Handing over of stocks existing in premises.

Ref. verbal request by Maj. Ebswerth.

1. According to current Italian Law, buildings owned by the Italian Government given in use to Military Administration are to remain at the disposal of this Ministry until latter want renounce to such use.
2. When, therefore, HQ and Allied Troops evacuate buildings formerly occupied by the Military Administration (barracks, stores, areas, etc.) these must be handed over to this Ministry's Representatives.
3. If in the buildings being handed back there be some work carried out by Allied or some material left by them, at the moment of handover an inventory will be taken and the Italian Representative will sign a proper receipt.
4. On the base of such documents, it will be proceeded as fixed in instructions attached to your M.M.I.A. letter Q/100 dated 13 March c.y., to take ensuing measures in accord between Army Liquidation Commission on one side and this Ministry through A.R.A.R.

SUBJECT : Requisitioned materials by RACTD.-

In July '44 the Recovery Squad of Air Force Centre (A.M.C) of Rieti requisitioned some chattels, upon an anonymous denunciation stating that these chattels were the property of the ex G.I.L. Command and not the property of an ex fascist Officer.

These chattels were dumped at the stores of "Nucleo Presidio Militare" for their custody.

The owner of these chattels, Signora Passeri Pierina, wife of Centurione Aresti, forwarded to our Command, the enclosed statement, claiming for the restitution of the furniture.

As these chattels had been requisitioned by RACTD HQ on the 30 October '44 - at the same time as the requisition of Vittorio Emanuele III Barracks - and not returned by RACTD when they left Rieti, it is kindly requested that M.M.I.A get in touch with RACTD, concerning the restitution of the aforesaid chattels.

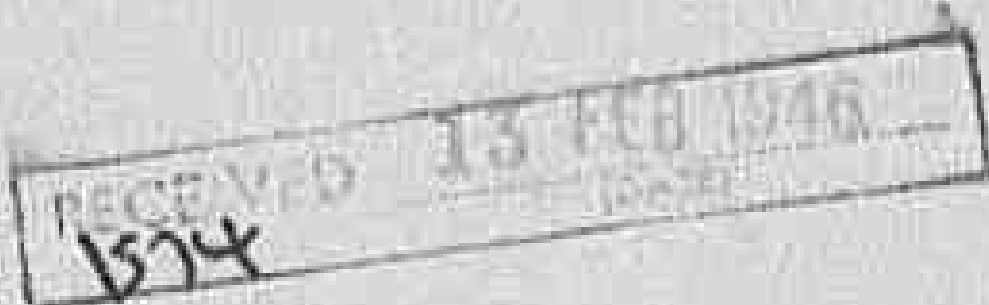

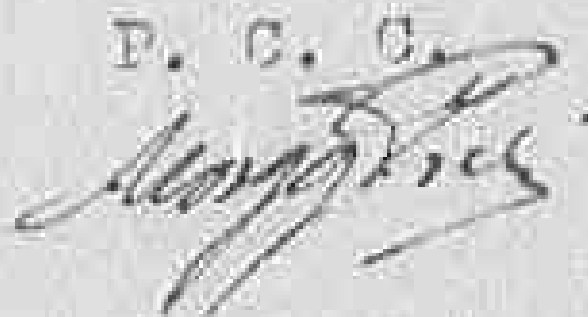

Interim procedure for the disposal of fixed assets in real estate in Italian Territory which is to be derequisitioned or otherwise pass out of British possession.

1. From time to time property held on requisition by British Naval, Military or Air Forces will be derequisitioned or pass out of British possession by transfer to the U.S. Forces, A.C. UNRRA or Allied organisations operating in an official role.
2. Such property may contain fixed assets such as huts, hatted camps, store sheds, workshops, railway track and fittings and other fittings of all types which have been installed during the British occupation.
3. Pending the receipt of official War Office policy on the disposal of these fixed assets, the instructions contained in the following paragraphs will apply.

REAL ESTATE TO BE DEREQUISITIONED

4. When it has been ascertained that no further Allied Military need exist for a particular property, if it is of a type likely to be of use to A.C. UNRRA, etc. e.g. storage space or large camps, it will be offered first to any Allied organisation operating in an official role secondly to UNRRA and finally to H.Q. A.C. Should none of the above organisations require the property, it will be derequisitioned.

The procedure will be as follows:-

- (a) The property will be inspected and an inventory made of all fixed assets. Special note will be taken of any U.S. Lend Lease origin.
- (b) Fixed assets of a readily removable nature or which have been reported through Service channels as in short supply will be removed under Area arrangements.
- (c) If any property contains no items of U.S. Lend Lease origin, it will be derequisitioned and handed back to the owners, who will sign a receipt for all fixed assets which are being left "in situ." The receipt will be in the form shown at Appendix 'A'. On completion, receipts and inventories will be sent to the Director of Hirings, A.F.H.Q.
- (d) If the property contains items of U.S. Lend Lease origin, full details will be reported to A.F.H.Q. and no action will be taken to derequisition property, pending approval from A.F.H.Q.
5. Before the receipts and inventories are passed to the Director of Hirings an estimate of the value of all fixed assets will be made and endorsed by the receipt. This estimate will be based on:-
 - (a) The value of W.D. imported stores.
 - (b) Military labour.

REAL ESTATE TO BE TRANSFERRED TO U.S. FORCES.

