On 6 April 1947 all combined American British Staff Section of AFHQ, with exception of the G-5 Section, moved from Caserta Italy to Leghorn Italy. The combined G-5 Section of AFHQ moved to Rome, Italy the same date and assumed all residual functions of the former Allied Commission and later of the Liaison and Civil Affairs Branch (LACAB). Only a Liaison Officer of G-5 AFHQ is physically located in Leghorn. Use of term "Lacab" and "Lacab G-5" as telegraphic address for the G-5 Section AFHQ in Rome has caused some confusion and delay in delivery of messages due to the fact that the term "Lacab" indicated no relationship to AFHQ particularly to addressees outside of Italy.

Effective 0010 20 May 1947, the use of the term "Lacab" or "G-5 Lacab" as telegraphic addresses for G-5 Section AFHQ will be discontinued. The same date hour, "G-5 Section AFHQ Rome" will be the only authorized telegraphic address used for that organization. All messages for Agencies in Rome other than for G-5 Section AFHQ which were formerly addressed to "Lacab" or "in care of Lacab" will be addressed to Rome Area Allied Command for delivery. All addressees are requested to include "G-5 Section AFHQ" as would normally require the attention of G-5 AFHQ for information or action. This procedure will permit such messages to be automatically transmitted to Rome for G-5 AFHQ and AFHQ Leghorn simultaneously and thus expedite coordination and action on replies. For action to G-5 Section AFHQ only, G-5 Section AFHQ Rome will include AFHQ Leghorn as action or information addressee on messages which they originate and which formerly required Staff distribution in AFHQ.

Subject: New location of the Mantova and Folgore Divisions and the 8th Alpine Regiment - Commissariat Services. -

Ref. letter 1/348/Serv dated 30/1/47 from SME Services Office. -

This Ministry lays down the following provisions connected with the commissariat services in order to cope with requirements entailed by the move and the new location of the formations in question.

I. Ration Service

a) - No new formation of units for the troops of the Mantova and Folgore Divisions, who by using the means at their disposal will be able to effect withdrawals from the Ration Central Depot of Mestre or the Ration Depot of Udine, according to their location, ~~and~~ after making detailed agreements with the Comm. Directorate of the Military Territorial Command of Udine. -

b) - Regarding the 8th Alpine Regiment which will be located at Pontebba, Tarvisio, and Tolmezzo, this Ministry advises on the necessity of forming from scratch a sub-depot for food, forage and fuel in Pontebba. -

Said depot might also make issues to other units should this be recommended.

A subaltern and two Senior NCOs will be assigned to said depot. Their names will be forwarded to the military Territorial Command of Udine. Remaining personnel, i.e. 8 to 10 men, will be supplied by the Commissariat Directorate of Udine.

Supply to said depot, as done so far for other ration depots located in the Eastern area, will be effected generally by the Central Ration Depot of Mestre even if the latter should later on be transferred to another location.

- 2 -

The stocks (bearing in mind the increases laid down for men stationed on mountains over 1000 metres height) will be those indicated on enclosure, made up to two months maintenance for ordinary rations (1 as rotation stock and 1 maintenance) and 10 days ration to be held ~~as~~ reserve, in view of the forthcoming increases ~~to~~ 5000 men. -

2. Clothing and equipment service. -

Units will get clothing replacements and repair to same from the depots existing (Clothing and Equipment Depot and Manufacture and Recovering Centre of Udine). -

Any special assignments for excess requirements will be reported to this ministry by the Commissariat Directorate of Udine. -

Withdrawals and issues will be normally effected by units to said depots.

Executive instructions will be issued by the Commissariat Directorate of Udine.

Regarding units which will be located between Mestre and Padua, an organisation which answers better to their requirements is under consideration.

