1. In July 1945, the MMIA Liaison Officer attached to Rear 8 Army reported to this Headquarters that there existed a stock of 10,000 Italian Fuses, slow burning, and 80,000 each Italian Detonators, type 6 and type 8, at a G.E.M. dump at MEDRUZZA, map reference C 5306 sheet 6, ITALY Touring Club Map. It was understood at that time that 8 Army would make this stock available to the Italian Army for Bomb Clearance Work, since it was surplus to Allied military requirements at that time.

2. For various reasons, the stock has not yet passed to Italian War Ministry control. It is requested therefore that the following information be furnished this Headquarters as soon as possible:-

- (a) Does the original stock, or any part thereof, still exist at MEDRUZZE Depot.
- (b) If the stock still exists, are H.Q. XIII Corps willing to release.

1. The 130mm Cartridge Bags reported by the Detached Artillery Section (Italian Army), COSENZA, cannot be identified as being of British origin. 130mm equipment was used by Polish and Russian Armies but the amn was of the QF Fixed type and had a brass cartridge case.
2. Owing to difficulty in identification, the amn reported by the Italian Ministry of War may refer to :-
 - (a) Filled cartridges, such as British 4.5 or 5.5in (130 mm is equivalent to 5.12in).
 - (b) Empty cartridge bags, such as are used by several Continental Armies for filling with propellant at the gunsite.
3. Will you please ascertain if the bags are filled or empty (ie free from explosive) and also request that the COSENZA Detachment supply details of markings on the packages or bags.
4. It should be noted that all future locations of amn for disposal should be reported to ADOS this HQ and not to GHQ.

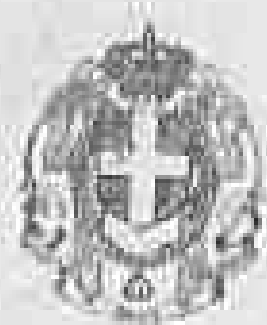

The Commanding General, MTOUSA, has issued instructions to all U.S. Army Commanders in Italy directing that all U.S. Army contracts authorizing civilian battlefield salvage be cancelled effective 28 Feb 1946 and that no further contracts will be negotiated with civilian firms. Also, insofar as the U.S. Army is concerned, battlefield salvage contracts in the future will be the responsibility of the Italian War Ministry through MMIA, or the Italian Ministry of Transportation.

2. This cancellation of contracts includes the civilian firms mentioned in your letter, as requested by you, and also all other civilian firms who might be in possession of contracts.

3. You are therefore at liberty to proceed under Italian law in any manner desired by you against any civilian firm conducting battlefield salvage not under contract with the responsible Ministry of the Italian Government.

4. Reports of salvage of Allied materials and ammunition, as specified in paragraph IX of your letter, will be made to MMIA, and you will thereafter be advised regarding disposition.

1. Inviting attention to copy of translation of letter from the Italian Minister of War, dated 11 Feb 1946 (Incl 1), with attachments referred to therein (Incls 2 and 3).
2. Over a long period reports have been received regarding "illegal" battlefield salvage by individuals intent on getting such quick profits as were apparent. It has been most difficult to trace these matters and establish responsibility. At the same time civilians have strongly objected to individuals entering their property for removal of such scrap, for the main reason that the identity of the individuals or the authority of their credentials was doubtful and the individuals grabbed everything in sight claiming that they had "Allied" orders. Some incidents resulting in shootings have been attributed to this activity. The fact is that the civilians holding these contracts have no responsibility to the property owners or their Government for clearing an area. It might be said that they construe their letter of contract as a "license to loot".

3. The Italian Government is being encouraged to fulfill its responsibility to its citizens, and the Italian Government is making an attempt to do this. It appears that the Italian Government should be encouraged and their expenditure of money and effort should be compensated for by the recovery of all salvage materials for the account of the government. Under the FBS letter, attached as Incl 2, the only one who gains is the Italian civilian, and the Italian Government is put to the expense of following his operations to insure that all dangerous materials have been removed by him, which is entirely unlikely for he will take away only those materials which he can acquire with the minimum of effort and the maximum of profit to himself.

4. (a) The War Minister states that all Allied materials recovered by the War Ministry would be held for disposal by the Allies. The Allies could at least recover from the War Ministry either the materials or value thereof, which is not the case of the civilian contractors, where the Allies get nothing.

