MINUTES OF A MEETING HELD AT 6 TERRITORIAL ARMY

2. Proposal

The difficulties regarding the maintenance of a detachment of 12 HCU at DELCOURA, on disbandment of 6 HCU, were explained by Lt.-Col. CHAMPTI, and certain proposals were made whereby it would be possible to maintain such a Detachment with the aid of 6 COMINT.

Lt.-Col. CHAMPTI was unable to give immediate acceptance to the proposals, but promised to investigate the matter thoroughly and give all assistance in his power. He organized a firm decision after discussing the matter with the concerned superior authority. Proposals made and suggestions regarding future maintenance are briefly outlined in ensuing paragraphs.

It was pointed out that all existing accommodation was held under British requisition and would have to be returned on disbandment of 6 HCU. The following request was therefore made.

- (a) Officers. A small villa or apartment. It was considered that the existing Officers' Mess was too large and unnecessary during the winter months when heating was impossible without very large expense.
- (b) Other ranks. To be provided with suitable accommodation for sleeping and eating from available Italian Army barracks. Food to be cooked by L.A. cooks, but all meals to be served separately owing to different composition of nations.

No alternatives were envisaged with regard to furniture as alternatives would be made from that at present in charge to 6 HCU. It was pointed out that should alternative accommodations have to be found for QM's the civilian staff would have to be increased by at least two, in order for efficient administration.



At an interview with Lt Col MARSSI, (Commissariate) of Defence Ministry - Army on 7 July 47, it was ascertained that the general clothing situation of the Italian Army at present is as follows:-

1. Battle-Dress

Satisfactory. Considerable quantities of good quality cloth were recovered from C.R.L. stocks and the new pattern uniform is in production for issue winter of 47/48.

Stocks of finished garments are distributed to various territorial Command Depots. No central clothing stores has yet been established.

2. Meld-Drill

Introduced for the first time by the Allies has now been adopted by Italian Army to save winter clothing.

New manufacture not considerable as civil competition severe. Large dependant on Allied stocks and position for current year precarious especially long treisore (10,000 needed urgently).

3. Boots

Satisfactory. Adequate stocks on present scale of issue. Civilian contracts arranged and provision made for 1947/48. Rising prices has slowed output from civilian sources. Units hold 30% reserve and much importance attached to Territorial Command "local repair" shops. These produce a serviceable boot. (In practice this Unit reserve does not seem to be maintained and individual soldiers are permitted or "obliged" to retain boots needing repairs).



In this regulation the following terms are used : -

Small arms - Includes rifles and pistols of all descriptions, together with their bayonets and accessories, machine carbines, together with their bayonets and accessories, revolvers, revolvers and carbines.

Mechanisms - Includes all calibres of machine guns up to and including 1 in., together with their mounts and other equipment and apparatuses, including spare parts, ammunition, feed belts, etc.

Accessories and supplies - Projectiles, latrines, Ammunition, dischargers, smoke, 4-in., bombardments, stores, instruments, projectiles and all equipment for the inspection of which the inspector is responsible.

Inspected - Inspecting in detail the condition and state of wear of the weapon or store by a thorough examination of the various parts and by the use of the appropriate causes, also, where necessary, carrying out disassembly and functioning tests to determine the serviceability of the weapon.

Inspection - A visual inspection not involving the use of causes other than those held by the unit commander. Carried out periodically by him. Personnel to ensure that the weapon or store is maintained in good condition and that necessary repairs and adjustments and all authorized modifications have been carried out.

DISCUSSION OF INSPECTION

- (a) The examination of small arms, machine guns and associated accessories equipment, except mortars and instruments will normally be carried out by an A.L.C. In exceptional circumstances, the responsibilities for the examination may be delegated to an NCO (e.g.). The examinations will be carried out as follows : -
- (i) All examinations, tests and inspections
- (ii) manually.

- (a) At quarterly periods between the annual examinations, A.I.S.A. will carry out inspection visits to units with armourers. At these inspections 10% of all small arms machine guns, and miscellaneous equipments in the hands of troops will be inspected to ascertain whether the unit armourer is carrying out his duties satisfactorily, and whether necessary adjustments, repairs and modifications have been carried out to the equipment.
- (b) During these inspection visits the following will be checked to ensure that they are correct and are being kept up to date:-
- (1) All armourers' tools held on charge.
 - (2) All technical publications held by the armourer.
 - (3) Copies of all inspection reports.
 - (4) Daily work book.
- (c) Should the general condition of the equipment at this inspection be considered other than satisfactory, arrangements will be made for 100% of the equipment to be inspected by an armourer (W.O.1 or 1) 64
- (d) A.I.S.A. will also carry out quarterly inspection visits to units without armourers to ensure that the equipment is being maintained in a serviceable condition and that the circuit armourers are carrying out the inspections, adjustment and repair of weapons in a

- (b) During these inspection visits the following will be checked to ensure that they are correct and are being kept up to date:-

5. In circuit armourers - all small arms, machine guns and miscellaneous equipments in the hands of troops.
- (a) Senior armourers doing duty as circuit armourers will at quarterly intervals between annual examinations, carry out inspections of the small arms, machine guns and miscellaneous equipments of all units without attached R.E.M.E. armourers. At these inspections, adjustments and repairs will be carried out as far as possible *in situ*.