3. Barrack stores.

The present availability of barrack stores and funds does not permit the building of a stock of new items. Therefore, we order that the equipment at present on issue to units, be taken away gradually obviously giving priority to equipments immediately required, such as bedding, etc. -

Detailed instructions will be issued by the Commissariat Directorates concerned which will order furthermore that the accounting settlements of the material be made between issuing and receiving depots.

Once the settlement is made the Commissariat Directorate of Udine will draft in resumé the provisions taken regarding the procedure of supply ordered, bearing in mind that the stock at the Nation Depot of Pontebba will have to be later on adjusted to the effective strength. -



SUBJECT: Decentralization of duties

1. Among the needs most felt, must be considered that of easing the central organization through a careful decentralization of duties transferring them to local units.

A first step towards this task was taken in circular 403790/Coord of 15 May 1946, but the instructions contained in it have not, for various reasons, been completely applied.

Instead this problem must be considered on the basis of the new military organization, similarly to what is being done in other departments of the State Administration, and we must proceed gradually but decisively on this road.

2. I have therefore ordered a re-examination of the questions put forward in a/c circular 403790/Coord., to elaborate and complete it, laying down the programs to be realized.

In table A the questions are considered which can be decentralized in a short time, through circulars or ministerial decrees; in table B the questions which, to be decentralized, need the necessary legislative provisions or regulations.

The General Directorates and Inspectorates are requested to arrange the issue of the necessary instructions, in order that the programs mentioned above can be completely carried out.

3. The important thing is to hasten the process, also for questions shown in table 'B' - For them the necessary legislative provisions must be drawn up in the shortest possible time, forwarding concrete proposals to this Cabinet. Proposals already made will be re-examined and brought up to date, considering the problem of decentralization from a full and practical view point.

4. The realization of the programs mentioned in para 2 will form a first appreciable result but will not exhaust the matter.

The structure of the military organization must then be revised to obtain a true and proper decentralized organization.

For this purpose, the General Directorate and Inspectorates must examine further possibilities of decentralization, with the intention of putting the local authorities in a position of arranging, with all speed, the greater part of local requirements.

As a result of the Combined Chiefs of Staff Standardisation policy the Italian Army now holds appreciable quantities of British weapons and equipment; to this has recently been added in anticipation of an increased entitlement under the terms of the Peace Treaty a number of weapons and 'A' vehicles (including some Lend Lease items in British custody which US did not wish to recapture); details of these were reported in our letter 8159/QM dated 11 Dec 46.

2. Normal maintenance of this equipment is denied to the Italian Army since

- (a) Indigenous resources cannot provide spares or ammunition for British or Allied equipment.
- (b) From British resources global surpluses alone can be utilised and these do not provide items in Short Supply; even those items available only find their way to the Italian Army in negligible quantities for reasons already reported by AFHQ.
- (c) Purchases overseas are not at present possible because the Italian Government has not the necessary foreign currency to undertake this.

3. The Italian Army justly represent that equipment without maintenance is useless.

4. A particular and outstanding case is the tanks and weapons referred to at paragraph 1 for which it will not be possible to provide ammunition, because of your 73446 Ord 21 dated 2 Dec 46 and 5/AMN/3389(RAC1) dated 21 Nov 46. In addition existing deficiencies in ammunition cannot be made up; our DOS/37/19(4) dated 16 Nov 46 and your 73391/Ord 21 dated 30 Nov 46 refer.

1. It is realised that the procurement of spares and material ex ALLIED Depots, is the responsibility of the Ministry of War. It is also appreciated that some time will necessarily elapse before the stores concerned are ultimately allotted to units against demands.
2. It is considered however, that if the ITALIAN Army is to obtain maximum benefit from such stores as are made available, their rapid distribution is essential. Particularly is this true in respect of M.T. spares and spares for BRITISH weapons.
3. Further, it is considered economically essential, as it is understood that the policy is to replace BRITISH M.T. with ITALIAN by the end of 1947, and the maintenance of both vehicles and weapons is rapidly deteriorating at this present time due to lack of essential spares.
4. It is obvious that if BRITISH materials are to be "Catalogued" and translated into ITALIAN before distribution commences, the time lag involved will be considerable.
5. Therefore it is respectfully submitted for consideration, that the BRITISH system of indenting for BRITISH stores be superimposed over the ITALIAN system, for such length of time as will ensure their rapid distribution to units.
6. Some difficulty will obviously be experienced regarding this method, but with the large number of ENGLISH speaking ITALIAN Army personnel, and the assistance of B.L.Us., difficulties should not prove insurmountable.

