OBJECT OF THIS DIRECTIVE

The object of this directive is to indicate the method of disposal of, and policies and conditions controlling the disposal of the remaining captured and/or surrendered enemy war material in the Mediterranean Theater. The following letters from their headquarters, or a similar, are hereby rescinded:

AG 306.3/103 100-O, dated 22 June 1945, subject: "Disposition of Captured Enemy Material in ITALY".

AG 306.3/145 001-O, dated 9 April 1945, subject: "Allocation and Disposal of Enemy Material in Greece".

AG 306.3/219 001-O, dated 3 August 1945, subject: "Disposition of Captured Enemy Material in AUSTRIA".

RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE CONTROL AND DISPOSAL OF ENEMY MATERIAL

a. The control of all enemy material in this theater is vested in the Supreme Allied Commander.

b. The allocation, use and ultimate disposal of enemy material is a responsibility of command, which will be exercised by you in accordance with the provisions of this directive.

OTHER INFO

The property of all enemy material in this theater is vested in the Supreme Allied Commander.

4. DISPOSITION

The majority of enemy material available for disposition is located in ITALY and AUSTRIA. Therefore this directive has been prepared with full reference to disposal in these two countries. Where the policy varies for other countries within the theater, notes have been added indicating the different procedure to be applied.

5. DEFINITIONS

a. Captured or Suspected Enemy War Material - (hereafter referred to as enemy material) includes any material of whatever nature and wherever situated, intended for use on land, at sea, or in the air, which has been at any time in use by, or intended for use by, the armed forces, civil defence, or other formations or organisations under the control or influence of the German Government, German authorities, or Governments or authorities of any states allied to, or associated with, GERMANY.

b. Disposal Authority is the military authority in whom is vested the power to dispose of enemy material.

6. PRINCIPLES TO BE APPLIED

a. Allied Naval, Ground and Air Forces Responsibilities.

Enemy Naval, and Air Forces material will be controlled and disposed of by the Allied Naval and Air Forces respectively. Enemy Ground Forces material will be controlled and disposed of by the Allied Ground Forces and co-ordination, where necessary, between the Allied Naval, Ground and Air Forces will be effected by the Ground Forces Commanders. The latter, in the appropriate cases, must be prepared to assist Allied Naval and Air Forces Commanders in the control and disposition of material peculiar to the enemy Naval and Air Forces. Consumer items will normally be the responsibility of the Allied Ground Forces.

b. Allied Ground Forces, Staff and Service Responsibilities for Control and Disposition of enemy material.

The responsibility for the control, safeguarding or disposition of all enemy Ground Forces war material is placed upon the Commanding Generals of all major commands in their respective areas. This responsibility will be exercised through the normal Allied Staff and Technical service channels appropriate to the type of material concerned. It is desired that arrangements made by each command be such that continuity of control can be maintained when changes of territorial command occur.

c. CONTROLLING AUTHORITIES AT AMMO - The control of enemy material will be exercised by AMMO through normal command and technical channels appropriate to the material concerned.

B. POLICIES

- a. Possession of material by units or individuals - Retention by units or individuals of such material unless properly authorized in accordance with this instruction, and other pertinent directives is forbidden.
- b. Use of material by Allied Commanders - Authority is granted for the maximum use to be made of enemy material required for the support of Allied Forces in the accomplishment of their assigned mission (including essential civil requirements) or for the maintenance of enemy forces.
- c. Recaptured material of Italian Military Origin - Recaptured material of Italian origin which is not required for military purposes, including maintenance of POW, will be turned over immediately to the Italian military authorities. The channel of transmission in material of Italian Ground Force origin, which is to be returned to the Italian Army authorities, will be the Land Forces Sub Commission A.C. (M.M.I.A.). Receipt for material so handed over will be taken by the issuing Allied Service and forwarded to this headquarters through normal service channels. All remaining recaptured Italian War Material, not required for maintenance as above, will be reported to AFHQ and disposal instructions awaited, except that in the case of Naval and Air Force material, when the instructions of the Naval or Air Force Sub Commission of the Allied Commissions, acting on behalf of the Allied Naval and Air Force Commanders, may be accepted.
- d. For Material of United States, British or other United Nations origin
 - (1) It will be the policy for material of United States or British origin recovered from the enemy by recaptured or surrendered to be turned over to the American or British services normally responsible for the class of material concerned.
 - (2) For materials which can be readily identified as having been acquired during the war in any way by the Germans, from any United Nations, will be restored, providing however, that material susceptible only of warlike use shall be restored only when it can be identified as having been captured from the armed forces of any United Nation.
 - (3) Any enemy material, apparently previously belonging to any of the United Nations as defined above will be segregated and reported to this headquarters. Particular attention is requested in this theater to material of Russian, Czechoslovak or French origin.