2. Over a long period reports have been received regarding "illegal" battlefield salvage by individuals intent on getting such quick profits as were apparent. It has been most difficult to trace these matters and establish responsibility. (b) The War Minister asks that the authority granted the STACCHINI firm by both PBS and Rome Area be cancelled as of 28 Feb 46, and that no further contracts or authority be granted any civilians. The importance of this matter to the Italian Government is emphasized by the fact that the War Minister personally signed the letter to MIA on the matter.

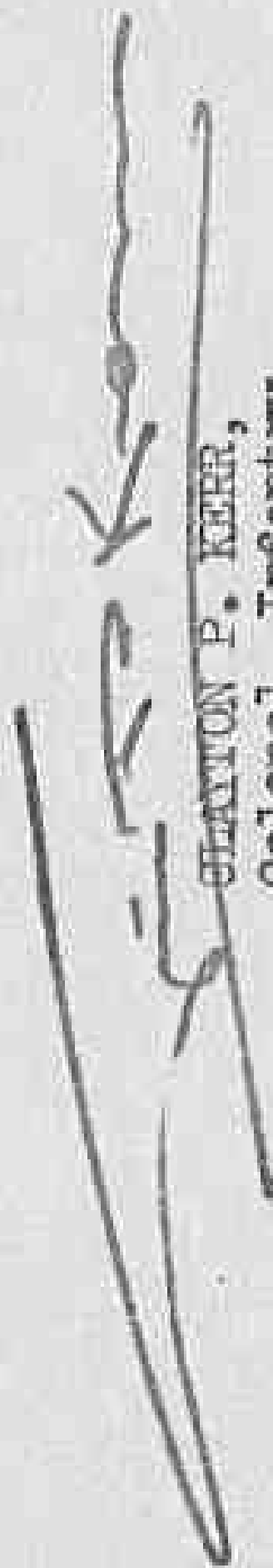
(c) The War Minister states that his Ministry is responsible to the Italian Government for handling this work, and that he will carry out his responsibility to the people of Italy and asks that the Allies remove a source of trouble and irritation and interference with the work being carried out by the War Ministry.

(d) The War Minister states that the Italian Government is attempting to exercise control of all metals in Italy for the good of the nation and assumes control of all metal recovered by the War Ministry operations. However the activities of the civilians under the contracts mentioned, being unknown to, or concealed from, and not reported to the Government, result in some metals not being used in the interest of the nation but being available only to the uncontrolled (black) market. The elimination of these civilian contractors would insure that all recovered metal is properly controlled by

4. (d)(contd). the Government, thus eliminating the black market.
5. Since the evident intent of the Allies appears to be the quick removal of dangerous materials from the Italian battlefields, without expense or cost to the Allies, it is therefore suggested that the interests of the Allies as well as of the Italian people could be best served by cancellation of all contracts or authority in the hands of all civilian firms, effective 28 Feb 1946 and no further contracts be given civilians, as requested by the War Minister.
6. Early action on this matter will be appreciated.

SUBJECT: Clearing, lifting and recovering explosives and other materials alike (excluding mine fields).

I) Some time ago the Ministry of War, started and is now still proceeding, using his own organizations and the help of civilians firms which are controlled by Military Administration, on the lifting, clearing and recuperating of all the explosives and abandoned materials who are scattered all over the national territory, including the Brothern Regions (all that doesn't include mine fields which are taken care by the Ministry of Public Works) for the safeguard of the population, and to give back to the farmers a safe land and to furnish - thru the Ministry of Commerce and Industry - salvage metals to help the iron-work industry that has such an important role on national rehabilitation.

II) The regions or zones where, by order of the Ministry of War, civilian firms engaged by a regular contract, and regions or zones where instead appropriate military units (formed temporarily for the purpose of removal of explosives etc.) are now operating, is clearly shown in the enclosed map which includes the complete country area.

III) In carrying out their task the a/m military units are often hindered by the presency, in the zone assigned to them, of individual civilians and private companies which are accomplishing their same activities with the only limitation to salvage material and ammunitions. Those people apparently are in possession of Allied authorizations - and some of them have no authorizations whatsoever - and that is against the regulations which order that all salvage metals are frozen by the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, which as mentioned before, forwards the material to the iron-work industry.