Subject: Directives for the training of cadres and men -
1st, 2nd, 3rd cycles 1946.

1. Annual Training Course.

The annual training course is composed of 3 cycles, each of 4 months duration:

1st cycle: preliminary and advanced training of the recruited contingent. Selection of Junior NCOs and tradesmen students.

2nd cycle: Unit training. Completion of the training of the soldier. Mastering of Junior NCOs and tradesmen. Exercises.

3rd cycle: Improvement of the training of cadres and men. Exercises.
For the system of recruiting adopted (three call-ups per year) at any time the strength of the Army will be as under:
1/3 of the strength (recruits) in training at GARRs, Central Military Schools and Services Units.

2/3 of the strength (men with over 3 years service) in Corps (with 1/3 half-way through the period of enlistment and 1/3 at the end).

As there are 3 call-ups per year, there are simultaneously three training courses per year and since these commence every 4 months, it results that during a period of 4 months three cycles on three various strengths are carried out:

- 1st cycle, in GARRs and Schools (this starts on arrival of recruits in GARRs);
- 2nd cycle, in Corps (at the School for tradesmen);
- 3rd cycle, in Corps (the strength of Corps is at all times half of that which attend the 2nd cycle and the other half which attend the 3rd).

The subdivision in cycles should not hinder the training continuity: therefore the training is carried out without interruptions, and progresses during the whole period of enlistment (12 months).

In consequence of such organization, the present directives for training cadres and men during the present 4 months necessarily affect the activity of all the 3 cycles. These, for the present, ~~will~~ generally prevail also for the period of 4 months which follows, unless suitable arrangements, imposed by season factors, are made.

2. Progressive.

The activities for which directives are issued cannot - in the present situation be carried out fully because of the lack of suitable ground, giving him at the same time, courage, concept of danger and faith in his own physical strength with the location of this troop and the fact that the terrain is not suitable for the development of the training programme, fixing the rate of development to be given to each subject bearing in mind that in all cases the following training subjects will be carried out:

- PT, recreational training and foot drill;
- Weapon training;
- Training for the public order services;
- Tactical training for small units;
- Firing exercises;
- Training of cadres and tradesmen.

Since this is the first application of the new training system, it is essential that unit instructors be well acquainted with and convinced of the new method of training. This is most essential so that Units are in a position to continue without stop on the new method when recruits arrive in Corps. In fact, the recruit must not notice the transfer from the School to the Unit and, therein, all that he learned in CAR or School must be confirmed. If the time available does not permit the carrying out of a long programme, difficult subjects should be missed, bearing in mind the principle which says: little but good. By doing so, we shall give proof that we also work hard in Units.

With the aim of permitting the most rational development of the training, services which do not require the employment of all the strength, must be organised so as to exclude complete W/E units (i.e. a squad in the platoon, a platoon in the Coy, and so forth). In such a way the strength excluded from such services could carry out in turn, its own training exercises.

3. Training of recruits at CARs and Central Schools is in accordance with directives and programmes already issued.

4. P.T. and recreational training.

The scope is to make the soldier tough, capable of withstanding strain and physical effort, of surmounting obstacles on various types of ground, giving him at the same time, courage, contempt of danger and faith in his own physical strength.

Under this last aspect, the PT and recreational training is also a school forming the character.

The succession of subjects and exercises in each single lesson must be studied progressively.