6. Fixed assets in real estate transferred to U.S. occupation will be accounted for in accordance with GPO 139/44. Vouchers will be prepared in respect of the stores

- (a) The property will be inspected and an inventory made of all the property. The property will be taken of any U.S. Lend Lease origin. Special note will be taken of any U.S. Lend Lease origin.
- (b) Fixed assets of a readily removable nature or which have been reported through Service channels as in short supply will be removed under Area arrangements.
- (c) If any property contains no items of U.S. Lend Lease origin, it will be derequisitioned and handed back to the owners, who will sign a receipt for all fixed assets which are being left "in situ." The receipt will be in the form shown at Appendix 'A'. On completion, receipts and inventories will be sent to the Director of Hirings, A.F.H.Q.

(d) If the property contains items of U.S. Lend Lease origin, full details will be reported to A.F.H.Q. and no action will be taken to derequisition property, pending approval from A.F.H.Q.

5. Before the receipts and inventories are passed to the Director of Hirings an estimate of the value of all fixed assets will be made and endorsed upon the receipt. This estimate will be based on:-

- (a) The value of W.D. imported stores.
- (b) Military labour.

REAL ESTATE TO BE TRANSFERRED TO U.S. FORCES.

6. Fixed assets in real estate transferred to U.S. occupation will be accounted for in accordance with GPO 189/14. Vouchers will be prepared in respect of the stores contained in the asset only, and account need be taken of:-

- (a) Military or Local labour charges.
- (b) Stores produced locally (i.e. in Italy)

REAL ESTATE TRANSFERRED TO OFFICIAL ORGANISATIONS.

7. Such transfers will be regarded as occupation or tenant basis. The British Army requisition will continue in force and where appropriate, normal charges will be made for the occupation.

REAL ESTATE TRANSFERRED TO UNRRA.

8. The value of fixed assets in real estate transferred to UNRRA will be assessed as the estimated cost of construction less depreciation. In this assessment full account will be taken of:-

- (a) Both Military and local labour charges.
- (b) The value of W.D. imported and locally produced stores.

9. Transfer to the assets will be affected on the certificate at Appendix 'B'. Should UNRRA not accept the value assessed in accordance with para 8 above, they will be required to complete Part II of the certificate giving their own assessment of the value. Certificate will then be forwarded to the director of Hirings through FA(B) AFHQ.

REAL ESTATE TRANSFERRED TO A.C. FOR USE EITHER BY A.C. OR AN ITALIAN GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY.

10. Fixed assets in real estate transferred to A.C. or Italian Governmental occupation will be recorded in accordance with para 4(c) and 5 above. The certificate at para 3 of Appendix 'A' being reworded accordingly.

DISCRETION OF LOCAL COMMANDERS.

11. Where any asset, though covered by para 4(b) above, is not of Military importance Area, Sub-Area or Garrison Commanders, not below the rank of Lt-Col., are given discretion not to remove it, provided that in their opinion its removal would:-

either (a) add unduly to the cost of reinstatement,

or (b) destroy as much greater value of the building.

RESPONSIBILITY.

12. Unless stated otherwise, the responsibility of carrying out all the above instructions rests with the local Area Commanders acting through the local Hirings Officer and/or Town Major.

Where the real estate has been used by RM, RAF, RE or Transportation, disposal action will be carried out in conjunction with a rep. of the interested Service.

1. A question which has been worrying my staff for some time is that of the method by which materials and improvements which have been put into Italian barracks by the U.S. Army while in occupation by them are to be disposed of when those barracks are handed back to the Italian Ministry of War. As far as I can trace, we have had no written directive on this subject, although my Second-in-Command has had certain telephone conversations with officers of MTOUSA, RAAC and ANLAC.
2. In the near future, many of these barracks are to be handed back to the Italian Army in accordance with AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 48 of 2 November which deals only with the buildings and not with any American material which has been put into them. Under an arrangement made verbally between my Second-in-Command, Major Atkinson, G-4 AFHQ and Major Toliver, RAAC, the movable property which had been put into the large Italian barracks at CECCHIGNOLA were to be turned over to the Italians on a shipping ticket. On the other hand, ANLAC has stated verbally that their instructions are to dispose of this material in accordance with MTOUSA circulars, and it will be offered to Italian State Railways for purchase. In this case, the Italian barracks have been placed under guard of Italian troops, and the questions arises whether the Ministry of War will allow outsiders to enter the premises for the purpose of bidding, although I do not suggest that this will happen.
3. Another side of the question is the desirability of co-ordinating the methods used by the U.S. with those used by the British, about which we are also in doubt. May I therefore ask for a ruling in writing covering the method of disposing of the various classes of movable and semi-movable material which has been installed by the Allies into Italian barracks, when those barracks are handed back to the Italian Army.

4. I recommend the course advocated in Para 2 as being the most practical way of dealing with interior fittings supplied by the U.S. authorities to Italian Army barracks. AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 48 of 2 November (copy attached) states that Military Barracks will be returned to the Italian Army. As the War Ministry are the logical users of the barracks, fittings, they should be handed over to MMIA on shipping tickets. Compensation would be made by the Italian Government. This procedure would be an exception to the general rule and apply only to such military barracks as are required for occupation by Italian troops.

5. In view of the fact that large movements of troops are taking place immediately as a result of the hand-over, I would ask that an early decision may be given me so that I may inform the Ministry of War what is the correct procedure.