IV) In reference to what has been mentioned above we transcribe some of the facts:

La Spezia-Pistoia-Firenze-Grosseto-Viterbo-Rome-Litteria-Pistoia-Poma-S. Maria-Napoli, beside the Italian western coast between Naples and La Spezia- and a all year extension to collect the a/m ammunitions in the R.A.A.C.'S are.

b) Another case concerning Sig. Carlo MORETTI, not better known, who has a permit dated 30 Oct 45 which does not show the place where it has been released (so that we are very little sure of the authenticity) signed by Mj. JOHN BRADDOCK of Hq Allied Commission APO 394, Captured Enemy Material Branch - W 10/77-9/1/46 R.A.F.O. 260- which found an helping hand in Sig. Ferruccio CAMBOSI, Rome, 6 Via Ruggero d'Altevilla, in recupering around the Roccasecca & Cassino area and further dispatching to Northern Italy all dear materials mainly brass of cartridge cases, copper alluminium, and expensive finished materials, gears ball-bearings etc.

c) A third case that of Mrs. Pietro ALAIMO, Rome, 55 Via Palestro, Quirino MASELLA, from Itri (Litteria), Pietro DOTTAVIO and Arturo TORDANI, who are conducting on their own account and on a big scale traffic of war materials salvaged in the Cieterna-Inzio-Campione area. In case that such a traffic hasn't been authorized by Allied headquarters (which fact this Ministry is not informed of) it must be considered illegal.

Investigations made in regard to these facts show that the above mentioned people have up to now illegally salvaged or sent (or are still sending) to firms in Northern Italy and Berni, about 1800 tons of material out of which almost 35 tons are dear metals.

V) Therefore it is easy to understand that such permits given to firms or individual civilians or to any outside interference, which are not controlled by our Administration, not only allow the elusion of the regulations concerning frozen metals, so damaging the economy and the authority of the Government, but give rise to harmful interferences in the ordered development of operations and cause troubles, which, at last, compromise the accomplishment of our aims.

VI) The most serious troubles, mentioned already in the above para can be summed up as follows:

a) Conflict of competency between the firms appointed to collect materials and ammunitions by order of Allied Headquarters and those who work for the Italian Military Administration, being ⁴⁰⁹² not compelled to carry out a complete clearing of the ammunitions, will try to clear out only those materials that can surely give them a good profit, while the second ones will consider pertaining to the Allies all those items too difficult to be removed.

b) Objections take place in the testing of the work carried out by the contractors working on account of the Italian Administration.

c) The clearing of dangerous areas is, to tell the truth, only partially effected, because while those firms authorized to work by

Allied headquarters certainly will not remove or blow all those unexploded American munitions, and in the other hand the firms working on account of this Ministry will not provide to it thinking of being such operations of strict competency of the a/m firms.

Therefore reports of death caused by explosives will continue on the same scale.

VII) As a consequence of the a/m facts and in order that the contractors of this Administration can have full responsibility of the work and to help the economy of the country which is facing a heavy expense in this actual deal, and the only way to compensate this loss is to be able to send the total quantity of the salvaged materials to the Italian industry. Our opinion is that the authorization granted by Hq. PENBASE to S/A STACCHINI do not be prolonged after the 28 of Feb 46. and the extent granted to the same firm from Hq Rome Area MTOUSA should be limited at the same date of 28 Feb 46.

In the same way revoke all permits eventually granted by Officers or Allied headquarters to other firms or individual civilians, for the removal of salvaged material all over the country, north included, and first of all, if proved like granted by Allied Hq, the permits to those firms mentioned in b. & c of above para.

VIII) If such an agreement results impossible it appears necessary that at least copy of letters from Allied headquarters authorizing firms for a/m works and showing the areas where the work will be carried out should be sent to us in order that we can notify all those military units responsible for the clearing, lifting and recuperating of material, which are operating in the same areas.

Experience one year old of hard and useful work done by this Ministry, the satisfactory results achieved, the big amounts spent and those to be spent by Italian Government, to terminate the hard job all over the country (including Northern Italy) has shown and still shows that such a work, which very possibly could rise abuses and nasty attacks from the press side, must be organized, directed and strictly controlled by one single organ technically and critically responsible, coming under the Government itself, and the lifting and recuperating of salvaged material must be combined with the elimination of dangerous explosives.

The farmers must be sure that once the clearing squads are gone thru, their fields are definitely safe and cleared.

IX) If your MHA agrees with the requests of this Ministry that is to cancel all permits already granted or to be granted, and only Ministry of War's organizations with set up all over could have such an exclusive responsibility, then all the American munitions and Allied materials that will be recuperated by military units, shall be stored for the disposal of Allied headquarters which from time to time should

be notified by us of the quantities and the depots where the stored material is being kept.