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- 3 -

An ample development in field gymnastics and competitions, liable to create esprit de corps and fighting spirit, should be given. All the spectacular sights which do not serve in combat, should be avoided.

5. Foot drill.

This is training which is important both to the recruits, who have to live together, and the regular soldiers who must maintain efficiently the military way of life.

Therefore, all units must give at least few minutes every day to this subject.

6. Mastering of NCOs and tradesmen.

- a) Junior NCOs - The mastering is done within each Corps. The selection of student NCOs, who must undergo a course, should be done as quickly as possible after a period of observation of the aptitude and capabilities of each man, which in any case must not exceed 4 weeks from the time of arrival of the recruits in each corps. To such end Commanders could also take the psycho-physical and psycho-technical advice of the CAR selection commissions.

b) Tradesmen.

The selection of tradesmen students should be carried out on the same principles as those for Junior NCOs. The men selected are transferred to the Central Schools which train them in trades. The formation of tradesmen is not, however, done during the carrying out of the courses which, whatever their duration, give essentially theoretical foundations. It is the Corps in fact that should complete and improve the tradesmen through practice. Expert Officers and NCOs, detailed to guide and control the work of the tradesmen, must know how to use the daily activity in order to teach while working.

7. Weapon training.

- a) The annual training course, which began in CARs during the recent call-up, will continue to be carried out in Corps on arrival of the recruits. W.e.f. that date, however, the new 4 months cycle of training will come into force. While waiting for the recruits, Corps will perfect the weapon training of the regular soldier, levelling up, as much as possible, the general standard of training and completing the syllabus, in cases where it is still incomplete, (see circular SM 90/R/4 dated 13th Jan. 1946).
- b) With the beginning of the 4 months cycle, the individual weapon training in Corps will be limited to completing training and classification exercises with various weapons, possibly those not done in CARs or Central Schools, and training in throwing hand grenades.

Supplementary lessons could be given to men who during the entire cycle, have not obtained a sufficient degree of efficiency.

- 4 -

Also shooting competitions could be carried out. The carrying out of exercises to maintain snipers in shape, is left at discretion of Corps Commanders.

- c) Since recruits are trained in GARs and Central Schools in British weapons, while awaiting the standardisation of armament and equipment of the Army, Corps in possession of Italian weapons (Internal Security Divisions, Infantry Rgts and Terr. Alpine) will carry out, for men transferred to them, an adequate programme of practical instructions on the arms in their possession and will carry out range practice considered necessary for a good knowledge of the functioning, behaviour during firing and use of same.

8. Combat training. Firing practice. Firing school.

a) Combat training.

For the Infantry, we cannot talk of unit tactical training unless each man knows how to spread quickly, post himself, jump and crawl, overcome various types of obstacles exposing himself as little as possible, maintain direction, shoot from various positions and also in the run, make use of ground cover, camouflage himself underground, etc.

To pretend to do unit tactical training without having at first acquired the knowledge of movements on the ground, is as much absurd as wanting to teach writing without going through the graphic teaching of each single letter of the alphabet.

With the beginning of the 4 months cycle, Corps will have to ascertain whether men transferred from GARs and Central Schools have well understood the technique of elementary movements.

The training programme of the 2nd cycle must deal mainly with combat training of the platoon and corresponding formations which must be understood to be, under all its aspects, fundamental. At the same time training of patrols must be developed for their employment as independent units with a vast field of action, great freedom of action, also for "raids" lasting a long period.

Only when the training of the platoon has reached an excellent standard of development, the training of larger formations will be carried out.

All instructions and exercises must give to the soldier a real atmosphere of war, similar to that created by modern war weapons. All that is "formal" should be excluded from the training.

Cooperation must be maintained at all time. Where there is an Infantry Division, the presence of men of various arms or services will permit the carrying out of exercises in the cooperation of small units; they must solve simple problems of tactical cooperation and particularly Infantry-Arty, Infantry Tanks, Infantry-Engns; owing to the present lack of technical equipment, the cooperation between Infantry and tanks will be carried out using various substitutes i.e. units which have no tanks could use track vehicles in lieu.