dated 2 October 45, (Cont'd)

a. Enemy Material required by the London Limitations Assignment Board - There still exists outstanding requirements of the London Limitations Assignment Board to meet global demands for enemy material. A list of these requirements is contained in this Headquarters letter AG 386.3/163 HP-O of 23 September 1945 as amended. A copy of the required items is attached at Appendix "A" for reference. Reports of availabilities of this material will be made in accordance with the letter under reference.

b. Enemy material required for research - A search list of enemy material required for research in U.S. has been supplied to major commands and items on this list are still required by Technical Intelligence. This material when found, is regarded as Category 1.

c. Carian Naval Equipment - All material pertaining to ships and vessels of the German Navy (including armament, ammunition and supplies) which must be handed over to the power receiving the ships and vessels, will be safeguarded and recorded through naval channels.

d. War Factories and War Factory Production - The policies contained in letter, this Headquarters, file M-534.3/C37 GM-O dated 2 August 1945, subject "Policy on Italian Limitations Production" will apply.

e. Remaining Surplus Material - All enemy material surplus to the requirements contained in a and g above will be disposed of in the manner indicated in the following sections of this letter.

With the exception of vehicles - see paragraph 9 g below - if material is surplus within any one particular command, it will be assumed to be surplus to theater requirements, unless notification received to the contrary, and will be disposed of as indicated.

9. METHODS OF DISPOSAL

a. Enemy material suitable for use in the civil rehabilitation of the country - In order that the maximum use may be made of surplus enemy material in its present form, all such material having a value in the civil rehabilitation of a country will be made available immediately for disposal to the government of that country as follows:

- (1) In ITALY (Geno Venetia Giulia and Udine Provinces - To the Ministry of Transportation through the Allied Commission to Italy.
- (2) In VENETIA GIULIA AND UDINE PROVINCES - To Allied Military Government XIII Corps.
- (3) In AUSTRIA - To British Troops in Austria (Military Government Staff) and later to Allied Commission to Austria when responsibility for civil supply passes to them from Military Government Staff.

(4) In other countries - To the respective Governments through the Allied Military agency in that country.

b. Captured Civilian Material

Captured material which is apparently of a civil character and surplus to known military requirements will be disposed of as above. The Government or Allied Military Government of the country will be responsible for investigating and settling claims to ownership.

c. Enemy material unsuitable for civil use (excluding ammunition)

All enemy material surplus to known requirements and having no value in its present form, in the civil rehabilitation of the country will be disposed of by being rendered innocuous, reduced to scrap and disposed of by the normal Salvage organisation. As far as possible, and in order to reduce transportation commitments, the material will be reduced to scrap in situ. Salvage organisations will arrange for the disposition of the material through normal channels to the Government or Allied Military Government concerned, from the location where the material is reduced to scrap. It will be responsibility of the command concerned to ensure that all enemy material is rendered of no further military value, in its existing form, before it is made available for disposal as scrap.

d. Chemical Warfare Equipment and Toxic Material

(1) All defensive chemical warfare equipment which may have a value in the civil rehabilitation of the country will be disposed of as in 9 a above. All other defensive chemical warfare equipment will be reduced to scrap.