In this way, beside the fact that Allied headquarters concerned would have a much better guaranty, it would make so much easier for us the now so hard task of trying to cut the illegal activity of recuperating salvaged material now carried out in such a big scale by unauthorized people, who by doing so are damaging the country economy and the Government authority.

X) We are waiting to know about your decisions.

1. Pursuant to authority received from the Commanding General, Mediterranean Theater of Operations, U.S. Army, the Polverifici Giovanni Stacchini, herein referred to as the societa' anonima, is authorized to proceed with the collection and demilitarization, at its own expense and without cost to the United States, of abandoned ammunition and components thereof, of U.S. manufacture, which may be found within the geographical limits as defined in paragraph 2 hereunder.

2. The authority granted by this letter is valid for the area bounded by lines connecting La Spezia, Pistoia, Florence, Grosseto, Uiterbo, Rome, Littoria, Formia, Santa Maria, and Naples, and the west coast of Italy between Naples and La Spezia. All of the above named cities, except the Rome Area, are included in the permissible area. Such authorization for collection in the Rome Area as the Commanding General of that area may have granted is in no way effected by this letter.

Forbidden areas are all United States, British, Italian or other depots, establishments or enclaves within the above defined area. Especially forbidden are the areas of U.S. Army Depot 4L57, bounded by lines connecting Leghorn, Pisa, Pontedera, Ronsecco, Colle Salvetti, and Leghorn; U.S. Army Depot 4P85, bounded by lines connecting San Vincenzo, Suvereto, Piombino, and San Vincenzo; and U.S. Army Depot 4N51, bounded by lines connecting Villa Literno, Aversa, Mattanagione, Gualiano and Villa Literno.

3. There is no objection to the collection of abandoned ammunition of other nations, but special permission should first be obtained from these nations.

4. All U.S. ammunition and components thereof collected by the societa' anonima in the areas defined in paragraph 2 will become its property immediately, by virtue of and in full compensation for the act of collection, with the provision that all ammunition will be redereed, by the societa' anonima, unfit for war-like use. This Headquarters, attention of the Ordnance Officer, will be informed of the collecting point or points at which the recovered ammunition and components are to be demilitarized,

and the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, or his representatives, will have the right to inspect the demilitarizing operations at any time, and to repossess for the United States any collected ammunition or components not properly demilitarized within the appointed period of time.

5. Unless sooner terminated, the authority granted by this letter is valid from date of acceptance to include 28 February 1946, and all ammunition or components collected must be demilitarized by 31 March 1946. The authority herein granted may be withdrawn at any time by the U.S. Army. In such event, notice in writing will be given to Polverifici Giovanni Stacchini at the address shown on this instrument. The authority herein granted is not exclusive and similar authority may be granted to other persons or concerns as may be deemed proper.

6. It is agreed and understood that the societa' anonima, in exercising the authority herein granted is acting independently and not as an agent or representative of the U.S. Army. The societa' anonima assumes all responsibility incident to the operations undertaken, by it and agrees to indemnify the United States for any liability or loss which the United States might incur as a result of damage to person or property resulting from said operations.

7. In order to assure identification of employees or agents of Polverifici Giovanni Stacchini in any collection projects arising from this authority, each such person must be provided, by the societa' anonima, with an identification card. The driver of each vehicle transporting collected ammunition must have in his possession a photostat copy of this letter.

8. Notification of acceptance of the terms of this agreement will be indicated by written indorsement hereon.

Therefore the firm should not have addressed their letter to you on 9 Feb 1946. A copy of letter from the firm to War Materials Disposal Branch, dated 16 Feb 46 is attached for your information. You are at liberty to take any action, against this firm as desired by you.

2. Neither the Captured Enemy Materials Branch nor the Transportation Sub-Commission has authority to grant permits for purchase or collection of salvage. Therefore any firm operating under such alleged permit is operating illegally, and can be dealt with by you under appropriate Italian laws, without reference to the Allied Command.