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- 5 -

We must never exclude the fact that the aeroplane today, determines each tactical and logistic action. The enemy air force must constitute a permanent strength in the sky of the area where exercises are carried out.

Awaiting the beginning of the 4 months cycle, Corps will see that military personnel with a certain period of service, undergo a tactical training so as to perfect them on the new method used (patrol - squad - platoon) by retraining them on the technical elementary movements.

b) Pioneers.

Divisional Pioneer Units will have to be trained in the use of the specific equipment in their possession and on the carrying out of their particular activities in operational units. In view of reaching this aim, it is essential that Pioneer Units are also trained for combat as small Infantry Units. Naturally, this training, owing to their particular duties, must be limited to the use of ground, as regards movement and firing, and to patrol, section and platoon action, with special regard for the "mopping up" of a house or inhabited place, the attacking of positions and strongholds, and the consolidation of positions.

c) Firing exercises.

The present situation does not permit the carrying out of manoeuvres, summer excursions (Alpine Troops) and firing practice for the Artillery. But, the Territorial Commands, according to the situation and locality in which they are stationed and the availability of men, will make out a programme of exercises with a view to obtaining the following:

- Inf. Regts and Territorial Alpine Troops: pl. firing exercises
- I.S. Regt: Coy firing exercises
- Inf. Division: Firing exercises of various weapons in co-operation (Bn, Group, various Unit of the Engr. - Services Units).

The laying down of the number and stages of firing exercises to be carried out, is left at the discretion of Territ. Comds.

Within all Infantry Units, squad firing exercises and route marching will create unity in small units and initiative and responsibility in Commanders.

d) Training and Firing School for Arty.

The Arty will carry out its training through firing exercises in battery and group formations.

For your guidance and for a systematic lay out of exercises it is stated that on 5 firing exercises there are:

- 3 preparatory
- 1 tactical
- 1 in cooperation with other weapons.

The Firing Schools - wherever they may be set up - will have to be normally organised by groups. 6649

9. Training for Public Order Services.

See directives already issued in a/m circular no 90/R/4 dated 13th January 1946.

- 6 -

10. Training for Alpine and Ski Troops.

Although the present situation of the country does not permit that units leave their normal stations and move into summer stations, it is, however, permitted to form small detachments (20-30 men) for short excursions or sojourn in the mountains. These detachments will be commanded by instructors specialised in the subjects to be carried out. As far as possible, Alpine tactics and technique will be closely inter-related so as to give the men a real atmosphere of war and impress upon the Alpine troops that there are two enemies to conquer: the ground and the enemy.

11. M.T. Training - M.T. Convoy exercises.

Such training must be carried out assiduously, progressively and perseveringly.

The importance of such training (in view of the modern motorised army) is so evident that the necessity of making every effort to give to MT drivers a deep technical knowledge and impress on their minds "motorisation", does not require any further comment.

Together with this training, training on transport organisation and discipline and road signals must be given. Also this is to be improved a lot.

Such training will be concluded with M.T. Convoy exercises to be carried out within each division.

12. Regulations - Morale - Administration of personnel.

Instructions on the above subjects must be limited to that necessary in every day military life and must be closely connected with actual practice.

The subject of morale should be well developed. The healing of spirits and consciences and the revaluation of the prestige of military institutions, are today (after the storm) most difficult, delicate and meritorious tasks which are to be carried out by officers of all ranks.

Officers who attended courses on democratic culture could also collaborate if available.

13. Training of cadre.

The training of cadre must be carried out with the aim of forming capable officers.

The logistic and schooling organisation of the troops must find its more complete realisation whilst carrying out training (being the most important item in a modern Army)

Care in organisation and rigidity of method are the centres around which the whole of the training must rotate. Setting aside long theoretical lessons made without preparation the practical method, real combat atmosphere and care to be taken in all details must characterise every activity and teaching.

