; <i>slight</i> foot defects may be present.
B. 6	...	Has defective (standard 3) hearing; is otherwise suitable for a higher category.
B. 7	...	First or second degree constitutionally; V.S. 1, 2 or 3; H.S. 1 or 2; marked defect of locomotion is present.
C. 1	...	Men fit for a higher category except for marked foot defects or other physical defects which will not be aggravated by service overseas; with V.S. 1 to 6; H.S. 1 to 3.
C. 2	...	Men of third degree constitution with V.S. 1 to 6; H.S. 1 to 3, or men fit for a higher category but who suffer from some disability which will be aggravated by service overseas.