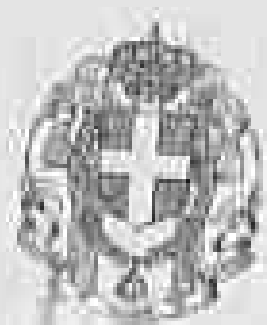

1. Inviting attention to copy of translation of letter from the Italian Minister of War, dated 11 Feb 1946 (Incl 1), with attachments referred to therein (Incls 2 and 3).
2. Over a long period reports have been received regarding "illegal" battlefield salvage by individuals intent on getting such quick profits as were apparent. It has been most difficult to trace these matters and establish responsibility. At the same time civilians have strongly objected to individuals entering their property for removal of such scrap, for the main reason that the identity of the individuals or the authority of their credentials was doubtful and the individuals grabbed everything in sight claiming that they had "Allied" orders. Some incidents resulting in shootings have been attributed to this activity. The fact is that the civilians holding these contracts have no responsibility to the property owners or their Government for clearing an area. It might be said that they construe their letter of contract as a "license to loot".

3. The Italian Government is being encouraged to fulfill its responsibility to its citizens, and the Italian Government is making an attempt to do this. It appears that the Italian Government should be encouraged and their expenditure of money and effort should be compensated for by the recovery of all salvage materials for the account of the government. Under the Hqs letter, attached as Incl 2, the only one who gains is the Italian civilian, and the Italian Government is put to the expense of following his operations to insure that all dangerous materials have been removed by him, which is entirely unlikely for he will take away only those materials which he can acquire with the minimum of effort and the maximum of profit to himself.

4. (a) The War Minister states that all Allied materials recovered by the War Ministry would be held for disposal by the Allies. The Allies could at least recover from the War Ministry either the materials or value thereof, which is not the case of the civilian contractors, where the Allies get nothing.

Italian Minister of War, dated 11 Feb 1946 (Incl 1), with attachments referred to therein (Incls 2 and 3).

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4. (a) The War Minister states that all Allied materials recovered by the War Ministry would be held for disposal by the Allies. The Allies could at least recover from the War Ministry either the materials or value thereof, which is not the case of the civilian contractors, where the Allies get nothing.

(b) The War Minister asks that the authority granted the SEAGUINI firm by both EEC and Rome Area be cancelled as of 28 Feb 46, and that no further contracts or authority be granted any civilians. The importance of this matter to the Italian Government is emphasized by the fact that the War Minister personally signed the letter to MIA on the matter.

(c) The War Minister states that his Ministry is responsible to the Italian Government for handling this work, and that he will carry out his responsibility to the people of Italy and asks that the Allies remove a source of trouble and irritation and interference with the work being carried out by the War Ministry.

(d) The War Minister states that the Italian Government is attempting to exercise control of all metals in Italy for the good of the nation and assumes control of all metal recovered by the War Ministry operations. However the activities of the civilians under the contracts mentioned, being unknown to, or concealed from, and not reported to the Government, result in some metals not being used in the interest of the nation but being available only to the uncontrolled (black) market. The elimination of these civilian contractors would insure that all recovered metal is properly controlled by

4. (a)(contd). the Government, thus eliminating the black market.

5. Since the evident intent of the Allies appears to be the quick removal of dangerous materials from the Italian battlefields, without expense or cost to the Allies, it is therefore suggested that the interests of the Allies as well as of the Italian people could be best served by cancellation of all contracts or authority in the hands of all civilian firms, effective 28 Feb 1946 and no further contracts be given civilians, as requested by the War Minister.

6. Early action on this matter will be appreciated.

SUBJECT: Clearing, lifting and recovering explosives and other materials alike (excluding mine fields).

I) Some time ago the Ministry of War, started and is now still proceeding, using his own organizations and the help of civilians firms which are controlled by Military Administration, on the lifting, clearing and recuperating of all the explosives and abandoned materials who are scattered all over the national territory, including the Northern Regions (all that doesn't include mine fields which are taken care by the Ministry of Public Works) for the safeguard of the population, and to give back to the farmers a safe land and to furnish - thru the Ministry of Commerce and Industry - salvage metals to help the iron-work industry that has such an important role on national rehabilitation.

II) The regions or zones where, by order of the Ministry of War, civilian firms engaged by a regular contract, and regions or zones where instead appropriate military units (formed temporarily for the purpose of removal of explosive etc) are now operating, is clearly shown in the enclosed map which includes the complete country area.

map removed by Capt Ward

III) In carrying out their task the a/m military units are often hindered by the preseney, in the zone assigned to them, of individual civilians and private companies which are accomplishing their same activity with the only limitation to salvage material and ammunitions. Those people apparently are in possession of Allied authorizations-and some of them have no authorizations whatsoever. And that is against the regulations which order that all salvage metals are frozen by the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, which, as mentioned before, forwards the material to the iron-work industry.

