1. We have your Cable Q 106 of 26 September and your letter MMIA/Q 1 of 24 September 1945 with reference to the Biella blankets. Captain O'Donnell furnished us copies of letters on which our whole case was based. It was understood that he had furnished copies of these letters to you, and therefore the figures given in your letter are not understood.
2. You will note that in the letter from Captain Turner to the Regional Commissioner under date of 17 July, copy of which is attached, Captain Turner reported 519,076 blankets in the Biella factory and warehouses, even giving the total weight of the blankets. Attached to this letter, Captain Turner reported on the stock in the warehouses, and it shows a list of stock which had been given away. For Captain O'Donnell to say now that the figures appear to be an exaggeration is not understood. I can't understand why Captain O'Donnell can't go out to the warehouses and find out the exact situation, and also contact Captain Turner to find out where the blankets are that he has reported to be on hand.
3. The ALCOM signal 5425 of 14 September directing that 200,000 be blocked for DISTWO means absolutely nothing as DISTWO should have control of all the blankets and should take what they want and give the balance to us. You have been furnished copies of the AFHQ telegram on the subject.
4. Please go into this matter thoroughly and find out the exact situation. We want to know if the report made by Captain Turner as to the number of these blankets was or was not correct, and we want to know the disposition of all the blankets, and we want to know what DISTWO is doing about the matter and how many they are going to retain for POW's and how many they are going to give us, and when we are going to get them. Note copy of Alcom cable. They still take the attitude that they have some interest in the blankets. In fact, 2Dist can take all of them if 2 Dist sees fit.

We have received your Q98 on same subject. Please follow this matter thru. We will take what 2 Dist does not want for PGW, and I am sure 2 Dist should give us the release order and not Alcom.

Please give us exact information on the number of blankets and other items given away or removed by AMG. If you can, give us the names of AMG officers authorizing the releases, with copies of the releases. AMG has no right to any of this and have violated instructions of AFHQ (1) in blocking and (2) in removing. I would like to get sufficient information to hang a courts martial charge on some Allied officer for illegal disposition, theft, or what have you.

Arrange for the Army to take over and remove at once any blankets released by 2 Dist and keep us fully advised.

MEMORANDUM:

TO : Chief Commissioner, Hq ALCOM

1. On 25 August letter was addressed to you on above subject (Copy at Appendix B).
2. On 4 September I found that Colonel Campbell had the file. Finally I reached Colonel Campbell and he discussed the matter. He finally agreed to see the Economic Section and arrange for a conference to be held to settle the matter in this building and also to wire the Milan Office of the Commerce Sub-Commission to not issue any of these materials until the question had been decided. I do not know what was done by Colonel Campbell, as I have not since heard from him.
3.
 - a. The question involved is "Are these blankets captured enemy material?". I had attempted to have this determined in this building, without success.
 - b. It will be noted in the various letters that:
 - (1) Some sort of an Italian organization is being organized by ALCOM to handle captured material. (Captured material does not pass to ALCOM until released to ALCOM under AFHQ orders.)
 - (2) Some of this material has been released to "prevent disease and unrest". (Such action by ALCOM officers is not authorized until AFHQ has released the material to ALCOM.)
 - (3) The so-called block was placed 17 July on "all ex-Republican and German property" pending action by War Disposal Sub Commission. (This was done almost a month after AFHQ published instructions on the disposal of captured enemy material, which instructions do not authorize any such action as taken by the ALCOM officers and does not mention the War Disposal Sub Commission.)

(4) Statement is made by the Regional Commerce Officer that the Armies object to AMG handling this material. (The Armies on that date were charged with control of this material, not ALCOM, so it is understandable that the Armies would object to unauthorized AMG interference.)

4. AFHQ has now answered the question in FX 42683 (Copy at Appendix A) with the statement "Status these blankets is that of captured enemy material", and 2 District has assumed control.

5. Your attention is again invited to this matter inasmuch as (1) ALCOM Officers are involved in actions contrary to AFHQ instructions and have attempted to assume control which is not warranted, and (2) it was hoped that the matter could be handled in this building, but the continued delays and inaction have defeated this. AFHQ has now settled the matter.



Information supplied to the Army Central Wool Office at Biella by the National Association of Wool Manufacturers concerning a stock of 500,000 blankets, discloses the following:

- 1) at the General Warhouse in Biella there are about 150,000 blankets which had been formerly delivered to German authorities. These blankets are frozen by A.M.G.
- 2) the balance of about 350,000 blankets is reported to be with industrial firms in the Biella area, either ready or in preparation. These blankets, however, having never been delivered nor killed to German authorities - according to a statement by the aforementioned Association - are the property of the firms since they were manufactured with raw materials owned by them.