(2) All chemical warfare ammunition will be destroyed by dumping at sea. Dumping will take place at least 20 miles from the shore, in at least 250 fathoms of water and away from shipping routes, fishing grounds and submarine cables. The provisions of AFHQ Operation Memorandum Number 77 and of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum Numbers 14, 15 and 35 will be adhered to in connection with all movement of toxic material.

(3) Any PREGARD or DREGARD (Valuable materials for destruction) in bulk will be released to the Government or Allied Military Government of the country in which it is found, for use only by reputable concerns whose plant can be subjected to suitable control, or such materials will be dumped at sea under conditions laid down in paragraph (2).

(4) Any other bulk toxic material will be treated as in paragraph (3) unless its transportation is considered dangerous, in which case it will be rendered innocuous by methods approved by the chemical warfare adviser.

(5) Further instructions will be issued by Chemical Warfare Staffs.

Extract from Itr. AG 386.3 Q(2)-O

Part 9. Ammunition

- (1) All enemy mines, grenades, detonators and initiators, explosives, small arms ammunition and ammunition of 20 mm caliber or below and surplus to known military requirements will be destroyed by dumping in the sea, or taken or by being exploded. Dumping will take place only in water of 50 fathoms depth or more. Until destroyed, as indicated, enemy material of this nature will continue to be a guard responsibility of the command in whose area it is located. In the destruction of this material German personnel, under Allied supervision, may be utilized and if necessary, German technical units may be formed for the purpose.
- (2) The location and quantities of all enemy ammunition, larger than 20 mm caliber, will be made known to the Government or Allied Military Government of the country concerned by the Command in whose area the material is located, through the Allied Commission or similar Allied agency. The Government or Allied Military Government of the country will then become totally responsible for the ammunition and will make the necessary arrangements with civilian firms, for the breaking down of the ammunition into its component parts. The Allied agency will be responsible for ensuring that the resultant products from the breaking down process, are not employed in the production of further armaments by the Governments of the countries. When the location and quantity of ammunition larger than 20 mm caliber has been made known to the Government or Allied Military Government of the country concerned, that organization will then be responsible for the safeguarding of the ammunition until its final disposal. Allied responsibility for safeguarding such ammunition will cease from the time that satisfactory arrangements have been made to this effect.
- (3)
 - (I) The allocation and quantities of all ammunition of Italian origin situated in Italy will be made known to the Italian Government or, in the case of the provinces of Udine and Venezia Giulia, to the Allied Military Government concerned.
 - (II) The Italian Government or the Allied Government will make immediate arrangements to take over the ammunition and will be totally responsible for its safe custody until its final disposal. The Italian Government or the Allied Military Government concerned will assume the responsibility, within a time limit to be set by mutual agreement with the competent Allied Military Commander, for safeguarding such ammunition.

- (III) In the interest of internal security the Italian Government or the Allied Military Government concerned will be instructed to concentrate for particular guarding all ammunition of 20 mm caliber and below including mines, grenades etc. They will be further instructed to place special guards on ammunition of a dangerous nature until its disposal. Commanders will satisfy themselves, when handing over, that such arrangements are in fact in hand. Such handing over will only be at their discretion having regard to any operational directives the contrary and to the maintenance of internal security.
- (IV) The Italian Government, or Allied Military Government concerned, will make necessary arrangements, and be totally responsible for the disposal of all ammunition of Italian origin whether by destruction, damping or breaking down into component parts for use in the civil rehabilitation of the country. Robots resulting from the breaking down processes will not be employed in the production of further armaments except as permitted by the Allied authorities. The Italian Government when making disposal will have regard to the requirements of the future Italian Armed Forces.
- (V) The Italian Government, or the Allied Military Government concerned, will be made finally responsible for the disposal of dangerous ammunition. However, present facilities for disposal afforded by the Allied will be continued as long as possible.
- (VI) Ammunition of Italian origin, located elsewhere than in Italy will be disposed as for captured ammunition of enemy origin.
- (7) Nothing in these instructions is to be regarded in any way as restricting the authority of all who does to dispose of ammunition, in any quantity, or in any manner considered suitable, which is in a dangerous condition, or constitutes a hazard to civil or military security.