- 7 -

The short time available does not permit abstract straying from the subject nor the tackling of difficult subjects which are beyond today's requirements. In other words we must not lose sight of today's duty of each individual. For example: the NCO i/c Rifle squad should not be taught what the NCO i/c Mortar squad is taught but perfected, specialised, firstly in the carrying out of his specific duties for which he is detailed.

Once this aim is reached, Regt. and Bn. Commanders could have the Officers and NCOs (regulars) trained in turn in various other duties so that each Officer and NCO, although being of a specific trade, is prepared to carry out any duty related to his rank.

Exercises with Coy. and Bn. cadre, on paper, with models and in the field, organised quickly but with precision and other tactical or logistic details, will improve, under the direction of an expert instructor, the tactical knowledge of Comdres of minor Units.

14. Exercises on signals.

With a view of keeping in shape signals personnel at HQs and Units, several suitable exercises within the Regt. and the Div. could be carried out in order to train HQ and Unit signals personnel how to speedily organise HQ posts and signals networks both in offensive action (i.e. approach, attack; and pursuit) and in defensive action (i.e. resistance, counterattack, redeployment).

Said exercises will help:

- to explain to cadres, through practice, signals organisation within the Regt and the Div on the battlefield.
- to accustom the men.

15. I shall be grateful to know, by the end of May, programmes compiled for each large formation and Infantry and Territorial Alpine Regts.

At the end of each four months cycle the addressee will make out a report on the results obtained.

1. From time to time the question arises as to the amount to be charged a soldier who loses or damages by neglect items of equipment of British origin.

In this connection M.M.I.A. have been asked to forward price lists of all such equipment.

2. The British Ordnance Vocabulary price for items of equipment is generally very low in comparison with the cost of replacement by the Italian Government.

It may often be shown that the listed price of "attractive items" is far less than may be obtained from a civilian receiver.

3. You are therefore advised to issue a scale of financial penalties to be applied to individuals proved to have been responsible for "loss or damage by neglect".

The scale which could be restricted to items in common use, should be related to the actual value in Italian currency and be uniform throughout the Italian Army.

With reference to 6 Terr. Comd letter No. 14571/Serv of 31 Aug '46, the following are forwarded herewith:-

1. Report on garments issued to 6 CAR, together with remarks of CAR regarding quality etc;
2. Report on suggestions and considerations made relative to the new Italian Army uniforms.

GARMENTS ISSUED TO RECRUITS OF VI CAR

1. The grey-green woollen winter uniforms issued in January and February 1946, are well made and of very good material. On the whole they proved to be really good.
2. As far as the green-dyed uniforms are concerned, they did not last very long. Moreover they turned out to be too small for the physical dimensions of the recruits then at CAR. The result, therefore, was far from satisfactory.
3. The grey-green shirts distributed during the same period were of two kinds. One kind, that formed part of the Republican Fascist Government supplies, left much to be desired both in the cut and in the quality of the material, but though it would not last for long, it was decided to utilize it for economy's sake. These shirts were then substituted by those of the other kind which was good in every respect.
4. For the same reasons given above, the summer uniforms and caps proved to be of little use, mainly because they would not stand washing. Nevertheless, during the time in which they were used, short though it was, they meant a sensible saving of material.
5. The summer shorts then issued were badly made and of various colours. The material for these was also of that recovered from Republican Fascist Gov. stores. However, according to regulations, shorts are to be worn only during training in the barracks.
6. The boots, also of old provision, are not bad, but too light in weight for military use as originally they had been made for workers. However, it was deemed better to utilize them rather than leave them to deteriorate in the stores.

2nd COURSE

1. Summer clothes in the new pattern are very practical and

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2nd COURSE

1. Summer clothes in the new pattern are very practical and well made. Unfortunately, the material has not proved to be good nor worthy of such accurate workmanship. Anyway, it was considered better to use the material up as it was scarce.