1. Thank you for your TUR/11/Q of 21 Aug. The facts in the case have been misrepresented. No request has been received to move blankets from Turin to Genoa. The M of W request to move 5,000 blankets from Naples to Genoa was disapproved on the grounds that there were reported to be large stocks of blankets in Turin which would be more than ample to meet the Genoa demands, and movement would be considered when the blanket situation in Biella was cleared up. Alcom has not yet replied to our Q/12/1 of 25 Aug.

2. There is no objection to moving blankets from Turin to Genoa providing the movement can be accomplished by rail, and Turin stocks are not depleted beyond your own requirements.

1. I am enclosing the MOIA letter /12/1 of 25 Aug as I am very anxious that it should be seen by the "upper circle" of V.A.W. It is a matter of great importance from our point of view as this quantity of Army blankets will see us throughout the winter and remove any risk of demands on AFHQ for assistance.

2. At the moment, although clearly military blankets, they are being filtered away in detail to odd civilian outfits and run the grave risk of drafting into the very black market. The Regional Officer in TURIN (enclosure No.5 & 4) is most helpful but the blankets still remain blocked.

3. It may well be that part of these Army blankets will be required for P.W. or surrendered personnel but that is District or AFHQ decision.

4. It would be a great help if G.O.O. 2 District could check into the position as possibly he is not aware of the position.

Inviting attention to four attached copies of letters with reference to 519,076 blankets in the Biella Factory, Vercelli (Turin), which are undoubtedly "captured enemy material" as defined in Par 3a of AFHQ letter file AG 386.3/163 LOG-0, Subject: "Disposition of Captured Enemy Material in Italy", dated 22 June 1945, which letter evidently supersedes any AC/AMG proclamations or orders (as mentioned in Incl 1) which are contrary therewith. Folio 4 Q/95.
2. The above cited AFHQ letter provides:
 - a. In Par 4b, the responsibility for safeguarding and control of "captured enemy material" rests with the District Commander.
 - b. In Par 9c, that recaptured material of Italian military origin, not required for military purposes including maintenance of POW will be turned over immediately to the Italian military authorities or reported to AFHQ and disposal instructions awaited. (This is to be done by the District Commander in this case.)
 - c. In Par 9k, that captured material, not required for military purposes, which is apparently of civilian character and Italian origin, will be turned over to AC or AMG.
3. a. In the cited AFHQ letter no authority can be found for the seizing, blocking, allocation or disposal by AC/AMG of any "captured enemy material" except that turned over under Par 9k, cited above. It must therefore be presumed that the blocking by AC/AMG of this material (which is "captured enemy material" of "Italian military origin", see Incl 3) is without authority, and unwarranted.
- b. The cited AFHQ letter is clear in connection with "captured materials of Italian military origin".

c. The MMIA LO on the spot requested the AC/AMG authorities not to dispose of any of this material until the question of ownership had been fully determined. Notwithstanding, information has been received that AC/AMG officers are disposing of a part of this material to civilians or civilian agencies, prior to any determination by the proper authority (District Commander or AFHQ).

4. It is therefore requested that instructions be issued forthwith to the AC/AMG officers concerned to (1) have all material disposed of by them returned to the factory, and (2) to remove the so-called "block" on this material, in order that the provisions of the cited AFHQ letter can be carried out.

1. It has not been possible to provide anti fly and mosquito proof wire gauze for Italian Military Hospitals, from Italian Army sources.
2. As all Italian military personnel, whether US-ITI, BR-ITI, or Italian, are evacuated to or cared for in Italian hospitals, it would appear to be an Allied commitment.
3. Minimum requirements for this purpose are estimated at 20,000 sq metres.
4. Every effort is being made to raise the standard of hygiene in the Italian Army, and if supplies can be made available, flyproofing of cook houses and food preparation rooms will likewise be carried out at Rft Depots, priority being given to those supplying Allied Service Units.
5. Estimated additional requirements 15,000 sq metres.
6. Approval is requested for the release of above material to Italian Depots whence issue would be controlled by this HQ.

1. Stocks of blankets are not sufficient to issue to all BR-ITI Service Troops to scale of 4 per man next winter.
2. Current events have left uncertain some factors that enter into any calculation of the numbers of blankets which will be required to equip to this scale but it is calculated that 200,000 will be needed. In arriving at this figure the following assumptions have been made:-
 - a) that, although the maximum ceiling of 35,000 will not be reached, the strengths next winter will be 30,000.
 - b) that the Combat Groups will continue to be supplied, not from stocks in BR-ITI clothing depots, but by Dr. Ord. through their respective BLUs and next higher formation.
 - c) that the wastage for Italian Army is double that in the British Army by reason of the poor quality of Italian blankets and of the greater risk of blankets being illegally disposed of. Wastage has been included right up to the end of the winter.
3. Is it confirmed please that next winter the scale of blankets for BR-ITI Service tps will be 4 per man throughout ?