(F) Animals - Any enemy animals surplus to known military requirements reported to this headquarters and disposal instructions awaited.

(G) Vehicles

- (1) All captured enemy vehicles will be used to the ~~greatest~~ fullest possible extent in order to save Allied transport. Whenever practicable, however, such vehicles will not be issued without workshop inspection, and never without ~~ID numbers~~ and full registration.

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- (2) The issue of enemy vehicles to occupying Allied units will be handled only in cases where such units have dependencies in their own's (i.e.), except within the powers delegated to commands to issue vehicles in excess of 1000 tons.

3) Vehicles of Italian origin, if supplied to allied requirements will be returned to the appropriate Italian Army authorities through the local Forces and Communication A.C. (NATO) under the terms of Paragraph 6 C above. All other captured Italian vehicles, if surplus to requirements, will be returned to the Italian Government, through Allied Commissions, under the terms of para. 9 (1) above. Italian military vehicles can usually be identified by two stars to be found on the engine. If doubt arises as to whether a vehicle or vehicle part is a civilian or military vehicle, such vehicle will be turned over to MIA who will determine the ownership and subsequent allocation in conjunction with Allied Commission. Every effort will be made to hand over all vehicles of Italian make to the appropriate Italian authorities at the earliest possible date. Every effort will be made to turn over to MIA all stocks of spare parts including tyres for Italian military vehicles which are marked with the two stars, or are otherwise identifiable as being the property of the Italian Ministry of War. Spares for Italian civilian vehicles will be handed over similarly to Allied Commissions or in doubtful cases, to the MIA. Surplus stocks may be retained for each Italian vehicles as are held against the declared requisitions, and provision of services for all vehicles handed over to them will be that of Allied Commissions or MIA as the case may be.

- 4) Vehicles of other United Nation origin will be disposed of as in para. 6 d. above.

5) All other vehicles to be turned to the requirements of any particular command, including those requirements of the Italian authorities, will be turned over immediately to the government or Italian authorities to be used as available to those countries and districts in which they will be disposed of as in paragraph 6 above.

Other Vehicles

- 5) All other vehicles, unless retained for any other particular purpose, will be made available to suit the locally existing conditions of those countries by the civil organisation of that country.

10. DURING OR IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE WAR AND GERMANY

Arrangements for the disposal of surplus enemy material in Italy and Greece will be made to suit the locally existing conditions of those countries provided the policies outlined in paragraph 3 above are complied with at all times.

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Under Article 9(e) (see Annex A.C. (part)) under the terms of paragraph 6 above, All other captured Italian vehicles, to sample to requirements, shall be returned to the Italian Government, through Allied Comision, under the terms of para. 9(e)(1) above. Italian Military vehicles can usually be identified by two stars to be found on the steering wheel, or on the front fenders & vehicle or "stalins ears" to denote captured vehicles, each vehicle will be turned over to the Italian authorities at the earliest possible date. Every effort will be made to return the Italian vehicles to the Italian authorities at the earliest possible date. 40. DISPOSAL OF MATERIAL WHICH IS NOT USED

In order that any captured equipments may be converted to a subsequent use arrangements for the disposal of surplus enemy material in stores now and those will be made to suit the local existing conditions of these countries provided the policies established in paragraph 5 above are complied with at all times.

41. RECORDS

In order that any captured equipments may be converted to a subsequent use

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records of all issues and receipts and material reduced to scrap will be maintained. Salvage organizations will record quantities and nature of scrap disposed of through normal salvage disposal channels. Copies of all records of transactions will be forwarded to Q(AW)ATF, through service channels, for maintenance of the records.

12. In the case that this directive is contrary to, or at variance with, other directives in this theater covering the same subject, this directive will govern.



MEMORANDUM

P. J. Walker

In September 1945 Col. GONZALES Alfredo - of the Medical Corps - applied for the release of an old inefficient car from the Prefettura of Udine. Col. Gonzales was then the officer in charge of the Health Office, 5th Territorial Command, Udine, and needed a car for his medical service.