2. The khaki shirts proved to be very good; the same can be said of the caps.

3. With regard to the shorts, the same inconvenience as in the previous distribution exists (i.e. variety of colours and bad workmanship).

4. The under-pants have been recently made with material that is the remainder of old stocks, but they have been distributed with a view to economy.

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Socks are practical and of good quality.

6. Boots are better than those previously distributed.

7. Towels and handkerchiefs are considered very good.

PROPOSALS.

- Soldiers should have two uniforms in order to enable them to change whenever a suit needs washing or repairing.

- The same can be said with regard to footwear, as often, in order to have his boots repaired, the soldier has to wear his best ones.

- In view of the forthcoming distribution of winter vests, it is advised to issue two to each soldier, for the principle of hygiene.

- It is suggested that a pair of woollen gloves be issued for winter wear.

- It would be convenient to distribute a canvas bag (holdall) for personal effects (i.e., razor, soap, brushes, toothpaste, toothbrush, comb, etc.).

Subject: NEW UNIFORMS.

With regard to the contents of Ministry of War letter dated 10 Aug. '46, on the above subject, the remarks and suggestions of this CAR are given below.

a- The new uniforms should be considered temporary and as "experimental". - NO OBSERVATIONS.

b- Summer field uniform;-
The KD jacket should be abolished and substituted with a shirt with two pockets, epaulets, and open collar. - OPINION:- FAVOURABLE.

The tie, which gives the uniform an untidy appearance, should be abolished. - OPINION:- FAVOURABLE.
Enamelled pin-badges and flashes should be worn on the shirts, or KD jackets if the latter are maintained. - OPINION:- FAVOURABLE.
The KD jacket should be abolished in any case when shorts are worn. - OPINION:- FAVOURABLE.

With regard to linen trousers it is suggested that; -
1) they be provided with three large belt straps instead of one

With regard to linen trousers it is suggested that:-

- 1) they be provided with three large belt straps instead of small belt straps, so that a web belt may be support through them;
- 2) the field uniform should have trousers complete with anklets, in the English style, in several sizes so that they are sure to fit well.

In case the jacket should be abolished:-

- 1) The number of shirts should be at least four; two for the field uniform (either that with trousers like those worn by paratroopers, or that with anklets) or that with shorts), and two for the dress suit;
- 2) Two cotton vests should be provided, especially if the jacket is

abolished, as in this case the soldier would be left with just his shirt even on chilly summer days.

c- Winter uniform.

The tie should be abolished and the shirt have a high collar that will look smart even without the tie. For this reason the shirts should be well made and in different sizes, so that it will never happen that a collar is too tight to be buttoned, as often occurred in the past. Very smart and practical are the zip fasteners with small woollen tassel, similar to those on the old shirts.

Further, it is suggested to substitute the shirt with a polo-neck jersey, which would also substitute the pullover now being issued, but in insufficient number (only 1 per man). The collar of the jacket should be provided with flashes as in the previous case. - OPINION:- FAVOURABLE.

d- Field caps with the same badge for all regiments, corps and ser-
vices. - THE USE OF ADOPTING THE SAME BADGE FOR ALL CANNOT BE SEEN. - This would abolish a tradition to which each soldier is certainly attached. On the other hand, flashes on certain garments (capes for instance) would not be worn, and, therefore, it would not be possible to distinguish the regiment. For the same reason it is not considered convenient to abolish the badges of rank on caps.

Besides being a great help to each individual, this would evit many inconveniences, i.e., uniforms made in different styles, officers and WO's abusively taking a troop uniform too, etc.
 The issuing of the uniforms in question could be effected periodically by Corps Commands, and in the case of an officer or WO being transferred, the issuing of the uniform could be recorded on AF 44 RA.