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- (b) The stripping, cleaning and oiling of all small arms, machine guns and miscellaneous equipments and the lubrication of rifles between stock and barrel will be carried out by circuit armourers annually, to coincide with the fourth quarterly inspection.

- (c) All weapons sentenced for repair or further examination in R.E.M.S. workshops during these inspections will be labelled and segregated.

6. By Circuit Armourers - small arms, machine guns and miscellaneous equipments held as unit mobilization equipment and small held for reservists, will be inspected at quarterly intervals between annual examinations as follows :-

- (a) 10% of small arms and miscellaneous equipments held as unit mobilization or reservists' equipment. At each inspection the rifles inspected will be stripped and lubricated between stock and barrel, the bolts stripped, cleaned and recilled.
- (b) 15% of bicycles will be inspected, and the bearings stripped, cleaned and relubricated. Covers and tyres of bicycles which are stored separately will also be inspected.
- (c) All machine guns and mountings will be inspected, cleaned and relubricated as necessary.
7. By Unit Armourers - all small arms, machine guns and miscellaneous equipments in the hands of troops.
- (a) R.E. H.H. armourers attached to units will carry out the following inspections to the small arms, machine guns and miscellaneous equipment held on charge to the units to which they are attached :-
- (i) monthly inspection of machine guns (training units only).
- (ii) monthly inspection of rifles.

3. By unit armourers - small arms, machine guns and miscellaneous equipments held as unit mobilization equipment and small arms held for reservists, will be inspected at quarterly intervals between annual examinations as follows : -

- (a) 10% of small arms and miscellaneous equipments held as unit mobilization or reservists' equipment. At each inspection the rifles inspected will be stripped and lubricated between stock and barrel, the bolts stripped, cleaned and resoled.
- (b) 25% of bicycles will be inspected, and the bearings stripped, cleaned and relubricated. Covers and tyres of bicycles which are stored separately will also be inspected.
- (c) All machine guns and mountings will be inspected, cleaned and relubricated as necessary.

9. The results of inspections in accordance with paragraphs 7 and 8, will be reported, as detailed in para 10 and 11.

10. In the case of inspections under paragraph 7, one copy of the report will be retained by the armourer for reference, and the other forwarded to the O.C. company or squadron, etc. In the case of the interim quarterly inspection, a copy of the report will also be submitted to the C.O. of the unit, giving a full statement of the general condition of the stores inspected.

11. In the case of inspections under paragraph 8, one copy of the report will be retained by the armourer for reference, and the other forwarded to the C.O. of the unit. If the condition of the percentage inspected indicates that further inspection is desirable, a report to this effect will be included.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONSTRUCTION WITH WEAPONS, EXAMINATION AND INSPECTION OF SMALL ARMS AND MILITARY EQUIPMENT

16. Before any weapon is inspected it will be ascertained that the weapon is not loaded. In no circumstances will live ammunition be taken into a workshop or other building which is used for examination, inspection or instructional purposes. Under examination or dummy cartridge, ³ an extra precaution, regular examination of dummy cartridge, must be made before commencing each day's work to ensure that no live ammunition is found in the weapon.

ARMAMENT INSPECTION IN CONNECTION WITH THE EXAMINATION AND INSPECTION OF WEAPONS, MUNITIONS, EQUIPMENT

12. Before any weapon is inspected it will be ascertained that the weapon is not loaded. In no circumstances will live ammunition be taken into a workshop or other building which is used for examination, inspection or instructional purposes. As an extra precaution, regular examination of armament carrying bags will be made before commencing each day's work to ensure that no live ammunition is present. Whenever live ammunition is found in a weapon which has been passed to an armourer for examination, inspection or repair, the fact must be immediately brought to the notice of the O.C. and the ammunition handed over personally for authorised custody.

13. No work which requires the use of gauges will be undertaken unless such gauges are available.
14. Weapons must never be left cocked.

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15. Persons requiring weapons which are within the capacity of unit or regiment resources will not be sent to hospitals for treatment unless circumstances render it unavoidable.
16. Should there be any doubt as to the responsibility of a weapon, it will be set aside for further examination by an A.L.I. or M.D. - Workshops.
17. Unit resources will maintain a complete record, at the daily work carried out. This record will be ready for inspection of the supervisor A.L.I. or Z.E.M.B., at all times.
18. In all respects relating to rifles, the mark, registered number of the rifle, including the index letter where shown, and place of manufacture, will be noted. In the case of pistols, machine guns, grenades, mortars and bicycles the mark and registration number will be noted.
19. After any stores or component parts of weapons, etc., form supplies which may be useful for future mobilization purposes, will be noted.
20. Unless held by armamenters will be vented annually with will also be carried out at any intermediate time should the results of examination of ammunition for weapons, etc., indicate such a course to be desirable.
21. It is the duty of an armorer not only to carry out his particular repair to equipment for which he is responsible, but also to ensure that the article is serviceable in every respect.
22. Armourers are not allowed to make any charge against, or accept payment from, soldiers for work performed on stores held on unit charge.
