THIS CONSOLIDATED INSTRUCTION ON THIS SUBJECTS, WHICH HAVE NOT PREVIOUSLY BEEN CIRCULATED. IT MUST BE CIRCULATED AS READ IN FULL.

Circular C.E.F. 100 of the 6th February 1945, together with subsequent amendments, is hereby cancelled and all instructions relating to persons entitled to deal at MAINT establishments overseas are consolidated hereunder:-

Basic instructions on "Persons entitled to deal at MAINT Establishments Overseas" are contained in War Office letter 103/GE/7166 (Q.2) of 29.12.43. A copy of which, including the amplification given in War Office letter 103/GE/7166 (Q.2b) of 13.5.44 is attached hereto. The authority for granting permits under paras. 4 and 5 of the War Office letter rests with Q (Maint); G.H.Q.

It should be noted that service personnel mentioned in paras. 1 and 2 of the War Office letter include personnel of Colonial, Indian and Dominion Forces.

MAINT PERSONNEL.

MAINT personnel referred to in para. 1(3) of War Office letter include all enlisted personnel and British Civilian employed by or attached to MAINT, including H.E. artists. MAINT artists, MAINT H.E. artists and W's are considered to be of Officer status for the purpose of obtaining MAINT Supplies.

Local civilian employees of MAINT or MAINT, whether artists or not, have no entitlement to deal.

POLISH ARMED FORCES.

Until further notice personnel of the Polish Armed Forces have the same right to deal as to use MAINT Supplies, as personnel of the British, Dominion, Indian and Colonial Forces. (Authority: G.H.Q. DIF. 2593/2(Maint) of 9/10/45).

USE OF SUPPLIES BY ARMED SOLDIERS.

Basic instructions on personnel matters "Overseas" are contained in War Office letter 103/WH/7166 (3.21) of 29.12.45. A copy of which, including the amplification given in War Office letter 103/WH/7166 (3.25) of 13.5.44 is attached hereto. The authority for granting permits under paras. 4 and 5 of the War Office letter rests with G (Main). HQ.

It should be noted that services personnel mentioned in paras. 1 and 2 of the War Office letter include personnel of Colonial, Indian and Dominion Forces.

NAVAL PERSONNEL.

Naval personnel referred to in para. 1(3) of War Office letter includes all enlisted personnel and British Civilians employed by or attached to the Navy, including HMSA artists. HMSA artists, HMSA sailors, etc. are considered to be of Officer status for the purpose of obtaining IFT Supplies.

Local civilian employees of HMN or HMSA, whether citizens or not, have no entitlement to deal.

POLISH ARMED FORCES.

Until further notice personnel of the Polish Armed Forces have the same right to deal and to use IFT Coupons, as personnel of the British, Dominions, Indian and Colonial Forces. (Authority: HQ. G.P. 2509/30 (Main) of 9/10/45).

USE OF CAMPAINS BY ALLIED SOLDIERS.

All IFT (and GWM) Clubs and Campains will be open only to British, Dominion, Indian and Colonial troops. All their invited guests, who are not Allied military personnel only (Italian troops are not Allied personnel).

Soldiers inviting guests will be responsible for all payments and for the behaviour of the guests.

Any Commander of the rank of Major-General or above, or of the rank of Brigadier in a country other than Italy may, in special circumstances, order that British Clubs and Campains be opened and the opened to such Allied troops on such terms and conditions as he may direct.

2. It is recognised that ships of the Merchant Navy operate under conditions which prevent their obtaining supplies for their normal needs. Consequently, during the establishment of the Ministry of War Transport, alternative arrangements for supplies for such ships have been made with that Ministry to enable them to obtain supplies for ships of the Merchant Navy at a special price over and above the normal price for the stocks of the Merchant Navy.

3. In addition, the Corporation has agreed to purchase and ship to these ports, for supply to ships of the Merchant Navy, supplies of food from the United Kingdom branch for the specific purpose.

4. The ports to which it is proposed to send stocks of food (initially) are Algiers, Alexandria, Barcelona, Genoa, and Oran. The ports to be supplied will be decided from time to time, by mutual agreement between the Corporation and the Ministry of War Transport.

5. Control of issues. In order to ensure that no ship obtains more than its fair share of the above commodities, each master, or his representative, calling for supplies, must produce at the time of the request a recognised log book, (M.T.F. Form No. 1541).

The log book will be issued to the master of ships of the Merchant Navy at the time of their first call on the Corporation. The Corporation will be responsible for the issue of the log book to every port where supplies are required.

8. **Prices.** The price to be charged for each supply to ships of the Merchant Navy is to be the same price for each of equivalent quality supply to U.S. Forces. arrangements for the supply of canteen stores to Merchant Ships in all canteen ports. In consequence, it has been agreed that such stores may be supplied from EFTI stocks in ports where there is an EFTI establishment and where there is no alternative civilian source of supply, at prices comparable with those charged by EFTI, provided that such issues can be made without detriment to supplies for M Forces. The ports covered by this arrangement are those in the Mediterranean, the Red Sea, the Persian Gulf, Ceylon, and the East.

2. The term "Canteen Stores" covers all such items as are normally stocked in ships' canteens. It does not include perishables such as butter, margarine or tinned meat, or wines and spirits. Beer and cigarettes are included as they will continue to be supplied in accordance with Circular 08/9/5.2.44.

3. Issues of Canteen Stores are normally to be limited to a maximum in value of 5/-d. per week for each member of the crew, including R.A.F.S. (Defensively Equipped Merchant Ships) personnel for one week. The total of issues of any one item is not to exceed the scale obtaining for the Army and the Royal Air Force in the area concerned.

4. A new heading "Canteen Stores" is to be inserted in the Logbooks, Form 1541, already held by Merchant Ships and this will be used to show the value of the stores issued and the period to which the issue related.

5. The strength of the crew in a ship does not vary and should the strength entered in the Logbook has been completed, there will be no need to have it certified again.

6. If a ship is to be out of touch with a base for several weeks, the Master will be entitled to draw in advance the ship's entitlement of canteen stores to cover a period not exceeding four weeks.

7. It is emphasised that supplies issued under these instructions are to be used from EFTI establishments only. The current retail prices will be charged, subject to a discount of 10%. Transmissions will be in cash only.

8. These new arrangements will not prejudice Merchant Ships from using MFTI canteens ashore as laid down in Circular 08/4/57.13.44.

9. It is emphasised that where EFTI and MFTI have trading establishments in the same port, supplies to merchant ships will be made from the EFTI establishment whenever practicable.