With regard to the dress uniform (which may be worn on duty so long as troops are not to be commanded) it is considered convenient to adopt the following system:-
Standard type of material sold at Military Stores (i.e. Unione Militare) Suits to be tailored privately.
A favourable opinion has been expressed to the granting of an adequate bonus to meet the expense of having the new uniform made. Should it not be considered convenient to pay the above mentioned bonus, it is suggested that the materials for making it be supplied gratuitously.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE MEMBERS

TO : Joint and Agricultural Sub-Committee, A.C.

1. With reference to my signed 5079 and letter WPA/MA/4 of 28th September, 1946. The Allied Military Administration have been approached and requested to supply the items mentioned, viz: Milk, Tea, Coffee, Syntexed Milk and various food supplies required in kind or otherwise. There are indications that the Allied Military Authorities are prepared to help as a temporary expedient, if it is authorized by the end of October, but not beyond.

2. It has been suggested that an Italian Mission for the supply of the above items (Italian) has been pursuing in AMMIA for some months, it might be possible for the Italian Government to obtain certain items from their sources at much cheaper cost to the Italian Government than local purchase.

3. It has also been suggested that some milk powder might be obtainable from A.S.S. ITALIA (I.M.I.) in exchange for certain other commodities.

4. The present action, viz: a cancellation of the Italian Package Scale (revised 1944) and displaced persons scale No. 10, owing to the refusal of AMMIA to permit the Italian Government to use certain items imported by them for displaced persons, although very similar in nature to the Italian Package Scale, would cost the Italian Government to buy locally considerably more than the cost of the Italian Package Scale. I endeavored to have prepared a revised scale, of the same nature as the Italian Package Scale, which would cost the Italian Government less than the cost at present allowed to Displaced Persons, (when the Allied Military Authorities can no longer help with the five items mentioned). However, this does not appear possible.

5. In order to assist the Italian Government in this matter of cost, it would be a great favor if you could assist in obtaining the necessary articles suggested either from the sources indicated in paras 2 and 3 or by some other method.

In the forthcoming summer season new types of summer uniform will be experimented upon on large scales; Winter uniforms will be experimented upon during the next Winter season.

It is emphasised that the following two types of trousers will be experimented upon ; one long which will be used with gaiters and one type as used by parachute troops. This is in accordance with an order issued by the Cabinet of the Minister by the Chief of SIRE.

Equipment - Italian Army

1. It is expected that increasing quantities of the following war-like material will be issued to the Italian Army almost immediately, from British Depots around Naples:-

- (a) Arms and ammunition
- (b) Motor vehicle spares and tyres
- (c) Wireless and signal equipment
- (d) Engineer and other stores

2. The conditions under which British Depots will be handling this material, and the Allies desire to close most of these installations as soon as possible, are likely to lead to a considerable confusion unless your organization is able to receive and distribute expeditiously large and unbalanced consignments of all types of material, at very short notice.

3. It is probable that your emergency Depot at Aversa may become over-worked and over-loaded and that as a result the issue of equipment to units may be delayed, and the flow from British Depots so checked that consignments may have to be diverted to surplus disposal agencies (ARSA) and so lost to the Italian Army.

4. To prevent this happening it is considered that an immediate interim plan should be made (related, as far as possible, to your final organization), which would facilitate the handling of material in appropriate Depots.

5. This has already been discussed with your representatives in the Directorates concerned, and the following suggestions have been made:-

6. It is of importance that such depots should be staffed by Officers and other ranks with experience of the British equipment they will be handling. This may well necessitate the temporary withdrawal of additional personnel from Infantry Divisions. The W.S. of the Depot's Staff should be decided as soon as a firm decision has been taken.

7. Will you please give this matter your urgent consideration and inform me as soon as possible what your plans are for the establishment and staffing of the necessary depots. If you so wish, I should be pleased to discuss, or give any further information required, from the Allied point of view so as to enable you more effectively to produce a plan.
