MEDICAL STORES.

Italian Medical Stores, BELLARIO, closed for the receipt of stores on 28th February 1946. All captured stores still to be checked were transferred to the Medical Stores at PLACERON. All concerned have been informed of the change of location of this medical store.

The Swiss Medical Plant has been handed back to the Italian Government. A start has been made in transferring drugs and machinery to PLACERON, - 40 truckloads received out of about 400 due.

Arrangements have been made whereby all medical stores released to USARPA in CARPINA are to be returned to PLACERON.

Complaints from the War Ministry regarding shortage of R.D.I. and condoms resulted in an arrangement whereby they can be purchased from Italian firms.

During March 25 tons of medical stores passed through the Central Depot of Medical Stores. Approximately 100 tons still outstanding. Vouchers for 30 tons, as R.D.I., etc., received during month.

MEDICAL STORES IN SWISS PLANT.

Reported reports of non-availability of Penicillin from Italian sources have been received. The War Ministry were instructed to make every endeavour to obtain this item locally, (LUGANO, etc.), but as yet have been unsuccessful.

A list of drugs in urgent need which cannot be obtained from Italian sources was presented at the ARHQ conference held on the 18th, - Penicillin was included in this list.

VISITS.

Captain STUBBS visited PLACERON from 4th to 8th March 1946 for the purpose of arranging accommodation for personnel and un-checked captured stores arriving from BELLARIO.

Lt. B.D.M.S., accompanied by A.D.S.E. on his inspection of the Food Store at PLACERON on 22nd and 23rd March 1946. A.D.S.E. also visited all the Medical Establishments in ROSS on the 27th.

MEDICAL STORES

Ministry of War has notified us that the agreed hand over of medical stores to U.N.R.R.A. in SARONELLA has been completed. U.N.R.R.A. are arranging to hand over similar items on the Mainland.

The Italian Central Depot of Medical Stores at MACILLANA is being transferred to FLORENCE, closing at MACILLANA on 28 Feb and re-opening at the ISTITUTO CHIRURGICO-PARACLINICO, FLORENCE on 1st March. A staff is being retained temporarily at MACILLANA to check and despatch remaining stocks.

During February 50 tons of medical stores passed through the Depot.

During February 100 tons of medical stores were still outstanding at the end of the month.

During the month advice notes for a further 10 tons of medical stores were received.

In addition to the above, GHQ have asked the Ministry of War to accept a further 100 tons (approx) from the East Africa Command.

MEDICAL UNITS

Nos. 83 and 91 Italian Evacuation Hospitals have been reduced to the status of a C.R.S. during the month. Both these units are being disbanded shortly as they are considered redundant.

HEALTH NOTES

The anti-malarial campaign for the Italian Army for 1946 was taken up with the War Ministry. They propose to spray all military barracks in malarious areas with DDT (if available). All Commanders and DDMS of Territorial Commands have been sent a list of anti-malarial precautions which have to be carried out before the 1st April 46. These precautions are on the same lines as ours. A further directive is being issued by the Ministry of War as the malarious season approaches.

At 31 January 10,769 beds were equipped and 6,470 occupied.

During January 1,423 sick ex-POW were repatriated from England and Dominions. Most of these were disembarked at TARANTO and were admitted to civilian hospitals for further treatment.

MEDICAL STORES

The Medical Stores Depot at MACILARA continues to receive captured Italian stores from GAF, NEF and East Africa Command. During the month some 100 tons of stores have been passed through this Depot, including 25 million tablets of Atobrine from NEF. Approximately 120 tons of stores on invoice are still awaited and a further 45 tons of stores in invoices have been added to this list during the month.

In the meanwhile the Italians are anxious to close the Depot at MACILARA as soon as this can be done and continue its activities in FLORINCE.

News has been received that Lt-Col. SCOTT, Pharmacist of the Italian Medical Services has gone to NEFANG for the preliminary work prior to hand over of the German manufacturing plant and medical stores depot to the Italian Government, and which is expected to take place towards the end of next month.

PERSONNEL

At the 28 Committee meeting held at CASPIA on 11 Jan it was decided that, subject to War Office approval, the appointment of AMLG to this HQ be downgraded to DATES and that 1 Sgt Dispenser RAMP be added to the increment to this WE (CE/1111/2).

Capt. L.J. HAWLEY, RAMP arrived at this HQ on 25 Jan 46 to assume the appointment of DATES and Lt-Col. JACOB left this HQ on 1 Feb 46 on posting to 137 Field Ambulance.

Two Sgts R.O., held on strength of the Depot on GEN 023 authority went home on release on 17 Jan 46 and will not be replaced.

I. "Operational" Picture

- (a) On 15th November 1945, the Italian Army including the Combat Divisions and less certain RE-IT and US-IT units, were transferred to the control of the Italian Government. With this hand-over, the Italian Government became responsible for the provision of their own supplies - medical stores, comforts, food, etc. from indigenous resources, surplus disposal agencies and the civil import programme.