IV) In reference to what has been mentioned above we transcribe some of the facts:

a) The case about the gun-powder factory - Giovanni STACCHINI, Rome which, by letters AG 400.93 BRQDS dated 13 Dec 45 Hq PENEASE Section, and AG 400 dated 21 Dec 45 Hq Rome Area MTOUSA (whose copies are inclosed herewith) obtained authorization, till the 28 of Feb 46, for the recupering and the stripping of the ammunitions and alike american salvage that were in the area that goes from

La Spezia-Pistoia-Firenze-Grosseto-Miterbo-Roma-Littoria-Pistoia-Forma-S.Maria-Napoli, beside the Italian western coast between Naples and La Spezia- and a all year extention to collect the a/w ammunitions in the R.A.A.C.'S are.

b) Another case concerning Sig. Carlo MORETTI, not better known, who has a permit dated 30 Oct 45 which does not show the place where it has been released (so that we are very little sure of the authenticity) signed by Mj. JOHN BRADDOCK of Hq Allied Commission APO 394, Captured Enemy Material Branch - W MO/77-9/1/46 R.E.F.O. 260- which found an helping hand in Sig. Ferruccio CAMUCCI, Rome, 6 Via Ruggero d'Altavilla, in recupering around the Roccasecca & Cassino area and further dispatching to northern Italy all dear materials mainly brass of cartridge cases, copper aluminium, and expensive finished materials, gears ball-bearings etc.

c) A third case that of Mrs. Pietro ALAIMO, Rome, 55 Via Palestro, Quirino MASSELLA, from Itri (Littoria), Pietro DOTTAVIDO and Arturo TORDINI, who are conducting on their own account and on a big scale traffic of war materials salvaged in the Gisterna-Anzio-Campione area. In case that such a traffic hasn't been authorized by Allied headquarters (which fact this Ministry is not informed of) it must be considered illegal.

Investigations made in regard to these facts show that the above mentioned people have up to now illegally salvaged or sent (or are still sending) to firms in Northern Italy and Terna, about 1800 tons of material out of which almost 53 tons are dear metals.

V) Therefore it is easy to understand that such permits given to firms or individual civilians or to any outside interference, which are not controlled by our Administration, not only allow the elusion of the regulations concerning frozen metals, so damaging the economy and the authority of the Government, but give rise to harmful interferences in the ordered development of operations and cause troubles, which, at last, compromise the accomplishment of our aims.

VI) The most serious troubles, mentioned already in the above para can be summed up as follows:

a) Conflict of competency between the firms appointed to collect materials and ammunitions by order of Allied Headquarters and those who work for the Italian Military Administration, being the first not compelled to carry out a complete clearing of the ammunitions, will try to clear out only those materials that can surely give them a good profit, while the second ones will consider pertaining to the Allies all those items too difficult to be removed.

b) Objections take place in the testing of the work carried out by the contractors working on account of the Italian Administration.

c) The clearing of dangerous areas is, to tell the truth, only partially effected, because while those firms authorized to work by

Translation (Cont'd)

Allied headquarters certainly will not remove or blow all those unexploded american munitions, and in the other hand the firms working on account of this Ministry will not provide to it thinking of being such operations of strict competency of the a/m firms.

Therefore reports of death caused by explosives will continue on the same scale.

VII) As a consequence of the a/m facts and in order that the contractors of this Administration can have full responsibility of the work and to help the economy of the country which is facing a heavy expense in this actual deal, and the only way to compensate this loss is to be able to send the total quantity of the salvaged materials to the Italian industry. Our opinion is that the authorization granted by Hq. PENBASE to S/A STACCHINI do not be prolonged after the 28 of Feb 46. and the extent granted to the same firm from Hq Rome Area MPOUSA should be limited at the same date of 28 Feb 46.

In the same way revoke all permits eventually granted by Officers or Allied Headquarters to other firms or individual civilians, for the removal of salvaged material all over the country, north included, and first of all, if proved like granted by Allied Hq, the permits to those firms mentioned in b. & c of above para.

VIII) If such an agreement results impossible it appears necessary that at least copy of letters from Allied headquarters authorizing firms for a/m works and showing the areas where the work will be carried out should be sent to us in order that we can notify all those military units responsible for the clearing, lifting and recupering of material, which are operating in the same areas.