The application was granted and a FIAT 500 released to the colonel. As it appears from the official certificate of the Prefettura - dated 11 Sept. 45 - the vehicle was off the road and without tyres and tubes. (It also lacked: carburetor, coil, distributor, plugs, battery, arrows, dash-board, upholstery, and other accessories). Col. Gonzales spent 200.000 lire to have it put in running order. He also had it registered at PRA, Udine.

According to the order given to him by the Prefettura, he could not give the car to anybody else, for any reason whatsoever. Therefore he took it with him when he was transferred to Rome on official service.

Sometime after the release of the car, the local AMG claimed that the car belonged to them and not to the Prefettura, and made Col. Gonzales sign another certificate. They assured him that this was a mere matter of form and that it would not change the position.

However, when the colonel left Udine for Rome, they stated that - according to this certificate, he could not take the car with him, and asked for the vehicle to be returned to them. They did not take any account of the expenses for the repairs which, according to the first certificate made by the Prefettura, should have been reimbursed if the Prefettura had asked for the return of the car.

Col. Gonzales was verbally assured by AMG that he will be given priority when the car is put on sale, but this statement is too vague and they might not be able to carry it out. Therefore Col. Gonzales is in danger of losing the money he spent on the repairs, and which he had to borrow at the time.

He is willing to surrender the vehicle, if necessary definitively, but would like to be sure that he is not going to lose too much money over it, and that he will be reimbursed for the expenses he met before he signed the second certificate.

On the other hand, on a ground of justice, AMG cannot take the vehicle as it is now, with all the parts which the Colonel had put on it.

In the meantime, by order of G-5, LACAB, MIQ (APO 794; Udine), the car has been confiscated by Garalinieri!!!!!!!

The undersigned asks that the order of the G-5 office may be cancelled, or - at least - that he may be reimbursed for the expenses made to have the car put in running order, or that the car may be definitively assigned to him, as has happened in many similar cases. (sgd) Col. Gonzales Alfredo

SUBJECT: Italian Army material captured by the Allies and returned to the Italian Government.-

The ARAR General Directorate pointed out to this Ministry that some release orders dealing with the material in question bear the following remark:-

"Section....and.... of att schedule to be handed over to Italian forces in accordance with GHQ letter AG 386.3C (AE) - 0 of 2 Oct. 1945 as amended by AG 386.3Q (CEMS)- 0 dated 8 Feb. and 8 March 1946".-

On other release orders, however, dealing with the same type of material falling under the same category, the above remark is omitted. For the latter, therefore, ARAR General Directorate thinks of not being compelled of handing over the material listed therein to the Italian Army.-

On the other hand, the opinion of this Ministry, according to instructions issued by Allied Authorities, is that all the material which is being handed over by CEMS to ARAR must be handed over by ARAR.

It is understood that the M.of W. is ready to make a pledge with ARAR the same way as ARAR did with the issuing branch and this in order that ARAR bears no responsibility for the material transferred to the Italian military administration.-

We beg you therefore, to kindly summarise all the instructions issued regarding the above in one letter which you will kindly address to the M. of W and ARAR General Directorate.-

1. The majority of captured enemy material dumps and depots have now been disposed of but isolated cases exist where a substantial quantity of material is still awaiting disposal. Owing to the rapid rundown in Allied Military personnel it is essential that all matters connected with the disposal of captured enemy material should be completed as soon as possible.

2. Addressees will therefore review the position concerning all captured enemy material dumps and depots in their territory. All material required for Allied military purposes will be withdrawn forthwith and inventories of material still remaining in dumps or depots will be reported to Headquarters Allied Commission, or other appropriate authority, for disposal in accordance with Allied Force Headquarters letter, AG 386.3 Q(AE)-0 of 2 October 1945, as amended.

3. Addressees will report by 1 October 1946, details of all depots or dumps still awaiting disposal; a further report will be rendered by 8 October 1946 giving the dates on which disposal was completed. Should any depot or dump still await disposal, full reasons for the delay will be given; thereafter a weekly signal will be sent showing position as at 1200 hours Saturday.

4. This instruction does not cover unit holdings of captured enemy material for which separate instructions are being issued.