Experience one year old of hard and useful work done by this Ministry, the satisfactory results achieved, the big amounts spent and those to be spent by Italian Government, to terminate the hard job all over the country (including Northern Italy) has shown and still shows that such a work, which very possibly could rise abuses and nasty attacks from the press side, must be organized, directed and strictly controlled by one single organ technically and politically responsible, coming under the Government itself, and the lifting and recupering of salvaged material must be combined with the elimination of dangerous explosives.

The farmers must be sure that once the clearing squads are gone thru, their fields are definitely safe and cleared.

IX) If you MMIA agrees with the requests of this Ministry that is to cancel all permits already granted or to be granted, and only Ministry of War's organizations with set up all over could have such an exclusive responsibility, then all the American munitions and Allied materials that will be recuperated by military units, shall be stored for the disposal of Allied headquarters which from time to time should

be notified by us of the quantities and the depots where the stored material is being kept.

In this way, beside the fact that Allied headquarters concerned would have a much better guaranty, it would make so much easier for us the now so hard task of trying to cut the illegal activity of recupering salvaged material now carried out in such a big scale by unauthorized people, who by doing so are damaging the country economy and the Government authority.

X) We are waiting to know about your decisions.

1. Pursuant to authority received from the Commanding General, Mediterranean Theater of Operations, U.S. Army, the Polverifici Giovanni Stacchini, herein referred to as the societa' anonima, is authorized to proceed with the collection and demilitarization, at its own expense and without cost to the United States, of abandoned ammunition and components thereof, of U.S. manufacture, which may be found within the geographical limits as defined in paragraph 2 hereunder.

2. The authority granted by this letter is valid for the area bounded by lines connecting La Spezia, Pistoia, Florence, Grosseto, Giterbo, Rome, Littoria, Formia, Santa Maria, and Naples, and the west coast of Italy between Naples and La Spezia. All of the above named cities, except the Rome Area, are included in the permissible area. Such authorization for collection in the Rome Area as the Commanding General of that area may have granted is in no way effected by this letter.

Forbidden areas are all United States, British, Italian or other depots, establishments or enclaves within the above defined area. Especially forbidden are the areas of U.S. Army Depot 4L57, bounded by lines connecting Leghorn, Pisa, Pontedera, Ponsacco, Colle Salvetti, and Leghorn; U.S. Army Depot 4P85, bounded by lines connecting San Vincenzo, Suvereto, Piombino, and San Vincenzo; and U.S. Army Depot 4N51, bounded by lines connecting Villa Literno, Aversa, Prattomaggiore, Qualiano and Villa Literno.

3. There is no objection to the collection of abandoned ammunition of other nations, but special permission should first be obtained from these nations.

4. All U.S. ammunition and components thereof collected by the societa' anonima in the areas defined in paragraph 2 will become its property immediately, by virtue of and in full compensation for the act of collection, with the provision that all ammunition will be redereed, by the societa' anonima, unfit for war-like use. This Headquarters, attention of the Ordnance Officer, will be informed of the collecting point or points at which the recovered ammunition and components are to be demilitarized,

and the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, or his representatives, will have the right to inspect the demilitarizing operations at any time, and to repossess for the United States any collected ammunition or components not properly demilitarized within the appointed period of time.

5. 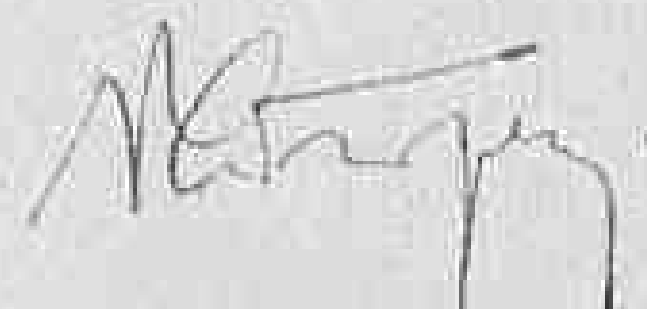

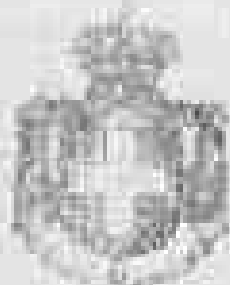

Allied responsibility for safeguarding such ammunition will cease from the time that satisfactory arrangements have been made to that effect.

When loading is completed a further list showing actual quantities despatched will be forwarded.
